

The tradition of Myddfai as a medical centre may have connections earlier than the famous physicians of the thirteenth century. Dr Huw Llewelyn, a retired consultant physician and endocrinologist, thinks that the herbal remedies used by the physicians may have been influenced by the Greek doctors who accompanied the invading forces during the Roman conquest of Britain from 43 AD. According to Dr Llewelyn, current chairman of the Physicians of Myddfai Society, retiring Greek doctors from the legions linked to the Dolaucothi gold mines may have settled in Myddfai where their ideas became combined with those of the Druids.

"The question is whether Greco-Roman ideas on medicine continued in Wales from the Romano-British period or whether they died out and were re-introduced afresh from Europe during medieval times to influence the Physicians of Myddfai," he said.

The earliest testimony to the physicians is to be found in manuscripts written before the end of the fourteenth century, of which the best known is the Red Book of Hergest (which refers to the Greek physician Hippocrates). It contains a collection of herbal remedies associated with Rhiwallon, reputed son of the Lady of Llyn-y-Fan Fach and a shepherd from Blaen Sawdde Farm near the lake.

According to fable, the shepherd married a beautiful maiden whom he saw rising from the waters of Llyn-y-Fan Fach. They raised a family, but she returned to the lake after being struck (perhaps unintentionally) three times by her husband. However, she continued to teach

her sons about the medicinal properties of local plants and their uses. One, Rhiwallon, and his own three sons became the renowned Physicians of Myddfai.

At the annual conference of the Physicians of Myddfai Society in June, Paul Vigor, an archaeologist from Pontardawe, will explore the Roman influence on Wales and Britain and Myddfai in particular, and the credibility of the idea that the Physicians were descended from Greco-Roman doctors.

This year's conference theme, "The Long View of Medical Education in the Past, Present and Future," will bring together voices from archaeology, medicine, and education to explore the evolving landscape of medical training and will be preceded by a poetry reading by Mary MacGregor.

The second speaker, Dr John Rees of Llanfair Surgery, Llandovery, will outline medical education since medieval times to today, including the latest advances in teaching methods and teaching qualifications.

The final speaker, Dr Huw Llewelyn, will discuss possible future directions in medical training, including the use of AI to preserve traditional diagnostic skills, to improve them and communication with patients.

His presentation will be followed by a general discussion involving all three speakers.

Padmasambhava Yoga & Meditation Centre

All at Padmasambhava hope you enjoyed the Easter holidays and are looking forward to the longer and brighter days of the early summer. There really is hope in the air as the different flowers and trees come into bloom and spread their scents and colours around – something we all need as our dear World struggles along.

Together with Nature's emerging energy and the lighter evenings, a yoga class can help harness positivity and bring even more fulfillment and balance to our lives. The physical movements of yoga practices can enhance the dynamic energy of the Season and the breathing practices bring a balance of both energy and a quieter stillness. The Summer term at Padmasambhava starts on Monday 28th April for some classes and Tuesday 6th May for others.

Monday's Gentle Yoga (11.45 to 1.15pm) offers a chance for students wishing to return to Yoga, and become familiar again with different practices. Gentle Yoga is also helpful for students with some health limitations, who may need to take extra care. The Beginner's (ongoing) on a Wednesday evening may have one or two spaces and it is still not too late to join this class. Thursday's Ammanford class in the Penybanc Welfare Hall is a wonderful way to join this local community group in both movement and relaxation.

All classes at PadmaSamBhava offer movement (asana), breath practices (pranayama) and relaxation (Yoga Nidra). By releasing the stresses in the body and working with breath awareness, the mind and body are brought to a quieter state. The deep relaxation of Yoga Nidra allows a reset of all systems – and becomes a time to deeply rest, focus the mind and sow a seed of positive intent.

A good selection of classes are held at the Centre in Llandeilo, as well as a weekly class at Ammanford Penybane Welfare Hall, the Reading Room at Cwrt Henri and Chair Based Yoga at the Llandeilo Bowling Club. The classes taught by the Centre are Integral Yoga – a gentle and steady progression, always working with awareness of your body in the physical practices, and bringing together mind, body and breath. Weekly practice of yoga allows the body to gain strength and flexibility week by week while developing focus and poise in the mind.

The benefits of yoga resonate beyond the class. Many students appreciate this quiet time each week and find they are developing useful tools for navigating the stresses of daily life. Perhaps with the warmer days, you might feel able to do your daily yoga practice outside in your gardens surrounded by the sounds and smells that are there.



MUSEUM NOTES NEW ATTRACTIONS AT LLANDOVERY MUSEUM

Several new attractions are on view at Llandovery Museum, which reopened after a winter break on Tuesday, 15 April. During the past few months, volunteers have been busy behind closed doors at Y Gannwyll, rearranging displays and preparing new labels, so that visitors can be better informed about Llandovery and the surrounding area.

There are two additional display cases, both donated by the Lloyd George Memorial Museum at Llanystumdwy, Cricieth. The cases were warmly welcomed by the curator of Llandovery Museum, Jane Carter.

She said: "They are able to accommodate large artefacts and keep them secure, with good environmental control. This will contribute to plans for displaying important items borrowed from other established museums in Wales."

A new display features miniature chairs won at local eisteddfodau. Two of the chairs were won at the Llandovery Grammar School Eisteddfod in 1958 and 1959 by David (Dai) Williams, Dinas-bach Isaf, Rhandir-mwyn, who later became a scientist specialising in grassland research. They were made by a fellow pupil, Glyndwr Evans, a carpenter's son of Glan-dŵr, Llanwrda. The third chair was won at Rhydlewis Eisteddfod in 1999 by Tomi Thomas, Tirallen, Llanwrda,

There are also two silver cups won at eisteddfodau in the area by Huw Morgan, a young baritone who lived locally and became an opera singer. Also exhibited are several prize bags, presented to the winners of various competitions, and which contained prize money.





One of the most elaborate displays, set up by Museum volunteer Hugh Davies, deals with Llandovery's long tradition of surgeons, pharmacists, chemists and druggists. The current Pharmacy in High Street has been there for over 170 years. There was also a Medical Hall in Stone Street.

Among the earliest recorded druggists was John Griffiths, a descendant of the hymnwriter, William Williams, Pantycelyn. His son, Thomas Griffiths, was the first chemist to occupy the Pharmacy. In 1851, he advertised that he was a retail agent for Jones' Nipple Powder!

William Goulstone, a native of Bristol, who died aged 93 in 1857, was a druggist in Market Street, together with his son James. The premises were badly damaged, and two people were seriously injured in 1855 when a spark ignited a canister containing gunpowder.

On 17th May Llanrhaedr Ym Mochnant plays host to a village opening with five gardens demonstrating an innovative use of small spaces. Two of these gardens are opening for the first time. Refreshments are available in the public hall.

Sunday 18th May Treberfydd House, Llangasty near Llangorse Lake has 10 acres of formal gardens and shrubberies Find the notable historic trees.

Saturday 24th and 25th May Bachie Uchaf, Llanfyllin who have opened for The National Garden Scheme for well over ten years. And on Sunday 25th May Llwyn Madoc, Beulah overlooks a lake. The gardens slope down away from the house and are at their best when the rhododendrons and azaleas are out. While Llysdinam, Newbridge on Wye has large garden developed over 150 years.

Monday 26th May Llanstephan House, nr Llyswen has a 20 acre garden, take a picnic and enjoy the views of the Wye Valley and Black Mountains. Also, Monday 26th Garthmyl Hall, Montgomery.

Saturday 31st May Gregynog Hall & Garden, Newtown. Also Saturday 31st May and 1st June Clawdd-Y-Dre, Montgomery is a well established 3/4 acre garden, with shrubs and perennials and stunning panoramic views across the valley.

There are gardens open by arrangement e.g. The Hymns, Presteigne (group or bespoke visit); Tranquility Haven, Knighton (up to 30); The Neuadd, Crickhowell (up to 12); Tyn-y-Graig, Newtown (up to 15 people) and Llysdinam see above.

CALON HEARTS CONTINUES TO TACKLE HEART DISEASE BY OFFERING FREE AND SUBSIDISED HEART SCREENING

Calon Hearts, the heart screening and defibrillator charity, is offering FREE heart screening to all 16–25-year-olds, in a bid to reduce the number of people who die unnecessarily each year due to an undiagnosed heart condition.

Every week in the UK, 12 seemingly fit and healthy young people die from an undetected heart condition which could have been discovered through a simple screening process.

To combat this, Calon Hearts is inviting young people to book a screening session. This includes an ECG – with a follow-up echocardiogram if the ECG detects any abnormalities, or at the discretion of the cardiologist.

In addition, the charity subsidises heart screenings for adults over 26, and includes an ECG, an echocardiogram and a consultation with the cardiologist for £280 (average prices are up to £1000).

Sharon Owen, charity director, says: "We are proud to offer both free and heavily subsidised heart screening programmes, thanks to our Ben McDonald screening fund. Ben tragically lost his life at the finish line of the Cardiff Half Marathon in October 2018, caused by an undiagnosed heart condition, so we are on a mission to ensure that no other family has to endure what Ben's family did.

"We urge everyone from the age of 16 to get their heart checked with us, as we know that early detection is key to effective treatment or could even save a life."
