AERO: FIG ACADEMY FOR AEROBIC GYMNASTICS LEVEL-2, PHILIPPINES



27th FIG Academy for Aerobic **Gymnastics** Level-2 hosted by **Philippines** Gymnastics Association at Rizal memorial Sports Centre Manila from 6-13th September 2015which attended by 15 coaches from five different countries i. e. Cambodia, Indonesia, India, Philippines and Sri Lanka. The participation in this Academy

was funded in part by Asian Gymnastics Union (AGU) using International Gymnastics Federation's Development Fund.

Mrs. Tammy Johnson of South Africa was the course expert for Aerobic Gymnastics Academy, who

was a former International competitor for Artistic and Aerobic Gymnastics, a professional dancer, and a National Coach. She was joined by Eva Szloboda, the Hungarian National Coach and former World Silver medalist and Dr. Olga Kyselovicova of Slovakia who is Vice-dean of the faculty of Physical Education and Sports, University of Bratislava. Most of the candidates performed very well in three-part technical and theoretical examination. The highest result of 92% is achieved by Jhennylo Gacula of Philippines, second by Armando Asuncion of Philippines and third best result went to Makarand



Joshi and Himanshu Kabra of India. The Academy is also a Landmark Academy for Mr. Hardy Fink (Canada). It is the 200th Academy since he has taken over as Director of FIG Education & Academy Programme in 2005. The FIG has now had 3,099 coaches representing 121 different federations from 5,570 Academy.

ART: ARJUN AND DRONACHARYA AWARDEES IN INDIAN GYMNASTICS

India has produced many legends in gymnastics since the inception of Gymnastics Federation of



India on 17th February, 1951. Many gymnasts represented India in Olympic Games in 1952, 1956 and 1964, World Championships in 1970, 1993, 1999, 2001, 2009, 2011, 2013, 2014, 2015, Asian Games in 1978, 1982, 1986, 2006, 2010, 2014, and Commonwealth Games in 1978, 2002, 2004, 2010, 2014 and in many other

International Championships such as Junior or Senior Asian Gymnastics Championships, Tulit Peter Cup and many dual meets. Union Sports Ministry only could find out few suitable gymnasts and coaches for India's Prestigious Arjun & Dronacharya Awards. The Arjun Award was instituted in 1961 while Dronacharya Award in 1985. A consolidated picture frame is prepared for your information and valuable record. First Arjun Award was bestowed to Mr. Sham Lal Khullar in 1961 followed by Mr. Mantu Debnath in 1975, Ms. Sunita Sharma in 1985, Ms. Krupali Patel in 1989, Ms. Anju Dua (Handicapped) in 1998, Dr. Kalpana Debnath (Life Time Achievement) in 2000, Mr. Ashish Kumar in 2011 and Ms. Dipa Karmakar in 2015 while first Dronacharya Award to Mr. Devendra Kumar Rathore in 2011.

Rakesh Patra a top Odisha gymnast serving in Indian Navy clinched the top position in the recently held selection trials scoring 81.90 points at IG Stadium New Delhi on 17th & 18th September 2015 for 46th World Championship which is to be held at Glasgow from 23rd October to 1st November 2015. The qualifying score is 81.50 points which is much below than his trial standard (81.90). Rakesh is having a bright opportunity to qualify for Rio Olympic Games if he performs better than his score of 81.90 points in the 46th World Gymnastics Championship at

Glasgow and may become the first gymnast from India to

compete in Olympics Games after 1964 Olympic Games at Tokyo Japan, where Indian contingent consists of Mr. Anant Ram, Mr. Trilok Singh, Mr. Yashwant More, Mr. Bhikhaji Bhonsle, Mr. Vithal Karande and Late Debashish Mondal participated last. Rakesh Patra is training under his coach Mr. Ashok Kumar Mishra. Recently, Rakesh Patra's photo appeared on the cover page of FIG Magazine

GLASGOW (GBR), FIG Office, Oct. 19, 2015: The Vault that will take your breath away

Specialists call it the "Produnova," named for Yelena Produnova (RUS), who was the first to do it in competition. The gymnast approaches the table going forward and executes two front flips before landing. This Vault, which carries an exceptionally high difficulty scores (7.0), attracts only the most adventurous gymnasts, who risk heavy penalties in execution for not landing it correctly. Three gymnasts -- Oksana Chusovitina (UZB), Yamilet Pena (DOM) and Dipa Karmakar (IND) -- are the only ones daring to perform it in 46TH World Championship at Glasgow. Dipa Karmakar (IND) has upgraded her second vault, now doing a Tsukahara double full twist as well as a serviceable Produnova.


ART/AERO/ACRO/RG: SHIV CHHATRAPATI STATE SPORTS AWARDS 2012-13 & 2013-14

Pune's Roma Joglekar in Artistic and Nishtha Shah in Rhythmic, Aurangabad's Sarvesh Bhale, Vivek Deshpande and Vandita Joshi in Aerobic, Mumbai's Arvind Shinde in Acrobatic Gymnastics were honoured with Shiv Chhatrapati Sportsperson Award 2012-13 while Pune's Rucha Divekar, Ajinkya Keshkar in Artistic and Madura Tambe in Rhythmic, Dombivali's Abhijit Shinde and

ART: 46th WORLD ARTISTIC GYMNASTICS CHAMPIONSHIP, GLASGOW 2015

Indian Men & Women Gymnastics Team consists of Rakesh Kumar Patra, Ashish Kumar, Siddhartha



Verma in MAG, Dipa Karmakar in WAG along with Dr. G. S. Bawa Coach MAG, Mr. B. S. Nandi Coach WAG, Dr. Kalpana Debnath WAG Judge, Mr. Deepak Kabra MAG Judge and Mr. Habib Farooki as Manager participated in the 46th World Artistic Gymnastics Championship at SSE Hydro Glasgow from 23rd October to 1st November 2015. Approximately 468 i. e. (192 women & 276 men) gymnasts from 87 countries participated in the 46th World Championship which was the most high profile sporting event in Glasgow since 2014

Commonwealth Games and Ryder Cup. Dipa Karmakar (group-10) participated in the qualifying competition on 24th October 2015 and ranked 103/192 with the total score of 49.966 points in Allaround Individual Championship (C-I) but did splendid performance in the Table Vault with (15.100+14700= 14.900) points and qualify for the C-III along the Top 8 Gymnasts of the world i. e. Simone Biles USA (15.633), Paseka Maria Russia (15.583), Hong Un Jong North Korea (15.533), S. Giulia Swiss (15.316), Wang Yan China (15.099), Downe Elissa UK (14.949), Dipa Karmakar India (14.900) an Moreno Medina Mexico (14.899). Dipa Karmakar is consistently improving her performance in Table Vault in every World Championship i. e. 13.150 at London in 2009, 13.433 at Tokyo in 2011, 13.866 at Antwerp, Belgium in 2013, 13.866 at Nanning China in 2014. She won Bronze Medal in Table Vault in XX CWG 2014 at Glasgow with 14.366 points and another bronze



medal in TV in 6th Sr. Asian Gymnastics Championship 2014 at Hiroshima with 14.725 points which were the history created performances by an Indian Woman Gymnast. India's premier woman gymnast and Arjun Awardee Dipa Karmakar has written her name into the record books, and made history by becoming the first ever Indian woman to qualify for the finals in Table Vault (14.900) of World Gymnastics Championships. She participated in Competition No-III for Table Vault on 31st October 2015 and placed 5th with the final score of 14.683 points i. e. (14.066 + 15.300). She scored 15.300 in Produnova a remarkable performance, which is highest ever in Table Vault scored by her since 2009.

With her impressive list of achievements since 2007, when Dipa Karmakar stood 2nd in All around Individual Championship at 48th Junior National Gymnastics Championship at Jalpaiguri (WB) than

captured gold medal in All-around Championship at Senior National Championships at Erode in 2010 and Jaipur in 2011 continuously, Karmakar has become a trailblazer in Indian sport, carrying the torch of gymnastics in India and showing the way forward to the young budding gymnasts of our country.

India's Rakesh Kumar Patra, Ashish Kumar and Siddharth Verma (Group-5) participated in qualifying competition on 26th October 2015 and ranked 90/182 with 80.864, 159/182 with 75.014 and 160/182 with 74.998 points respectively. Rakesh Kumar Patra performed fantastically in the championship with his full vigour and strength and consistently given an improved performance on Rings in every World Championship since 2010 i. e. 13.600 at Tokyo in 2011, 13.633 at Antwerp, Belgium in 2013, 14.133 at Nanning China in 2014 and 13.866 at Glasgow in 2015 but could not qualify in any of the event for C-III. Let's hope for the call for Olympic Test Event to Rakesh Kumar Patra as Reserve 1 while Dipa Karmakar as Reserve 2. 46th World Artistic Gymnastics Championship Glasgow 2015 was broadcasted in more than 67 countries worldwide.



ART: FIG ACADEMY LEVEL 2 FOR MAG & WAG COACHES IN QATAR 2015

Gymnastics Federation of Qatar hosted a Level 2 Academy for Men's and Women's Artistic



Gymnastics in the new Qatar Gymnastics
Centre in the capital city of Doha from
November 11 and 18, 2015. It was the fifth
time that Qatar has hosted an FIG Academy
and attended by 18 coaches' i. e. (8 in MAG &
10 in WAG) from ten different federations –
Egypt, France, Indonesia, India, Iran, Jordan,
Lebanon, Philippines, South Africa and Yemen
including Pravin Dhage, Himanshu Dave in MAG
and Ms. Suparna Das in WAG from India. In

addition, a coach from **Palestine** attended full time as an observer. Uniquely, this was the first time in 212 Academies that the host federation did not register any of its own citizens.

The course leader was **Chris Evans** of Great Britain who is an osteopath and Women's Artistic Gymnastics coach and has served as FIG expert at numerous Academies. He taught all of the theory lectures while practical were taken by **Rick McCharles** of Canada. Later, **Lilia Ortiz Lopez** of Mexico joined them to teach women's apparatus as well as choreography and music lectures. The highest examination result for men and for the course overall was achieved by Cyril Zamora of France. The second and third highest results both went to women's Gymnastics coaches – Maria Barakat of Jordan and Anna Francesca Cruz of the Philippines respectively which was in the range from 50-93%.

ART: FIG ACADEMY LEVEL-I FOR MAG & WAG COACHES IN WUHAN, CHINA



Just over one year ago, FIG President Bruno Grandi (ITA) and General Secretary André Gueisbuhler inaugurated the first FIG International Gymnastics College at the Wuhan Sports University (WSU), China and Gymnastics Federation of the People's Republic of China hosted a FIG Academy Level 1 for Artistic Gymnastics (Men & Women) from 9-16 December 2015 at FIG International Gymnastics College at Wuhan Sports University China. 20 MAG and 11 WAG coaches from ten FIG member federations i. e. Bangladesh, China, Hong Kong, India,



Iran, Malaysia, Pakistan, Philippines and Singapore participated in the above course including Sukhwinder Singh Saini, B. L. Bayaskar, Pawan Bhoir and Ajit Jharande from India. In addition, a coach representing Singapore but with Canadian citizenship attended as an observer. Bangladesh attended an Artistic Gymnastics Academy for the first time and became the 100th country to do so. The examination at the end of the Academy consisted of a two-part examination that includes theory and practical examination involving

the teaching of a Men's or Women's Artistic Gymnastics skills to the rest of the participants. An identical highest result for the course was achieved by three MAG coaches i. e. Sukhwinder Singh Saini of India, Soong Park Loh of Malaysia and Yan Jin Cheng of Singapore.
