Pastor's reflections

July and August already! It seems like time is moving so much faster these days. Wasn't the end of the school year just a month ago, at least for those in Cabell County? Time is moving faster because I am older now and moving much slower. Who knows?

One of the things I am excited about in July is going to New Orleans and participating in the ELCA Youth Gathering. There will be many youths, adult chaperons, pastors, and outside guests at the Gathering. All total the staff for the Gathering say there are almost 14,000 people. That is a lot of Christ's followers who practice their faith in a Lutheran way!

The theme for the Gathering is: "Created to be." Each day we will look at a subtheme from Created to Be: **Brave – Authentic** – **Free – Disruptive – Disciples.** Which one of those subthemes is the most interesting to you? I like all of them but the one that intrigues me the most is: **disruptive.** What does it mean that as disciples of Jesus we are disruptive? I think it has much to do with justice. As disciples of Jesus, we are disruptive of the structures and separation that has caught a hold of our society. It seems to me it reminds us that we are called to be inclusive. We are called to be people who share and show the love of Christ everyday in our lives.

We have been collecting a "noisy offering" for the celebration of the 50th anniversary of the ELCA World Hunger. In my mind the most important ministry we share together in the ELCA. I wonder if the disruptive theme in New Orleans will remind us of the people in our world, in our country who go to bed hungry. We have collected about \$350 so far. Thank you to all who threw your change in the metal buckets to help others who are hungry. My goal for this "noisy offering" is \$1,000. I think we can make it.

August brings us VBS and Jill May and our Christian Education committee are using the material from the ELCA World Hunger. Looking forward to this. We will also be starting up Adult Forum and Thursday Bible study in August.

So much ministry and activity. Thank you for sharing your gifts both money and time to see St Paul shares and lives and shows the gospel in our neighborhoods.



Prayer Shawl Ministry


