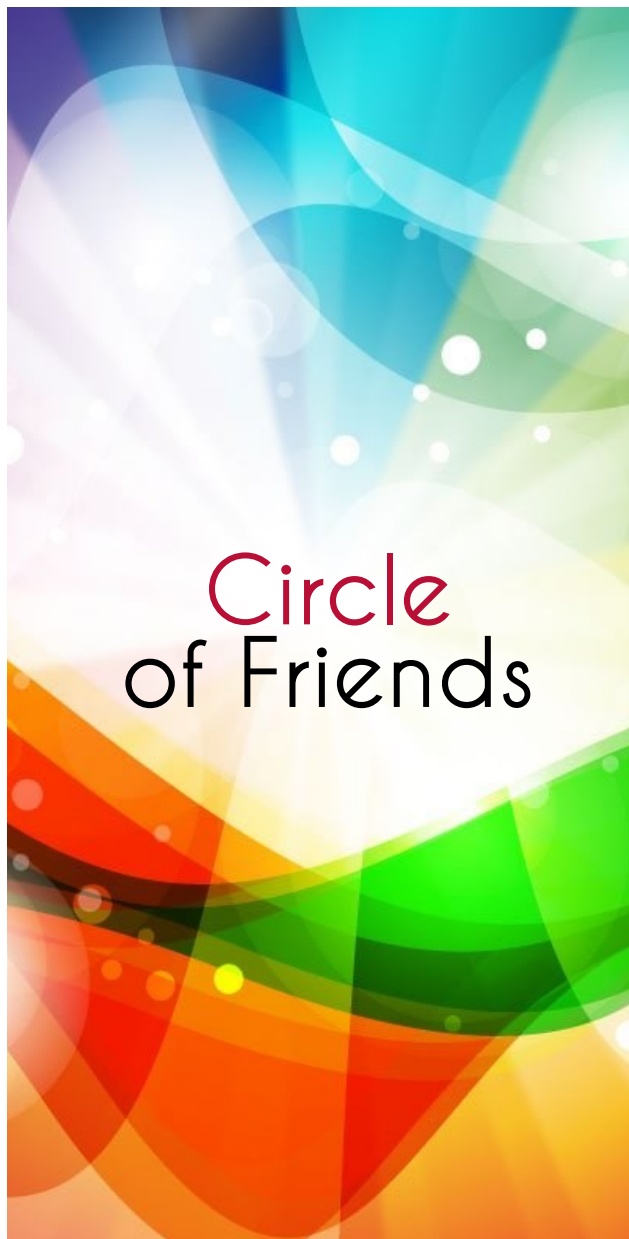

Public library services will be provided in an environment that encourages and supports all members of the public to develop their full potential.

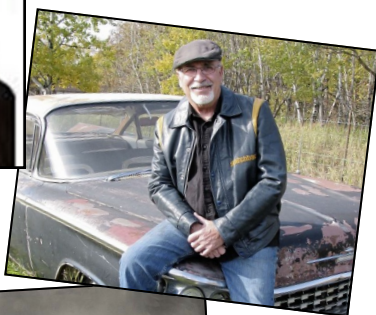
