Safeguarding Statement	<p>The school recognises its moral and statutory responsibility to safeguard and promote the welfare of all pupils and staff. We endeavour to provide a safe and welcoming environment where children and adults are respected and valued. We are alert to the signs of abuse and neglect and follow our procedures to ensure that children receive effective support, protection and justice.</p> <p>Child protection forms part of the school's safeguarding responsibilities.</p>	<p>Staff in Lostock Hall Primary School take the safeguarding of each and every child very seriously. This means that, should they have any concerns of a safeguarding nature, they are expected to report, record and take the necessary steps to ensure that the child is safe and protected. This is never an easy action, nor one taken lightly. They are aware that it can lead to challenge from parents/carers, but at all times staff have the child at the heart of all their decisions and act in their best interests.</p>

Safeguarding Statement	<p>At Disley Primary School we aim to provide a secure environment where children always feel welcome, safe and happy. All staff at Disley understand that anyone who comes into contact with children, their families and carers has a role to play in Safeguarding. Safeguarding is of paramount importance and it is always taken extremely seriously. All staff have up to date Child Protection training and therefore have an understanding of the signs of abuse and neglect. Staff are aware of how instant communication with the Designated Safeguarding Lead or Deputy is vital in order to ascertain the most appropriate course of action. Dealing and responding to Safeguarding issues and concerns can be challenging and difficult at times but all decisions made ensure that the children's best interests and ultimate safety are at the heart of all actions undertaken.</p>	<p>This has many meanings: looking after your children at playtime; keeping your children safe online; ensuring our building is in good order; risk-assessing off-site activities; or taking action to prevent a threat. Every single member of Hague Bar Primary School staff has been trained to deal with these and other circumstances. Our robust Governing Body ensure upkeep of current policies and that they are actioned day to day. Our Designated Safeguarding Lead is Mrs Rachel Parry and her Deputy is Ms Louise Moore. They are always available to hear any concerns regarding a child's physical, mental or social well-being.</p>
