Supervisor Converse opened the meeting by leading all in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

CODE ENFORCEMENT REPORT

Code Enforcement Officer (CEO) Fordham did 13 inspections, issued 10 Building Permits, attended 1 Planning Board Meeting and one Zoning Board of Appeals Meeting. He had 2 septic inspections, with one passing and one failing, had 1 complaint, issued 2 written violations for mowing, 2 after the fact permits, 2 Stop Work Orders, and 2 Court appearances.

Water Clerk, Pat Gary reported, 5 monthly meters read, 586 quarterly meters read and 9 meters were replaced in the month of June. Supervisor Converse assigned Councilwoman Rice, Councilman Dunphy, Water Clerk Gary and Water Treatment Plant Operator, Mike Sehm, to set up interview times and dates for the soon to be vacant Water Clerk position.

HIGHWAY REPORT

The Highway Department paved Brown Road from Salter Road to Lyman Road and hauled crusher run for the shoulders. They did their second round of roadside mowing and moved the speed sign from Glenmark Road to North Huron Street. A speed study was conducted on Glenmark Road from July 7, 2025 to July 14, 2025. The report showed 3,290 vehicles traveled by that location during that time frame with 375 violations.

ANIMAL CONTROL REPORT

Animal Control Officer (ACO) Flo Miller received a call from a property owner who lives in Florida about her tenant on Wayne Center Road who moved out and left their 3 dogs chained to a tree with no food or water. ACO Miller brought the dogs water and food and left a note on the door to call her within 24 hours. A woman picked up the dogs and stated a puppy was missing. There was no puppy seen by ACO Miller. The woman took the dogs to her new residence in Red Creek, saying she had left the animals in her boyfriend's care, but he had been put in jail. The dogs were very thin for their size and breed.

HISTORIAN'S REPORT

Historian Tish Miller gave an update from the Bicentennial meeting. Some activities that are planned for the weekend of the event are: a 5k race on August 1, 2026, a scavenger hunt, car show and chicken barbeque at the Rose Fire Department's Fireman's Field. North Rose Fire Department will host a breakfast on August 1, 2025 as well as a band and fireworks in the evening; food trucks and vendors, the churches will have games at Marshall Park, Parker Maybe will be giving a grave cleaning demonstration at the Rose Cemetery, Marshall Farms will have a canine event, an apple machine demonstration by Jerry Jahreis from Eden and a history walk with Historian Miller. She had asked for more volunteers for the event as the attendance is dwindling.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman of the Planning Board, Steve Guthrie, reported that the engineering firm MRB Group will be doing a walk-through of both hamlets to address the drainage concerns where they will then present a quote for the drainage study.

ZONING BOARD OF APEALS REPORT

Matt Horn, of MRB Group, will be discussing the zoning changes at the next ZBA meeting. The Planning and Zoning Boards would like the Town's lawyer present for the August 13,2025 ZBA meeting discussing solar.

Councilwoman Murphy and Councilman Lasher will be setting up interviews for the Planning and Zoning Secretary. Supervisor Converse requested Chairman Guthrie and CEO Fordham attend the interviews.

He is leaning toward the B1 option from MRB Group's previous chart opting out of the Air Stripper and improving and maintaining the current working wells, costing \$2,657,000.00 with rescue from Wayne County Water and Sewer Authority should an emergency occur.

Councilwoman Murphy announced there will be a one-day training school for Planning and Zoning Board of Appeals members if they would like to attend.
