### Dear St. Paul Congregation,

We started choir rehearsals mid-August and I hope you enjoyed the first choral anthem after the summer. This coming Sunday, we will sing another anthem for you, to Dietrich Bonhoeffer's text "By Gracious Powers." You may know Bonhoeffer as one of the most influential Lutheran theologians of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, and as one who was actively involved in the resistance against the Nazi regime. Even though Bonhoeffer wrote this text during his imprisonment in 1944, it is wonderfully comforting and hopeful.

If you are interested in singing in our choir or otherwise engaging musically in our Worship, please talk to me on Sunday mornings or simply come to a choir rehearsal on Wednesday nights at 7 pm, downstairs in the choir room.

Sunday in two weeks, on September 10, we will have our annual Worship and picnic at Ritter Park, and the praise band Render the Hearts will provide music for us. Let's give them a warm welcome like in previous years!

A brief report from my time in Germany and Italy this summer: In early July, I performed a solo recital in my hometown. The venue was packed with a little over 100 people in the audience, and I enjoyed seeing many familiar faces – friends, former teachers, parents of friends etc. Even my kindergarten teacher was there, and I recognized her at once (after more than 40 years...)! The local newspaper published a nice article about the concert, and the ads said, "Henning Vauth, USA." I always find this change of perspective educational. For people in my hometown in Germany, Huntington, West Virginia means the big, wide world.

A week after the concert in Germany, I traveled to Sicily again for an -day international piano festival and competition, where I taught 18 students, performed in a mixed faculty recital, and adjudicated a competition. Traveling back to Germany proved to be an adventure, as the airport in Sicily had a fire and was closed for several days. With an economy-size rental car (stick shift), and three students from the US, Canada, and Vietnam plus luggage we drove 9 hours from Sicily to Rome, the next airport that had available flights the following day. I did not know the students before the festival and they did not know each other, but we had a wonderful time, ate pizza in Naples (which was on the way), and walked around the Vatican in the middle of the night, since we had a couple hours left before the first student needed to be at the Rome airport at 4:30 am.

I'd like to express my sincere gratitude to Keith Wellman and Dylan Morgan for filling in for me and making it possible to visit my family in Germany.

Last but not least: A big thank you to David Mansouri and Katherine Becker Mansouri for playing violin during the last Sunday of July at St. Paul. It is always a pleasure to make music with Carolyn Becker's musical family!


