ADHA Issues Open Letter Objecting to ADA Resolutions: Advocating for Collaboration in Dental Care

The American Dental Hygienists' Association (ADHA) has issued an open letter expressing concern over recent resolutions introduced by the American Dental Association (ADA) that affect the role of dental hygienists in patient care. The ADHA argues that these resolutions fail to recognize the full potential of dental hygienists in expanding access to oral healthcare and undermines their expertise and value in the healthcare system.

In the letter, the ADHA calls for greater collaboration and constructive dialogue between the ADA and dental hygienists. The association stresses that policies should reflect the reality of modern dental care, where dental hygienists are integral to improving patient outcomes and addressing the disparities in care, particularly in underserved populations.

The ADHA advocates for a cooperative approach that prioritizes patient-centered care and leverages the strengths of all dental professionals, emphasizing that collaboration—rather than division—is the path forward for advancing the profession and improving oral health for all.
