I. Welcome and Review of February 21st Meeting Minutes

The committee reviewed notes from our meeting on February 21, 2024. No changes were noted.

II. Priority Action Area Discussion

The committee discussed priority policy areas including infrastructure, zoning/code enforcement, and economic development.

From an infrastructure perspective, the committee agreed that water production/treatment needs to be expanded to ensure available capacity for growth. Additionally, the potential for sewer in the hamlet of North Rose should be evaluated. Stormwater and flooding was also identified as a concern.

Relative to economic development, the committee focused on accessibility to fresh food as a priority, as well as the attraction and support of small businesses; particularly in the hamlets. The committee discussed opportunities to support building owners with necessary renovations, and ideas around shop local campaigns.

With respect to code enforcement and zoning, the committee prioritized property maintenance concerns on main routes, and evaluation of bulk and density standards in the hamlets and other future growth areas.

Our next meeting will focus on community engagement and leadership development.

III. Spring Public Input Event Logistics

Our 2nd public input event is scheduled for April 17th at the North Rose Fire Dept. The focus of that meeting will be to receive feedback on priority policy areas and associated strategies.

Available committee members should try to arrive approximately an hour early to assist with set-up. Food will be secured from the diner. Ms. White will work with Ms. Murphy to coordinate.

IV. Next Steps

Mr. Horn noted that he will continue to refine the implementation strategies discussed today, and that we will regroup on outstanding priority policy areas at our April meeting. Additionally, Ms. White will coordinate with Ms. Murphy on logistics for the upcoming public engagement event.

The next regular meeting of the Committee is scheduled for April 24th at 6:30p.
