Supervisor Converse opened the meeting by leading all in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Justice Rowley told the Board she was applying for a grant for \$30,000.00 to update the Court from JCAP. The JCAP asked Justice Rowley to obtain 3 quotes from contractors for the intended project. She will be speaking with Code Officer Fordham for information on local contractors.

CODE ENFORCEMENT REPORT

Code Officer Fordham had 8 inspections, 8 building permits, attended one Planning Board and one Zoning Board of Appeals meetings, issued one written violation and one verbal warning for the month of July.

WATER REPORT

Water Treatment Plant Operator Sehm collected water samples with one testing positive for coliform. Three more samples were collected all showing negative results for coliform and e-coli. He, Henry Martin and Ray Frazer attended annual water school.

The Water Department gave interviews to fill the soon to be vacant position of Water Clerk.

HIGHWAY REPORT

The Highway Department finished the shoulders on Brown Road and worked on the drainage, sealed a crack on Galen Road from Wolcott Road to the air strip, and helped the Towns of Sodus, Galen and Wolcott with Paving. Highway Superintendent Jay obtained plow equipment quotes for the new truck that has been ordered and will need the Board to make a decision to buy the parts that have an 18 month wait list.

The solar speed sign was stolen from Route 414 and is assumed was turned in for scrap metal judging by the debris left behind. There was discussion of placing "Air Tags" on equipment being this was not the first theft of the Town.

ANIMAL CONTROL REPORT

Animal Control Officer Miller picked up an aggressive dog on Shepard Road and brought it to the Humane Society. A week later she had a call from a lady on the west end of Wayne Center Road that was also taken to the Humane Society. Both dogs were believed to be drop offs.

HISTORIANS REPORT

Historian Miller reported information from the August 12, 2025 Bicentennial meeting. Some activities planned are: an apple machine demonstration, a 5k race, a scavenger hunt, a history walk with Historian Miller, a grave cleaning demonstration with Parker Maybe, A car show and chicken barbeque at the Rose Firemen's Field, breakfast at the North Rose Fire Department, and live music and fireworks overseen by the North Rose Fire Department to name a few. The committee is still looking for sponsors and donations.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Phil Torrey, Jeff Jay and Matt Horn of MRB Group walked around the Hamlet's to look at the drainage situation. MRB Group will soon send a report with pricing.

The Planning Board reached out to the lawyer for input on battery storage, there is no word back yet as the he has been on vacation.

"Lego Land" is coming to the Town of Rose on Main Street. Board members questioned how the store would be able to stay in business being there not a high demand for Legos. Chairman Guthrie explained they do the majority of their business online and sell nationwide.

BUDGET MODIFICATIONS

Energtix sent an invoice for drug testing that exceeded what was budgeted. Town Clerk Gonzalez explained they sent a bill in January 2025 for 3 dates in 2024. They then sent another invoice in August with two dates in December 2025 and one for 2025. Between the two invoices the Town was billed \$745.00. There was \$300.00 budgeted for 2025.
