

That is a lot! So thankful for our work together here at St Paul. Without all of you the ministry and mission we do in Christ's name would not be able to be accomplished. As we begin this new church year my mind also goes to the services on Sunday morning. This year the primary gospel for the lectionary is from the Gospel of Luke. Luke's text is a bit of a travelog. Jesus is moving around much in the narrative. Luke also has some of the most cherished stories in the New Testament: The "Good" Samaritan and the "Parable of the two sons and the father" being two that many of us may recall.

I wonder if Luke does this to remind his readers, then and now that the Gospel is always moving. The Gospel is a verb – an action word. The actions we do in Christ's name move the Gospel out into the places and people who need to hear it. Those on the fringes of our culture. Our work as God's people here in the place is so important. Again, I thank you for your contributions to this work we do.

I pray this Advent that God in Jesus will bless you with hope. I pray that God in Jesus becoming flesh among us will remind you how much God loves you.

Dear St. Paul Congregation,

November is at the end of the church year and also near the end of the fall semester at Marshall - one of the busiest months. As during the past few years, I am in Medellin, Colombia to perform at teach at a piano festival in the end of November, this year during the Thanksgiving break. Thank you to Keith Wellman for filling in for me on November 24. I am skipping the last day of the festival and will be back at the organ bench on Advent 1!

Starting Advent 1, we will change the setting of the liturgy from IV to V. The liturgy for Advent midweek services is new. The choir has been practicing it, and I will play excerpts from it on the piano in the beginning of communion during Advent so you will become familiar with the melodies.

We have started rehearsing the music for the children's nativity play on Advent 3 (thanks to Jill May). It will include two contemporary songs: "Make Room" by Casting Crowns and "It's Yours" by Matt Maher, alongside some old favorites.

The organ will eventually need cleaning and some repair work (it's a complex instrument, and this kind of maintenance is normal). We have one quote so far, and I am in the process of getting an additional estimate from a second company.

The music for Christmas Eve is also in the works: as always you will hear around 30 minutes of mixed special music before Worship.

In the little series about playing the organ, I'd like to introduce you to another advanced technique of hymn playing. It is called "reharmonization". This means that instead of the standard harmonies accompanying a melody, you will hear a different chord or chord succession. Often, this is done for special effect. One of the most famous examples is the chord underneath "Word of the Father" in the last verse of Oh Come, All Ye Faithful. British musician David Willcocks wrote a mid-20th century arrangement of this Christmas carol, and his reharmonization of the abovementioned text give the "Word" of the Father special gravitas. When church musicians talk about "The chord", that's what they mean. Listen for it, when we sing the last verse of Oh Come, All Ye Faithful on Christmas Eve!


