November is and always has been a busy month in the liturgical year. We begin November with All Saints Sunday. All Saints Day is always the first Sunday in November. This is the day after All Hallows Eve or Halloween. The second and third Sundays of November we go back to "days after Pentecost". The fourth Sunday in November is Christ the King Sunday and the final Sunday, November 30 is the first Sunday in Advent. All of this change makes a busy time for the Altar Guild ministry people in November. Changing the altar cloths to the different colors each week can be an arduous task.

November is also a transition month in the church year. The word liminal comes to my mind. Liminal is a term that reminds us about transitionary times. It's like the text from Ecclesiastes: a time for every purpose under heaven. I have written to you all a lot about "times". I guess it is because it seems to me that times are upon us. Not sure what that means except that times always are upon us. Maybe it is also because I am getting older. Maybe it is because I will miss my father in particular this coming All Saints Sunday. He was a faithful servant with the patience of Job that many times was tested by me and my siblings. He and my mom also brought us to worship every Sunday and upheld the Word of God in our home.

The other "time" I celebrated on October 19 was 39 years of ordained ministry! That's a lot! There are too many places I have seen and the people I have encountered along the way to list here. Suffice it to know that many of them are/were faithful servants of Christ who love the church and the community that encompasses them in all "Times".

In whatever time it might be I try to remind myself that God is with us. The promise of the incarnation – God made flesh is not just something we remember and celebrate at Christmas time. 
