Fall Winter Lawn Tips

For Maryland's cool-season lawns, the University of Maryland Extension (UMD Extension) recommends fall aeration and overseeding, followed by mowing to 3-4 inches high. Leave chopped leaves on the lawn to decompose, and do not apply fertilizer between November 15th and March 1st due to Maryland's Lawn Fertilizer Law. Avoid walking on frozen grass to prevent injury

Security Alert - Check washing

Reports have been made that checks have been stolen from blue USPS boxes and "washed". Police said this kind of mail theft is pretty common. "Check washing" is where a check is altered, by erasing the payee and amount, and then rewrites to steal money from the victim's bank account.

How to protect? Use the inside box at the post office during regular business hours or pass across the counter to postal employees. Use a Security Pen for writing checks. These pens use a non-erasable, permanent gel or pigment-based ink pen that soak into the paper's fibers, making them harder to remove with chemicals.

Memory Lane by Carl Utt

Among ranchers, split-levels, and colonials, Camel's Den Cave is just a short walk from the neighborhood. Camel's Den Cave is a small shelter cave near Daniels. The cave was formed from Cockeysville Marble, which is highly crystallized white metalimestone laced with calc-schist and a variety of other minerals. This type of rock was most famously used in the Washington Monument. The origins of the name are unknown, but an historical reference speculates that early settlers thought the arched entrance resembled the outline of a camel.

Another little-known cave was found on Main Street when Ellicott City flooded in 2017. This flood unearthed in a building's foundation, a hidden cave. Little is known about the cave, it's possible it was a site for storing Prohibitionera alcohol and as a stop on the Underground Railroad, at this time no documentation to support.
