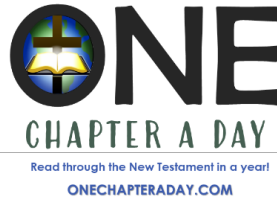


**MEMORY VERSE OF THE WEEK: Revelation 12:10-11**

**MONDAY, AUGUST 15**

**Read Revelation 10**

- 1. In verse 4, "... write them not" was the command given to John. Why? Are all people to understand God's Word? See John 12:28-29.
- 2. "Take it and eat it." (Verse 9). Where have we seen this commandment given to an earlier prophet (Ezekiel 3:1-3)? What does this mean? Who gave the scroll to John?
- 3. What was the commission given specifically to John (verse 11)? Is he a faithful prophet?
- **Prayer: Lord, let me be an obedient servant and to share Your Word with the people You have placed in my life's path.**

**TUESDAY, AUGUST 16**

**Read Revelation 11**

- 1. In verse 1, what was John told to do? What is God's measuring rod? How do we at Faith Lutheran measure up?
- 2. Verse 10 describes the world's celebration at the death of what? Scriptures say that the witnesses had been a \_\_\_\_\_ to them. Is the world today tormented by the Gospel? Think of some examples.
- 3. What final event in this world's history is described in Verses 15-19? How does the passage in verse 15 ("... he shall reign forever and ever") relate to Jesus' temptation found in Matthew 4, 8-9?
- **Prayer: Lord, give me Your Spirit of love and obedience that I might measure up to Your heavenly standards as I follow You in this world.**

**WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 17**

**Read Revelation 12**

- 1. The woman mentioned in verse 1 represents what? Did the audience of Revelation cry out in pain and agony when they delivered the Word of Christ to the lost and fallen world? How would they receive the news of verse 5?
- 2. To what event does Revelation 12:4 and verses 7-10 refer? See also Jude 1:6. Who wins?
- 3. Verse 17 explains Satan's enmity towards us believers. Are evil entities actively fighting against you? Is that a good thing or a bad thing? Why?
- **Prayer: God, thank You for giving me the strength and vision to keep Your commandments, to measure up to Your standards, and to hold a clear Christian testimony to the world around me.**
