**MONDAY, MARCH 7**

**Read Romans 4—Abraham’s Righteousness Through Faith**

1. How does Abraham’s case (where he is justified by faith apart from works) show there is really no difference between Jews and Gentiles when it comes to righteousness?
2. Was circumcision a work for righteousness for the Jews or was it a sign/gift from God (see also Genesis 17:11)?
3. Are we the ungodly (like Abraham) justified through: A) faith AND works or B) faith NOT works? Do v 4-5 make this very clear to you?

• **Prayer:** *Lord, give us hearts like Abraham, hearts that trust Your promises.*

**TUESDAY, MARCH 8**

**Read Romans 5—Live in Peace With God**

1. Since we are today justified through Christ, we now live the following with God: pe\_\_\_\_\_, ac\_\_\_\_\_, ho\_\_\_\_\_.
2. When we cannot avoid pain and suffering, we are told by Paul to rejoice in it. How should we do that?
3. We have a “much more” God. Read v9, v10, v11, v17, v20. What does God give us so abundantly?

• **Prayer:** *Lord, Your grace abounds so that I may enjoy life and peace with You.*

**WEDNESDAY, MARCH 9**

**Read Romans 6—Live Your Baptism**

1. Are we to continue to live in sin since grace abounds? What is Paul’s answer to this (v3-11)?
2. Are we to continue to live in sin since grace abounds? How does it strike you to be called a “slave to righteousness”?
3. Paul does not talk about sanctification and bearing good fruit to the Romans until late in Chapter 6. Does sanctification come before, during or after our justification/reconciliation?

• **Prayer:** *Jesus, thank you for dying for me and saving me. Lead me to serve You by serving others.*

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
