Pastor's Reflections

I am what people call a "Trekkie." What this means is that I enjoy Star Trek in all its forms. Kathy and I have been watching on Paramount Plus streaming service one of those forms of Star Trek called *Discovery*. It has been fascinating and interesting and thought provoking all at once. The show focuses around one character named Michael. Michael is a woman who eventually assumes the role of captain on the ship Discovery. Michael gets into a lot of trouble during many of the episodes. She always seems to get out of trouble with her shipmates, but it takes a while for her shipmates to trust her and to follow her.

Sometimes I wonder what it takes for people to follow you as a leader. Is it personality that drives people to want to follow leaders? Are leaders born and not made? Jesus had twelve followers and one of those betrayed him and another denied even having known him. When I was in seminary a phrase that was used frequently for us was: "you are to be a leader among leaders." Interesting thought. For Michael of Star Trek Discovery, it is about heart and love and a willingness to make tough decisions that some people may not like. It is also about being with and among people, listening. I am also convinced that being a leader in the church is about discerning God's will, mission, and ministry together.

In Luke 9 verses 57 to 62 Jesus has set his face toward Jerusalem and people are following along. One person says: "I will follow you wherever you go.' Jesus says to him: "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head. To another he said, "follow me." But he said, "Lord first let me go and bury my father. But Jesus said to him, "Let the dead bury their own dead..." What does one make of these passages? Is Jesus using hyperbole and exaggerations?

I would suggest to you that Jesus is asking people (followers/disciples) to let go of the past. The question I would ask is: How are our lives different as followers of Jesus? What distinguishes us from others? You see for followers of Jesus we have a new identity. It is one of being pilgrims who do know the destination. Yet we are also nomads who are called to go to uncertain paths to places where the holy is residing, sometimes in places we would never have thought.

June 16, 2022, Kathy, Alex, and I began our eighth year with and among you all here at St Paul in Huntington. It has been a joy and a struggle through pandemics and pre- pandemics and now living with a still very active virus in our lives. The Good News is that we have sought to do it together and there has been grace upon grace offered and received. My prayer is that in the next years we will continue to grow in God's grace and be able to live and share that grace in our lives daily. My prayer is that the leaders, elected and otherwise, would seek to discern God's will in this place. I leave you with this question as a church and as an individual follower of Jesus: What is God doing in your life (in the life of God's church) these days?

Dear St. Paul Congregation,

Thank you so much for welcoming my family to St. Paul so warmly last Sunday. We enjoyed Washington D.C. for a couple of days, saw the White House, National Mall, etc. and then drove to West Virginia, where we have been exploring Huntington and its surroundings. Looking at our area from a visitor's perspective has renewed my appreciation of all the great "outdoors-y" things to do in this part of the state. We loved canoeing on Beech Fork Lake and hiking at Barboursville Park. And, of course, we visited my father's memorial brick in the Rose Garden at Ritter Park.

The St. Paul Choir met for our traditional summer break dinner and fellowship on June 16 at Pier One Landing. A great time was had by all, the food was delicious, and the sunset over the Ohio River spectacular. Some choir members also met on June 22 at Gino's to celebrate Kay Jenning's birthday. Unfortunately, I wasn't able to join (I was picking up my mother from the airport in D.C. at the same time), but I've been told it was a nice gathering and people successfully evaded the approaching storm that night.

You may have noticed that I played a series of late 19th-century French Toccatas as organ postludes in June by the following composers: Dubois (June 5), Widor (June 12), Larriu (June 19), and Gigout (June 26, last Sunday). I love the music and it helped me expanding my organ skills. A toccata is a musical genre for keyboard instruments (organ, piano, harpsichord...) with improvisatory character in which fast passages often alternate with massive-sounding chords. It is meant to show off the virtuosity of the performer. The musical genre "toccata" is much older than any of the French toccatas I played in June, and next Sunday (July 3) I will play a toccata that was written more than one-and-a-half centuries earlier, in 1708 or slightly before. It may be the most famous work ever written for organ, and I know that you will recognize its very beginning: The Toccata in D minor, BWV 565 by Johann Sebastian Bach, also known from the 1940 Disney cult classic "Fantasia."

My family's visit to Huntington has reminded me to be thankful. The sending hymn on July 3 will be "Now Thank We All Our God." I will pick up this theme the following Sunday, July 10 (their last Sunday in Huntington) in the organ postlude: a cho-rale-improvisation on the same melody ("Nun danket alle Gott") by Sigfrid Karg-Elert.




