Read 1 Thessalonians 2

- 3. "...Satan hindered us." What does that mean? Is spiritual warfare real? Have you seen or do you currently see it in your life? See Job 1 for an interesting court room drama.
- Prayer: Lord, let me always present Your Gospel with mildness and tenderness to the unbelievers in my life.

Read 1 Thessalonians 3

- Who does Paul send to help establish and exhort the Thessalonians in their faith? What two additional epistles does Paul write to this man? How is Paul developing him to continue the ministry of the Gospel to the Gentiles?
- 2. What is the report on the Church at Thessalonica? Compare their challenges and response to the Corinthian or Galatian churches. False prophets deceived them all. Do these prophets exist today? If so, name some signs of false teaching.
- 3. What are some reasons some churches flourish and others are overtaken by heresy?
- Prayer: Lord, lead me by Your Word, Your Spirit and wise Christian counsel to protect me from the many false prophets in today's society.

SATURDAY, MAY 28

Read 1 Thessalonians 4

- Paul discusses sanctification. How would you define sanctification? Are there actions that accompany it? Name three items
 Paul mentions. Do you think that Thessalonica was more or less carnal than the United States today?
- 2. Paul encourages the Thessalonians to keep up the good work they are doing. In verse 9, he repeats one of the two commandments Jesus gave us. What was it?
- 3. In verses 16-17, Paul describes Jesus' return. He mentions a sound of what instrument? This instrument is mentioned also in Exodus, 1 Corinthians, and Revelation. What is the study of end times? For extra credit, research how this instrument is involved in Christ's second coming.
- Prayer: Lord, let me mediate upon and be prepared for Your return. Thank You for Your saving Grace.
