Here is the pineapple casserole recipe that many of you asked us to share. The recipe originally came from one of my mother's best friends back in the 1960s. It is a bread pudding of sorts! (Norma Gensler)



RECIPE

- > Pineapple Casserole
- > 1 cup sugar
- > 4 fresh eggs
- > 1 stick butter
- > 1 can crushed pineapple (thoroughly drained)
- > 5 slices of bread (I use Hawaiian bread from Kroger) cut into 1" cubes
- > Cream sugar, eggs, and butter. Add drained pineapple and then fold in the bread
- > Bake in a greased casserole @350 for about an hour. It will smell delicious and be browned on the top crust.
- > This recipe doubles and triples easily! A double recipe fits into a 9 x 12 sheet cake pan. Enjoy!
