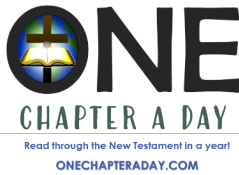


MEMORY VERSE OF THE WEEK:

MONDAY, MARCH 21

Read Romans 16—Connection Groups in Rome in 55 AD

1. Where did many of the early churches gather? Where might churches in high persecution countries like Nigeria and China gather?
 2. Where in the bible have we met the group leaders Prisca and Aquila before? How might their struggles and persistent faithful hard work be an example to us?
 3. Divisions in Christian churches began early in history. What does Paul say about avoiding and dealing with church divisions?
- **Prayer:** *Lord, graciously preserve me this day and at all times, from every ill and danger of body and soul.*

TUESDAY, MARCH 22

Read 1 Corinthians 1—Saints and Sinners

1. The Corinthians have lots of sin problems that Paul addresses in the letter. How can he greet them as saints in v3?
 2. What is the root cause of the problems the Corinthians are having? Are the Corinthians following man’s wisdom or God’s wisdom?
 3. Where do we find God’s wisdom? Why is it important to always strive for unity in our church and the universal church based in God’s word?
- **Prayer:** *Lord, be gracious and merciful to me, bless and sustain me this day and the rest of my life.*

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 23

Read 1 Corinthians 2—Wisdom from the Spirit of God

1. Paul describes the wisdom and power of God as being something simple and uncomplicated. J ____ C ____ and him c _____. (ESV)
 2. Who imparts the wisdom to us? What role does the Pastor’s preaching and our proclaiming the Gospel play?
 3. Paul says the natural/normal person does not accept the Spirit of God and the Gospel is folly to them. How might this help us have compassion and to approach unbelievers?
- **Prayer:** *Lord, let Your Holy Spirit be with me that I may understand what is good or evil so that my thoughts, words and deeds are always pleasing to You.*
