LLANDOUERY SHEEP FESTIVAL WILL BE WONDERFULLY WOOLLY THIS MONTH

Llandovery Sheep Festival will be going baaaa-ck to its wonderfully woolly roots later this month when the emphasis will be on the different varieties of sheep breeds, wool crafts and wool demonstrations.

The weekend-long festival, taking place on 20 & 21 September 2025 in Llandovery town centre, will highlight the wool industry and local sheep farming. It will also be a celebration of rural arts and crafts, local food and drink producers and live entertainment and performers.

Rachel Everett, Chairman of the Festival, said, "The Llandovery Sheep Festival is 15 years old this year and has gone from strength to strength since its inception. It is an event that's been wholeheartedly embraced by the people of Llandovery and its success is very much a reflection of that. Events such as this are important to the rural community, not only in terms of bringing people together, but also in terms of showcasing the best

of local produce, goods and services. Thanks to the help of Lisa Denison, a local small holder, we will have lots more sheep at this September's event in the expanded sheep marquee. It will be a vibrant hub of woolly wonder packed with fibre craft stalls, live demonstrations and, of course, a variety of sheep breeds."

The Festival has been fortunate this year to have the support of the exceptionally talented illustrator and artist, Jack Skivens, who has recently moved to Llandovery with his family. Jack has generously used his skills to create brand new logos and imagery for the Festival. Jack will also create a brand new illustrated map for the Festival which will highlight the charm, history and hidden gems of our wonderful town.

Children will have their very own marquee at this month's event for the first time. There will be storytelling, crafts and entertainment especially for younger visitors.

Llandovery Sheep Festival Village Show will return again this September. Locals are being asked to showcase their talents if they make their own jam, grow their own vegetables, bake, paint, craft or keep bees. The Village Show is held on Sunday, 21 September in the Castle Hotel and entries must be handed in on the day by 10.00am.

The town's Market Square and Castle carpark will be a kaleidoscope of colour during the event with exhibitors selling their wares from textiles, arts and crafts to locally produced food and drink. The streets of Llandovery will also be packed with hot food on-the-go, entertainment and live music including a new collaboration this year between local pubs and the Festival. The Llandovery & District Model Railway Club will be back in the Castle Garage Showroom with their magical model railways.

Returning for this year's Festival will be a programme of talks on the Saturday in the Castle Hotel, including the Climate Forum discussing the future of energy from 11.00am. Sheikh Ahmed will then take us on a captivating journey through one of Wales most powerful and mysterious legends – the Physicians of Myddfai from 2.00pm and from 3.30pm. Nigel McCall, awardwinning local photographer, is going to give a talk about his photography and his book 'Aberglasney Gardens – a calendar year'.

Sustainability is important to our work so that has been at the forefront while decorating the hub. We especially wanted to show what can be done with donated, preloved and upcycled items, while also making the most out of a relatively small space by creating items that are movable and multi-functional. It has taken a lot longer than just going out and buying new but by doing so, we have created a unique and welcoming space to work and chat about climate and the community. Huge thanks to businesses and individuals who have donated goods to help us achieve this.

Sustainable transport and E-bike hire remains our main focus, and we are still working hard to fulfil this element of the project. It is exciting to see progress on the Tywi Valley path and we eagerly await the final section to Llandeilo being open. A LISTENING SPACE FOR PARENTS

Everyone at PadmaSamBhava hopes you are well and have enjoyed the wonderful sunny weather - and not found it too hot - and that you've enjoyed a break from usual routines. 





IT'S A BUMPER ORCHARD YEAR IN DYFFRYN TYWI!



Once renowned for its orchards the Tywi Valley is experiencing a revival in orcharding, and 2025 is heading to be a record breaking harvest of apples, pears, plums and damsons.

Paul Davis, of Dolau Hirion in Capel Isaac is a plant hunter.....not in far flung parts of the world, but right here in the Tywi Valley. He has spent the last 30 or so years hunting out local and distinctive varieties of apples, and propagating and selling them throughout the locality and beyond. Paul is now retired (he likes to keep his hand in of course!), but varieties like Pig yr Wydd (Llanwrda), and Marged Nicolas (Dinefwr area) are just two varieties that have been registered in the National Fruit Register as from this area. Paul has probably sold thousands of trees in and around the Tywi Valley and many are now reaching maturity and are producing heavy crops. There are also many that are probably not being managed to their full potential!

More and more communities up and down the valley have been celebrating apples and orchards in recent years with apple days and other orchard related events and activities. There's an upsurge in fruit tree owners seeking out and re-learning the once common but now largely forgotten skills and crafts of orchard management.

Dinefwr Orchardeers, a voluntary community group based in Llandeilo, has been quietly working with various orchard and fruit tree owners in and around the Tywi Valley for 10 years, alongside looking after the National Trust heritage tree orchard at Dinefwr Park. They are now equipped with excellent processing facilities to deal with the increasing harvest of fruit from around the valley and turn it into delicious apple juice and cider. The Orchardeers have started accepting donations of surplus apples and pears too and may even be able to offer a collection service – if enough volunteers are available!

This year, working with other community groups and organisations, a wide range of events are being presented as a......

TYWI VALLEY FESTIVAL OF ORCHARDS

..... kicking off with the ever popular Cwmdu Apple Day on 27th September and running right through to National Apple Day on 21st October.

If you've ever wanted to find out more about starting and caring for an orchard (defined as five or more fruit trees in the same 'enclosure'), or what to do with your apples and pears, then why not come along to one or more of the family friendly community events planned this autumn:

- Saturday 27th September The annual Apple and Cider Day at Cwmdu from lunch time until 5 pm (ish). A celebration of apples and cider in the pub streamside garden at the community run Cwmdu Inn. Bring your apples for possible identification or have a go at pressing and juicing. Seek out expert advice on the management of fruit trees and taste some of the wide range of ciders on sale. A fun afternoon out for all the family.
- Saturday 4th October Apple Day at Ysgol Bro Dinefwr, 10 am until 2 pm. Bring your apples for pressing and bring your own bottles to take your fresh juice home with you. The school garden known as 'Natur' will be open and there will be an opportunity to view developments for this vital outdoor classroom for our students.



- Sunday 5th October Harvest Day at Aberglasney Gardens with apple pressing, folk dancing, music, workshops and storytelling – hopefully in a new Tipi.
- Saturday 11th October Orchard Day with Dinefwr Orchardeers at the Dinefwr Heritage Orchard on the National Trust Dinefwr Park Estate. 11 am to 4 pm. Take an orchard tour to view the over 100 varieties of heritage fruit trees. Collect a bag of apples from the orchard and have a go at pressing them right there in the orchard and taste the freshly pressed juice. Bring your own apples for pressing or identification and seek out expert advice. Taste and buy some of the range of pasteurised apple juice and ciders produced from the orchard.
- Saturday 18th October Llandovery Community Apple Day 10 am to 4 pm. Join us at the Llandovery Youth and Community Centre. Bring along your apples and make fresh juice on the day using our scratter and press. Bring suitable containers so that you can take your juice home - it freezes beautifully, giving you a taste of autumn all winter long. There will also be a seed and plant swap. Whether you're an apple enthusiast, a gardener, or just looking for a friendly community event, we look forward to seeing you
- Saturday 18th October Apple Day at the National Botanic Gardens of Wales. Apple experts will be on hand to try and identify your apples and there will be a display of the many and varied apples growing throughout the area.

Tuesday 21st October – It's National Apple Day! A special celebration initially launched by Common Ground, a cultural charity, to celebrate and promote the diversity of apples and orchards.

If you've a surplus of apples this year, have you considered making cider? Join the valley wide Cider Club and learn the dark arts of cider making, in a very sociable manner. Or let Dinefwr Orchardeers make cider for you in their Apple Shed – a treat to look forward to in 6 to 9 months' time.

MUSEUM NOTES THE MYSTERY OF 'JENNY FACH'



One of the most popular exhibits at Llandovery Museum is a photograph of a young woman taken in the town at the end of the nineteenth century. Visitors are invariably drawn to her – not only by the fine composition of the image, but by the sitter's magnetic expression. Her clothing suggests she was a servant, but her identity remains unknown.

The portrait bears only two words, *Jenny Fach*, in the hand of its creator, the celebrated Welsh photographer John Thomas. Although museum volunteers have spent countless hours scouring parish records, newspapers, and archives, 'Jenny' has stubbornly resisted positive identification. However, it is now believed that her true name may not have been Jenny – or Jennifer – but Ann.

A clue emerges from the Carmarthen Journal and South Wales Weekly Advertiser of 9 October 1891, which reports the death of an inmate at Llandovery Union Workhouse: "The Master reported the death at the house at the age of 40 of Ann Jones (better known as 'Ann Jenny Fach') on the 25th September."

Given that John Thomas visited Llandovery in 1885 and again in 1891, it is plausible that this Ann Jones is the woman in the picture. If so, the photograph was likely to have been taken during his first visit, when Ann was in her mid-thirties.

The name 'Jenny Fach' may well have been given to her by Thomas himself. Perhaps she reminded him of 'Sweet Jenny Jones', the dairy maid whose romantic adventures were immortalised in a popular ballad. Whether intended as a whimsical nickname or an affectionate label, it is likely that the title stuck.

Born near Cellan, Cardiganshire, in 1838, John Thomas began his working life as an assistant in a Lampeter draper's shop before moving to Liverpool. After a decade behind the counter, he turned to photography, establishing The Cambrian Gallery.

Thomas was more than a studio photographer – he was a tireless traveller who hauled his heavy equipment the length and breadth of Wales. In an age when photography was painstaking and technical, he mastered the challenges of wet-plate negatives, which had to be processed on the spot. His travelling kit included not only the camera, lens, and tripod, but a portable darkroom, five bottles

of chemicals, heavy glass plates, and a cloth to block out the light.

Every portrait entailed infinite creativity and patience. Exposure times were long, and sitters had to remain perfectly still for several seconds. Clothing might be borrowed or adjusted to present the subject in their best light, and Thomas, unusually, was even known to pay his subjects for the privilege of photographing them.

When he retired, over 3,000 of his negatives were purchased by Sir O. M. Edwards to illustrate his Welshlanguage magazine Cymru. Today, those images form part of the National Library of Wales' photographic collection an extraordinary visual record of nineteenth-century Wales.

John Thomas died in October 1905 and was buried in Liverpool's Anfield Cemetery. Yet, his work remains as popular as ever. The woman, known only as Jenny Fach, gazes out across more than a century, her life story lost to time. Whether servant, workhouse inmate, or balladinspired muse, she remains Llandovery Museum's most enigmatic face.

Llandovery Museum and Heritage Centre is open Tuesday to Saturday, 11:00am - 2pm.


