

**Primary Ballet**: Black leotard, Black Ballet Skirt (Photo below), Pink ballet tights, Pink Ballet shoes must be clean with elastics. Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom. **Boys:** Black tights or bike shorts, well fitted white t-shirt, black shoes with white socks. Neat hair

**Grade 1 Ballet:** Black leotard, Pink Ballet tights, Pink Ballet shoes with ribbons no elastics (15mm), Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom.

**Grade 2 Ballet:** Black leotard, Pink Ballet tights, Pink Ballet shoes with ribbons (15mm), Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom.

**Grade 3 Ballet:** Black leotard, Pink Tights, Pink ballet shoes with ribbons(15mm), Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom. Light make up optional.

**Grade 4 Ballet**: Black leotard, Pink Tights, Pink ballet shoes with ribbons (15mm), Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom. Light make up optional.

**Grade 6 Ballet:** Black leotard, Pink Tights, Pink ballet shoes with ribbons (15mm), Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom. Light make up optional.



### **JAZZ**

#### Uniform Requirements

Primary and Junior Modern Jazz – Modern Jazz: Black leotard, Black 3/4 tights, tanned tights, Tan Jazz shoes must be clean. Black Hair blossom, hair parted in middle, low bun.



**Grade 1 Modern Jazz:** Black leotard, Black ¾ pants, Black jazz shoes, Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom.

**Grade 2 Modern Jazz:** Black leotard, Black ¾ pants, Black jazz shoes, Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom.

**Grade 3 Modern Jazz:** Black leotard, Black ¾ pants, Black jazz shoes, Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom. Light make up optional.

**Grade 4 Modern Jazz:** Black leotard, Black ¾ pants, Black jazz shoes, Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom. Light make up optional.

**Grade 5 Modern Jazz:** Black leotard, Black ¾ pants, Black jazz shoes, Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom. Light make up optional.





#### Uniform Requirements

#### **Junior Tap:**

Female - Black leotard, Black plain ¾ pants, Tan tap shoes, Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom.

**Grade 1 Tap:** Female - Black leotard, Black plain ¾ pants, Black tap shoes, Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom. Light make up optional.

**Grade 4 Tap:** Female - Black leotard, Black plain ¾ pants, Black tap shoes, Hair parted in middle low bun with black hair blossom. Light make up optional.





Successfully completing an examination should be celebrated rather than a focus on the credit level achieved. Naturally we aim for students to achieve THEIR personal best and we are cognisant that this is also important to the students. It is imperative that our expectations remain realistic. While all students are performing to their best there are also good and not so good days. On exam day, the examiner is the only person who actually sees this. Despite what 'should have happened' it doesn't always go that way on the day. Please help to keep expectations realistic and support your student to be very proud of completing their examination. Your teachers do an outstanding job and they want every one of their students to achieve their personal best. It is imperative however that we celebrate all successes and achievements. This is what will keep students engaged, happy and emotionally happy, and ultimately retains their very special joy of dance.

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
