SHOP THRIVES UNDER LOCKDOWN REGIME

The tills are still busy at Dryslwyn Community Shop and Post Office as the volunteer-run business pushes on through the Covid-19 lockdown crisis.

Over the past ten weeks, sales up by 25% even though the opening hours have had to be halved.

The store's Post Office business has also enjoyed a boost as local people have taken to sending 'goodwill' parcels to the families and friends they are unable to visit. The shop's volunteer coordinator, Michele Powell commented: "Chocolates and cakes appear to be the most popular options, and more birthday presents are being posted rather than delivered by hand - although many people are sending gifts simply as an affirmation of their friendships"

Local businesses are also depending on the PO for their basic banking and postal needs.

Up to telephoned ten grocery orders a day have been handled by the shop staff, with Michele pointing out: "Curiously, the majority of people who place orders with us prefer to collect them from the shop – presumably because this enables them to see and meet friends and neighbours. if only at a 2 metre distance.." She added that deliveries can be made where necessary


Supplies of milk, eggs and bread have held up throughout the eight weeks, and the shop has been able to source fruit and vegetables without problems - "we can also add them to orders if we are given two or three days' notice," Michele added.

Yet around half the shop's normal volunteer force of 40 people have had to temporarily stand down for age and health reasons - hence the shortened 8.30 am to 12 noon hours

Michele continued: "It has been a hectic couple of months, but once again the shop as proved its value to the community - and not just as a source of groceries. It's a great source of reassurance, particularly to elderly people living on their own, that the shop is not only able to meet their grocery needs, it is also able to also provide a very strong, personal contact with people who know them as individuals."

And this has been backed up by the shop's Facebook page, which is carrying regular mental health awareness post from Rachel Stuart at Dryslwyn The page is also featuring an increasingly popular nature diary.

The shop and Post Office (which stands next to the H.G. Bryer Mazda dealership at Dryslwyn) now opens from 8.30 am to 12 noon. The telephone number is 01558 668221.

Though the centre is closed at present some staff are working behind closed doors supporting the local community. The situation is frequently being reviewed to understand when a safe re-opening can occur. On sunny days books are available for free at the front of the building, along with some lovely plants for sale.

The Help Llandovery Facebook page – www.facebook. com/helpllandovery/ – is still running with volunteers ready to deliver prescriptions, food shopping, take items to the post office, dog walking or just be available for a friendly chat. Do call us on 01550 721499 if you need help of this sort.

Thanks to funding from various grants, we can now also offer help to you in the form of basic food supplies. If you have lost your job or have a reduced income and need some help with feeding yourself and/or the family please message Help Llandovery or ring us on 01550 721499, we can arrange to put an appropriate grocery bag together to be left at the rear of our building at an agreed time for you to collect.

Over 200 activity packs have been distributed to local children with at least one other in the works; they include some fun competitions which we will be following on our Facebook group. If your children would like one of these, please ring 01550 721499 to have your name put on the list or to arrange collection from the back of the LYCC building.

Also, an Art For All Facebook page - www.facebook. com/artforallandallforart/ - is operating to encourage those who attend our activities/workshops to create and enjoy art during the lockdown, submitting it anonymously to the page. We would welcome artwork from anyone who would like to be involved. There is a weekly theme but art on any topic and of any medium can be submitted. It is envisaged that an exhibition will be held sometime in the future at the LYCC for those who would like to take part.





Sine the start of the Coronavirus lockdown, our little hall in Bethlehem has remained firmly shut, along with every other village hall and community centre in the country.

This has meant that our Sunday café, which was due to open for the summer just after Easter, has also been closed.

But.... we are back! From Sunday June 21st, the café is open for takeaway meals, from 12.00 – 2.30pm.





SOUTH WALES D-DAY ROLE REVEALED 76 YEARS ON



For exactly twelve months leading up to D-Day on the Sixth of June, 143,870 GI's and USN CB's landed in South Wales during Operation Bolero. Army and Navy Engineers built camps, hospitals, depots and maintenance bases, others trained on beaches and ranges for the Invasion. Many would often debark their troopships, entrain on GWR or LMS trains and be away to their camps in the UK..

Huge amounts of cargo – 4,508,836 tons of tanks, guns, ammunition, boxed vehicles and gliders, stores and locomotives – were unloaded at the Bristol Channel Ports of Swansea, Barry, Cardiff, Newport and Avonmouth. Finally 42,000 GI's would depart those Welsh ports, leaving behind a memory or friendship, sometimes a bride. This was the Bristol Channel Pre Loaded Build-Up Force, bound for Normandy 76 years ago, in 1944.

TAILS FROM THE TRUST CONNIE THE LOCKDOWN RESCUE FOAL

With being closed to the public and unable to fundraise in our usual capacities, we have had to cope with the most unique circumstances in its 35 year history. Equine welfare and rescue work must continue even during lockdown. When we received a call from a worried walker in mid-March about a foal, we knew we had to respond urgently, despite the challenges we faced.

What greeted us was the most heart wrenching scene; a tiny foal all alone and hungry, still trying to feed from her thin dead mother on the ground. At only 2-3 weeks old, our team and Dyffryn Tywi Equine Clinic vets scrambled to catch and guide the frightened foal over fences and bridges to safety. Over the following days at the trust, she was fed around the clock and learnt to trust the team.

Rescue is just the beginning for Connie. She will have a tough battle ahead to grow and learn to be independent

on her own. As an orphan separated from her mother so young and found in such harsh conditions, she may well face health problems as she grows. For us, it's the best result that she wont grow up in a life of neglect that she wouldn't have survived. We will strive to give her a safe haven as long as she needs it.

Three months on, Connie can now run around outside freely, growing stronger and making friends with our other foals rescued in lockdown Apollo and Zeus and of course Gwen. It's vital she grows up with horse company, and one of our older residents Abbie has taken her under her wing after losing her own foal a couple of years ago. She's finally had a chance to mother a baby and since we introduced them, they haven't looked back.

We've had incredible support from our community throughout lockdown and our work continues to be vital with 28 horses on site. THE 1980S: THE TWINNING YEARS

Thirty five years ago a twinning ceremony took place in Llandovery/Llanymddyfri linking the ancient borough with the town of Pluguffan/Plugüen in Brittany. The partnership persists thanks to the efforts of many such as Glyn Evans, Martin Watts and the present chairperson Kate Morgan. It may be of interest to learn why and how the twinning came about.

Throughout the 1970s there was much agitation in Welsh communities in support of efforts to ensure the survival of Welsh as a living language. The unrest in Wales was part of a Europe-wide movement in support of minority languages such as Breton, the Basque language, Irish Gaelic, Scottish Gaelic, Cornish and many others. It was felt that one way of promoting minority languages was to establish relationships between appropriate settlements in the various countries and regions.

Llandeilo was one of the first towns in this part of Wales to twin and did so with Le Conquet in Brittany. A few of us in Llandovery were interested in the idea and in the spring of 1982 we met with representatives from a town near Le Conquet who were looking to twin with a town near Llandeilo. Their invitation to visit their town in the summer of 1982 was readily accepted. But first a public meeting in Llandovery chaired by the Mayor unanimously agreed to go ahead with the twinning idea. A committee was formed made up of two representatives from every organisation in town; thank goodness the White Hall had a big room almost large enough to accommodate the whole committee! I was elected chairman, the late Eirwyn Stephens vice-chairman, Mel Williams secretary and Geraint Morgan treasurer. I was given the green light to visit the place in Brittany in the summer of 1982 and to report back on its suitability as a twin town.

We received a warm welcome on our visit to the town near Le Conquet and received an invitation from the Mayor for the Llandovery Male Voice choir to visit the place in the summer of 1983. Back in Llandovery the choir readily accepted the invitation and their proposed visit was endorsed by the twinning committee as a step forward in deciding the suitability of the place as a twinning partner. Choir members went about buying passports and interest in the twinning idea was growing. I enlisted the assistance of Huw S Thomas, French master at Llandovery College, to receive any telephone messages that might come from the Breton town. Only one message came and that arrived in early 1983 to inform us that town council elections had taken place in Brittany and

the Mayor and several councillors had lost their seats and the new Mayor had no interest what-so-ever in twinning! What a disappointment! Did not the gentleman realise that Llandovery Choir had paid for passports?!

I turned to Cymdeithas Cymru/Llydaw (Wales/Brittany Society) which held a list of towns interested in twinning. As luck would have it a town near Kemper already with a twinning committee was ready to talk twinning. Another bit of good news was that the chairman of the Pluguffan/ Plugüen – that was the name of the town – twinning committee was fluent in English. It was arranged for the chairman to telephone me and a night or two later I had the pleasure of speaking for the first time with Bruno LeRumeur who lived on a farm, Kernevez vihan, near Plugüen. Bruno invited a deputation from Llanymddyfri to visit Plugüen at the end of May 1983. And so it was that myself and the late Eirwyn Stephens together with Colin Bancroft and Gerald Prichard travelled in Colin's car to Southampton and took the ferry to Cherbourg. On the road to Rennes - where Bruno and others were to meet us - the car's exhaust fell off and from then on the vehicle's tractor-like noise attracted people out of their homes as we sped through the villages of Normandy. When Rennes came into view I realised that our nominated meeting place, Rennes rail station, was a huge place! How on earth were we to recognise the Bretons from Plugüen?! We parked the car and walked towards the hundreds of people milling around the station. And then amongst the crowd was a Red Dragon walking on its hind legs! I approached the Dragon and offered it my hand ... "Denley?" asked the creature wrapped in the large flag ... "Bruno?" I replied and that was the start of a friendship that has lasted to this day.

Our three day visit to Plugüen was an exceedingly busy one and the four of us were very pleased with what we saw and heard. Even though none of us from Llanymddyfri was fluent in French or Breton there was enough similarity between Welsh and Breton to enable us at least to ask where the toilets were. It was a very favourable report that the four of us presented to the twinning committee in Llandovery.

During the summer of 1983, ten or so members of the Plugüen Twinning Committee visited Llandovery when it was agreed to proceed with the twinning and to hold two official ceremonies - the first in Plugüen in the summer of 1984 and the other in Llanymddyfri a year later.

And so it came about that two bus-loads - one carrying the Male Voice Choir - and one or two car-loads travelled to Pluguffan at the end of August 1984 and a similar number made it to Llandovery at the end of July 1985 to take part in the twinning ceremonies which were conducted through the medium of Welsh, Breton, French and English. For the Llandovery ceremony a special multilingual booklet was prepared by Handel Jones describing the town and surrounding villages and including a pile of adverts which give a revealing picture of the shops and businesses in the town 35 years ago. The twinning charter, a work of art by Jakez Derouet of Plugüen, that was signed in the ceremony can be seen today in Y Gannwyll, Llanymddyfri.

Tywi Valley Open Studios, an event that Carole particuarly enjoys, with vistors able to see her studio, take part in workshops or discover her Welsh mountainside garden has also been delayed until July 2021. As her studio had already been prepared for this event, Carole hopes there will be opportunities later to welcome visitors to see her work & also explore the garden that has benefitted from extra attention this year.

From Pilpcwm to Rajasthan

THE BUTTERFLY EFFECT – HOW DID I GET THERE?



As part of my New Year's resolution some years ago, I set out on a cold January day to attend a class in wet-felt making. I was told by the tutor to make a note of the date, as that was the day that would change my life. I didn't honestly believe her but that's just what happened....

While my felt is made predominantly with sheep's wool, it's not the 'fuzzy felt' of our child-hood, snooker tables and hats – it is made from the softest of fibres and curls. Within a few weeks I had progressed to 'nuno' felting - a technique which incorporates silk (or other open weave material) in the felt-making process to produce a completely new fabric without stitching, sticking or sewing.

Buying silk in the UK can be expensive so I began researching suppliers of vintage silk and thus began a relationship with a company in Delhi from where I bought a variety of fabulous fabrics over the months. The craftmanship is exquisite. Soon I was buying vintage saris and dupattas (shawls) because I loved the detail and workmanship - these textiles never did find their way into my nuno felt. Once ordered, I eagerly anticipated a little bundle from India - packages covered in an array of intriguing stamps; sometimes sewn by hand and sometimes containing an extra little gift for me.

I marveled at the workmanship - tiny bandini (tiedye) patterns which must have taken hours to make - complete with hand-sewn beads, intricate metalwork and other embellishments.

My imagination ran away with me - wouldn't it be fun to meet my supplier? I did think that a weekend just to Delhi was a bit excessive so I booked a trip around the Golden Triangle - Delhi, Agra and Jaipur. And so my love affair with India began.

I have returned to Rajasthan (one of the more northern states) many times, usually on my own, but this year organised a three-week trip with a small group of likeminded ladies to share with them my passion for this most fascinating of countries. Men were welcome to join but none were brave enough!

It is true what they say — "India is an onslaught for the senses" — colours, smells, noises, tastes and emotions. The people are generous with their time, wit, warmth and hospitality — and it is the people who provide my abiding memories, no matter the fabulous treasures of Taj Mahal and other wondrous monuments.

India is not for everyone, but if you can see beyond cows (and other animals) on the road, honking horns (because they can), being the object of genuine curiosity (in the way that Indians are to us), then you will have the most wonderful experience.

Once off the plane you just get into the swing of Indian life.... On one trip I was drinking 'opium' tea with Bishnoi tribal elders within a few hours of landing, on another I 'flew' the zip-line from fortress battlements (no hard hat required) and on my most recent trip my 'girls on tour' spied an elephant through the kitchen door of a restaurant. Did we take a photo? No - it seemed perfectly normal at the time – we were only bothered by the traditional musician playing 'Frere Jacques' on a sitar! Only in India!

Accept the people and they will accept you. I have made what I know to be life-long friendships over the past few years – ranging from the drivers who have spent weeks at a time in my company and whose only concern have ever been for my safety and well-being; traders who have opened their hearts and homes to welcome me and my 'girls'; to a Maharani with whom I had organised a week of voluntary work, only to be curtailed by Covid-19.

Besides the people, India does of course have a few must-see sites.... The incomparable Taj Mahal for one – despite being the most popular and revered monuments amongst Indians and tourists alike – you can still find a quiet corner just to marvel at its awesomeness (after you've had your photo taken of course on 'Diana's' bench!). The pink city of Jaipur with its Amber Palace and Jantar Mantar; the blue city of Jodhpur, home to the impregnable Mehrangarh Fort and Umaid Bhawan Palace; the White city of Udaipur with lakes to mesmerise; the golden city of Jaisalmer.... I could go on but there are guide books to tempt you!

My trip this year began on March 1st – the plan being that after three weeks of touring, my 'girls' would depart, leaving me to have a week volunteering with village ladies. Although we were aware of the coronavirus panic looming in the UK – we laughed at Facebook images of Waitrose shelves empty of toilet rolls – we had no idea of how events would unfold for us. Luckily, we had seen the major sites as planned, participated in block printing, cooking, leopard safari and traditional painting lessons.

We were also fortunate enough to take part in the 'Holi' festival which celebrates good over evil and the beginning of Spring. We witnessed bonfires burning on Holi eve and naturally 'played' with paints and joined the dancing on the day itself.

The only change to the itinerary was to spend time in Udaipur instead of Kerala, which had closed its borders very early on in the crisis.



During the last few days it became apparent that hotels were taking Covid-19 very seriously - we were not allowed into our final hotel until getting the 'all-clear' from the main hospital. Major monuments were closing and shops were beginning to shut. I was unable to carry out voluntary work as groups were unable to gather, but I still thought a few days in Udaipur would be welcome after my girls had departed for the UK. My plans were shattered when I received a phone to suggest I 'got out quick'. In other words, join my party on their overnight trip to Delhi and get an earlier flight home.

So, I had to say goodbye rather quickly to my lakeside view hotel in Udaipur and travel for 12 hours in our minibus as internal flights had by then been cancelled. I said goodbye to my close friends - as they had now become - at New Delhi airport while I waited 36 hours for a new flight to Dubai and onward to London. Indira Gandhi International airport was a sad place when I left - the airside shops and restaurants were being closed around me as I departed within two and a half hours of the airport shutting.

It was a sudden and severe lockdown in India but with a population of nearly 1.4, billion, confirmed deaths are (as at time of writing) less than 6,000. I will return next year with a new group with whom to share the wonders of India and complete the voluntary work I passionately believe in. Are you up for the adventure?

Oh, and as an aside - that first wet-felting lesson did change my life... In addition to the adventures above, I recently 'gave up' my day-job to start my own felting venture - 'Fabulous Feltings' - giving regular workshops and making unique wearable art. 
