
ART: FIG WOLRD CHALEENGE CUP AT MERSIN TURKEY 2018

Padmashree Dr. Dipa Karmakar with her coach Mr. B. S. Nandi Dronacharya Awardee and Rakesh Kumar Patra with his Coach Mr. Ashwani Samantray participated in FIG World Challenge Cup at Mersin Turkey from 6-8th July 2018. Dr. Dipa Karmakar, the only Indian gymnast to make a World and Olympic final, made a successful comeback after nearly two years due to an injury by winning the gold medal on Women's Table Vault. India's premier gymnast Karmakar (24), suffered a torn anterior cruciate ligament after the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, where she placed a historic fourth on Vault. In FIG World Challenge Cup Mersin (Turkey), she opted not to attempt the risky handspring double-front she competed in Rio, instead performing a McIntosh (handspring layout front full) and double-twisting Tsukahara with an improved average of 14.150 points and clinched gold medal. This is Dipa's First Ever Gold Medal in FIG World Challenge Cup. Another amazing performance given by India's Most Experience Gymnast Rakesh Kumar Patra, who finished at











4th place on Rings consecutively two times in two FIG World Cups at Melbourne in February 2018 with 13.733 points and at Mersin (Turkey) in July 2018 with 13.650 points while he was 6th on Parallel Bars with 14.000 points. Both Dipa and Rakesh have been included in the 10-member gymnastics team for the upcoming XVIII Asian Games at Jakarta-Palembang Indonesia 2018. Mr. Deepak Kabra (Judge, WAG) and Mr. Pawan Bhoir (Judge, MAG) also accompanied the World Cup bound Indian team to Mersin (Turkey). Total 54 men & women gymnasts from Azerbaijan, Bulgaria, Canada, Chile, Croatia, England,



Finland, Ireland, India, Iran, Jordan, Netherland, Romania, Turkey, and Uzbekistan in MAG while Azerbaijan (3), Chile (1), Croatia (4), India (1), Indonesia (1), Turkey (3), and Uzbekistan (1) in WAG participated in the 2018 Mersin World Cup. Dipa has brightened the name of state of Tripura by





winning the gold medal at Mersin World Challenge Cup and Government is likely to name her as <u>Tripura's Brand Ambassador</u> which will encourage the youth of the state.



Sports Authority of India (KITD-Division) proposed to conduct the selection trials in gymnastics at IG Stadium New Delhi on 26th July, SAI Hyderabad on 30th July, Shiv Chhatrapati Sports Complex Pune on 31st July and at Sports Authority of India Kolkata on 8th August 2018 to short list the remaining gymnasts for SAI Khelo India Academy which is going to be established at IG stadium New Delhi. Accordingly, Mr. R. N. Mangla



Coordinator Khelo India Selection Trials (KIST) conducted the selection trials in Gymnastics for boys & girls U/14 & U/17 at Shiv Chhatrapati Sports Complex, Pune on 31st July 2018 in presence of Mrs. Susmita R. Jyotsi Director SAI Regional Centre Mumbai, Mrs. Sandhya Kaul Member Talent Screening Committee (TSC) and Dr. Makrand Joshi Secretary Maharashtra Amateur Gymnastics Association. 105 gymnasts i. e. Boys U/14 – 26, Boys U/17 – 37, Girls U/14 – 26 and Girls U/17 – 16 were registered. The competition for boys U/14 and girls U/14 was stared at 10.00 am and completed by 3.30 pm followed by competition for boys U/17 and girls U/17 at 4.00 pm after the lunch break which was completed by 9.30 pm with 2 panels of gymnastics judges in Men's Artistic Gymnastics and Women's Artistic Gymnastics each against the approved of 6 judges in MAG & WAG each. It was very difficult to complete the competition of all the 4 age groups with the approved judges of 6 each. So 22 judges including 5 FIG International Judges Mr. Pravin Dhage, Mr. R. L. Verma, Mr. Pawan Bhoir, Mr. Sanjay More and Mrs. Sanjivini Purnapatre were invited for evaluation of the performances of 105 registered gymnasts who participated in Khelo India Selection Trials held at Shiv Chhatrapati Sports Complex, Pune on 31st July 2018. FIG Code of Points for juniors was applied in the above trials as followed in the 1st Khelo India National Gymnastics Championship held at Delhi from 31st January to 8th February 2018 to maintain the similar pattern of evaluation in the trials.

AERO: INTERNATIONAL AEROBIC GYMNASTICS CHAMPIONSHIP ARIZONA USA

India's Anikete Chakraborty in Men's Individual, Esha, Yurika and Divyashree in Women's Trio participated in 2018 International Aerobic Championship in Arizona, USA from 1-2nd August 2018. Anikete Chakraborty won bronze medals with 18.450 points in the above mentioned Championship on 2nd August 2018 in Men's Individual category in the age group 2 while Esha, Yurika and Divyashree won the bronze medal in Women's Trio category. The event was conducted by the Association of National Aerobic Championships (ANAC), which is the sanctioning body of International Aerobic Championship and International Youth Aerobic Championship. In addition to above Mixed Pairs, Group and Aero Dance were also conducted.






AERO: DR. MAKRAND JOSHI CONFERRED BEST COACH AWARD 2017-18

Physical Education Foundation of India hosted the 3rd PEFI Awards ceremonies at Pragati Maidan New Delhi during Sports India 2018 on 10th August 2018 in which Shri Manoj Tewari President Delhi BJP was the Chief Guest, President of BJP Kisan Morcha and MP Virender Singh Bist was the Special Guest while Founder President of PEFI and Former Union Minister Dr. Sanjay Paswan presided over the function. Awards were given in four categories in the name of Dr. P. M. Joseph, Dr. G. P. Gautam, Dr. Ajmer Singh and Komal and VK Pahuja. Dr. Makrand Shrikrishan Joshi of Maharashtra received the Prestigious *Dr. Ajmer Singh Lifetime Achievement Award for Best Coach from BJP MP Manoj Tewari in presence of Dr. A. K. Uppal Ex Vice-Chancellor LNIPE, Treasurer Mr. Anandeshwar Pande eminent personalities in the field of Physical Education during 3rd PEFI 2018 for his





Excellence contributions to the Nation in the field of Physical Education, Artistic and Aerobic Gymnastics as a Coach, International Judge and Administrator. **Dr. Makrand Joshi** two time Shiv Chhatrapati Awardee and International Judge was the manager and turned into a super coach of the Indian Gymnastics team in XXI Commonwealth Games in Gold Coast Australia in 2018. He was also the coach of Indian Aerobic Team at the World Aerobic Gymnastics Championship in 2006 and 2014 and at Asian Aerobic Gymnastics Championship in 2009. Dr. Makrand Joshi GFI Executive Member visited IG Stadium at New Delhi on 10th August 2018 to meet Indian Gymnastics teams (men & women) for upcoming 18th Asian Games at



Jakarta-Palembang and congratulated them with warm & good wishes for the competition. *Dr. Ajmer Singh was an Indian sprinter who competed in the 1964 Summer Olympics, was a gold medalist in 400m and silver medalist in 200m at the 1966 Asian Games, in Bangkok, and later served as Director of Sports, Punjab University, Chandigarh. He graduated from Government College, Malerkotla, and later did his Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P.E.] from Laxmibai National College of Physical Education, Gwalior. This was followed by M.A. from Punjab University, Chandigarh, and finally, he also did his Ph.D. from Punjab University Chandigarh. Dr. Ajmer Singh was the only First Indian personality with a PhD degree in Physical Education to have been honoured by Government of India with the Arjun Award in 1966. He was a self-made man who came from very humble beginnings and remained a humble person all his life, an able administrator, a great coach and teacher, a passionate mentor, a strict disciplinarian, a warm human being whose heart and the home was always open to others, and a very fine family man. He also remained Vice-Chancellor of Laxmibai National Institute of Physical Education (LNIPE), Gwalior and Maulana Abul Kalam Chair and Director Sports, at the Punjab University, Chandigarh. He last breathed in Chandigarh in the morning of 26 January 2010, at the age of 70, and is survived by his wife, two sons and grandchildren.

AG: 18TH ASIAN GAMES AT JAKARTA-PALEMBANG INDONESIA 2018

Indian Men & Women Gymnastics Contingent consists of Rakesh Kumar Patra, Yogeshwar Singh, Gaurav Kumar, Ashish Kumar, and Siddharth Verma in MAG and Dipa Karmakar, Pranati Das, B. Aruna Reddy, Mandira Hazra Chaudhary and Pranati Nayak in WAG along with their coaches Mr. Ashwani Samantray (MAG) and Mr. B. S. Nandi Dronacharya Awardee (WAG) participated in the 18th Asian Games held at Jakarta-Palembang Indonesia from 18th August to 2nd September 2018. Mr. Deepak Kabra and Mr. Pravin Dhage FIG International Judges from India were also present among MAG Judges in the 18th Asian Games Jakarta-Palembang. Approximately, 12000 sportspersons from 45 countries participated in 2018 Asian Games Indonesia in 40 Sports Disciplines. 139 men and women gymnasts from 24 countries i. e. 78 men gymnasts from 23 countries with 14 full teams and 61 women gymnasts from 16 countries with 12 full teams took part in gymnastics at 18th Asian Games at Indonesia. There will be a C-I which will decide the medal for Individual Championship as well qualification for C-III and C-IV Team Championship where best 8 teams in MAG & WAG will proceed to Team Finals and 3 gymnasts from each team will compete on an apparatus and all 3 scores will be counted for Team Championship. Indian Men's team could not qualified for the team championship due to 9th place in the qualifying round while Indian women team qualified for the Team Championship at 7th place with 144.30 points and finished at 7th place with 138.50 points in the finals (C-IV) i. e. (TV-39.100 + UB-32.400 + BB-32.400 + FX-34.150) and Dipa could not participate in the team championship due to knee injury. Dipa Karmakar's injury did not allow to give her best in Table Vault and failed to qualify but Dipa's compatriots Pranati Nayak with 13.425 and Aruna Reddy with 13.350 made a grade at 6th & 7th place in Table Vault and Aruna finished at 7th place with 12.775 points and Pranati Nayak finished at 8th place with 12.650 points. Dipa qualified in

Beam with 12.750 points at 7th place even after knee injury and finished at 5th place with 12.500 points in the finals (C-III). Mr. Karan Chautala Working President of GFI was in Jakarta during Asian Games 2018 and had a Gala Dinner with Indian Gymnastics Men & Women Teams, Coaches











and Judges. Ms. Akshata Shete and Ms. Kshipra Joshi FIG RG International Judges from India also acted as judge during Rhythmic Gymnastics Competitions held at Jakarta on 27th & 28th August 2018.

ACRO: NATIONAL GYMNASTICS JUDGE'S COURSE IN ACROBATICS 2017-2020

National Judges Course in Acrobatic Gymnastics of XIV Cycle (2017-2020) was organized by Gymnastics Association of Kerala at Mannam Memorial National Club Thiruvananthapuram Kerala under the aegis of Gymnastics Federation of India (GFI) from 29-31st August 2018 which was attended by 45 judges' from different affiliated units of the country. The course was conducted by Mr. Sumith MR FIG International Judge in Acrobatic Gymnastics Cat-IV with latest Code of Points, amendments and changes in theory and practical. This was the first conducted for Acrobatic gymnastics in the XIV Cycle 2017-2020. Mr. Jay Narain Das aged 73 years from West Bengal who is one of the founder of Acrobatic Gymnastics in India also attended the course. 13 judges from different states who qualified on merit were selected for judging panel to evaluate the

3rd BSB Bank FIG World Challenge Cup was held in Minsk Belarus from 17-19 August 2018, where Israel's Linoy Ashram and the Italian group emerged as the All-around champions. More than 200 gymnasts from 45 nations including Aditee Dandekar, Disha Nidre in RGI and Nirija Chavan, Divya Dave, Radhika Dharap, Disha Nidre and Janhavi Vartak from India participated in FIG World Challenge Cup at the Falcon Club in Minsk. Ms. Kshipra Joshi, Ms. Sadichchha Kulkarni as a coach, Mrs. Varsha Upadhye as Head of





Delegation while Ms. Akshata Shete accompanied the Indian RG Team as Judge. The competition in Minsk was the penultimate event of the World

Challenge Cup series before 2018 World Championships, taking place 10-16 September in Sofia, Bulgaria. Russia was the most successful nation in Minsk with eight medals — one in each event and Belarusians won seven medals (1 gold, 1 silver, 5 bronzes). 1988 Olympic champion Marina Lobach (BLR) was on hand to observe and present medals. Ashram, the first Israeli to win a World Championship All-around medal, continued to write history in Minsk. First at the 2018 World Challenge Cup in Guadalajara (ESP), Ashram became the first Rhythmic gymnast to win two World Challenge Cup All-around titles in the same year and is now leading the FIG World Challenge Cup rankings and also set a new high score on Clubs, 20.650, surpassing the 20.050 earned by Dina Averina (RUS) at the 2018 European Championships, the previous high mark since the Code of Points was modified two years ago.

After the fourth and last FIG World Cup series in Baku from 27-19th April 2018, the International Gymnastics Federation (FIG) started its first of four so-called World Challenge Cup of Rhythmic Gymnastics series. This year's first event took place in the Spanish city of Guadalajara from 4-6th May 2018, followed by the second in Portimao (POR) from May 11 - 13, but the third in Berlin at the end of May was cancelled. So in the middle of August followed No. 3 in Minsk (BLR) from 17-19th August 2018 and at the End of August the last World Challenge Cup of the 2018 circuit in Kazan, Russia from 24-26th August 2018. The event at the Kazan Gymnastics Centre, the fourth and final stop of the 2018 Rhythmic Gymnastics World Challenge Cup Series, more than 125 gymnasts from 36 nations including Meghana Gundlapally and Priyanka Kunchetti from India participated which served as a final warm-up for many gymnasts prior to 36th Rhythmic Gymnastics

World Championships in Sofia (BUL) scheduled from 10-16th September 2018. Alexandra Soldatova (RUS) and the Italian Group captured the Allaround titles via tie-breaks at the 2018 Rhythmic Gymnastics World Challenge Cup in Kazan (RUS), where Dina Averina and the Russian Group swept the apparatus finals. Best of all the





36th FIG Rhythmic Gymnastics World Championship was organized by Bulgarian Gymnastics Federation at Arena Armeec Sofia, the capital of Bulgaria from 10-16th September 2018. More than 350 gymnasts from 60 countries including Meghana Gundlapally, Aditee Dandekar in RGI, Nirija Chavan, Disha Nidre, Janhavi Vartak, Radhika Dharap and Divya Dave in RGG from India participated in the 36th FIG Rhythmic Gymnastics World Championship at Sofia, Bulgaria. Ms. Kshipra Joshi, Ms. Sadichchha Kulkarni as coaches, Ms. Akshata Shete as Judge and Ms. Varsha Upadhye as Head of Delegation accompanied the Indian RG Team to Sofia. 2018 FIG RG World Championship will be the First qualification for 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games. More than 150 gymnasts competed in the five individual events (All-around, Hoop, Ball, Clubs and Ribbon) as well as the team



competition at the Arena Armeec and in the Group competition, 36 countries competed in the three medal events (All-around, 5 Hoops, 3 Balls + 2 Ropes). Indian RG team finished at 36th place with 16.450 points while Russian finished at top with 46.300 points in group finals. The medal-winning nations in the Group All-around competition will qualify as federations to the 2020 Olympic Games in Tokyo and other nations will



have further chances to qualify in 2019 and 2020. This is the first competition to award Olympic berths for any of the Gymnastics disciplines for the 2020 Olympic Games, which also includes Artistic Gymnastics and Trampoline.
