A partnership with Lake Friendly Manitoba and the East Interlake Conservation District

has been created to establish an Urban Prairie oasis.

Local farmers helped provide the composted biomass for the soil used in the Urban Prairie project.



The library structure was strategically oriented to capture the regional prairie vista. In the landscape, a system of bio-swales were introduced to direct water to the existing natural drainage.
