Why should you consider becoming a Governor?

There are many potential benefits for you personally and professionally, for example

- Developing skills and experience such as teamworking and interpersonal skills, decision-making, financial management, strategic planning, problem solving, all of which are valued by employers
- Building networks and relationships in your community
- Supporting children and their families in your community

All of this will look good on your CV and impress prospective employers!

What do governors do?

The Governing body has 3 key functions:

- Setting the vision, ethos and strategic direction of the school
- Overseeing financial performance & ensuring money is well spent
- Appointing and holding the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils

What will I have to commit to?

The Full Governing Body usually hold a planning meeting once at the start of the new academic year and once per term for general meetings. As a governor you will also be expected to either be a member of a specific sub-committee (which usually meet once per term) or to take on a link role aligned to a particular school improvement or curriculum area.

Governors are not generally involved in the day to day running of the school, but are expected to spend time getting to know the school, to visit the school to inspect and support and to attend key school events.

What support will I get?

You will receive a thorough induction, training as needed and support from fellow governors, along with membership of the National Governors Association and all their resources
