Pastor's Reflections

I seem to be saying these words more often: "I remember when". Here are some examples: I remember when school was hardly ever called off (I grew up in northeast Ohio in a place called the "snow belt". Let me just say we got a lot of snow and cold), I remember when everything at school was on paper and the teachers handed things back graded within a couple of days, I remember when the church was full of people, I remember when Sunday school had many children in the classrooms. I could go on. Do you remember when? What do your remembrances look like? Sometimes, probably many times, our memories betray us, don't they? The interesting thing is that if you talk to five people about their remembrances of a specific event there will be five difference accounts of how the event is remembered.

Why do you say those words: I remember when..."? Are they words that bring you back to the past? Are the remembrances good or challenging ones? Do you reflect and say those words to bring joy and happiness to your life today? I wonder.

On February 14 – Ash Wednesday – Valentines Day – we will once again come to worship to remember. As a part of the liturgy the imposition of ashes and the words: "remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return". That can be a frightening thought, can't it? I am dust and I will return to dust! The remembrance is a recognition that God is God, and we are not. The Lenten season is a time to remember and to celebrate our creatureliness. Yes, God is Good and we are not AND God loves us AND God forgives us AND God reminds us of this love daily in life.

So, one of the things I have been trying to do when I find myself saying the words: I remember when... is to be thankful/grateful for today. That remembrances are good things, but we also live in the here and now – moment by moment and each moment is filled with blessings from God.

So, as you embark on the Lenten journey of remembrances, don't forget to thank God for today and all the possibilities for blessing as the day proceeds.

In January we celebrated the life of two saints at St. Paul, Ernie Golder and Al Schneider, and next Saturday we will celebrate the life of another one, Ingeborg White. Our choir is there for these occasions, and so are people who provide for and help with receptions and more. As someone said in the choir said recently, this speaks volumes about our church.

I'd like to take this opportunity and welcome a new choir member. Sarah Elrod moved to Huntington in the fall and has attended St. Paul for a few months. This past Sunday, she sang for the first time together with us during Worship. Sarah is a recent graduate of Augustana College, a Lutheran college in Illinois with a strong music tradition (affiliated with the ELCA). She studied music education with clarinet as principal instrument and has a beautiful soprano voice. We are very glad to have her. With last year's new members Dr. Dan and Edie Beals and all of our longtime-serving and experienced singers, the choir has a very healthy size. For Lent, we will switch the Setting of the Liturgy to No. 5 in the Blue Hymnal (With One Voice).

Some of you know Dr. Elizabeth Reed Smith, who has been the violin professor at Marshall and concertmaster of the Huntington Symphony Orchestra for many years. She will be retiring at the end of this semester. I feel an especially strong bond to her, because she was the chair of the search committee that brought me to Marshall, and the German piano that resides in my living room used to belong to her parents while they were music professors in South Carolina. She studied at Yale University and received her doctorate from the Eastman School of Music (like me, just a couple of decades earlier – we did not know each other before I came to Huntington). I've been fortunate to play with her throughout my time at Marshall and am looking forward to our "last" duo recital together (at least, while she is still teaching at Marshall).

The recital will take place on Sunday, February 18, at 3 pm in Smith Recital Hall on campus. Among other works, we will be playing sonatas by Swedish composer Amanda Röntgen-Maier and Joseph Bologne, Chevalier de Saint-Georges, the "Black Mozart" (the movie "Chevalier" from 2022 is about his life). You are cordially invited. Admission is free.








40 Days, 40 Quarters
