
One cloud on the horizon is the end of the UK government incentive schemes for Renewable Heating systems. As things stand the Domestic Renewable Heat Incentive (RHI) will end in March 2022... and there is no sign of a replacement. Unfortunately Welsh Government do not seem to see the environment as a priority.

So please note if you are thinking of installing a renewable heating system in order to receive RHI payments (illustration below) the system would need to be installed and commissioned by the **31st March 2022**.

OVER 14,000 GP CONSULTATIONS CARRIED OUT VIRTUALLY IN PAST 12 MONTHS IN CARMARTHENSHIRE, CEREDIGION & PEMBROKESHIRE

A staggering 14,228 GP consultations have been carried out virtually during the past 12 months in Carmarthenshire, Ceredigion and Pembrokeshire, saving patients time and money whilst keeping them safe from catching COVID-19.

A survey of patients who have had virtual GP appointments over the past 12 months said the benefits included not having to travel or find parking and, as they hadn't had to leave home, they were able to help reduce the spread of COVID-19.

One Hywel Dda patient who had used virtual consultations said that these appointments were, "much better than having to attend surgery" particularly as they had just had a baby. They also noted that the app was "easy to load" and they had no issues utilising the service.

The way we access local NHS services has changed, with more ways in which you can consult your doctor or nurse. Most surgeries now offer telephone as well as electronic advice consultations in the first instance. Following your advice call, a face-to-face appointment may be organised, but video consultations are also available. You can now speak to a doctor or healthcare professional using the video camera in your smartphone, tablet or computer and a connection to the internet. This is often more convenient and can save you time, as you will not need to travel for a face-to-face appointment. The system used is confidential and secure.

Jill Paterson, Director of Primary Care, Community and Long Term Care at Hywel Dda University Health Board, said, "If you are offered a video consultation appointment this is because your Health Care Professional has indicated that is it safe and appropriate to do so. Your video appointment will be confidential and will not be recorded."

After being offered a video consultation you will be sent a letter, email or text with details of your appointment. This communication will contain details of the service that has requested to see you by video and have provided a web address link. You can type or copy the web address link into a web browser via an internet

enabled device and this will take you to the video clinic waiting area.

In order to access your virtual appointment, you will need:

- · Access to a device that will allow you to access the internet. You should use Google Chrome or Microsoft Edge web browser on a desktop or laptop, or on an Android tablet or smartphone or Safari web browser on an Apple iMac, MacBook, iPad, or iPhone.
- Your device will need a webcam (camera), speakers and microphone.
- · A good internet connection (if you can watch a YouTube video, this is good indication that you have a good connection).
- An internet usage plan that is sufficient to cover the data consumption of a video call - ideally use a Wi-Fi connection if you have this available.

An illustrated talk entitled Shipwrecks in Carmarthen Bay can now be seen on the website www.carmants.org.uk . The talk was given on 2 March at a Zoom event arranged by the county's history and archaeology society, the Carmarthenshire

Antiquarian Society, in conjunction with Laugharne History Society.

Heather James BA FSA is the speaker and the talk covers why there were so many shipwrecks in Carmarthen Bay and then focuses on three significant wrecks which can still be seen today at low water. The talk also deals with the remains of a number of smaller, local wooden sailing ships that can be can be seen off Cefn Sidan, Laugharne Sands and Marros Beach, some of whose stories can be told while others have yet to be identified.

More can be discovered about the county's history and archaeology by joining the Carmarthenshire Antiquarian Society. Members receive its fact-filled publication *The Carmarthenshire Antiquary* together with details of its complete programme of proposed talks and visits to historic places across the county which is ready for commencing as soon as the pandemic situation will allow.



AMPUTATION SURGEON BUSY AT WORK AFTER LOSING LEGS

WRITES HUW S THOMAS



Fomer Llandovery College student Neil Hopper who was at the Carmarthenshire Independent school in the early 1990s has a remarkable tale to tell.

The Old Llandoverian vascular surgeon, based at the Royal Cornwall hospital in Truro, Cornwall had amputated thousands of limbs during his career but in April 2019 had both his legs removed after becoming seriously ill with sepsis.

The Welshman had been on a camping holiday in woodlands with his wife Rachel and children, Evie 10 and Harry, 6, when he and Evie, felt unwell.

Both went down with stomach bugs but whereas Evie mercifully recovered Neil went on to develop sepsis.

"I thought I had picked up some stomach bug, took some paracetamol and went to bed"

"I can remember my feet hurting and the next thing I can remember was being in intensive care, having mysteriously contracted sepsis"

"I had hyperbaric oxygen therapy for a fortnight in an effort to help the blood supply to my legs but it had no effect."

"The result was that they amputated my toes but it was clear that I needed further surgery."

"It might have been possible to save one of my feet but only after a whole series of painful operations."

"The surgeons believed that if I had both legs removed, there was a reasonable chance that it would be successful."

"I'd carried out many amputation operations myself and knew the challenges ahead, so Rachel and I made the decision to go ahead with below the knee amputation."

Recovery was long, painful and exhausting, involving intense physiotherapy and rehab training but he had to wait nearly two months for treatment after leaving hospital.

"It was a very difficult and at times depressing few months but it made me realise what amputees had to go through on the road to recovery." Undaunted, he returned to work part time in October 2019 and was back operating by February 2020.

"I started just before the Covid lockdown so I didn't time it very well! – but fortunately vascular surgery is a speciality that deals mostly with urgent or emergency."

"So the day to day impact has not been huge but we are all very proud how RCHT has coped with it all."

Neil continues to performing the very operation that he himself had undergone but also squeezes in time campaigning to improve services for amputees in Cornwall and further afield.

"I go out and talk to some learned societies, talk about our challenges on TV in a short documentary about my return to the operating theatre."

"There have been appearances on BBC Breakfast News and I also got on The Morning couch with Eamonn and Ruth!"

"Oh - and I have also found a bit of time to become an anatomy lecturer at the University of Exeter to help with the cause!"

It is all part of Neil's dedication into making sure all amputee patients have access to the best possible care and treatment after surgery and for clinics to provide better emotional support to patients.

"I've got through it and got to the other side and my patients can see that."

"Before my own surgery I had an academic, objective idea of what it was like to be an amputee but now I can talk to patients with a clear understanding of what the challenges they have to face."

"The thing we can easily change is that period of eight weeks between leaving hospital and getting new legs. That's the black hole nobody really thinks about."

"It's fair to say we've spent decades improving amputee care in hospital. We've got that bit right now, but it's that next bit that doesn't seem to be as good."

His courage and determination in adversity earned Neil the Amplifon Award for Brave Britons Against All Odds Champion.

Amplifon's judges said: "Neil's is an extraordinary story. He has gone far beyond the normal realms of human expectation and endurance."

"It was thought his career would be over when he lost

his legs by the knee but six months later he was back on his prosthetic feet carrying out operations again."

"In addition, he has launched his own campaign for better NHS after-care for amputees following his own experience."

A native Welsh speaker Neil did his GCSEs at Gwyr and then did his A levels in pure and Applied Maths, Chemistry and Physics whilst at Llandovery College.

"I have very fond memories of my days at the College, in and out of the classroom - and Dr Denley Owen in Physics, Mr J H Thomas in Maths and Mr Mark Snell in Chemistry were very influential in my future in "Sciences"

"I was particularly fond of Dr Owen who'd sometime skip the set Physics syllabus and tell us how to build a nuclear bomb!"

"I enjoyed the CCF and got into the shooting team and although not a rugby player, I did become the 1st XV camera man!"

Neil graduated top of his year from the University of Wales College of Medicine in Cardiff, followed by a first class degree in Anatomical Sciences and an honours degree in Medicine.

"Early in his career I developed a keen interest in vascular surgery mainly because it was reconstructive, no two operations were the same and having to operate on all parts of the body provided the variety to keep my interest"

Before completing his surgical training he travelled with his family to Sydney, Australia to undertake a surgical fellowship at the famous St. Vincent's Hospital, Sydney where he gained further experience in all aspects of vascular surgery - including advanced open and endovascular (keyhole) aortic aneurysm repairs.

Admitted into a Fellowship of the Royal College of Surgeon, Neil became a consultant vascular surgeon at the Vascular Institute for Cornwall (based at the Royal Cornwall Hospital, Truro (RCHT) in 2013 and provided varicose vein surgery at the Duchy Hospital, becoming the Clinical Lead for Vascular Surgery.

"We must see referrals happen much quicker" vowed the surgeon.

"When eventually I got my "new" legs, it was meant to take about four to six months to get walking and I did it in three hours!


"I don't know how. You would never have picked me ... a fat, unfit bloke who's a bit clumsy. All of a sudden I just put the legs on and could walk. I think that was partly due to the fact that I'd got myself stronger.

"That made me think how does that affect other people who have that eight weeks [between amputation and new legs] and they're getting weaker and weaker, and you ask them to do something that is physically quite demanding; getting up on prosthetic legs. It's hard work."

The man who was back operating ten months after losing both his legs to sepsis has become and remains a inspiration to all those amputees struggling to get their lives back after the trauma of drastic surgery.

BRANCHING OUT WITH '9TREES' A PRIME SUBSCRIPTION THAT CUTS CLIMATE CHANGE!



9Trees has started an ambitious task to plant nine trees for every UK person each year. Planting 9 trees each year will balance the average UK carbon consumption. This progressive approach is not going to be easy. Without support to plant 'Nine Trees Each Year', our mutual journey to carbon neutrality by 2050 will be arduous. Springing into action, 9Trees has created a pioneering subscription service allowing people to grow their own forest. As a result, three thousand broadleaf trees on the border of England and Wales are currently being planted on two hectares of land (two rugby pitches) in Radnorshire (Powys), Wales. Eight species of broadleaf tree will reforest the land. With eight more sites confirmed, 10,000 trees will be planted by December 2021.

Although planting trees is no substitute for burning fossil fuels, it can help mitigate against climate change. Climate change is one of the biggest threats to our ecosystems. Planting 9 Trees per person per year, will suck the carbon from the air and provide much-needed habitat for our local wildlife. The Climate Change Committee (CCC) suggests that around 30,000 hectares of broadleaf and conifer woodland need to be planted each year for 30 years to hit net zero emissions.

Michael Cunningham, (He / Him) 9Trees Co-Founder and Director explains, "The trees we plant now will be your legacy for the future. In 25 Years, they will be sequestering roughly 40lbs of carbon per annum. In 50 - 100 years time, each tree should have captured One Tonne of carbon. To reduce our carbon footprint, we need to draw down the carbon that we continue to create through our daily lives."

9Trees are pushing the boundaries of common tree planting at Powys with these three processes.

- 1. The woodland is grown from annual subscriptions. A process 9Trees hopes will spark a national 'Nine Trees Each Year' promise.
- 2. Each tree is geolocated so that subscribers can take a mindful walk in their very own woodlands throughout the UK.
- 3. The Woodland will be as natural as possible. No chemicals will be used in the making of this woodland. To protect the trees during early growth chestnut fencing has been erected, eco matting has been handmade and cardboard collected from local businesses will act as a grass suppressant.

The trees at Powys will grow into a network of habitats and over the next 50 years will be inhabited by a wild assortment of creatures living, nesting, and resting amongst native trees. One species of bird that 9Trees hope will set up residence is the Treecreeper, a curved bill bird that dances around trees in search of insects. Each tree has been specifically chosen for the location, putting the right tree in the right place. The three thousand broadleaf native trees will encourage biodiversity. The species include Oak, Silver Birch, Hawthorn, Rowan, Downy Birch, Elder, Blackthorn.

Ash Kent, (They / Them) 9Trees Co-Founder and Director, explains, "It's not just about planting trees to sequester carbon; we need to be creating woodlands that support the local wildlife and connect up existing habitats without destroying valuable species-rich grasslands or peat bogs."

9Trees hopes that their efforts will encourage our nation to make a promise and plant Nine Trees Per person per Year. A national movement will be a big step towards carbon neutrality and create woodlands for creatures and folk to enjoy for generations to come.



We are excited to announce that the creation of a mosaic mural and notice board, designed and made by the community of Llandeilo, is due to begin this April.

THE STORY SO FAR...

The idea started way back in 2019 as I lingered in front of noticeboards in shop doorways starting conversations with people who live and work in Llandeilo.

So much was happening then in Llandeilo and the notice boards we have were jam packed and overcrowded! From these chats I discovered that many people want more connection and communication with their community but not all on-line. They want to find out local information by word of mouth or via a notice board rather than always from facebook or other on-line platforms.

Together we also recognised that these boards of community communication were not in the most convenient of locations. Whilst reading the notices one needs to keep stepping out of the doorway to allow shoppers in and out of the shops. So, from these conversations, the idea germinated of a big central community notice board!

Around this time the sixth formers of Ysgol Bro Dinefwr created a fantastic mural on the wall of the tennis pavilion by the playground. This received much positive feedback and praise from local residents and so generated enthusiasm for another community mural.

It was these two elements that combined and inspired this project.

At a consultation event in December '19 it was decided that the mural and noticeboard would be located on the side wall of Hugh Evans and Son Butchers, in the walkway connecting the main car park to Rhosmaen Street. This is already a place where people meet and chat away from the busy high street traffic, so it's an ideal area for interaction with the noticeboard. And we already have a small but growing team of people offering to maintain the notice board once it's up and running. The surrounding mural will add a visually and texturally exciting focal point and draw attention to the notice board.

I have been working with Transition Tywi Trawsnewid to raise the funds necessary. We are delighted to announce that the project has now received funding from The National Lottery Community Fund. We are also being kindly supported by LBS and DL Williams.

In addition to the ever-expanding list of local people and groups already wanting to be involved in the project we will be publicising bilingually via posters on the very visible mural site wall and on the existing notice boards in Llandeilo. Also look out for what's happening here in The Post.

The Creation of the Mural

The mural will be designed and created by the community through dynamic, supportive and highly participatory workshops. These will be led by myself, Dani Lee and my team (danileearts.co.uk). We will be bringing together and actively involving many people from Llandeilo in creating an artwork the community will be proud of.

The project will kick off with some Ideas and Design Workshops.

The Mosaic Workshops will then bring us together again to create the ideas that we have designed. Once complete, the mural will then be installed along with the notice board in the walkway. All the workshops will be open to anyone living or working in or near Llandeilo.

VALUE OF THE PREMIERSHIP

Those who have doubted the value and importance of Welsh Premiership rugby to the regional and national game should think again in the light of recent events on the international scene writes Huw S Thomas

Man of the Match in the Wales v Ireland game and equally outstanding in the Welsh win at Murrayfield was former Llandovery prop Wyn Jones who spent years learning his trade in the tough world of the Premiership before turning professional with the Scarlets.

Known In the Llandovery locality by the name "Wyn Clynmawr" - from the farm outside the town which has been in family hands for generations - Jones has been turning in storming displays for region and country.

And he puts much of his success at the top level of the game down to his experience in the Premiership.

Wyn Jones remembers one game in particular that summed up his front row apprenticeship.

"One of the last games I played for the Drovers was a quarter final tie in front of a big crowd at Eugene Cross Park."

"The Ebbw pack was the best in the league with hard, tough, rough experienced players from 1 to 8 – Ross Jones, Matthew Williams, Rob Sevenoaks, Damien Hudd, Ashley Sweet, Rhys Clarke, Cameron Regan and Ronny Kynes."

"If you didn't stand up to them, they would run all over you and their close range line out was a huge part of their success but we matched them toe to toe in set and loose."

"That was as hard a game as I have ever played at any level and a wonderful learning curve for me – despite being sent off right at the end for maul infringements."

"That whole Cup campaign was a huge test for us and for me in particular as we came up two other very strong packs in Cardiff in the first round and then Pontypridd in the semi-final at neutral St Helen's."

"In the semi final game against Pontypridd at St Helen's, we cause a huge shock by beating the hot favourites for the Cup 25-16"

"Ponty - with fly half Ceri Sweeney back from his stay at Exeter Chiefs - were virtually winning everything at the semi-pro level and we had to put every ounce of energy and effort over 80 minutes to get the better of them."

"My last game for the club couldn't have been

better stage managed as it was against out fierce rivals Carmarthen Quins - Kieran (Hardy) and Ryan (Elias) were in their squad – and in the Welsh Cup Final, too, at the Principality Stadium"

"I scored one of the tries in our 25-18 win before moving full time to the Scarlets and it was a brilliant end to a long and happy association with my home town club which had a dedicated and knowledgeable committee under President Phil Davies and Chairman Handel Davies."

"It's true to say that such full on games prepared me well for the physicality of the professional and even international scene."

"And we were always encouraged by the Llandovery coaching team to be far more than scrummagers but to run, handle and off load to produce a style of rugby that was a joy to be part of."

"I've naturally had to work on my fitness and bulk up ready for confrontations with big men and adapt to the speed of the game but the professional has time on his hands to do this."

"There is a huge amount of raw talent in the Premiership, ready to step up a gear if only given the chance"

As a former first class hooker with Swansea, Euros Evans must take praise for his work with Jones as must veteran Llandovery prop Andrew Jones – a Barbarian - who played 577 games for the club in a wonderful 22 year career and who was always at hand to give his young prop advice and counsel on all front row matters.

"Cantona (aka Andrew Jones) was a specialist loose head and made me scrummage against him in training and talked me through all the tricks of his long lasting trade."

"Emyr Phillips and Dorian Williams also gave me invaluable help in aspects of forward play."

Now widely recognised as hard scrummaging, mobile, ball carrying forward, excelling at turnovers the loose head prop, the 28 year old is already being touted a British Lion by no less a figure as Sir Ian McGeechan.

Wyn Jones's story casts the Premiership in a fine light but also highlights fault lines in the Welsh set up- is the identification of talent good enough?

Not deemed good enough to get into the Scarlets

Academy or age group U16 and U18 teams, Jones learned his trade via the Junior Drovers set up at Church Bank before getting into the Youth team when a pupil at Llandovery's Ysgol Pantycelyn.

His natural strength - befitting a farmer used to manhandling stubborn sheep and rams - allied to powerful bursts in the loose and charging runs soon saw him come to the attention of the senior coaches at Church Bank.

The young farmer made his Drovers debut in 2011 as a 19 year old when studying for a degree in Agriculure at Aberystwyth Univerity and went on to play 90 club appearances in Premiership, Tovali Cup, Swalec Cup and British and Irish Cup games with additional games for local feeder Ammanford in his early days.

The highlight of the 2016 season for both Jones and the Drovers was the win over local rivals Carmarthen Quins in the final of the Swalec Cup in Cardiff on May 1, 2016, the prop scoring one of the three Llandovery tries.

Gareth Jenkins from the Scarlets had been keeping on eye on him in Premiership games and realised that here was a late developing talent who would prosper in the professional game

His outstanding play and well taken try convinced the powers that be at Parc Y Scarlets that here was indeed someone who could go all the way to the top.

Llandovery coach Euros Evans echoed his club's thoughts.

"We were sorry to see Wyn go but our role and duty is to prepare players to make the step into regional rugby and hopefully beyond."

"Playing against older more experienced props is how young props learn. Every game you are learning not only from your opponent but from your team mates, working together to solve problems."

"Wyn learnt quickly and at young age he was one of the best props in the Premiership and when he was at this level he was ready to transition to the pro game."

"Not only does the Premiership help develop their playing skills, it also helps them understand the importance of a team culture, the role they play within a team, develop resilience and help them understand the importance of winning games, these skills are essential in the professional game."

"He learned his trade in the hard world of uncompromising Premiership forward play, in the cold and wet, facing props who might have played a few hundred Premiership games and who would find weaknesses in young props as a matter of satisfaction and pride."

"I remember the year we won the Cup. Wyn had a great game against the renowned Ebbw Vale pack when he gave us a solid scrum and was a key part in stopping their famous driving line out."

And another player who had a sound apprenticeship in the Premiership with Carmarthen Quins was scrum half Kieran Hardy - who was influential when he came on for Gareth Davies in the last half hour against Scotland.

Every Premiership club has prepared many a young player for the professional game including current Welsh players.

Between 2011 and 2015 he scored 65 points in 59 appearances for the Quins, then moved to the Scarlets from where he was capped against Italy in 2018.

Each of the Premiership teams can boast of similar successes but Llandovery's list of those given chances with the club to go on to better things makes impressive reading.

Top of the list is Emyr Phillips who played 130 times for the club, mentoring fellow farmer Wyn Jones on the way before moving to the Scarlets from where he gained three Welsh caps.

And if we go a little further back, we can see how successful were stints at the club for future internationals.

Coaches Iestyn Thomas, Rob Appleyard, Lyndon Lewis and Euros Evans moulded many a good player into a better one.

Future internationals Dafydd Jones, Tal Selley, Mark Jones, Adam Warren, Sam Parry, Rhodri Williams all testify to the importance of their formative Church Bank years.

42 times capped back row Jones came via Aberaeron made 31 appearances for the Drovers - 22 in one season in the pre-Premiership National League Division One.

Four times capped hooker Sam Parry played 17 times all in one season (2010-2011), wing Tal Selley – one of only three Welsh players to play for the four different Welsh regions - turned out 30 times and Adam Warren made 53 appearances in scoring 105 points.

The star back to come thought the club before going onto great things has been wing Mark Jones who came from Builth Youth and in season 1998-1999 ran in a record breaking 21 tries in 26 appearances.



To see him haring down the wing with the speed, balance and elegance of a gazelle thrilled home supporters as never before - or perhaps since - and he played 43 times in the white and red shirt before having a glittering career with the Scarlets and then Wales for whom he scored 13 tries in 47 internationals.

Current Dragons captain Rhodri Williams will be remembered at Church Bank for his darting, sniping runs which saw him 12 tries in 44 appearances before eventually playing three times at scrum half for Wales.

This sextet all played for Wales but here are a host of others who have graduated from Church Bank into the profesional ranks – the likes of lock Lyndon Bateman (67 games), Simon Emms (23), Rhodri Gomer Davies (19) and Peter Edwards (106) whilst many others made impressions at Llandovery when lent out from the Scarlets for reasons of rehabilitation and recovery, urgently needed game time.

The Premiership has also been invaluable in providing opportunities for internationals to recover their form and fitness in a competitive environment - Lou Reed, Andy Powell, Rob McCusker, Vernon Cooper, Josh Turnbull, Garan Evans, Aisea Havili, Nathan Brew, Tadgh Beirne were all Scarlets who re-found form or favour or new life after short stints at in the Premiership.

As was Canadian Jamie Cudmore who - unrated by the Scarlets - ended up playing 23 games 2002-2003 in the then National League Fist Division before being voted in France as one of the greatest of all locks in the French Top 14.

Critics of the Premiership - or National One that was should also realise that regions have made serious errors of judgement in not identifying or nurturing talent in the Premiership.

As an example, two players missed by the Welsh system made huge impacts with Exeter – Phil Dollman and One of Tom O'Flaherty.

Cardiff University student O'Flaherty played for Cardiff towards the end of 2013 and scored four tries in four appearances before a move to Bridgend where he scored 18 tries in 25 appearances in the 2014-15 Premiership season and scoring the match-winning try against Pontypridd in the Swalec Cup Final.

He was not offered a contract by Blue or Ospreys so he spent a season in France in the Top 14 with Montpellier.



On his return to Wales, he had joint registration with Bridgend and the Ospreys but his talent went unrecognised and he only played just a few games of any importance for the Ospreys before joining Exeter where he has become a leading light in Premiership and European Cup campaigns.

Centre Phil Dollman played four years with Bedwas in the Premiership under the ever astute eye and coaching of Steve Law who always considered his protégé top regional quality but was underused by the Dragons.

Released, he moved on to Exeter in 2009 where he became a key figure with his ability to play all over the back line, won a Premiership title with the Chiefs and ended up playing nearly250 games for them over 11 seasons.

And let's not remember that the Premiership/ National One was the learning place of one of the great Welsh players of recent times – James Hook who spent two years at Neath before being offered an Ospreys contract.

The WRU should cherish the Premiership and morally, sportingly and financially support the efforts of the clubs to successfully prepare players – the likes of Wyn Jones – for the international scene.

With coaches the like of Steve Law, Jason Hyatt, Dale McIntosh, Euros Evans, Justin Burnell and Josh Turnbull at the ready, the Union needs to invest in the clubs, coaches and players who will help strengthen the pursuit of excellence in the Welsh game.



"IT ALL STARTED WHEN I NEEDED A NICE TABLECLOTH!"

In December 2018 Anne and Damian Ward of Llangammarch Wells had family over for a one off Christmas visit from Australia and South Africa.

When looking for a 'nice tablecloth' in a bag of assorted white goods in the Brecon British Red Cross Shop, she found a bedspread which has taken her and her family on a time traveling AND international journey of incredible historical discoveries. They have been to villages and towns in the UK and Wales, to Flanders Fields, the Somme at 1916, Hollywood USA, a Benedictine Abbey in Ireland, and to Australia, New Zealand, Canada and South Africa- and all during a world wide lockdown.

This bedspread is hand embroidered with twelve regimental badges that were all active in World War One. It is entirely, and uniquely, in white work and bordered with machine made filet lace- 26 metres of it. It has been dated to have been made between 1916 and 1920 and by very skilled hands, as confirmed by the Royal School of Needlework and the British Embroidery Guild.

But there is no information on WHO, WHY or WHERE it was made as there is no label or signature on it. Anne and Damian have been doing extensive research, trying to find these answers so as to give it as much provenance as possible so that its story, whatever it is, can be told by the museum they are donating it to. The Charity Shop could not tell them how they came by it and local appeals to try and find its donor/last owner have been unsuccessful.

They have written a book, entitled 'Twelve Secret Voices' about their research and the bedspreads possible origins which is now available.

"We as a family have a lot of theories that even experts we have consulted agree with. Just a few of the many there are include: That it was sewn by soldiers convalescing from wounds, or those receiving specialist treatment, as a gift for one of the medical team.

'Lap Crafts' were taught to occupy patients who were bed-ridden for extended periods of time, including embroidery, crotchet, knitting and basket weaving. It was the start of what we today know as Occupational Therapy.

Embroidery was seen as so mentally productive to these men in the First World War that in World War Two, embroidery kits were even included in British POW relief parcels.

Another theory is that it was made by continental refugees as a thank you gift for someone in England who showed a particular kindness to their plight or maybe made a significant fundraising contribution.

Over 200000 refugees came to the UK from Belgium, France and Russia from 1914 onwards. They were welcomed and accommodated by civilians who wanted to 'do their bit' but they also set up their own communities such as 'Elisabethville' (named after the Queen of Belgium) near Folkstone. Despite the language barrier, they took jobs locally and in turn contributed to the war effort. There were even ammunition factories that were entirely managed and staffed by refugees who were after all able bodied and skilled men and women. When the war ended, they were offered free passage back to the continent and by 1921 records show that 90% had done so.

One more theory is that it was sewn by an embroidery college or club for a war, or post-war, fundraising exhibition and sale. The quality of the needlework definitely lends merit to this theory.

All sorts of fundraising incentives were done in all the

countries involved in the war. In Australia there was a national 'Belgium Day' in May as well as 'Australia Day' in July. Rosettes were sold, balls and concerts organized and all sorts of fundraising ideas were employed. Similarly in New Zealand, there are accounts telling of the same methods as Australia but we also found a story of how school children contributed their pocket money coppers to make money trails AND knitted socks for soldiers. So a specially made, exhibited and then sold high quality item such as this bedspread can certainly be considered.

We may never find out its reason for being made and where it has been these last 100 years, but it will be available to be seen and be puzzled over at the National Army Museum of London to which it has been donated.


