The Gaynor Family Regional Library is dedicated to providing public access to the resources required to facilitate lifelong learning in our communities. Public library services will be provided in an environment that encourages and supports all members of the public to develop their full potential.

The Library is administered by a volunteer Library Board of citizens appointed by the City of Selkirk, the R.M. of St. Andrews, the R.M. of St. Clements and the Village of Dunnottar. Funding is provided by municipal contributions from the City of Selkirk, the R.M. of St. Andrews, the R.M. of St. Clements, the Village of Dunnottar and the Province of Manitoba.

## Our Services

We have a variety of resources available for school work, business or personal research. If we don't have the materials you need, we can point you in the right direction. If you need help researching a topic or finding that answer, ask our helpful staff.

If we can't find the answer in our library, then through a partnership of all libraries in Manitoba the material can be brought in for you. In most cases there is no fee for this expanded service.

### **Public Computers**

Free access to the internet, email, research, or word processing. We offer Microsoft Office on each computer which includes Word, Excel, PowerPoint and Publisher.

### **Child Computers**

An imaginative interface for ages 2-8. Enjoy developmental programs designed for independent, group, or supervised learning. Programs are certified for educational and developmental content.

### **Ebscohost**

Free online research database which can search thousands of e-journals containing millions of articles. Our library has a subscription and can be used by our patrons. Ask us for more details or look over the **Research Brochure** for instructions.

### **One Search**

An option in our catalogue that will query numerous databases at once. Type in the topic you are researching and look for the **One Search** tab in the top right corner of your screen for the results.

Databases include: Dictionary of Canadian Biography, Exploring Nature, NASA, Canadian Encyclopedia, National Geographic, Encyclopedia of Earth and Accuweather.
