Since this past December I have been writing a blog post each week that our Office Manager posts on our web page. I must admit that it is sometimes hard to produce a subject with which to write. I try to think of a subject, but it seems like I am running out of subjects to write about.

I wonder though. Have any of you been sharing blog posts with others? This is an especially important part of why I chose to write the blog posts in the first place. I want the posts to be another way that the Gospel is shared and showed to people in the world. When we share the posts it one more way the God can reach the hearts of those who have not heard about Jesus. It is one more way that people who have been hurt can be healed. It is a way people can have hope.

The last Sunday in May is Pentecost Sunday and what many call the birthday of the church. It is also the giving of the Holy Spirit. All the texts focus on the Holy Spirit. NADIA BOLZ-WEBER COMING TO CHARLESTON, WV





She served as the founding pastor of House for All Sinners and Saints, a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America in Denver, Colorado, until July 8, 2018. As of this date, she is also a three-time New York Times bestselling memoirist. Bolz-Weber is known for her unusual approach to reaching others through her church. She has produced work in the church that scholar and writer <u>Diana Butler Bass</u> considers part of "a new Reformation"
