

To be sure, this is always a challenge in any group that wants to grow and expand. This month we are ending the liturgical season to prepare ourselves for a new season in December. Might be a good time to invite and welcome others into this "St Paul family".

You can purchase items for the backpacks! See the list of suggested items below. Please bring your items to the church and leave them in the container in the narthex.




