

ABERGLASNEY GARDENS' HEAD GARDENER, JOSEPH ATKIN, EXPLAINS HOW WE CAN USE ROSES IN ALL AREAS OF THE GARDEN

One of the great things about gardens is that they should never stand still and this is certainly the case at Aberglasney. Each year we try to improve on the display, usually by lengthening the season of interest or by creating new features. These types of changes and projects are usually carried out in the winter. Over the last two years we have done a great deal of work with roses building a Rose Arber and planting a huge Rose wall. This has led to us looking at how we can use Roses in other areas of the garden. This is primarily by mixing them into our other displays which are mainly informal. Over the years we have found that the more common Tea Roses are both hard to grow and use. This is mainly due to the climate at Aberglasney and the type of garden we have. This has meant we have had to try the more unusual or wilder roses which make excellent garden plants.

The great advantage of these Roses is that they get less disease but also make excellent garden plants. Many have the added advantage of attractive foliage, nice hips, or autumn colour, which means they can be mixed with other shrubs very well. Another bonus is that many flower in midsummer which is often a hard time to get flowers in the shrub border.


The Rugosa types are extremely useful plants as they flower all summer and make a good foliage plant with hips and autumn colour. The make excellent hedges or screens, we often use them at the back of borders to add height. The Rugosa and most of these types of Roses also have excellent fragrance. There is one white one planted on a corner which always seems to have a visitor with their nose buried in it.

We also grow many ramblers which provide a wonderful burst of colour and scent in early summer. As they are so vigorous, they make a huge impact and are excellent for covering large walls or garages. They can also be grown as free-standing shrubs but they take up a huge amount of room.

There are some excellent shrub Roses that are much more manageable, we grow the Gallica Roses in the formal Cloisters where they make a wonderful display mixed with Lavandula Angustifolia and Erigeron Karvinskianus. Another type of shrub Rose which does very well with us is the moss Rose which again provides good foliage, but they also have very fragrant old fashioned type flowers. These are generally early flowering usually in June which can be a bonus.

We are trying a great number of old fashioned and wild Roses in different areas of the Gardens which is very exciting as they allow for new combinations and add interest at different times of the year. Generally, Roses need a fair amount of sun and therefore what you grow with them needs the same. When you use shrub Roses in borders there is a great opportunity to plant next and under them to give a long season of interest. So far, we have tried Snowdrops and Hellebore for early spring Narcissus and Tulip for mid spring and Allium 'Purple sensation' for late spring. By this time the Roses come into flower and with some variety you will have blooms all season. Cranesbill, Delphinium and Hollyhocks will make great midsummer companions. Elsewhere in the Gardens we are mixing the natural looking Roses with shrubs and under planting with robust ground cover perennials like Comfrey. So, whether we want high or low maintenance areas there is still a place for these types of Roses which in themselves are less work than the normal Tea Roses. So thorns aside, they are well worth thinking about.

LLANWRTYD HERITAGE AND ARTS CENTRE LAUNCHES NEW HERITAGE TRAIL

On 2nd April 2022 the Mayor of the town, Jim Davies, will unveil the first plaque in the new trail that has been developed around Llanwrtyd Wells.

Funded by the National Lottery, there are two trails, the Town Trail takes approximately 45 minutes and the Country Trail about 90 minutes both easy, predominately flat walking.

Each building/location will have a special plaque with a brief description and the trail will be clearly marked with waymarkers.

We would encourage people to first visit the Heritage Centre and collect a brochure which gives information about the locations and a map of the route.

We are particularly pleased to offer a Children's Trail which follows the same route as the main trail but has been developed to encourage children to learn about the history by 'finding the frogs' along both the town and country trails. A special Children's brochure is available from the Centre which details their trail, giving historic information along with puzzles and questions which can be answered by following the route and then on return to the Centre they will be given a gift for the successful completion of the booklet. Thus providing an entertaining walk for the whole family.

Brochures are also available from dispensers by the door when the Centre is closed.

Many of the locations in the town have an interesting history and walking the Heritage Trail is an excellent way of learning about Llanwrtyd Wells and taking in the beautiful surroundings and we hope will be enjoyed by residents and visitors alike.

LLANDOVERY MUSEUM SET TO REOPEN AFTER WINTER BREAK

Good news from Llandovery Museum, which hopes to reopen by Easter. Although it has been closed during the winter months, volunteers have been busy cataloguing the contents and rearranging the displays.

"We are now looking forward to welcoming visitors, hoping that the response will be as good as last year," said Curator Jane Carter.

Jane would also like to find out more about the clog makers who were once active in the Llandovery area.

At one time, tall stacks of clog soles were a familiar sight in the vicinity, with as many as thirty men sometimes working in one camp.

After splitting a piece of wood, the bark was removed before the wood was roughly shaped with a small axe. The pieces were then thrown into a tent where the clog soles were made.

These would be divided into four piles, according to size, and dried in huge stacks, before being shipped to Lancashire.

There they were hollowed, and the leather uppers were attached. The clogs were then ready to be worn by millworkers in Rochdale, Bolton, Preston, and other cotton towns.



The post of town councillor is voluntary; however, there is a small annual gratuity towards expenses. As councillors, we are expected to serve on subcommittees, which may mean extra meetings, usually held in the evenings, some months, and attend town events.

We try our best to serve the town's people as best as we can. Unfortunately, we do not have the power to make decisions on everything we would like; however, we have good contacts and can be an essential voice in getting things done. Welcome to Episode 2 of "Ask A Celebrant" where Dinah and I answer your questions pertaining to the role of a Celebrant.

Firstly, thank you all for you feedback following our first episode. This column hopefully will, tempt you to seek us out on you favourite media player. Episode 1 focused on what a celebrant actually is and does It introduced us and discussed how wide a variety there is within the independent celebrant community. As with its name, the purpose of Ask A Celebrant is that we answer your questions and, after the first episode, we received loads.

A large bulk of those questions related to weddings. After the whole trauma of covid, along with wedding postponement; wedding supplier closures and loss of deposits; many couples chose to rethink and go for a smaller, more intimate celebration. Couples seemingly began to pare back and focus on the real reasons for wanting to get married and have a wedding celebration. Which parts of the process were truly reflective of them? Some chose to get on and get the legal bit done, the marriage contract, and have a wedding celebration at a later date, or an anniversary celebration a year on, instead. Some decided to cut out the legal bit all together and just find a celebrant, take their most important friends, and exchange promises under their favourite tree. The focus became more about the two of them and how they felt, and what they wanted to say to each other. Many chose a location that had a personal significance to them... even their garden, the venue of their first date, or their local beauty spot where they'd walked and exercised during the lengthy lockdowns.

The 'micro wedding' became, and remains, popular. Least of all for its smaller budget. Many people decided they wanted to celebrate in a more environmentally conscious way. Others saw the benefit of retaining the cash for a deposit on a future home. Others realised how less stressed they felt at the thought of not having to walk down an aisle or speak in front of a large group.

There are lots of ways and reasons to celebrate love, unity, and commitment. There's the marriage, the micro-wedding, the big fancy wedding of course. Then there's vow renewals when you hit a landmark number of years; 10th, 20th, 25th anniversary. But what about other reasons? What about those times when appreciating you partner should be more than a date night, a snog, or a small gift? Maybe between you, you have achieved something magnificent. Maybe you've survived some trauma together and want to express how the other helped you. Perhaps it's time to acknowledge or reaffirm how much you appreciate your partner; thank them for how much more magnificent you are with them than you already were! Perhaps you have added to your family and want to welcome that element into your partnership.

There are lots of reasons to create a ceremony to acknowledge, recognise and celebrate your partnership; what you give to each other; what you've survived; and how you promise to support each other into the future. We'd describe these celebrations as 'non-weddings'. And we're big fans.

Ask the Celebrant is a conversational podcast answering your questions and goes live monthly on 28th of each month. The first episode introduced the two of us and clarified in more details what a Celebrant actually is. The next episode focuses on rethinking weddings and looking at other reasons to celebrate love, unity, and commitment.

Future episodes are up to you and will depend on the questions you ask. We will even be bringing along guest speakers.



HATS OFF TO THE LLANDEILO LITFEST FOR REINVENTING ITSELF

When the pandemic struck last year, the festival went fully online. This year it will take advantage of the newly refurbished brand new Hengwrt (formerly known as Shire Hall) with its beautiful ambience and modern equipment.

In its fifth year the festival will go fully live again but also allow remote access via zoom streaming for some events.

"I'm so pleased with the programme the team came up with this year," says festival chair Christoph Fischer. "Llandeilo is a town of high standard festivals and we want to match the success of previous events."

NEW DEVELOPMENTS FOR YOUNGSTERS IN LLANDEILO

Following several consultations with youngsters in Llandeilo, the Llandeilo Children and Youth Society has decided to start operating an After School Club in the downstairs room of the Civic Hall. An agreement with the Civic Hall has been reached and the Society hopes to operate the club from mid-April.

"While we had big plans to set up a full-blown Youth Club, the kids we chatted to really just wanted a cosy place with WiFi and other amenities to hang out in," explains society chairman Christoph Fischer. "In a way this has made our life easier to start with as we do not need qualified youth workers but only supervising staff. We're now looking for volunteers as well as any soft furnishing donations, preferably beanie bags that can easily be stored away."

One of the reasons the program can now go ahead is that the Society is teaming up with Llandeilo Box of Fists Gym, which will share the location and bring it to use at times and days when the After School Club isn't operating.

"We both want the same thing," says Box of Fists founder Woody Lewis. "Get kids off the streets, stop antisocial behaviour, create a safe space and fight boredom. Box of Fists received a community fund from CAVS and by pooling our resources with the Llandeilo Youth and Children Society we can have sole use of the premises in the Civic Hall and make our money stretch further."



"After two years of setbacks because of the pandemic and locations becoming unavailable this is absolutely fantastic," glows Fischer. "We still have bigger ambitions and plans on the back burner, but for now it's a huge step in the right direction."

Box of Fists will run classes for children, adults and for those with different abilities. The After School Club will be open to youngsters between the ages of 14 and 18 years of age.

RUTH BIDGOOD (1922 – 2022)



The poet Ruth Bidgood, a member of Llandovery u3a, has died just four months short of her centenary. She was one of Wales's finest English language poets, producing a substantial body of work over five decades.

Her poems evoke the landscape of mid-Wales and the people in that landscape. In 2011, she won the prestigious Roland Mathias prize. In 2019,

she became a Fellow of Aberystwyth University.

Ruth was born in Seven Sisters, went to school in Port Talbot and in 1940 on to St Hugh's College, Oxford where she read English. She then served as a Wren, working as a coder in Cairo. After the War, she lived in Surrey, married, brought up a family and worked for Chambers, the publisher.

She and her husband bought a bungalow in Abergwesyn. It was after she moved to Wales full-time that she began to write poetry in earnest. It will be for her poetry that she will be best known, but she also did considerable research into the history of her 'milltir sgwâr', publishing articles in several journals.

We felt privileged in the u3a to have her as a member. She contributed much, especially to our poetry group. We shall miss her.

to how we can best help. Some of it is deleted as it is intended primarily for Rotary members.

Dear President.

As we watch the unbelievably ugly situation in the Ukraine develop it is clear that a great deal of humanitarian support will be needed. Rotary is not in the business of disaster response and we need to concentrate our efforts initially on the humanitarian needs of refugees. I know that we as Rotarians can and will do as much as we can to assist those people who have been displaced within the Ukraine or have arrived as refugees in bordering countries.

I know that there has already been an incredible amount of activity across the District with street collections and clubs pledging money from their charity accounts. This is as well as personal donations from individual Rotarians. There is also evidence that some Clubs have been busy collecting supplies and equipment that will be transported to Ukraine's border. Many Clubs have historical contacts with Clubs in Poland and are pursuing avenues of support through these clubs.

It is, however, important that we make a considered and co-ordinated approach. I know some clubs have been making substantial donations to Shelterbox. News today is that refugee camps will probably not be set up and that those fleeing Ukraine will be housed in available accommodation in countries across Europe and the UK.

We will of course very soon find that some Ukrainians

will arrive in southern Wales and we will need to have a cohesive plan of support in place. This is not going to be a sprint and we must plan for the long term needs of refugees wherever they are

My intention is to set up a District Task Force who will be able to draw together all the strands of information available and develop an action plan. I would like to see this include:

- · A central fund of donations held in the District
- Creative use of any unused District Grant money
- Finding matching grants so that we can leverage the money
- Drawing in any unspent money from the current year budget
- · Starting a Crowdfunding project.
- · Decide on how funds will be spent

Advice from RI is not to send any money to Ukrainian bank accounts as the status and stability of the banking system.

I have added a 'Donations Route' diagram that may assist you in making decisions for contributing.

The community surrounding the National Botanic Garden of Wales was instrumental in helping the Regency Restoration project gain international acclaim with the presentation today (March 3) of the Institution of Civil Engineers (ICE) coveted People's Choice Award.

The winner of this award is decided by a global public vote and was last won by the Zhuhai-Macao Bridge in Hong Kong which shows the scale of the competition and the magnitude of the win.

The success of the Botanic Garden's restoration project involved an impressive number of local people, groups and organisations across Carmarthenshire, from the council, schools and local volunteers to groups such as the Dinefwr Photographic Society, Mencap, Barod and Cyfle Cymru.

The project also promoted local procurement from the early planning stages.

The Award was presented by Ed McCann, 157th ICE President who was joined by the Welsh Government Deputy Minister for Art and Sport, Dawn Bowden, Botanic Garden director Huw Francis, and representatives of the principal contractor WM Longreach. The project team behind key design and project management from Mann Williams, Nicholas Pearson Partnership LLP, Caroe and Partners Architects, HR Wallingford - Reservoir Engineer and project manager Helen John were also in attendance.

Mr McCann said: "It is a pleasure to meet those involved in this marvellous project.

"It is unique in the way that it brought together local civil engineering and other organisations to deliver the project and engage with local schoolchildren, sharing their expertise to ensure that our work towards a sustainable future is in good hands".

The National Botanic Garden of Wales Regency Restoration project, which took five years to complete at a cost of more than £7 million, is the largest of its kind in Wales and included two new lakes, bridges, dams, cascades, a waterfall and an extensive network of paths, all set in 300 acres of wooded parkland.

Welsh Government deputy minister Dawn Bowden said: "This project is a shining example of a sustainable development supporting our economic, social, environmental and cultural well-being."

Ms Bowden added: "Building resilience into our natural resources and ecosystems, so that these benefits are available now – and for our future generations – is vital."

Huw Francis said: "This successful project has been a fantastic team effort and is receiving huge approval from the thousands of visitors who have already visited."

The project was also awarded the ICE Alun Griffiths Community Award recognising the involvement of the local community during the process and completion of the work. The award was presented by Ken Evans, Chair ICE Wales Cymru.

There should be no doubt about the scale of action needed to adapt to the climate emergency the Chief Executive of Natural Resources Wales (NRW) said today (15 March) as the environment body welcomed the Welsh Government's financial commitment to strengthening the nation's flood and coastal defences.

The Minister for Climate Change, Julie James MS has outlined a range of projects that will be supported over the forthcoming year as part of the Flood and Coastal Erosion Risk Management, 2022-23 programme of investment.

With 1 in 8 (around 245,000) properties in Wales are at risk of flooding, the commitment will enable NRW to progress its plans to build and maintain flood defences across key flood risk areas across the nation.

The announcement comes in the weeks following the publication of the latest Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) report which underscored the urgency with which the world should act to mitigate against climate impacts.

Extreme weather events are expected to become more frequent and more severe in Wales in the future. Just four months on from COP26, where world leaders committed themselves to rapid action on climate change, the scale of the task is deemed more urgent than ever.

Clare Pillman, Chief Executive of Natural Resources Wales said:

"Investing in and maintaining flood defences will always be at the heart of Wales' approach to managing flood risk, and we welcome this commitment from the Welsh Government to improve defences and to support flood risk projects for the forthcoming year.

"The IPCC report published last month highlighted the need for the urgent delivery of effective adaptation measures, and how actions we take today will shape how people adapt and how nature responds to future shocks.

"This means putting our ambitions for a climate and nature recovery on equal footing and using all the levers at our disposal to manage flood risk.

"We need to embed of a mix of flood risk management approaches that includes both hard engineering and nature-based measures to improve Wales' resilience to extreme weather. That means working both upstream to reduce the risk of flooding and working downstream to ensure that when flooding does occur communities suffer minimum damage and can recover quickly.

"The scientific evidence is undeniable - climate change is making it harder to hold weather-related shocks at arm's length, and the IPCC's report and COP26 commitments should leave nobody in any doubt about the scale of action needed right now to tackle the emergency."

Across the whole of Wales, 73,000 properties at risk of flooding already benefit from NRW's flood defences.

Pending relevant permissions and approvals, the schemes earmarked to benefit from the flood programme 2022/23 include:

NEW PROJECTS

• The development of a strategic flood risk management masterplan for the whole River Taff catchment in response to the February 2020



floods. NRW has been carrying out detailed flood risk modelling in the Lower Taff catchment and the River Cynon and Rhondda rivers to support the next phase of work planned to develop the plan. This work is being done in collaboration with all flood risk management authorities in this area.

- **Pwllheli**, **Gwynedd** A new scheme to address both river and tidal flood risk to hundreds of properties on the Llyn Peninsula.
- Cowbridge, Vale of Glamorgan commencing construction work to meet NRW's statutory obligations under the Reservoir Act to deliver safety improvements to the flood storage area protecting the communities of Cowbridge and Llanblethian.
- Afon Wydden in Llandudno, Conwy commencing construction work to meet our statutory obligations under the Reservoir Act to deliver safety improvements to the upstream storage area protecting the community of Llandudno Junction along with critical infrastructure such as the A470.

ONGOING PROJECTS

- Stephenson Street, Newport commencing construction work to improve tidal flood defences in the Liswerry area of Newport reducing the risk of flooding to 194 homes and 620 businesses.
- Llyn Tegid, Bala, Gwynedd continuing the ongoing construction on reservoir safety works to the embankments and structures which surround Y Bala.
- Ammanford, Carmarthenshire construction work to improve local flood defences in Ammanford which will benefit 289 homes and 13 businesses.
- Cardigan, Ceredigion progress scheme development for areas liable to tidal flooding in the town around the Strand and St Mary Street and develop design work ahead of future defence construction.
- Llanfair Talhaiarn, Conwy completion of construction work on culvert improvements already undertaken in the village and community and consideration of other measures within the local catchment.

Funding will also be available to help progress detailed appraisal work and flood risk project development work in Tenby, Llangefni, Porthmadog, Liswerry Pill in Newport, Aberdulais and in Bangor on Dee.

NRW will also receive funding to continue its substantial improvement project on its Flood Warning and ICT systems and other related services such as the flood forecasting and telemetry systems. This will help progress some of the actions outlined and the lessons learnt in the reviews of the February 2020 floods when NRW called for a seismic shift in how Wales responds to the climate emergency and manages its future flood risk.

The funding settlement will also enable NRW to progress important mapping and modelling work to inform future potential flood schemes and coastal adaptation planning. It will also support the delivery of many smaller projects across Wales including maintenance to the hydrometric work and the refurbishing and repairing of its network of flood defence structures.



As a result of the Covid pandemic, it has been a while since choir members have been out and about practising and performing.

The evening will be introduced by BBC Radio Wales presenter Roy Noble.

Tickets for each concert are £10, and will be available this month from members of the Choir.
