6th Annual General Meeting of Maharashtra Amateur Gymnastics Association (MAGA) was held on Zoom App on 27th June 2021 at 11.00 am due to Covid-19 Pandemic which was attended by 42 delegates of 24 affiliated District units. The participant district / units were Aurangabad, Akola, Amravati, Beed, Buldana, Gondia, Hingoli, Jalna, Jalgaon, Krida Probodhini, Latur, Mumbai City, Nashik, Nagpur, Nandurbar, Nanded, Palghar, Pune, Parbhani, Pimpri-Chinchwad, Raigarh, Sports Authority of India (SAI), Thane, and Washim. Mangla were present in the meeting. First of all, Secretary MAGA welcomed the President, Vice President and other MAGA officials as well as all delegates from 24 district units. All the 42 members were introduced to the house who attended the AGM and one minute silence was observed to pay respect to the departed souls of Shri Jadish Shirke, Shri Deepak Surve, Shri Kailash Nilakh, Mother of Dr. Sagar Kulkarni and Shri Ajeet Jarande, Shri Dilip Ojha and Shri Hari Om Savita during the year. Mr. Sanjay Shete President MAGA welcomed all the members and launched MAGA's Annual Report 2020-21 which was sent to all the district units online and physical copy will also be given to them in any of the coming state championship. The Annual Report 2020-21 is also sent Maharashtra Olympic Association and Gymnastics Federation of India. Mr. Sanjay Shete gave the permission to start the discussions on the agenda provided.

- 1. The minutes of the last AGM minutes held on 11.10.2020 were read and approved by the present members.
- 2. Dr. Makarand Joshi informed that the Auditors feed which was increase in the last AGM to Rs. 20,000/- pm is reduced to Rs. 15,000/- pm due to Covid-19 Pandemic. All members agreed unanimously and passed by the house.
- 3. Mr. Pavan Bhoir Treasurer MAGA presented the Financial Audited Report for the year 2020-21 and tentative budget for 2021-22 for Rs. 21,77,500/- was also presented in detail which was passed unanimously by the members. Mr. Sanjay Shete complimented with special thanks to Mr. Pavan Bhoir for presentation of budget in a befitting manner which was only possible by him.
- 4. Dr. Makarand Joshi proposed to conduct a workshop for judges in the days to come with the help of Technical Committees of MAG & WAG to prepare a Code of Points for under 10 boys and girls for Level-I for 7 years, Level-II for 8 years & Level-III for 9 years. The Medals will be awarded on the basis of percentages like 70-80% Bronze Medal, 81-90% Silver Medal and 90% and above Gold Medal. This exercise will help to create a strong base among the young gymnasts. Tentative Workshop may be conducted on trial basis on or before 10th July 2021.
- 5. Dr. Makarand Joshi congratulated the MAGA member's i. e. Ms. Akshata Shete AGU member in RG Technical Committee, Dr. Makarand Joshi AGU member in Aerobic Technical Committee, Mr. R. N. Mangla in Scoring Committee, Ms. Varsha Upadhye in Selection Committee, Mr. Ajeet Jarande in ACTC Committee and Mr. Pavan Bhoir in Trampoline Technical Committee, who are inducted by GFI in the different

Technical Committees. Later, he proposed the Vote of Thanks and meeting ended with the permission of the chair and wished for the better future of gymnastics in the state and as whole in the country.

RG: FIRST EVER ONLINE RG GYMNASTIVAL COMPETITION AT MUMBAI









Mr. Sanjay Shete President MAGA spoke in his inaugural address that every year on 23 June, International Olympic Day is celebrated across the world. The day was initially observed to promote the idea of the Olympics and in order to celebrate the establishment of the International Olympic Committee which





was formed on 23 June, 1894 in Sorbonne, Paris. The Olympics Games were revived by Pierre de Coubertin. First Olympic Day was celebrated on 23 June 1948 by 9 National Olympic Committees (NOC) with the objective of the day to promote sports and spread the message to make sports an integral part of life. Olympic Day is based on three pillars i. e. Move, Learn and Detect. Mr. Sanjog

ART: PRANATI NAYAK QUALIFIES FOR TOKYO OLYMPICS 2020-21

Indian Gymnast Pranati Nayak (6.4.1995), who had claimed a bronze medal in Vault with 13.384 at the 8th Sr. Asian Gymnastics Championship held at Mongolia from 19-22nd June 2019, has qualified officially on 27th June 2021 to compete at the XXXII Tokyo Olympics 2021 after qualifying Asian Continental quota following cancellation of the 9th Senior Asian Gymnastics Championship which was scheduled to be held from 29th May - 1st June 2021 in Hangzhou China due to Covid-19 Pandemic. Pranati Nayak scored a total of 45.350 with 13.350 in Vault, 9.650 in Uneven Bara, 11.050 in Beam 11.300 in Floor and clinches a bronze medal in Vault final at Ulaanbaatar Mongolia which came to her rescue to find herself in the midst of the Indian Contingent for Tokyo Olympics. Pranati Nayak, also hoped to qualify for Tokyo Olympics by producing a good show at 49th World Championship at Stuttgart Germany from 4-13th October 2019 with a total of 45.832 after scoring 14.200 in Vault, 10.566 in Bars, 9.933 in Beam and 11.133 in Floor. Pranati blossomed under SAI Chief Gymnastics Coach Ms. Meenara Begum's tutelage and quickly established herself in Indian Gymnastics. Her bronze medal in Mongolia not





only brought her National Recognition but also made her a second ever Indian Woman Gymnast to represent India at Tokyo Olympic Games 2021 after Dipa Karmakar who represented India in 2016 Rio Olympic Games and stunned the World of Gymnastics by securing 4th place in Vault.

Hailing from a Village Karkai Tehsil Pingla District West Medinipur, Pranati Nayak comes from a very humble background. She started gymnastics at the age of 6 years in 2001 in her village Karkai District West Medinipur. Later she was selected in SAI Scheme and joined Sports Authority of India's Hostel at SAI Eastern Centre Kolkata in 2003 and had training under Ms. Meenara Begum SAI Chief Gymnastics Coach, who not only took Pranati Nayak under her wings but also took care of all her financial needs in Kolkata. While supporting her was tough for Nayak family due to financial background, Ms. Meenara Begum took care of everything, from her stay, to food, to pocket money and all her miscellaneous expenses during last 16 years of training from 2003-2019 at SAI Eastern Centre Kolkata till 2019. Presently, she is undergoing training with SAI Gymnastics Coach Mr. Lakhan Manohar Sharma at SAI Kolkata after the retirement of Ms. Meenara Begum.

Pranati Nayak (26) represented West Bengal in 18th & 19th Sub-Junior National Gymnastics Championship at Chandigarh in 2004, at Mumbai in 2005 and won 4 gold and 2 silver medals. She again participated in 21st Sub-Junior National Championship at Khelgaon Allahabad in 2007 and had a tough fight in Individual Championship with Rucha Divekar of Maharashtra and could win 2nd Best Gymnast Title while Rucha Divekar won the Individual Championship but Pranati Nayak won gold medals in Team Championship, Table Vault, Uneven Bars, Beam and Floor.



Pranati Nayak represented West Bengal in 49th Junior National Gymnastics Championship at Cuttack in 2009 and won gold in Table Vault & in Team while bronze medal in Individual Championship and she won gold in Team, UB, BB, silver in Individual Championship and bronze medal in Table Vault and Floor in 50th Junior National Championship at Jaipur in 2010. She also participated in 51st Junior National Championship at Bangalore in 2011 where she won silver medal in team Championship and Floor while bronze medal in Table Vault.

Pranati Nayak represented West Bengal in 52nd Senior National Gymnastics Championship at Rai (Haryana) in 2012 and became 2nd Best Gymnast with silver medal in TV, BB and gold medal in UB, FX and in Team Championship. She participated in 9th Federation Cup at Agra in 2012 and won 3 gold and 2 silver medals. She represented West Bengal

in 34th National Games at Ranchi in 2011 and represented Madhya Pradesh in 35th National Games at Trivandrum Kerala in 2015 and won 5 silver and 1 bronze medal in both the National Games. Pranati Nayak joined Indian Railways in 2016 and participated in 55th Senior National Championship at Gurugram in 2016 and won gold in U. Bars, silver in Balance Beam & Table Vault. Later, she became Allaround Individual Champion in 57th Sr. National Championship at Pune in 2019 with gold in Table Vault, Beam, silver medal in Team, Uneven Bars and bronze medal in Floor. She participated in All Inter-Railway Gymnastics Championships since 2016 till date and won many medals in different events and in team Championships.

Pranati Nayak is a National Champion and International Gymnast represented country in 4th Children of Asia at Yakutsk Russia 2008, 11th Junior Asian Championship at Chiba Japan in 2010, XX Commonwealth Games at Glasgow in 2014, XXI Commonwealth games at Gold Coast in 2018, XVII Asian Games at Incheon in 2014, XVIII Asian Games at Indonesia in 2018, 45th World



Championship at Nanning, China in 2014, 47th World Championship at Montreal Canada in 2017, 49th World Championship at Stuttgart Germany in 2019 and 7th Sr. Asian Championship at Bangkok in 2017. She participated in FIG World Cup at Melbourne Australia in 2018. Ms. Pranati Nayak represented Nation in 8th Senior Asian Gymnastics Championship at Mongolia in 2019 and won the First Ever Bronze Medal in Table Vault and she became the first women gymnast from West Bengal to win any International medal.

Pranati Nayak is conferred the most Prestigious "Kreeda Samman Award" 2015 by Honourable Chief Minister Of West Bengal Ms. Mamata Banerjee for her fabulous performance in India and abroad. She won about 39 Gold, 30 Silver, 15 Bronze medals in India and 1 Bronze medal in the 8th Senior Asian Gymnastics Championship at Mongolia in 2019. President and members of MAGA congratulate to Pranati's tough journey to XXXII Tokyo Olympic 2021.

RG: AMERICAN ASSO. OF 7 SISTER STATES OF N. EAST FELICITATED UPASANA

Ms. Upasha Talukdar (14) is the first Rhythmic Gymnast from Guwahati Assam one of the Seven Sister State of North Eastern Region. She is the pride of North East and was one of the youngest RG gymnast, who participated in 3rd Khelo India Youth Games held at Guwahati in January 2020. She proved her metal in its first debut by displaying wonderful performance and begged 1 silver in Ball, 1 bronze medal in Rope and ranked 5th in Individual Championship for her Host State Assam with her elegance and

graceful movements. An US based International organization known as Friends of Assam and Seven Sisters (FASS) has felicitated her with a citation and a cash prize of \$ 2500 for her exceptional performance in the field of Rhythmic Gymnastics as well as for her further higher training and improvement in performance so that she can participate in future International Competitions. She started Rhythmic Gymnastics at the age of 8 years without any RG Expert Coach in Assam or even in entire North East and




without any proper infrastructure. She utilized the digital media and many virtual coaches to train her and one of them was Ms. Olyesa, a 16 year old Rhythmic Gymnast from Russia who helped her to make her first routine via Skype. Upasha U/10 from Assam also participated first time in 24th Sub-junior and Junior National Rhythmic Gymnastics Championship at Mohali in 2018 and won Gold in Free Hand Exercises.

ART: 2021 GK US CLASSIC COMPETITION AT INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA



The 2021 U.S. Classic, known as the 2021 GK U.S. Classic Competition is the 37th edition of the <u>U.S. Classic</u> gymnastics tournament. The competition was held in senior section on May 21–22, 2021, at the <u>Indiana Convention Center</u> in <u>Indianapolis</u>, Indiana. The U.S. Classic is known for having a highly competitive field featuring many top gymnasts. Recent events have featured all five members of the

The four-time Olympic gold medalist edged teammate Jordan Chiles of World Champions Centre in successful defence of her 2019 GK U.S. Classic all-around title. Along the way, Biles debuted the long-anticipated Yurchenko double pike vault, becoming the World's first woman to land the high-difficulty skill in competition. While Biles' 16.100 on vault led all competitors,



My Kayla Skinner of Desert Lights Gymnastics claimed the apparatus title by showing two separate vaults averaging 14.675. Biles posted high scores on balance beam (14.850) and floor exercise (14.250). Kayla DiCello of Hill's Gymnastics, who finished third in the all-around, topped the field on uneven bars with a score of 14.600. Ava Siegfeldt of World

Class Gymnastics became the final senior gymnast to qualify to the all-around at the upcoming US Gymnastics Championships, earning a 52.700. Simone Biles performed the 5 new elements which are

named as Biles during 2017-21 such as double twisting double tuck salto dismount on Beam, Yurchenko ¹/₂ on entry, forward layout salto with two twists and yurchenko double pike on vault, double layout half out and triple twisting double tucked salto on floor.



He explained and emphasize more on Terminology and progression on Day-2. He answered all the questions with good explanation and informed that to be a good Trampoline Gymnast, one has to train himself or herself for at least 5-8 hours in a day or 48 hours per week in 3 sessions including ground training. ART: THE GREATEST UZB GYMNAST ENTERED IN THE GUINNESS RECORDS BOOK



Oksana Aleksandrovna Chusovitina (Russian: born 19 June 1975) is an Olympic gymnast who has competed for the Soviet Union, Uzbekistan, and Germany. Chusovitina's career as an elite gymnast has spanned more than a quarter century. She has been performing since 1987 and won the USSR Junior Nationals in

1988 at the age of 13 and began competing at the international level in 1989, before many of her current rivals were even born. She is the only female gymnast ever to compete in seven Olympic Games, and is one of only two female gymnasts to compete at the Olympics under three



different national teams: the Unified Team in 1992; Uzbekistan in 1996, 2000, 2004, and 2016; and



Germany in 2008 and 2012. Chusovitina has also competed in 16 World Championships, four Asian Games and three Goodwill Games. Chusovitina holds the record for the most individual World Championships medals on a single event (nine, on the vault) and having world ranking-1 in vault. She set a record as the oldest gymnast to ever compete at the Olympic Games at the age of 41 and 2 months and the only gymnast ever to compete in seven consecutive Olympiads, surpassing the record of six that she set in 2012 with <u>Yordan Yovchev</u> of Bulgaria. Oksana Chusovitina competed at the <u>2019 World Artistic Gymnastics Championships</u> at Stuttgart Germany and qualified for her eighth Olympic Games to be held at Tokyo from 23rd July - 8th August 2021 and will compete in Tokyo Olympics at the age of 46 years. Oksana Chusovitina from Uzbekistan won gold medal at the FIG World Gymnastics Cup 2021 and entered her name into the Guinness book of records. Salute to the Greatest Uzbekistan Gymnast Oksana Chusovitina and her medal records in major tournaments.


OLYMPICS: INDIA'S OFFICIAL KIT FOR TOKYO OLYMPICS UNVEILED



Prime Minister Narendra Modi held a review meeting on Thursday (3rd June 2021) over the preparation of athletes for the upcoming Tokyo Olympics which will be held in just a few weeks in Japan's capital. Union Youth Affairs and Sports Minister Kiren Rijiju said the PM has appealed to the people that the entire nation has to cheer for our athletes. The

Olympic kits were unveiled by the Union Sports Minister after the crucial review meeting with PM Modi. Sports Minister Kiren Rijiju further remarked that the launch of the official kits could have been done at

a grander scale but it had to be curtailed down due to the prevailing COVID-19 situation. He thanked the team for organizing the launch event and also the players who will be participating at the Tokyo Olympics during the testing times. The Indian contingent for the upcoming Tokyo Olympics 2021 is expected to be








athletes who have qualified for the Olympics have received the first dose of COVID-19 vaccine except for a few who have recently contracted the virus. He requested Sports Minister Kiren Rijiju to ensure that all the Indian athletes are fully vaccinated before they head to Tokyo. The official kits are sponsored by Li Ning while the official ceremonial kits are sponsored by Raymond. IOA Secretary General Rajiv Mehta said that four sets of official kits will be given to each athlete participating in Tokyo Olympic Games. Six Olympic-bound athletes, including Neeraj Chopra, Bajrang Punia, Ravi Dahiya, Sumit Malik and Seema Bisla and Chief-de-Mission of the Indian contingent Mr. B P Baishya and his Deputy Mr. Prem Chand Verma were also present in the unveiling function. The Indian Olympic Association (IOA) has dropped Chinese sportswear maker Li-Ning as its official kit partner citing the sentiments of the people of the country on 9th June 2021 and Our athletes, coaches and support staff will wear unbranded apparel at the Tokyo Olympic Games 2021 which were unveiled by Honorable Union Minister for Youth Affairs & Sports six days ago on 3rd June 2021.

ART: SIMONE IS THE FIRST WOMAN TO WIN SEVEN U.S CHAMPIONSHIP TITLES



Simone Arianne Biles (born March 14, 1997) dominated the U.S. Gymnastics Championship on 6th June 2021 and made history by winning her <u>seventh</u> <u>national all-around gold medal</u> at the Senior Women's Competition at Dickies Arena in Fort Worth, Texas. With this win, she became the first woman to win seven straight titles at the U.S. Gymnast Championship in history. Biles now ties with gymnast Alfred Jochim for the most titles by an American.

The five-time Olympic medallist put on a stunning performances that landed

her a score of 119.650. Biles won gold in the vault, balance beam, floor, and all-around categories. Simone Biles has won every US All-around Individual Championship since 2013. <u>Sunisa "Suni" Lee</u> received second place with a score of 114.950, and Jordan Chiles finished third with a score of 114.450. Biles hopes to continue her reign at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics as she aims to <u>win back-to-back</u>

Olympic titles. Simone Arianne Biles (24) is an American Artistic Gymnast with a combined total of 30 Olympic and World Championship medals. Biles is the most decorated American Gymnast and the World's third most decorated gymnast, behind Belarus' Vitaly Scherbo (33 medals) and Russia's Larisa Latynina (32 medals). At the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, Biles won individual gold medals in all-around, vault and floor; bronze in balance beam; and gold as part of the United States team, dubbed the "Final Five".



Biles is a five-time World all-around champion (2013–2015, 2018–19), five-time World floor exercise champion (2013–2015, 2018–19), three-time World balance beam champion (2014–15, 2019), two-time World vault champion (2018–19), a seven-time United States national all-around champion (2013–2016, 2018–19, 2021), and a member of the gold medal-winning American teams at the 2014, 2015, 2018, and 2019 World Artistic Gymnastics Championships. Additionally, she is a three-time World silver medallist (2013 and 2014 on vault, 2018 on uneven bars) and a three-time World bronze medallist (2015 on vault, 2013 and 2018 on balance beam).

IOC: INDIA'S P. V. SINDHU FOR IOC'S BELIEVE IN SPORTS CAMPAIGN

World Badminton Federation (BWF) has been appointed India's Ace Shuttler P. V. Sindhu (26) as the athlete ambassador for the Prestigious International Olympic Committee's (IOC) 'Believe in Sport' campaign leading up to Tokyo Olympic Games 2020 aimed at preventing competition manipulations. BWF bestowed this great



honour of athlete ambassador for IOC's "Believe in Sport" campaign at the World stage. Over the course of her career, P. V. Sindhu has won medals at multiple tournaments including <u>Olympics</u> and on the <u>BWF circuit</u> including a gold medal at the <u>2019 World Championships</u> at <u>Basel</u>, <u>Switzerland</u>. She is the first Indian to become the Badminton World Champion and the first Indian woman to earn an Olympic silver medal at 2016 Rio Olympic. She has won a silver medal each at the <u>2018 Commonwealth Games</u> and <u>2018 Asian Games</u>, and two bronze medals at the <u>Uber Cup</u>. She rose to a career high World ranking of No. 2 in April 2017.

KIYG: SPORTS MINISTRY SANCTIONS RS. 20.67 CR TO HOST KHELO INDIA GAMES

The Sports Ministry has sanctioned Rs. 20.67 crores for Haryana to host the 4th Khelo India Youth Games (KIYG) scheduled to be held from 21st - 30th November 2021 at Panchkula, Shshabad Markanda, Ambala in Haryana, Chandigarh an Delhi in 25 sports disciplines including five indigenous games i. e. Mallakhamb, Gatka, Thang-Ta, Kalaripayattu and Yogasana for the first time in this edition of Khelo India Youth Games. The Government's flagship event, an under-18 years national-level multi-discipline sports extravaganza is a fantastic platform for young and aspiring athletes to showcase their talent. The whole purpose of the Khelo India Games to create and strengthen the sporting ecosystem of the country and to identify and nurture talent for podium finishers in major international competitions including Olympics. The sportspersons from BRICS Countries i. e. Brazil, Russia, China and South Africa will also take part in the Fourth





Edition of Khelo India Youth Games for the First Time. The first edition of the event was held in New Delhi in 2018 under the banner of Khelo India School Games. Thereafter, it was renamed as the Khelo India Youth Games. Maharashtra and Guwahati hosted the 2019 and 2020 editions respectively.

CAIMS: SPORTS MINISTER KIREN RIJIJU LAUNCHES CENTRALISED ATHLETE INJURY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

Union Minister for Youth Affairs and Sports Shri Kiren Rijiju on 11th June 2021 launched an ambitious Centralized Athlete Injury Management System (CAIMS) virtually which aims to provide world class inputs on prevention, diagnosis, high quality treatment and rehabilitation to athletes on time and maintain records for mapping their injury via an Online Athlete Management System. The core committee of CAIMS includes eminent top of the line experts such as Dr. SKS Marya, Dr. Dinshaw Pardiwala, Dr. BV Srinivas and Shrikant Iyengar.



This system, to be run by the Sports Authority of India (SAI) in collaboration with the leading medical experts of the country, will be applied initially to the developmental group of athletes for the 2024 Paris Olympics and will broaden to others later on. Shri Kiren Rijiju said that I have seen athletes whose careers have been damaged or shortened



due to lack of timely and proper treatment of even common injuries. For some

injuries, treatment is not available in our country and athletes will have to go abroad. So, this is a humble beginning to address such injuries. I hope this initiative will lead to a system where we will have a professional way of managing injury of athletes. This is a centralized platform where we will have a common and uniform injury and rehabilitation management system. He further said that sports science in India is still in a nascent state and need improvement and want to be a sporting powerhouse to have a world class injury management. We will need upgradation and improvisation in many things and that is how we will learn to make this a success."

Indian Olympic Association President Shri Narinder Batra lauded the Sports Ministry and the Sports Authority of India for the initiative. He said that a lack of communication between athletes and medical provider's leads to devastating injuries to athletes, hinders their recovery and leads to re-injury and that affects their career.





Speaking about the importance of the initiative, Secretary (Sports) Shri Ravi Mittal said "Sports has become very competitive and when our athletes compete to their maximum to win medals they sometimes get injured. It is imperative to treat these injuries at a right time and in the right way to ensure that our athletes are in the best of health and form. CAIMS is expected to revolutionize the way athlete injuries are managed and treated. It will have the following four structures: Athlete Wellness Cell, On-Field Sports Medicine

Experts, National Resource Referral Teams and a Central Core Team.

Dr. SKS Marya, Chairman of the Central Core Team, hailed CAIMS and said that it will go a long way towards overcoming the geographical barriers in treating athlete injuries. "India is a huge country and our aim is to reduce the geographical and administrative barriers in the management of injuries of athletes. The event was attended by Shri Ravi Mittal Sports Secretary, Shri Sandip Pradhan Director General SAI, Shri Rajiv Mehta Secretary General IOA, renowned orthopaedic surgeons like Dr. SKS Marya, Dr. Anant Joshi and Dr. Dinshaw Pardiwala.

DSU: K. MALLESWARI APPOINTED AS FIRST VC OF DELHI SPORTS UNIVERSITY

India's First Woman Olympic Medal Winner Padmashri Karnam Malleswari was appointed as the first Vice-Chancellor of Delhi Sports University on (Tuesday) 22nd June 2021 by the Delhi Government while Lt. Governor Delhi is the Chancellor of Delhi Sports University Delhi. Padmashri Karnam Malleswari is the first Indian woman weightlifter, who won first ever Olympic Bronze medal. She created history at the XXVII Olympics Games at Sydney in 2000 by lifting 110 kilogram in snatch and 130 kilogram in clean and jerk categories. The Delhi Assembly had passed a bill in 2019 to set up a Delhi Sports University (DSU) in West Delhi's Mundka, which will



offer graduation, post-graduation and doctorate degrees in cricket, football, and hockey among other sports and will make India proud in the World of Sports. The women who lifted the Nation in Olympics Karnam Malleswari hails from Voosavanipeta in Amadalavalasa Mandal of Srikakulam. She started her weight-lifting career at Maruti Yuvajana Vyayama Mandali. She began undergoing training in weightlifting when she was 12 years under SAAP coach Neelamsetti Appanna. She won several international medals, including two gold and two silver in World Championship in 1993, 1994, 1995 and 1996. Mrs. Malleswari's record still remains intact as no woman from India won a medal in weightlifting

at Olympics. She was honoured with Arjun Award in 1994 and Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Award in 1999. She is also a recipient of Padma Shri Award in 1999. Earlier Dr. Jatin Soni from Gymnastics was appointed as First Founder Vice-Chancellor of Swarnim Gujrat Sports University Gandhinagar Gujrat in 2012 and continued till 2019.

SPORTS: A TRIBUTE TO GREATEST HOCKEY LEGEND BALBIR SINGH SENIOR

In a tribute ceremony, the Mohali International Hockey stadium will be named after three-time Olympic gold medal-winning hockey legend late Balbir Singh Sr. who had passed away on May 25, 2020. Balbir

Singh Senior (31 December 1923 – 25 May 2020) was an Indian hockey player. He was a three-time Olympic gold medallist, having played a key role in India's wins in London (1948), Helsinki (1952) (as vice-captain), and Melbourne (1956) (as captain) Olympics. He is regarded as one of the greatest hockey players of all time, a modern-day Dhyan Chand, a



legend of the sport, and is widely regarded as the Sport's greatest ever centre-forward. His Olympic record for most goals scored by an individual in an Olympic men's hockey final remains unbeaten. Singh set this record when he scored five goals in India's 6–1 victory over the Netherlands in the gold medal game of the 1952 Olympic Games. He was often called Balbir Singh Senior to distinguish him from other Indian hockey players named <u>Balbir Singh</u>. This is a great inspiration to the future



hockey generation that a stadium is named after a Great Hockey Legends Balbir Singh Senior. Earlier National Stadium is named after Hockey Wizard Major Dhyan Chand who is regarded as the greatest in the history of the sport and known for his extraordinary goalscoring feats. India under his leadership won three Olympic gold medals in 1928, 1932 and 1936, during an era where India

dominated field hockey. He scored 570 goals in 185 matches from 1926-1949. The Karni Singh Shooting Range is named after Maharaja of Bikaner Karni Singh at Delhi. Dr. Karni Singh was the first Indian to compete at <u>five Olympic Games</u>, which he did from 1960 to 1980, missing the Games of 1976, representing India at clay pigeon shooting at Summer Olympics in Rome 1960, Tokyo 1964 (Captain), Mexico 1968, Munich 1972 and Moscow 1980.

He whole heartedly developed, established and flourished Gymnastics and Mallakhamb at Mulund Gymkhana Mulund. He was a good organizer, administrator, ever smiling and a gem of a person for gymnastics. He conducted many state championships and other invitational competitions at Mulund Gymkhana successfully. Late Shri Deepak Surve was the President of Mumbai Sub-Urban District Gymnastics Association for many years and worked for the maximum participation of its gymnasts in the championships.
