## CANOLFAN **GYMDEITHASOL** LLANGADOG COMMUNITY CENTRE



After a period of uncertainty about its future, Llangadog Community Centre is now seeing a revival in its use by the community and a range of events being put on to entertain and encourage people to come along and support the hall and bring it back as a hub for the village.

Currently, there is the Village Market every second Sunday of the month which has a selection of produce from local producers and traders or just the chance to have a cup of tea and chat. There are several clubs and societies who meet at the hall. These include a Knit and Natter group, the Llangadog WI, Merched Y Wawr, the OAP group and Llangadog Gardening Club to name a few. The local Brownies also meet at the hall.

Activities available to join are dance fitness classes. learning a language, karate or having a game of badminton and there is a full-size snooker table available for use. There are regular whist drive evenings and bingo, quizzes and charity auctions organised by local groups. Cadog Film Club meets regularly, and they will be starting a new programme of films in the autumn. More musical, theatrical and children's events are also being planned.

Over the last year, the hall has had performances by the Battling Butler Circus Group, a Children's Film with a visit from Father Christmas, a wonderful evening of music with the Tim Kliphuis trio and a musical duo whose music reflected their interest in the environment. There have been Eistedfodd events, historical talks, harp workshops as well as birthday parties, wakes and many other gatherings.

Upcoming events are: August the 3rd, HeARTworks, a local community organisation, are hosting an evening of song and stories with Welsh singer and songwriter, Owen Shiers and renowned storyteller Cath Little. On September 20th, there will be a Bingo Night organised by Llangadog Church. More events are scheduled for the



autumn and all the regular groups and activities will be taking place. Information about these is on the Facebook page Llangadog Matters and Community Support, and here in The Post.

So, after a rather barren period, partly due to the effects of Covid 19, the hall is now a place where there are opportunities for entertainment, learning, sport, getting fit, joining interest groups and being able to buy from local traders and a place which, hopefully, offers something for everyone in the community.

Over the coming year, we would like to see even more groups making use of the hall and more people using it for their own events, clubs and activities and we are always happy to have suggestions about what people would like to see happening or being offered.

The hall offers the opportunity for both large and small occasions. The main hall is perfect for large numbers and concerts as it has a stage which has a full surround sound system and stage lighting. The YMCA is useful for smaller groups and there is the Green Room for meetings and small group activities. There is a fully equipped kitchen available for use when hiring.



I now have a dynamic hip screw holding me together. Thanks to Dan, Emma, Katie and the rest of the family and my good friends I am making excellent progress. A big thank you to everyone involved in my care.

The day after I returned home from hospital we were off to Laugharne for a day with Arts Care, Gofal Celf. Dan took on the mantle and together with Terressa got everyone safely to the car park ready for an enjoyable and different day. Firstly everyone was issued with earphones and given instructions. Everyone found themselves a space and following the instructor moved to the music. Dan said that despite reservations to start he enjoyed and amazed at how many people stopped to take photos and watch. After eating their packed lunch it was time to do some craftwork. Using reeds they were helped to make a very attractive star. Huge thank you to Dan and Terresa, and the instructors in Laugharne a very enjoyable day had by all, and the weather wasn't too bad either.

Jane joined us in June to give us a demonstration on the craft of felting. She started off by explain how she got involved in the craft. Having been told as a young girl that she lacked artistic skills ,she has gone on to prove to that teacher just how wrong they were as she has produced so many wonderful articles over the last few years. Having qualified as a nurse she eventually went into Medical management until 7 years ago she decided to take up felting full time. Returning to her family home, she has converted the garage into a very efficient workspace where she holds classes and makes her different felt treasures. There are different types of felting and she showed us a variety of different types. Having found a love of saris as a source of material to add to her Nano felting, she has found a love of India which she loves to visit as often as possible. Felt is a fabric made from wool, water and agitation. Within the wool are hidden barbs which open up and join together

when the wool, hot water and a little, liquid soap are agitated together. Jane has discovered that local wool is a firm type and although good for some articles, because of strength it is too course for wearing so she uses marino wool which is much softer. The silk from the saris is cut into strips and added to the wool and also becomes incorporated into the wool as it is agitated. Having taken my girls for a day's workshop last Christmas I can promise you it is a very enjoyable experience. Thank you Jane. I'm sorry no one took you up on the chance to have a go, their loss. July is our day trip to Tenby. Everyone enjoyed last year so I hope if the weather is kind to us we will have another enjoyable time.

We always welcome new members, guests, any age or gender. We meet on the last Wednesday of the month at 1.45 in Rhys Pritchard Memorial Hall, we enjoy a talk, and a cuppa and an opportunity to chat and make friends. We have occasional trips further afield. ## RE-THINK SUMMER UPDATE

We've had a few very busy months. With the Bute energy statutory consultations happening in the three villages near Radnor Forest, local community meetings, a drop-in session to support everyone and a fantastic meeting in the Metropole there was not a dull moment. The statutory consultations raised more questions then were answered and RE-think was there to support and provide facts taken from Bute's documentation. Many people attended, contacted us for information and wrote to Bute with their concerns. RE-think also made sure that local and national representatives were made aware of our concerns about the impact the largescale industrialisation proposed by Bute energy on the environment, the countryside and local wildlife and businesses. We are now waiting for Bute's announcement of the planning application, which they expect will happen late summer '24. More raising concerns and writing to do! Green-gen meanwhile have been granted the license for the pylon and power lines with some modifications by OFGEM. Anyone who is contacted or receives a letter and is concerned, please get in touch with your local action group for support. But all is not lost! The Green-gen Towy-Usk line only becomes necessary if the wind energy parks that parent company Bute Energy proposes to build around Builth Wells are granted permission. We need to stop Bute Energy by showing that their project does nothing for Wales other than destroying the countryside, communities and wildlife. And finally, some positive news. ### WELSH TALENT AT ITS BEST

The winners of the second Art Competition held by the Llanwrtyd & District Heritage and Arts Centre were announced at a special preview evening held on the 6th July.

More than seventy invited guests viewed the exhibition which comprised of eighty pieces chosen from the original one hundred submissions and there was a varied interpretation of the theme 'A Moment in Time' from the Welsh based artists. The display included a variety of mediums including work in oils, pastels, pencil, acrylics together with litho-prints, photography, collage and mixed media.

The panel of judges which included Wendy Connelly and Robin Bailey from Raw-I Studios in Chester, Brent Blair owner of the Lion Street Gallery in Hay-on-Wye and Chris Matchett art restorer, all practising artists with a history of international exhibiting, had a very difficult decision on the night. They were impressed by the brilliant and creative photography and interesting technical pieces in addition to the more traditional work and felt that the standard was very high with wonderful pieces providing great variety and a superb exhibition. Particular commendation was given to Simon Lilly.

However, eventually Charlotte Vickery was chosen as the winner for 'Calidos Recuerdos' which the judges felt 'was a challenging composition with an excellent use of a minimal palette - the flashes of under painting adding vibrancy.' Charlotte received a prize of £500 sponsored by Charcroft Electronics Ltd based in Llanwrtyd Wells.

Second prize of £250, sponsored by Lofftwen Forest Farm, was awarded to Barbara Simon for her work 'Doorstep' which was considered to be a 'relatable narrative with a bold technique resulting in subtleties of colour and texture which added depth.'

The third prize of  $\pm 100$  sponsored by Llanwrtyd resident Col. Tim Van Rees, will be awarded as a result of a Visitors' Choice vote. Visitors to the Heritage Centre throughout

July had the opportunity to view the exhibition and vote for their favourite with the winner subsequently announced in August.



"We were delighted with the number of entries, diverse interpretation of the theme, various mediums used and the wide-ranging geographical response' Lynne Brookes, Centre Manager told the audience adding "we are so lucky that Wales has such a wealth of talent and creativity and the Centre is honoured to have the opportunity to display some of this artistic ability through this competition."




## "COME FOR A CUPPA"

They decided to stop at what is now known as Llanddeusant – the religious community of two saints.

Our present church was built in the 14th century, doubling in size in the 15th century as the population grew. Victorian times saw more renovations, yet still retaining the ancient

As part of the event, studio potter, Carole Spackman, is opening her wild meadow garden for visitors. Her garden is a beautiful place to relax & enjoy nature. #### MUSEUM NOTES THE CAPTAIN, HIS WIFE AND THE RED KITE




A red kite hovering above Llandovery is a common sight nowadays and it's easy to imagine that the graceful bird is keeping a watchful eye on the Catholic Church below. Our Lady's Catholic Church has a stained-glass window in memory of a person who was one of those mainly responsible for reviving the kite in the Upper Tywi Valley at the end of the last century, namely Herbert Reginald Henry Vaughan (1893-1978).

If it hadn't been for the efforts of him, his wife and a few others (including Dafydd Dafis, Rhandir-mwyn) none of the rare kites would have survived. The birds had been shot and poisoned to such an extent that fewer than half a dozen remained.

Over a period of 30 years and more, Captain Vaughan and his wife Irene were at the forefront of efforts to conserve the bird. For a few years following the Second World War, they were the only people involved. The window, installed in 1981 and designed by Joseph Nuttgens, was commissioned by Mrs Vaughan following the death of her husband in 1978.

The kite is among a dozen birds depicted in another stained-glass window in Our Lady's Catholic Church, Llandovery. The window, designed by Margaret Rope, a Carmelite nun and sister of Irene Vaughan, was commissioned by Captain and Mrs Vaughan in memory of their two children. Herbert Vaughan died when he was only three days old, and Teresa Vaughan died aged only 15. As the history of the kite is now well-known, we shall focus on Captain Vaughan - and especially his wife. Captain Vaughan served in the Royal Navy between 1911 and 1945. His father, Herbert Stanley Vaughan, oversaw supplies for the Navy in Hong Kong, Gibraltar and Malta. He was a keen historian and one of the founders of the Marine Research Society.

When Captain Vaughan died in 1978, The Times said he had done more for conservation in Wales than any other person. It was noted that he had taken over the Council for the Protection of Rural Wales and made it a strong and effective body. He was a founding member of

the Brecon Beacons National Park Committee and served on various other committees.

He always kept one eye on his watch. Once he walked out of church because Mass was late. He would also insist that 'R.N.' be included at the end of his name so that no one thought he was "a mere Captain in the Army'.

Without belittling the admirable efforts of Captain Vaughan, one gets the impression that the tremendous work of his wife, who worked in her own quiet way, has been overlooked to a large extent.

Irene Mary Rope (1889-1993) was born and raised in Shrewsbury, where she would accompany her father, a doctor, on his rounds in a pony and trap. He would encourage her, the youngest of six children, to take an interest in flowers and wildlife in general. Although he died when Irene was only nine years old, she went on to become a professional botanist.

Before that, however, she had studied history at



St Anne's College, Oxford (1908-1911). As she was a woman, she was not allowed to take her degree 'officially', and had to wait until she was 86 years old. During the First World War, she drove an ambulance in the Balkans and was awarded several medals.

Irene married Captain HRH Vaughan in 1920 when they were both serving in Gibraltar. Later, she would occasionally visit her husband, for three years at a time. during his postings abroad; one of the highlights was a desert picnic with the Emir of Kuwait when she had to eat a special delicacy, uncooked sheep's eyes.

When their young daughter died in 1938, she moved to Wales. In Rhandir-mwyn, Irene ran a small farm on her own throughout the Second World War, until her husband's retirement in 1945.

When he was in the Royal Navy, Captain Vaughan would be at sea for months on end – and Mrs. Vaughan's efforts to protect the kite were crucial; at that time its numbers had decreased to a handful of pairs. The Vaughans' dedication to this cause continued after the war and their efforts were rewarded in 1955 with the RSPB Silver Medal – and again in 1968 with the Society's Gold Medal, the only time the honours were awarded to a husband and wife.

Following the death of her husband in 1978, Irene moved to Woodbridge, Suffolk, to be near her nephew. Many years later, the residents of the Upper Tywi Valley were still reminiscing about the little woman who rode a large white horse to keep an eye on the kites' nests. She would also ride to record the plants of the area; sometimes a plant would be in the horse's mouth before she had a chance to examine it.

Later, she bought a car and continued to drive until she was over 90 years old. For her 100th birthday, although she insisted that it should be a quiet occasion with no presents, a dinner was arranged for 80 friends and relatives. She received a telegram from the Queen and a special Blessing from the Pope.

Thanks to her family's generosity, through the Rope Trust, the Catholic Church in Llandovery has benefitted greatly.

#### TOWN COUNCIL LAUNCHES COMMUNITY SUPPORT DROP IN SESSIONS



Llandeilo Town Council and the Llandeilo Community Action Hub teamed up with the Women's Institute Llandeilo and NACRO Cymru to host a monthly coffee morning and community and support group drop in in the Civic Hall.

The Womens Institute Llandeilo provided the social aspect of the event by hosting a coffee morning and were joined by 9 Exhibitors at the event and 15 Exhibitor Representatives, including a surgery / opportunity for questions with Mayor Charlotte Morgan and County Councillor Edward Thomas. Tenovus Llandeilo, Men's Shed Llandeilo, Llandovery & Llangadog, Dementia Friends Llandeilo, Permaculture Twyi & Fabric Upcycling, Llandeilo Town Band and Llandeilo Rotary were the local groups represented at the first drop in.





Also attending were wider support groups such as Wales Council for the Deaf, Shadows, Actif – Adult Fitness Activities, Adferiad – Carmarthenshire Carers Info & Support, The Wallich – Conflict Resolution Preventing Homelessness, Hywel Dda UHB – Diet & Nutrition, Cradle Choir – WNO, Dewis Cymru – Well Being Services Database and Alzheimer's Society.

"I'm incredibly pleased with how well the first drop-in session went," says Mayor Charlotte Morgan. "We had people representing their groups either with a table, leaflets or people came and circulated chatting with others, and we already have others signed up for the next."

The Llandeilo Community Action Hub, a volunteer network founded during the pandemic, had secured a grant from the NISA / CK's 'Making a Difference Locally' programme" to fund the first six months of the drop in. Action Hub committee members - and also town councillors – Christoph Fischer and Kate Glanville approached Mayor Charlotte Morgan to set up a working group to facility the event and find funding beyond the first six months.

"Our work was always to connect isolated people and people who don't know what help or opportunities are available to them," says Christoph Fischer. "Cwmanman and Llandovery have launched similar projects and Nacro Cymru are holding their Llandeilo Connecting Carmarthenshire Community Wellbeing drop ins at our event to bring groups from a wider spectrum into the fold."

"We have to thank Community Research Engagement Officer Robert Ramsaha-Southall and Catherine Hindmarsh for their support."

One service provider said: 'Llandeilo Civil servants/ officials attended to show support. It's clear Llandeilo wants us here!'"

"It's great that the town council came onboard the project and has taken such a strong and positive lead," agrees Kate Glanville. "The drop-in provides essential information about services but it is also a great opportunity for people to get together over a free cup of coffee and have a chat."


The hugely successful Motorbike Weekend now organised by Blood Bikes Wales is a massive event

#### MEET THE MEMBER. Brian Morgan-Black.



This months Meet The Member (and our brilliant Rotary Santa) Brian Morgan-Black.

I was born in the revitalised city of Coventry in the mid-fifties and, despite an unwanted (by me) family move to Hinckley over the border in Leicestershire, I saw out my teenage years as a student in Godiva's patch. After an unexpected gap year, with two major job offers declined, I headed up the M1 to Leeds to study English. That's where I developed my loves of real ale, rugby and music – anything from prog rock and classical to sensitive singer-songwriters and post-punk. I teamed up with a rock DJ for gigs and shows on Radio Aire, and then got a respectable suit and tie job with IBM, which led to loan spells in Nottingham, Glasgow and Manchester, all fine beer cities.

In 1984 a country-wide role with IBM, based in Boringstoke, prompted a move south and started my 17 years in Alton, Hampshire, where I worked supporting the admin functions of the midlands and northern offices before moving into Systems Integration. In 1991 I left IBM to set up a horse racing consultancy business and, weeks in advance, advised all my clients to do the 1992 Gold Cup/Grand National double with Cool Ground and Party Politics at the then odds of 50/1 and 25/1. A massive 1,250-1 double landed – yet I was so deeply involved in the business (12-hour days seven days a week) that I forgot to place the double bet! A recession came, my customer base dwindled and I reluctantly went part time.

I ran pubs and hotels for friends, pulling tens of thousands of pints; was a back office manager for a leading travel company; did taxi control for the morning shifts; worked for a vinyl sign-making company; ran racehorse-owning partnerships; assisted real ale wholesaling; bought and sold on ebay; wrote sports reports and more.

The reporting led to a full-time role in journalism and a four-year stint as a newspaper editor, which takes us up to the end of 1998. Throughout these busy and less than lucrative years I played reasonably competitive badminton, five-a-side football, darts, crib and cricket and very competitive beer drinking. I was a founding shareholder and folk/blues/world music DJ for many years on Wey Valley Radio, where I co-presented the world's first live radio wine tasting sessions. I was on the committee of Alton Rugby Club for many years, rarely missing a game for the men's and women's first teams, and once on Burns' Night satopposite the giant Alastair McHarg as he plunged a dagger into the haggis with such ferocity that I ended up wearing a good few percent of it.

I was a rather young Justice of the Peace for North-East Hampshire (Alton, Petersfield and Aldershot) from 1991 to 2001, regularly being day chairman, and only stopped because the courts were making unreasonable demands on working people. By now I had undergone a career change, joining Hampshire County Council as a Day Service Officer for Adults with Learning Disabilities, and progressed through working for the County Director on successful wide-scale policies, and on into being a Social Worker in the same sector. That's where I was when my job was terminated through ill-health in 2001. House moves happened in the background as I had spells in a converted barn in a forest near Midhurst, several years in Wickham (Hants) and back into West Sussex in the lovely village of Compton. I met my wife Trish in 2001 and moved to Southampton with her, then up to Buckinghamshire for her job, and back to the village below Compton, West Marden, where I spent many happy years writing, DJ-ing, ebaying and working as a parish councillor. With Trish's Swansea-based Mum in declining health and Trish fighting health battles of her own, we decided that our final move would be to Wales and, after months and months of searching, we came across lovely Llandovery. On our first morning in the town, over a world class breakfast, our host Anne told us that we would fit in well here: she wasn't wrong! We've set about restoring the historic King's Arms to a form of glory, with great success via Trish and lodger Keith in the garden and outside areas, and a dogged approach to repairs ranging from a new roof to leaking pipes and

more. Yes, as we were warned, it's a money pit – but it's our money pit and we love it.

Our quiet retirement is anything but. We've only been here 21 months but already Trish volunteers twice a week in the museum and has been working very hard to get the theatre back into use for the community. I've gone back into DJ-ing (DJ Random, book now!) and help out once a week at the Gwynfe Cat Welfare shop. Together we open and man the Drovers' Club Shop before and after every home game. What a rugby club to find! And, of course, Rotary found me. I enjoyed the social company of many members and they persuaded me to join in with supporting this wonderful organisation. It's great to raise funds and see them helping out the many worthy groups in and around Llandovery and throughout the world. In my first year I was encouraged to take on a special seasonal role, and it seems I have a job not for life, but for Christmas! I'm also busy setting up a live music business called Triple L. Llandovery Live Lounge will promote concerts in and around the area's diverse venues with artists ranging from the local to the international at realistic prices.

Retirement? What retirement?

## DAVID THORPE



Our dear friend, local writer, teacher, and activist David Thorpe died in Barcelona on April 25th, aged 69. A memorial was held at Llandovery's Rhys Pritchard Memorial Hall on June 29th. Almost a hundred people gave tribute to an extraordinary life lived to the full, despite many challenges, which had so inspired and touched their own.

As an only child with cerebral palsy and acute asthma, David was often isolated and subject to bullying. His steely determination and resourcefulness let him defy expectations not only to walk, but to run, cycle, swim, draw, and write. He addressed his younger self in a short prose poem entitled 'Thank You Little Me,' read by his son at the memorial, ending: 'Thank you young David for all that, the strong heart and brain, the optimism and enthusiasm. Despite your lackings, handicappings and heartbreakings, you made it through.'

He found comfort, friends, and role models in superhero comics. In 2021 he wrote, "I may not even have become a writer if I hadn't discovered Marvel comics as a child, because at least four of Stan Lee's characters were disabled ... Reading this normalised my experience, making me realise that I didn't have to be a perfect physical specimen to stand a chance of having super-powers and saving the day."

Always a political and environmental campaigner, at eleven he won a writing competition with an essay mourning the loss of pastures near his home to urban sprawl, sparking a lifelong passion for using words to change minds. In the eighties his London home was a hub of activity for artists and activists, and his phone was tapped by the police as he organised support for the miners' strike, anti-war and apartheid protests. His lived by his principles, composting food and recycling, lecturing his friends for being wasteful when most of us had no idea what he was talking about.

In 1980 he achieved his ambition of working for Marvel, writing groundbreaking work on 'Captain Britain'. A child of the sixties, his anarchic humour combined with concerns about nuclear war and global capitalism in provocative characters such as Mad Jim Jaspers and Doc Chaos. With insight, he let his stories reflect the troubles of the times, determined that they be a force for good in the world. He set them in an alternate universe which he called Earth 616, familiar to fans today as the main setting for Marvel's films and comics.

He raised his children in mid-Wales, where he founded and managed the publications department at the Centre for Alternative Technology. As an environmental journalist and author, he wrote several acclaimed guides including 'The One Planet Life' and 'One Planet Cities', laying out clear and accessible ways for individuals and communities to begin living within the planet's limits.

Latterly he co-founded the One Planet Centre and the One Planet Council, and developed a holistic path to sustainability for organisations, called the One Planet Standard. David suffered a stroke in August 2021, and yet a few weeks later travelled in a wheelchair by train to Glasgow to launch the Standard at COP26. Shortly thereafter, Swansea Council became the first organisation to be accredited with One Planet status.

With irrepressible determination, David continued dictating books up until the end of his life. His awardwinning fiction includes 'Stormteller', a novel inspired by the Mabinogion set in a Welsh town ravaged by the rising sea, and 'Hybrids', a warning to his teenage children's generation, foretelling two decades ago the insidious melding of mobile phones into bodies and minds. His final book, published last November, is a memoir called 'The Secret Origin of Earth 616'.

David loved living in Wales and in his final, beautiful home of Llandovery, where he ran writing workshops and helped set up the repair café and local climate action group. After his stroke he benefitted from the support of the community, including attending Monday chair dance class with Abigail, Angharad and Diane, and the chair yoga class with Ginny at the rugby club.

He was grateful for the company of international workaways who supported him to continue working, and

for the very special relationships built with his personal assistants Emma, Kamila, Ruth, and Mark, and the amazing team of carers who came to his house each day including Menna, Tony, and Liz, some of whom spoke with compassion and humour at his memorial.

Jane Davidson, director of the One Planet Centre and former Welsh Minister for Environment and Sustainability, echoed another tribute describing how David could both 'irk and enthral'. He could be impatient, frustrated and sometimes blunt when people didn't get what he was trying to do—but he was that rare thing, a true polymath, both visionary and practical: he knew what he wanted and got things done, however difficult the circumstance. His friend Martin Kennedy said, 'he was one of the good guys—more Spiderman than Hulk, but with a large helping of Doctor Strange sprinkled on top."

David is survived by his partner Francoise Petre, who so enriched his life and made possible so many magical times for them, including his last miraculous trip to Barcelona; and by his beloved sons. At the memorial Dion and Nemos expressed how they weren't ready to let their father go. None of us are. His drive, determination, and commitment to his principles made him a lasting inspiration to everyone who knew him. He truly made a positive mark on the world, something of which young David would have been proud. Long may his spirit and work live on!

Being a Welsh Fair it is understandable that there should be a good selection of Welsh items on offer. Whether it's an original Welsh watercolour or oil painting or a piece of Welsh pottery or examples of Welsh textiles. There will also be a selection of Welsh blankets and textiles on display, the result of Wales having a rich heritage, in the woollen industry.

There are some interesting displays to be discovered at the fair whether it's a rare postcard, a collection of old photographs or an unusual love token. One of the dealers Allys Gronow has a superb collection of these special coins.



Love tokens are coins that were engraved after the minting process was complete. Generally, an artisan removed the words and images from the reverse, or sometimes from both sides.Artisans ranging in skills from a high-quality craftsperson to a "do-it-yourselfer" then engraved or punched pictures, initials, and messages on the cleared area.

Other times, the coin was left intact and the artisan engraved initials, dates, or pictures on the edges around the images of royalty. The coins became lucky charms, objects of art, and pieces of jewellery. The messages on the coins could be used as spiritual reminders, family documentation, or sentimental sweet nothings.

In Britain, the practice of giving 'love tokens' has

been around from at least Roman times, mudlarking expeditions on the Thames river banks have often uncovered bent or bowed coins ranging from as far back as the 16th century. The breaking of gold and coins were often included as part of the marriage ceremonial contract, but ardent suitors would often bend the coins and present them to the lady they wished to court as a symbol of the strength of their love, affection and intent.

Even though clipping, defacement and other wilful damage of coins was a treasonable offense, some took a risk by presenting a bowed or bent coin to their lady love. If the love token was accepted, that meant the suitor was successful; if they were discarded, it was a rejection. It has been surmised that many of the 'crooked coins' found on the banks of the River Thames — most of the surviving ones are from the 17th and 18th centuries — carry legacies of unrequited love. Often in these coins, the head of the monarch would be rubbed clean and initials of the giver or/and the intended would be engraved. Some of those accepted would even be worn as a pendant or incorporated into jewellery to be worn close to one's person. The bent coin, "a token of your pledge," became a physical reminder of your obligation.

Because love tokens were hand-engraved, they are unique. The birth of a baby, the initial of your intended, a soldier leaving a memory of himself with his loved ones, or a prisoner getting sent off to do his time; all have been remembered on the surface of a coin.

Around the 19th century, such love tokens/coins took on an additional meaning as they "were created by convicted Britons before they were transported to Australia.Smoothed coins engraved with affectionate messages were gifted to loved ones by convicts awaiting execution and transportation. These mementos of affection were often known as 'leaden hearts'.



Love tokens tell stories that begin with the words, images, and initials engraved on the coins .

Other methods of making coins into tokens included cutting coins and "pinpunching" (a stippled technique that employed a hammer and point). Free-hand engraving may date as early as the 1500s in Great Britain

But these little objects are also passports to another time. In the hands of historians, they illuminate different facets of Georgian society – from courtship, entertainment and fashion to empire and belief

Interestingly enough, a significant number of the copper and nickel coins that were engraved were also gold plated. A poor person might have used this denomination and then by gold plating them, made them look like their gold counterpoint coins. Whatever the host coin, the feelings and emotions were the same. Some could just afford to show their love more than others. These little gems of history are a great area to start collecting in.Most collectors are looking for sharp engravings and unusual pictures .Allys has a great collection on display and is very knowledgeable.



The Llandeilo fair is full of exciting collections from Llanelli cockeral plates to the rare Wemys ware and including collections of French brocante, quality jewellery, vintage accessories and small pieces of furniture.

Attractive displays of gardinalia has proved extremely popular at the fair, including watering cans, wheel barrows, garden tools and large garden pots and urns.

The Llandeilo fair has a rich cross section of antiques and vintage on display, from jewellery,watches, books, ephemera, militaria and vintage clothes and accessories. There will also be collections of glass and up cycled and pre loved furniture, plus interior design pieces. I'm sure visitors will not be disappointed with the selection on offer at this popular fair.

Homemade refreshments will be available and doors open at 10.00am until 4.00pm. Admission is just  $\pounds 2$ .


