Mount Hebron started out with one house in 1808, and over the next 80 years only a hand full of structures were built in the neighborhood. Growth to our neighborhood started in the nineteen sixties with the rancher style homes, followed by the split levels in the seventies, and then the colonials.

The communities of Mount Hebron, The Orchards, and Patapsco Park Estates have been represented by the Mount Hebron Community Association since the nineteen sixties.
