Happy New Year! You are probably thinking, "What? Happy New Year that doesn't start till after Christmas. Well, we in the church have always done life in a different way. One of those different ways is starting the church year differently than the calendar year. Our church year starts in Advent and the color for the four Sundays in Advent is blue. By the time you receive this newsletter the First Sunday of Advent will be upon us.

We here at St Paul have much going on in Advent. Every Sunday in Advent is filled with something special. See the calendar for the particulars. On top of that this year we will once again have two Christmas Eve services – 7:00 pm and 10:00 pm. As planning is still ongoing, I hope to have two distinct services on Christmas Eve. I like to say each one will have its own "flavor".

Advent, like many of you has always been a special season for me. It all started with the family of origin as we always had an Advent wreath at home and did devotions together, usually in the afternoon or evening on the Sundays in Advent. I especially remember this time this year as the last of my parents, my father died this past March. He and my mom were the driving force of faith formation in our family. This is something I have tried to carry on with our daughter as she reaches her teenage years. This year we will have purchased three different Advent calendars with special treats inside of them on the days of Advent. In addition to this I plan to read the devotional that comes from Luther Seminary that is still available in the entryway to the sanctuary.

So Happy New Church Year to you all. As this season of Advent proceeds may you prepare for the Christ child to come once again.

And just like that – another church year has gone by. I have only a few announcements for this newsletter article:

The organ tuners from Peebles-Herzog in Columbus touched up our organ last Tuesday and will return for more work and minor repairs in early 2026. The Council approved their proposal at its last meeting. I am very excited about this.

The children's service will be on Advent 3 (December 14). Jill and I started practicing with the kids mid-November. The music will be a mix of traditional Christmas carols and contemporary Christian songs. In addition, Barbara has been working with the Diehl bell choir for both, the children's service and Christmas Eve.

There will be two Christmas Eve services this year, both with special music: at 7 pm (special music 15 to 20 minutes before, performed mainly by children from our congregation) and at 10 pm (candlelight service, special music performed by professional guest musicians, the St. Paul Choir, soloists from our congregation, and me, to start 45-60 minutes before the service). Especially with the later service/special music we are hoping to reach out to the community. Please invite your friends!

Dr. Dan Beals has asked me to help with providing some musical expertise for Sunday School topics in Advent. See you there!

We began November by honoring All Saints Day, remembering the faithful who have gone before us this past year. This day is especially meaningful for many of our youth and members as we reflect on their lives and legacies. The following Sunday, we commemorated our veterans with gratitude, presenting homemade cards and poppies, the poppy symbolizing HOPE. One of our beloved members and veterans, Hayman Pemberton, was honored with a beautiful flag quilt presented by Norma Gensler and crafted and sewn by his wife, Creigh. The quilt's vibrant red, white, and blue fabrics were a true tribute to his service. Our youth have been active in fellowship and service through CCC. They created cards for veterans and prepared a special dinner for Susan and Dale Kelz following Susan's hip replacement surgery. The celebration will feature a pianist solo, a trio, trumpet accompaniment, and bell choir performance. The youth will share the story of Jesus' birth through scripture, sign language, and song. We invite you to join us for this special time of worship, fellowship, and joy. As we enter the Advent season, let us prepare our hearts for Christ's coming. May the love and light God has given us shine brightly for all to see. Let us share His grace and hope with everyone we meet. CCC will resume on January 7<sup>th</sup> after the New Year.


