

Announcement of Vote on September 14, 2023, Stated Meeting

In accordance with Imperial Bylaws, Article 31, it is announced that there will be a vote on a resolution to revise the Alzafar Shrine Bylaws. The resolution was read, a motion was made and seconded and passed, at the August 10th, 2023, stated meeting, and was laid over until September 14, 2023. A copy of the proposed revised bylaws is available to review in the Alzafar Recorders office.

Alzafar Shrine Resolution for By Laws Change 2023

Whereas the last known bylaws approved by Shriner's International were from 2004;

Whereas the Bylaws changes submitted in 2022 were not approved by Shriner's International;

Whereas the Bylaws have been rewritten to conform with the bylaws of Shriner's International and;

Whereas the bylaws have been reviewed by the Temple attorney and will be sent to Shriner's International for approval; now, therefore be it

Resolved, That Alzafar Shriner's on behalf of its members

1. approves of the bylaws as written; and

2. supports sending the bylaws to Shriner's International for approval.

Changes are as follows:

1. 178 instances where Chapter is changed back to Temple (per Imperial)

2. The proposed amendments contain 41 references to "Imperial Council", "Imperial Bylaws", "Imperial Law" or "Imperial Law and Order". Those references are contrary to §1.1 of the Articles of Incorporation of Shriners Intl. and §101.3(o) of the Bylaws of Shriners Intl. These have all been addressed to comply with the Bylaws of Shriners International

3. Article 2 Membership, Section 2 Prerequisite to Membership (a) was changed to comply and mirror Bylaws of Shriner's International

4. Article 2 Membership, Section 4 Balloting was changed to comply and mirror Bylaws of Shriner's International

5. Article 2 Membership, Section 9. Retention of Membership (e) was removed (no imperial Bylaws exist that were referenced

6. Article 2 Membership Section 10 Initiation fee (f) was changed to comply and mirror Bylaws of Shriner's International

7. Article 2 Membership, Section 11 Dues a,b,c,d,e, and f were changed to comply and mirror Bylaws of Shriner's International

8. Article 2 Membership, Section 12. Hospital Assessment was changed back to Hospital Levy per bylaws of Shriners International.

a. Also a,b,c, and d were changed to comply and mirror Bylaws of Shriner's International

9. Article 4 Officers, Section 5 Election Regulations a,b,c, and d were all changed to comply with and mirror Bylaws of Shriner's International

Article 4 Officers, Section 7. Vacancies was changed to comply and mirror Bylaws of Shriner's International
Filling Vacancies in Particular offices were changed in its entirety to comply and mirror Bylaws of Shriner's

International

11. Article 4 Officers, Section 10 Potentate's Ordinances were changed to comply and mirror Bylaws of Shriner's International

12. Article 4 Officers, Section 14. Recorder's Duties (a) 9 -change from February and now reads "Before January 15 each year, transmit to the Imperial Recorder in the form prescribed, the annual returns for the temple" per Shriner's International Bylaws

13. Article 4 Officers, Section 18. Board of Directors (g) Changed to read Sale of Temple Assets. Any temple, or any of its affiliates, contemplating the sale, lease, exchange, mortgage, pledge or other disposition of all or substantially all of its property and assets, may only do so upon such terms and conditions and for such consideration as shall be first authorized by a vote of the temple at a stated or special meeting which sets forth in the notice of the meeting the specific nature of the business to be transacted. The notice of the meeting must be sent to every member of the temple at least 20 days prior to the meeting. Which now complies and mirrors Bylaws of Shriners International



ALZAFAR SHOTGUN UNIT AKA SMOKIN' CLAYS By Secretary Bill Willis

Our final competition is behind us after a great showing at TSA. What a great year it's been for the Smokin' Clays. We have new members showing their shooting prowess, friends and family joining us at our fun shoots/practices, and having great turn-outs at our stated meetings. Now it's time to start thinking of polishing up our skills for our next competition which will be the TSSSA Mid-Winter shoot next March. It's also time to start looking for a member to step up and get in line as our 2nd Vice President to lead our unit into the future. We'll be voting for the 2024 leadership team at our October stated meeting, so, Shotgun Unit members, if you're interested in the 2nd Vice position, please submit your name to any of the current leadership.

We'll be shooting sporting clays at Mid-Winter so that's the discipline we'll be focusing on at our practices for the next several months. For those of you that are unfamiliar with sporting clays, I have a brief description of it below. It's great fun and by far my favorite game to shoot.


Sporting clays is a form of clay pigeon shooting often described as "golf with a shotgun" because a typical course is laid out in natural surroundings and typically include ten to fifteen shooting stations. Like golf, shooters move from one station to the next to complete the course. Unlike skeet and trap, however, which are games of repeatable target presentations, sporting clays simulates the unpredictability of live bird hunt-*Continued on Page 10*

ing, offering a wide variety of field shooting situations by presenting targets with various trajectories, angles, speeds, elevations and distances. To further challenge shooters, the size of the clay target may vary from the standard trap/ skeet clay birds to the smaller "midi" and "mini" targets, or even a flat disc-shaped "battue" target. There are also "rabbit" targets which are thrown on the edge to roll and hop unpredictably across the ground to simulate rabbit hunting.

A typical round of sporting clays consists of shooting 8 to 10 targets at each station by a squad of up to five shooters for a total of 50 to 100 targets per person per round. Targets are normally thrown in pairs. A pair of targets may be thrown as a "true pair", thrown at the same time, or as a "report pair", thrown sequentially where the second clay target is launched when the shooter fires his

gun at the first target. Numerous hunting conditions can be simulated by combining various speeds and angles with different sizes of clay targets. Each station is unique. Throughout the course, shooters will typically see targets crossing from



either side, coming inward, going outward, flying straight up, rolling on the ground, arcing high in the air, or thrown from towers. The possible target presentations are limited only by the imagination of the course designer, safety considerations and the terrain. The configuration of the course and the target presentation at each station is often changed to maintain interest for the shooters and for environmental preservation of the course.

Well, I hope my explanation of sporting clays was clear as mud, or at least peaked your interest enough to come out and give it a try. We'd love to have you come out and join us for a morning of fun shooting, followed up by a tasty lunch cooked over the grill. Please contact any member of the Shotgun Unit for the date and location of our next fun shoot. Hope to see you there.

If you'd like to find out more about the Shotgun Unit, our stated meetings are held on the second Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Shotgun Meeting Room. Ladies are always welcome. Be sure to come early as our Honorary Third Vice and Chief Chef, Noble David Hadley, always serves up a delicious meal around 6:30. Until then, "Keep your powder dry, and remember, as long as there is lead in the air, there is always hope!"



Even though it's a little warm, the Ruffians still get out and about. We enjoyed a ride from Camp Alzafar around the Hill Country and ended up at Noble JT Mayor's for a BBQ he hosted along with his lady. That's what makes the group so awesome, fun and fellowship!
