National Judges Course in Trampoline Gymnastics of XIV Cycle (2017-2020) was organized by Gujrat Gymnastics Association under the aegis of Gymnastics Federation of India (GFI) at Pandit Din Dayal Upadhyay Indoor Stadium Athwalines Surat from 25-26th March 2018. The course was attended by 15 men judges' from all over the country and was conducted by FIG International Judge of XIV Cycle Mr. Pawan Bhoir Cat-IV as per the 2017-2020 Code of Points in Trampoline Gymnastics as adopted at 14th Cycle FIG Intercontinental/International Judges Course.



TRAMP: 8TH SR & JR NATIONAL TRAMPOLINE GYM CHAMPIONSHIP SURAT 2017-18

8TH Sr. & Jr. National Trampoline Gymnastics Championship was organized by Gujrat Gymnastics Association (GGA) under the aegis of Gymnastics Federation of India (GFI) at Pandit Din Dayal Upadhyay Indoor Stadium Athwalines Surat on 27th March 2018. 50 gymnasts from SSCB, Maharashtra, Gujrat, Rajasthan and Tamilnadu participated in the above championship. The gymnastics performance on Trampoline was evaluated by the newly passed out National Judges in the championship under the guidance of FIG International Judge Mr. Pawan Bhoir of XIV Cycle (2017-2020). Subhodeep Nandi of Maharashtra won gold medal in Junior Boys Group seen with Coach Mr. Prasenjit Debnath in the picture.

RG / ART: XXI COMMONWEALTH GAMES GOLD COAST AUSTRALIA 2018

Indian Gymnastics Team consists of 7-member i. e. Ashish Kumar, Yogeshwar Singh, Rakesh Patra in Men's Artistic Gymnastics, B. Aruna Reddy, Pranati Nayak, Pranati Das in Women's Artistic Gymnastics and Meghana Gundlapally in Rhythmic Gymnastics along with women coach Ms. Minara Begum and Dr. Makrand Joshi as Head of the delegation left on 30th March 2018 to participate in XXI Commonwealth Games Gold Coast Australia. No coach accompanied for Indian Men's Artistic Gymnastics and Rhythmic Gymnastics teams to Gold Coast. FIG International Judges Mr. Deepak Kabra in WAG, Mr. Pravin Dhage in MAG and Ms. Akshata Shete in RG evaluated the high level gymnastics performance at Gold Coast in their respective fields. Total 51 men gymnasts and 47 women gymnasts from 16 countries and 26 RG Gymnasts from 13 countries participated in gymnastics in the XXI Commonwealth Games at Gold Coast Australia 2018. Artistic Gymnastics Competitions were held from 5-9th April while Rhythmic Gymnastics from 10-12th April 2018 at Coomera Indoor Sports Centre Gold Coast. High hopes were from Ashish Kumar on Floor & Table Vault, Rakesh Patra on Rings who finished fourth in FIG World Cup in Melbourne in February 2018, B. Aruna Reddy on Table Vault who recently fetched bronze medal on Table Vault in FIG World Cup in Melbourne 2018 and Meghana Gundlapally in Rhythmic Gymnastics who ranked one in the selection trials held IG Stadium New Delhi from 12-14th February 2018 with 52.75 points.

Indian Men's Artistic Gymnastics team could not put up an impressive performance on the very first day and ranked at 9th place with 174.300 points out of 9 teams but Yogeshwar Singh qualified at 18th place with 75.300 points for C-II and finished at 14th place with improved score of 75.600 points on 7th April 2018 while 2010 CWG medalist Ashish Kumar was a big disappointment who finished at 25th place with 71.700 points which was far below than his selection trials score of 77.75 points and could not make it to the C-II and C-III. Rakesh Patra qualified for C-III on

Rings at 5th place with 13.950 points on 5th April 2018 and finished at 8th place with 12.933 points with a dismount fall on 8th April 2018. Indian Women Artistic team started well with Balance Beam on 6th April 2018 but penalized 1.00 points in the team final due to not identical leotard during team competition and again all the three women gymnasts i. e. B. Aruna Reddy, Pranati Nayak and Pranati Das were penalized 0.30 points each due to missing National Emblem on their leotard during performance on Beam which was a biggest negligence on the part of internationally experienced gymnasts and coach. Indian Women team was ranked at 7th place with 128.975 points out of 8 teams but Pranati Nayak qualified for C-III on Table Vault at 8th place with 13.300 points on 6th April 2018 while Pranati Das qualified for C-II (AA) at 18th place with 43.800 points and finished at 16th





place with a marginal improvement in her score to 43.900 points. B. Aruna Reddy who was initially at R-I for C-II (AA) with 43.500 points who also later qualified at 18th place due to pull out by a women gymnast and finished at 14th place with an improved score of 44.400 points on 7th April 2018. It is the first time that 3 Indian Girls in Women Artistic Gymnastics (WAG) qualified for finals i. e. 2 in C-II and 1 in C-III at CWG Gold Coast 2018. Earlier Pooja Surve in Rhythmic Gymnastics qualified for finals in C-II at CWG New Delhi in 2010. India had medal hopes Rhythmic from Gymnast Meghana Gundlapally who started her campaign on 10th April 2018 but failed to give an impressive performance in the C-I and scored only 34.600 points and missed the finals by only 0.06 remained at R-II if any two gymnasts pulled out than she can make her place to participate in the C-II. Meghana Gundlapally also participated in International Tournament and World Cups at Sofia before coming to Gold coast where she could score only 40.75 and 33.800 points respectively. However, Gymnastics suffered due to administrative mess with various factions vying for control and the



effect was also seen in results / performance. It is worth to mention specially for Dr. Makrand Joshi who accompanied Indian Gymnastics Contingent as Manager but worked as Coach for the moral support to Indian Men's Artistic Gymnastics Team as well as to RG Gymnast Meghana Gundlapally who was all alone in the absence of official coaches with the contingent in MAG & RG. President of India His Highness Ram Nath Kovind and Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi spared their precious time to meet all the medal winners of XXI CWG Gold Coast 2018 and had a photograph with them to appreciate their achievements for the glory of the country.

The meeting was attended by Dr. Makrand Joshi Secretary General MAGA, Advocate Shankarsan Joshi, Mr. Sanjay Hirode, Mr. R. N. Mangla, Mr. Pravin Patil, Mr. Sagar Kulkarni, Mr. Rajesh Latpate and Mr. Rohan Shriramwar but Shri Sanjay Shete President Maharashtra Amateur Gymnastics Association (MAGA) could not attend the meeting due to preappointments. The committee discussed on many subjects as per agenda including confirmation of the last executive committee meeting's minutes which was held at Mumbai on 21.11.2017.

Indian Junior Boys and Girls Gymnastics teams consist of Agnivesh Pandey, Vaibhav Chaurasia, Md. Anas, Bhaskar Das, Ankur Sharma in MAG, Purva Kirve, Soham Naik, Garima Sharma, Protishtha Samanta, Siddhi Hattekar in WAG along with their coaches Mr. Mahendra Babhulkar, Mr. JP Chakraborty, Ms. Tanuja Gadwe (WAG), Mr. Rohit Jaiswal, Mr. Ankit Tripathi, Mr. Himanshu Dave (MAG) and Mr. Anil Mishra (Manager) participated in the 15th Junior Asian Artistic Gymnastics Championship held at Jakarta, Indonesia from 25-28th April 2018. FIG International MAG Judges Mr. R. L. Verma and Mr. Satpal Chhabra also accompanied the Indian contingent. All the gymnasts went through a selection trials held on 27th March 2018 at Pandit Din Dayal Indoor Stadium Surat conducted by Gujrat Gymnastics Association under the aegis of Gymnastics

Federation of India. GFI also conducted coaching camps from 11-20th April 2018 for boys at Khel Gaon Allahabad (UP) and 15-20th April 2018 for girls at newly built Akar Gymnastics Forum Kalyan (Maharashtra) equipped with Taishan Gymnastics Equipment under their expert coaches before leaving for the championship on 22nd April 2018. The 15th Junior Artistic Gymnastics Asian Championships officially opened on 25th April 2018 at Istora Senayan in Jakarta Indonesia until Saturday which was attended by Youth and Sports Minister Imam Nahrawi, Indonesian Asian Games Organizing Committee (INASGOC) chief Erick Thohir and Indonesian Gymnastics Association (Persani) deputy chairwoman Ita Yuliati. 120 gymnasts including 69 MAG and 51 WAG from 18 countries i. e. China, Japan, Korea, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, India, Iran, Sri Lanka, Vietnam, Thailand, Mongolia, Qatar, Bangladesh Iraq and Chinese Taipei participated in the continental competition in the minimum age groups of 14-17 and 13-15 for the MAG and WAG respectively. This year's championships will be a qualification event for the 2018 Youth Olympic Games to be held in Buenos Aires Argentina from 6-18th October 2018 where 3834 sports persons from 206 countries will take part in 241 events in 32 sports including gymnastics. The quota of 8 gymnasts each in MAG and WAG based on All-around scores of eligible gymnasts subject to maximum of 1 gymnast per country. Indian MAG team placed 8th with 206.200 points far behind gold medalist China (239.450) while Indian WAG team placed 9th with 120.100 points against the China's gold with 162.950 points. Protishtha Samanta the only gymnast in WAG qualified for C-III in Table Vault (TV) with 12.600+12.950=12.775 points at 8th place and finishes at 7th place with 12.638 points i. e. (12.600+12.675) while Ankur Sharma (12.250) and Agnivesh Pandey (12.175) in MAG qualified for C-III in Pommel Horse (PH) at R-2 and R-3.

RG: 10TH SENIOR ASIAN RG CHAMPIONSHIP KUALA LUMPUR MALAYSIA 2018

Indian Senior Rhythmic Gymnastics teams consist of Meghana Gundlapally, Aditee Dandekar, Disha Nidre, Kimaya Kadam in RGI and Aditee Dandekar, Disha Nidre, Janhavi Vartak, Divya Dave, Nirja Chavan and Radhika Dharap in RGG participated in the 10th Senior Rhythmic Gymnastics Asian Championships participated at the Axiata Arena, National Sports Complex, Bukit Jalil in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, from 29th April to 3rd May 2018. Mrs. Varsha Upadhye, Ms.

Varvara Filiou and Ms. Sadichchha Kulkarni accompanied the team as coaches for junior and senior teams. The gymnasts featured from 18 countries China, Japan, Thailand, Korea, Lebanon, Malaysia, Korea, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Hong Kong, Vietnam, Chinese Taipei, Singapore, Mongolia, Turkmenistan, India, Indonesia and Kyrgyzstan. The group qualifications (5 hoops, 3 balls + 2 ropes) were held from April 29 to 30 and the finals on May 1 and 2 respectively while the individual all-around finals were on

May 1. Meghana Gundlapally who participated in various International competitions improved her score to 40.700 points in Asian Championship and placed 26/49 in C-I in comparison to CWG 2018 and ranked 19th with best 3 scores of 31.500 points and qualified as R-3 for C-II. Indian Senior RG team was placed 10th with 93.00 points out of 10 teams while gold medal was won by Uzbekistan with 151.600 points. Senior Group (RGG) team of India stood 10th out of 10 teams getting 9.400 points in 5 hoops and 6.900 points in 3 balls & 2 ropes.

RG: 16TH JUNIOR ASIAN RG CHAMPIONSHIP KUALA LUMPUR MALAYSIA 2018

16th Junior Rhythmic Gymnastics Asian Championship was also held simultaneously at the Axiata Arena, National Sports Complex, Bukit Jalil in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, from 29th April to 3rd May 2018. Indian Junior RG team consist of Priyanka Acharya, Shriya Kulkarni, Asmi Badade, and Bhumika Dhone in RGI and Janhavi Kapur, Nishika Kale, Vedashree Shetye, Manjiri Rane and Angelica Fernandes in RGG participated in 16th Junior Rhythmic Gymnastics Asian Championships. FIG Judges Ms. Akshata Shete, Ms. Kshipra Joshi and Ms. Pooja Surve also accompanied the team for the above championship. The gymnasts born in 2002 or before are eligible to participate in the Junior Asian RG Championship. The competition held in individuals including hoop, ball, clubs, ribbon and groups. A total 17 countries including heavyweights China,



Japan, Thailand, Korea, Lebanon, Malaysia, Korea, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Hong Kong, Vietnam, Chinese Taipei, Singapore, Mongolia, Turkmenistan, India, and Kyrgyzstan participated in the 16th Junior Asian RG Championship. Priyanka Acharya ranked 29th out of 51 gymnasts with a total of 36.700 points whereas 3rd reserved gymnast Enkhadalai from Mongolia received best 3 apparatus scores 30.550 points in the qualifiers of All around championship while Priyanka Acharya missed 3rd reserved place with a marginal difference of 1.550 points scoring best 3 apparatus scores 29.000 points but topped in Indian team. 16th Junior Asian RG Championship was also a qualification event for the 2018 Youth Olympic Games to be held in Buenos Aires Argentina from 6-18th October 2018 where Priyanka Acharya and Shriya Kulkarni were the probable's and ranked 20th and 23rd out of 27 gymnasts. Priyanka Acharya brought Indian Federation at 11th rank for YOG 2018 out of 51 gymnasts but only 7 federations i. e. Uzbekistan, Japan, Malaysia, Kazakhstan, China, North Korea & South Korea got qualified. Though Priyanka Acharya could not make it for YOG 2018 but it is a big achievement for her and encouraging too. Indian Junior RGI team ranked 11th with 88.250 point out of 13 teams while Kazakhstan won gold medal with



133.750 points. Indian Junior Group (RGG) i. e. Janhavi Kapur, Nishika Kale, Vedashree Shetye, Manjiri Rane and Angelica Fernandes participated for the first time in 16th Junior Asian RG Championship and qualified for the Apparatus Finals Group and stood 6th out of 6 teams getting 6.000 points in 5 Ropes and 6.350 points in 10 clubs.

TRAMP: 4TH SR & JR ASIAN TRAMPOLINE GYMNASTICS CHAMPIONSHIP, MANILA

Indian Trampoline Contingent consist of Vinayak Breed (Jr. Men), Siddhi Breed, Shivani Dound (Both Sr. Women), Abhijit Nimbalkar, Sehul Panchal (Both Sr. Men) and Mr. Ranjit Pawar (Coach) participated in the 4th Senior & Junior Asian Trampoline Gymnastics Championships which was organized jointly by Gymnastics Association of Philippines (GAP), Philippines Sports Commission, Tourism Promotion Board and Makati City at University of Makati in Manilla, Philippines from 19-20 May 2018 under the aegis of Asian Gymnastics Union (AGU). FIG International Judge in Trampoline Mr. Pawan Bhoir also accompanied the Indian Team. This championship was also a qualification event for 2018 Youth Olympic Games (YOG). The junior male and junior female gymnasts should be 13-17 years old and born in between 1st January 2001 to 31st December 2005 but to qualify for YOG male & female gymnasts must be 16-17 years old and born in between 1st January 2001 to 31st December 2002. Trampoline competition was conducted in Men's and Women's Individuals and two routines are performed by the gymnasts of 10 elements each in qualifying as well as



in finals. Only 53 junior and senior gymnasts (men & women) from 10 Asian countries i. e. China, Hong Kong, India, Iran, Japan, Kazakhstan, South Korea, Uzbekistan, Vietnam, and Philippines took part in the championship and competed for the top honors in two days tournament. Philippines hosted this fast growing sports world wide first time in their country. 2 senior women from India and 1 from Philippines participated in the Individual Women Event and that was the final in which Shivani Dound and Siddhi Breed from India won gold & silver medals while bronze medal won by Abaniel Erin of Philippines. Abhijit Nimbalkar and Sehul Panchal of India participated in qualifying round (C-I) in senior individual men event and Abhijit Nimbalkar qualify for the finals with 77.380 points at 6th place out of 14 gymnasts and finished at 5th place with 44.850 points while Sehul Panchal



was at 9th place with 66.990 points. Vinayak Breed in juniors scored 62.830 points and placed 19th and could not make it to the finals out of 21 gymnasts 10 countries. No junior women gymnast from India participated. Medal winners at the above championship were felicitated on their return at Bhoir Gymkhana Dombivali with great pump and show and gymnasts thanked all the officials of MAGA and Gymnastics Federation of India for their whole hearted support.

AERO: 15TH WORLD AEROBIC GYMNASTICS CHAMPIONSHIP, PORTUGAL 2018

Indian Aerobic Gymnastics Contingent consist of Gaurav Jogdand (IM), Rugved Joshi and Sharwari Limaye (Mix Pair), along with their coach Dr. Makrand Joshi were selected to participate in 15th World Aerobic Gymnastics Championships at Guimaraes, Portugal from 1st to 3rd June 2018 through a selection trial held at Aurangabad on 15th April 2018 in which best gymnasts from SSCB, Maharashtra and Gujrat also took part. Indian Aerobic Gymnastics team could not be cleared due to some unavoidable reasons and was not able to take part in the championship. More than 280 gymnasts from 35 countries participated excluding India in the 15th World Aerobic Gymnastics Championships at Guimaraes, Portugal to battle out for gold in the seven categories of Aerobic Gymnastics i. e. Individual Men, Individual Women, Mixed Pairs, Trios, Group, Aerobic Step and Aerobic Dance as well as a Team Competition. Group has five athletes while Step and Dance both have eighth athletes each. Eight World titles were at stake, including the one for Teams that will be defended by China. The 8th World Age Group Aerobic Gymnastics Championship attracted more than 350 young gymnasts from 29 countries at the same venue from 25-27th May 2018. India could not send the team in the 8th World Age Group Aerobic Gymnastics Championship. The World Championships of the Aerobic Gymnastics that celebrated its 20th anniversary in 2015 will be hosted by Portugal for the first time which will be the third FIG World Championship in Portugal. Earlier, 18th Trampoline World Championship was held in Porto in 1994, and 20th Acrobatic Gymnastics World Championship took place in Coimbra in 2006. The event was first inaugurated in Paris in 1995. With the organisation of both the junior and senior events, the experienced World Cup (March 2018) organisers of the Gymnastics Federation of Portugal (FGP) aim to increase the popularity of Aerobic Gymnastics in Portugal and to develop Gymnastics in Guimaraes which is the birthplace of Portugal's first king. The city of Guimaraes, which is also called the Cidade Berço ("cradle *city"*), is often referred as the birthplace of the Portuguese nation.

ART: AGU'S COMMON TRAINING CAMP IN MAG AT BANGKOK, THAILAND

Gymnastics Association of Thailand under Asian Gymnastics Union (AGU) Development Project organized a Common Training Camp for Men's Artistic Gymnastics (MAG) from 11-15th June 2018 in Bangkok, Thailand. 22 coaches from 11 countries i. e. Bangladesh, Iran, India, Korea, Cambodia, Nepal, Philippines, Qatar, Thailand, Uzbekistan and Vietnam and 7 gymnasts from 7 countries i. e. Cambodia, Iran, Korea, Nepal, Philippines, Thailand, and Vietnam participated in AGU's Common Training camp which was taken by FIG Expert Mr. Yoon Soo Han from South Korea. Mr. Rohit Jaiswal, Mr. Kushan Agrawal, Mr. Sumit Kharpas and Mr. Tejas Patel participated from India in the above course. The



main objectives of the course are to exchange experiences in

coaching learning in Men's Artistic Gymnastics, to enhance cooperation, communication and good relationship between coaches and gymnasts from different countries of Asian Continent.
