Visit with Author - Julia Penny

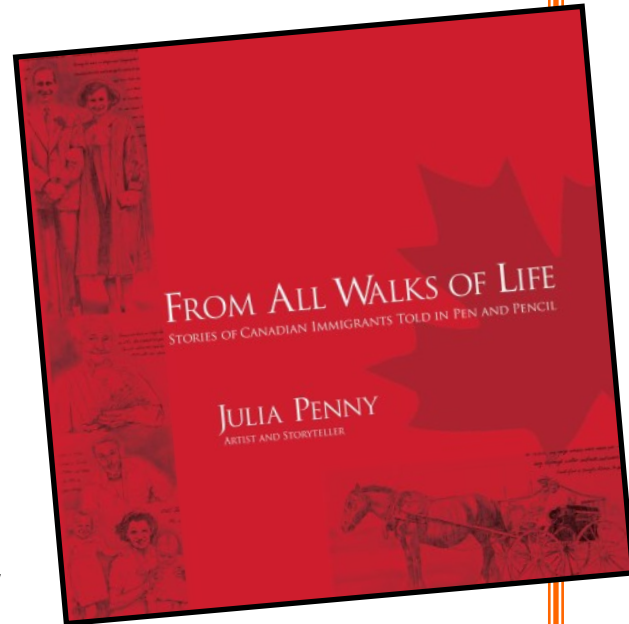

From All Walks of Life by Julia Penny

Stories of Canadian Immigrants Told In Pencil and Pen

“‘From All Walks of Life’ is a celebration of the immigrants who settled in Canada and most of the subjects are Manitobans. Artist Julia Penny, listened to the stories her partner and his friends told of the area's residents and their struggles in a new land. She created 151 portraits and wrote their stories next to their portraits. Most of her subjects settled in the Winnipeg, Selkirk and Interlake area of Manitoba. You may find someone you know!”

Rising early, while all is quiet, Julia Penny creates in her studio every day. An early interest in drawing blossomed into a passion for painting, first in acrylics with her training in art school and as a graphic designer. Her subjects are portraits but really everything is a portrait to her... landscape, still life, faces and figures. Her work is in collections nationally and internationally.



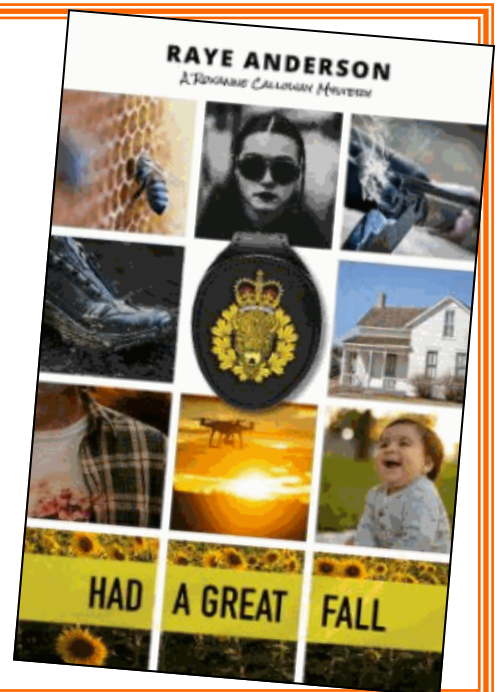
