

### Pastor's Reflections

Ever thought about how many questions you ask yourself or others during the day? I believe if you thought about it, it would be a lot! How many of those questions you ask yourself or others not get answered? Again, I believe it would be many.

I try to do a brief meditation every morning before I have my breakfast. I have been using for the past year an application on my phone called Calm. Every day there are Calm app staff who put meditations on the app for people like me. This morning (September 29) the mediation was about questions. The basic point of the meditation, at least from my perspective, was that sometimes many questions do not get answered, and that is ok. The meditation sought to help its listeners to "let the questions be."

That seems hard because for many of us the nature of a question is that it has an answer. I thought about this when it comes to our faith life – our lives as followers of Jesus. In faith there seem to be many questions that do not have an answer. Questions like: Who is God? Why does God not "fix" the world we live in? What is this stuff about free will? You have some questions that have been weighing on your heart. What are they? Can you "let them be" without a clear and definitive answer?

Scripture is of help to us here. The writer of Hebrews in chapter eleven starts the chapter with these words: Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." Pretty powerful words for us who have a "boat load" of questions about faith. The writer of Hebrews does not stop there with this description of faith. The writer then writes about the "ancestors." The people who have come before who have "by faith" sought to live faith, even when those questions they asked had no definitive answer because people of and by faith live in a relationship with a God who keeps us. With a God who loves and forgives us. With a God who sends us into the world, like our ancestors before us, to live in faith. Read all of chapter 11 of Hebrews and you will see what I mean!

Here at St Paul this October is filled with ministry activities – Stewardship program, Blessing of Animals, Trunk or Treat, First communion instruction just to name a few. Thank you for your faithful witness to the Gospel here in the tri state area. Thank you for "by faith" you go into the world with questions to ask and to hear from others. May God bless you on your way.


Sunday mornings at 11:15 in the parlor. Adult forum has been discontinued for the time being. Please join us for fellowship time.



All items need to be individual sizes and not contain peanuts.


# DAILY Devotional
