#### Trudi Petersen - Found and Seek

A unique combination of handmade Welsh artisan products, including blacksmith Aaron's hand forged iron work and a selected range of vintage and antique decorative and home wares. Their small shop, based in Mansel Street in Carmarthen town has been described as a 'treasure trove' and a 'hidden gem'.

#### ART AT THE HALL

Art at the Hall is attracting new exhibitors to compliment the already rich community of local artists and makers. This exhibition, curated with the garden and plant lover in mind with botanical florals, garden watercolours, pottery vases for wild flower bouquets and sculptures for the garden. Printmakers Judith Stroud, Alan Williams and Alison Shotbolt will be returning to join us along with potters Mick Morgan, Nick Membery, Jennifer Hall and Jonathan Cox. Ceramic sculptures from Sallie Wakley and Valerie Price West will also be on show. Recent paintings by Maria Pierides and Leigh Sinclair, stained glass by Simon Howard and forged pieces by blacksmith Aaron Petersen add to the rich selection of arts and crafts on display at the exhibition, all pieces will be for sale.

Joining us for the first time - Owen Schroder-currently studying for his A-levels Owen as been turning for around 4 years. His first encounter with woodturning was on a pole lathe. Still at school but enjoy turning at every opportunity, the majority of Owen's wood is sourced from local farmers and is always from fallen trees, not purposely cut ones. "I find sourcing my own material interesting and beneficial in that it is cost effective and I can collect more interesting bits of wood than you would find on a shop shelf."

ADRIFT POTTERY – a creative partnership of Karen Williams and Andy Horwood who make a modern version of traditional slipware using red earthenware clay covered in creamy slip. Each and every piece is individually made, on the wheel or hand built, then drawings are sgraffitoed on, revealing the red clay body. They use a limited palette of mainly raw iron, cobalt and copper oxide to colour the pieces. "Our inspiration comes from nature and the beautiful wild landscape of West Wales."

Potter Rachel Smith – based in London with strong Welsh connections, Rachel discovered the exhibition through Instagram and visited for the first time in December for the Winter exhibition. Rachel has been invited to join us as a guest potter - her work is wheel thrown, high-fired stoneware, and each vessel form is individually created in small batches. Rachel is inspired by 1970s mass produced tableware, mid century studio pottery and textiles, creating every day contemporary objects with a colourful hit of nostalgia.

Painter Adam David Taylor – trained in Cardiff where he received a degree in fine art, he spent his years living in Cardiff and London. He has recently relocated to a small cottage Pembrokeshire where he works as an artist. His abstract paintings of the Welsh landscape will be shown for the first time at the Hall this June. Potter Joe Frowen – based in Carmarthenshire Joe recently graduated from Coleg Sir Gâr with a ceramic degree. "The year since graduating has been great for me - first winning the student award at King Street Gallery, then going on to Hatfield Art in Clay where I won the student prize from Potclays with a sponsorship. I intend to follow this path in ceramics, develop my work in style, technique and colour and hopefully make pieces of work that people will enjoy."

Billy Adams, a potter and member of The Makers Guild in Wales whose work deals with exploring and experimenting with aspects of landscape. He works within the vessel format, combining textures and colours to give the viewer an intimate insight into his private view of ceramics. Rims, handles, lips and balance are commonplace within traditional ceramics, yet he uses them in a unique integrated structure which elevates them beyond their own identifiable function and so gives them another meaning.

The private view evening will be sponsored by Jin Talog – 21st June 6.30 – 10pm

You can also join us on Tuesday 25th May from 6pm when Jess Jones of Little barn Nursery will be giving a talk on gardens from 6pm.

Llandeilo Sculptor and Illustrator, Gill Still, will be with us on Thursday 27th from 4pm for an exclusive signing of her beautifully illustrated limited edition book, we will extend opening times to 7.30pm with Jin Talog running a Gin Bar that evening from 4pm.

The Exhibition will run for 9 days 22nd – 30th June, opening each day 11am – 6pm.

#### LLANWRDA AND LLANSADWRN COUNTRYWOMEN

At our meeting on 13th May Brian Richards gave us a very informative talk on the Penllergaer Valley Woods. The estate was developed by John Dillwyn Llewelyn and his wife Emma after spending their honeymoon on a grand tour of Europe and being inspired by the woods, lakes and waterfalls of Switzerland, Germany and Austria with Penllegaer estate ultimately becoming one of the most important historical victorian gardens of Wales. An interest in science, horticulture and photography lead to the building of an observatory with a revolving cupola and telescope from which the 1st photo of the moon was taken; the upper lake was the site of the 1st trials of an electric powered boat; the building of an orchid house with a lake and waterfall of hot water to create the appropriate humid atmosphere. However as time passed the house and estate fell into disrepair and the ruins of the house were finally demolished in 1961 and by 1990 the estate was forgotten.

In 1995 Richard Morris started to raise awareness with the council and Cadw and a trust was formed to protect the grounds from developers and volunteers began to reveal what was hidden in the overgrown woods. A heritage lottery grant of £2.4m in 2010-12 enabled the trust to de-silt the lake, rebuild the observatory and a medieval bridge, create a car park and kiosk now a coffee shop and visitor centre. A further lottery grant of £1.8m will enable the next projects of renovation the walled garden and orchard with an additional visitor centre next to the coffee shop which now has a footfall of 100000.

But despite the lottery funds for capital projects, the trust need to raise £130k pa so although entry to the woods is free a small charge is made for parking. At our next meeting on 3rd June in the Reading Room Llansadwrn, Menna Evans will give a presentation "All one needs to know about dogs".



#### AGA-STYLE KLOVER SMART 80 REPLACED SOLID FUEL AGA

A leaking chimney ruined the existing solid fuel Aga in this farm building.

The owners took the opportunity to rejuvenate the outdated kitchen but wanted to preserve the rustic and traditional look. To the declared Aga fans only the very similar looking Klover Smart 80 would do to preserve the original charm of the building and form an attractive feature in the heart of their house.



It fitted in the alcove of its solid fuel predecessor and not only serves as heating but also provides hot water and a hob for the kitchen.

The system is automated, allowing the owners to programme the time the heat and hot water come on. It is also cleaner and much easier to operate, saving them plenty of time and dirty, hard labour. By moving away from fossil fuels the owners have significantly reduced their carbon footprint.

They qualified for an interest free loan to pay for the system. Regular payments from this governmental scheme over 7 years will help to repay the initial capital cost.

#### Padmasambhava Yoga & Meditation Centre

The Summer term at the PadmaSamBhava is now at its halfway stage and is enjoyed by many happy students. There are also classes available in Ammanford, Cwrt Henri and at Maes Elfryn Hall, Llandeilo.

On this coming Saturday June 8th Poornam presents "Becoming a Compassionate Witness". The Witness is the silent, peaceful centre of your being. When you develop the Witness, it empowers your ability to see things as they are. This workshop explores developing the ability and compassion to stay with what is arising, through posture, breath and meditation.

Next month on Saturday 6th July Christley will hold a Restorative Yoga Relax and Renew class before the summer break. Restorative Yoga is useful when you need to eliminate fatigue or stress, as it allows deep rest both physically and mentally. In this mostly floor-based class, props are used to safely support the body in various postures. This class is limited to 7 people.

Starting on Saturday 9th November Poornam and Vanessa begin a four-part course, "The Golden Thread: Sadhana and the Rhythms of Nature". This is a course about Sadhana (spiritual practice) and also about observing and coming to understand the Nature of things. The Golden Thread explores the interrelationship between our inner and outer worlds and the elemental forces which form the foundation of our being. Following the cycle of the seasons, the tools of yoga and a deepening awareness of Nature, participants are invited to undertake their personal quest through Sadhana (the path of practice) for a full year with practices both in and outdoors. The course will be held at the National Botanic Garden of Wales. Course dates; 9th November 2019, 14th March, 13th June and 12th September 2020. Classes at Padmasambhava take into account the health and abilities of everyone and aim to help both the mind and the body. The physical movements bring flexibility to the body and the breathing practices are useful tools to calm the mind and increase energy. Each class ends with Yoga Nidra, a deep relaxation practice which helps



## LLANDOVERY GARDENING CLUB



On Thursday 25th April we left Llandovery and headed for Llanover Gardens near Abergavenny. We were given a very warm welcome by Elizabeth Murray, the owner of the estate, and also treated to coffee and cake. We were then given a short tour of the gardens before a heavy shower sent us scurrying indoors where Elizabeth gave us a screen presentation on the history of the gardens which was created by her 3 times greatgrandfather, Benjamin Waddington, at the end of the eighteenth century. Benjamin diverted the Rhyd-y-meirch stream through the garden to create a series of ponds, cascades, weirs and further streams. He planted many trees including London plane, then new to the country, together with indigenous species such as beech and larch. He also created a circular walled garden with an impressive dovecote, now Grade II listed. Benjamin's youngest daughter, Augusta became the famous Lady of Llanover who avidly supported welsh culture. She married Benjamin Hall (after whom Big Ben is named). As one of her many good deeds, Lady Llanover helped to found Llandovery College in 1847 by donating the land upon which it stands.

Succeeding generations of the family made further alterations to the gardens, including an avenue of sweet chestnuts trees under which spring bulbs have been planted to provide a colourful welcome to each new year. Elizabeth told us that her father was responsible for planting the many different magnolias, for spring interest, together with acers, euonymus and liquid ambers to provide autumn colour. Today, the circular walled garden has deep herbaceous borders which are magnificent in

Luckily the rain soon passed over, the sun came out and we were able to spend a very pleasant hour wandering around the garden enjoying the spring flower display. We then returned to the coach and made our way to Abergavenny for lunch before the return trip to Llandovery.





#### SPRING ON THE FARM

Now that the better weather is here, the rescue ponies at Lluest are spending time outside in the fields, nibbling the grass with the sun on their backs. But rich spring grass can be problematic for many horses. Native ponies particularly are prone to weight gain and this can be a factor in contracting the painful condition laminitis. Laminitis is a disease affecting the sensitive tissues inside the hoof which become inflamed and swollen. In the worst cases, the bones in the hoof can rotate and in severe cases penetrate the sole of the foot. Several of our 'plumper' residents are therefore on restricted grazing for their own health and wellbeing.

#### FOAL UPDATE

We have had two beautiful foals born on the farm this spring. The first is a colt foal born to a little bay mare we rescued early in the year. We've named him Eric. A beautiful and friendly boy he has shown a lot of interest in his human carers from the day he was born. His mum, Ariel, was in poor condition when she came to the trust earlier this year with two other mares, Melody and Alana, and a small colt called Sebastian. Melody is due to foal soon so we are keeping a close eye on her.

Foal number two, also a colt, was born to Sarabi. The grooms have chosen the name Zazu for this stunning boy. Last year Sarabi underwent dental work at the vets for a cavity caused by loss of bone in her upper jaw, which had caused a large infected swelling on her face. This is under control for the time being and mum and baby are doing very well.

#### HAPPY ENDINGS

Dillon our 30-year-old gelding came to us early in 2018 very underweight and with significant skin problems

caused by lice and rainscald. So scurfy was his skin that much of his hair had fallen out. After around three months of treatment for his skin, and with careful feeding, his coat started to grow back and he began to put on weight. He went on to find a lovely forever home. Much to our delight, we heard from his guardian who tells us that he is doing very well. She said: "He has turned into a cheeky chap, sneaking into the feed room if I'm not looking and galloping round refusing to be caught when it's time to come off the grass".



# WAR HERO'S FATAL AIR CRASH IN HILLS ABOVE CYNGHORDY

On a June morning, seventy-five years ago, a farm servant travelling on horseback in the hills above Cynghordy was surprised to see that the tops of several trees in the vicinity had been torn off.

George Watkins was making his daily journey from his smallholding of Ffos-goi to Clyn-saer, a large sheep farm in Cynghordy, where he worked as a servant. The explanation lay a short distance ahead, where an aircraft wing and debris were scattered over a wide area. The body of the pilot had been burned beyond recognition.

Alun Augustus, the current owner of Gilfach Farm, Cynghordy, well remembers his father's account of events.

Access to the site was very difficult in 1944, Crychan Forest didn't exist and there were no forestry roads. Local farmers, including Glyn Augustus of Gilfach, removed the pilot's body, together with parts of the wreckage, by horse and gambo. The largest piece, a whole wing, wasn't retrieved until much later, when the forestry roads had been built.

Arwyn Evans, who now lives in Ystrad-brân, Cynghordy, was a young teenager at the time of the accident, and used to go fishing on a nearby stream. He described where he saw the wreckage: "By the Glanbrân Arms, there's a turning for Hermon and Tirabad. You

come to Gerddigwynion and Llethr-hir. Then, after passing these two places, you climb for about half a mile until you come to quite a large cwm on the left which leads down to the old Clyn-saer mansion. I'm sure that it was in this cwm that I saw the remains of the plane."

The plane was a Thunderbolt, piloted by Captain James W. Wilkinson, the 31-year-old Commanding Officer of the 82nd Fighter Squadron of the United States Army Air Forces (USAAF), based at Duxford, near Cambridge.

It was one of America's most important fighters. On D-Day, only two days after the Cynghordy crash, every available Thunderbolt provided air cover for the Allied invasion fleet as it crossed the Channel.

Captain Wilkinson believed that steam locomotives could be immobilised for several months, rather than weeks, if they were hit in the right places. The RAF wanted him to demonstrate his theory, and arranged for a locomotive in Wales to be used as a target.

The demonstration was due to take place on 4 June, but was prevented by bad weather. A frustrated Captain Wilkinson radioed the Duxford control tower to say that he was going on his own on a local test flight. As he was flying low over the Central Wales railway line, he crashed into a mist-shrouded hill, 4½ miles North-East of Llandovery, and was killed.

Only a fortnight earlier, Captain Wilkinson had earned a Distinguished Service Cross when he led a flight of three fighters in an attack against more than thirty enemy fighters which were about to attack an Allied bomber formation. One wingman was forced out of action, and Captain Wilkinson's plane was damaged by enemy fire, but the fighters were dispersed.

Moments later, a second and bigger flight of enemy fighters began to attack the bombers, but it, too, was broken up. The DSC citation records how Captain Wilkinson and his remaining wingman then flew ahead of the bombers and attacked a third enemy group of more than thirty fighters forming for attack.

"Although in this action his other wingman was lost, Captain Wilkinson continued to press straight through the enemy flight, shot down one plane, and once more broke up a threat against the bombers," adds the citation. "By his extraordinary heroism and his determination to protect the bombers at all costs, Captain Wilkinson

rendered outstanding and valorous service to our nation."

At the time of his death, Captain Wilkinson, had made more than 200 combat flights and had destroyed eight German planes in the air.

In April 1943, the tail of his plane had been sliced off in a mid-air collision. He broke his spine as he was bailing out, and had to spend several months in hospital.

A few weeks after his death, his English-born widow was presented with his Distinguished Service Cross and Silver Star, the second and third highest bravery awards in the USA.

It was only a few months previously that Frieda Sutton, who was involved in the nursing and Air Raid Precaution services, had become his second wife. She was inconsolable after her husband's death. Six months later, at the age of 34, she died in a London flat, clutching a photograph of her husband.

Captain Wilkinson, a native of Swarthmore, Pennsylvania, was buried in the American Cemetery at Cambridge, England. His son from the first marriage later became a fighter pilot. Wreckage from the Cynghordy crash forms part of the American Air Museum's collection.

The USAAF stayed at Duxford until the end of 1945. At the peak of its strength, in 1944, it employed 450,000 Americans in Britain. Many were fighter pilots or bomber crews, but most of the men and women were involved in various tasks to keep the aircraft flying. Nearly 30,000 never made it home.

# BLOSSOMING GARDEN HITS A NEW HIGH



The National Botanic Garden of Wales is celebrating another increase in visitor numbers – even topping last year's 17-year high.

A grand total of 163,403 leisure visitors crossed the threshold at the Carmarthenshire attraction between the beginning of April 2018 and the end of March 2019. Not only is this the highest visitor figure since the Garden opened in 2000, but a huge increase on three years ago, when the total for the year (2015-16) was a little over 114,000.

Director Huw Francis said: "To increase our numbers by nearly 50,000 in three years is a fantastic success story for the Botanic Garden, a real credit to the hard work of our staff and volunteers, and a reflection of the huge support we receive from our members and friends."

But, said Mr Francis, there are other milestone moments in the past year that are as important as the number of people through the gate: "It's not all about visitor numbers for a botanic garden: we have to work every bit as hard to meet other crucial goals, too."

He explained that, as a national institution, the Botanic Garden delivers key benefits for Wales, especially against the Well-being of Future Generations Act: "Delivering



more than 27,000 educational engagements with our small team is a real high watermark for us," he said. "And the exceptional work our science and horticulture teams are doing all around the world – as well as in our own backyard – is something all of Wales can be proud of."

Against a backdrop of feared widespread insect collapse, Garden scientists are focused on their Saving Pollinators project, which involves researching the behaviour of pollinators to better inform what we can do to help them thrive, deliver habitat restoration and support species recovery.

This year, with specialist support from the Millennium Seed Bank and Botanic Garden Conservation International (BGCI), the National Seed Bank of Wales has been established, while conservation and research work continues on rainforest restoration within the Kinabatangan floodplain in Borneo, as well on endangered plant species in Wales.

Mr Francis added: "The National Botanic Garden of Wales is a world-leading centre of excellence in science, horticulture and conservation representing Wales on the world stage, as well as a leading visitor destination, and we hope all of Wales is as proud of its National Botanic Garden as we are."

Gary Davies, Chair of the Garden added: "The National Botanic Garden of Wales is an independent charity, looking forward to celebrating its 20th birthday in 2020. As the critical research and conservation work goes on, in what looks like being challenging times – both for increasing visitors and securing the required funding for the sort of scientific and educational endeavours we are aiming to do – we will redouble our efforts at every level and look forward to welcoming even more visitors during the coming year."

I am again indebted to Dan our Secretary for his minutes which I refer to here. Lyn was introduced by our President Gary who he met over 2 years ago when they were both elected as Trustees of the new Llandovery Museum which is now open. Lyn is extremely supportive in the community being on several committees and organisations including the League of Friends of Llandovery Hospital. He is also a proud and long standing member of Côr Meibion Llanymddyfri/the Llandovery Male Voice Choir. Lyn was proud to mention that even at his age he still lectures in Carmarthen every Monday. His talk would be reminiscing about the past as he was very interested in local history. He looked back with fond memories how the Railway Station used to be a hive of activity with many steam trains passing through and remembered the old pedestrian bridge over the railway lines. Lyn was born and bred in Myddfai and lived there until he left for University but has never lost

contact with the village, still visiting Sion Chapel. He stated that the meaning of 'Myddfai' was bowl or saucer which is accurate as whichever way you leave the village you have to climb a hill to get out of it. His father lived all his life in Myddfai working as the local blacksmith which was the family trade with his Grandfather working in Gwynfe and his great Grandfather in Brynamman. Even then they had to diversify and his father would deliver mail before starting his days work as the blacksmith. Another of his father's jobs was pulling teeth! The family started the village shop and Post Office, hence 'Lyn Post' (Lyn the post). His mother came from a farm on the Eppynt Range (now spelt Epynt) but in 1939 all 52 farms in the area had to move out which they did and the Epynt Range became what is known as the best infantry training area in the UK. In his early years Lyn attended Myddfai school which had 40 pupils. Until he was 13 there was no electricity in the village apart from generators in Myddfai Hall. They had to make their own entertainment which was basically based in the Hall with quizzes, Eisteddfod's etc. In 1959 Lvn left Myddfai school with seven other pupils for Llandovery and the numbers at the school never recovered and eventually closed. Village life back then was centred around the small square where locals gathered on the one seat and chatted away for hours. Lyn stated that we should not underestimate the value of our churches and chapels and his closing remark was that 'We should not live in the past, but also never let go the sense of community'.

The talk was thoroughly enjoyed by all Lyn. Diolch yn fawr iawn i ti.

You may find anything from cards, prints and original works of art, see anything from works in progress to exhibitions of contemporary art, better yet, you can acquire pieces for your collection direct from the artists themselves.

You have the chance to meet and talk with the artist. often over a cup of tea and a slice of cake, and gain a unique glimpse of the artistic process. Don't feel shy about visiting; all the artists are only opening their studios as they are keen to meet you.

fine, and which allowed the Castle to be within our sights throughout the Walk. This is a Walk which we are sure will remain long in our Catalogue.

Thursday 28th March: The Official Opening of the final (Powys) of the Heart of Wales Line Trail in Llandrindod Wells. There were three walks of varying length which could be followed.

Following our descent on the eastern side of the hill, we were rewarded for our efforts with a warm welcome at Pantycelyn Farm, where we were all treated to invigorating cups of tea from Cynthia and Cecil Williams!

### NEW AGREEMENT WILL HELP CONSERVE AND IMPROVE OUR RIVERS IN WALES

A new agreement between Natural Resources Wales and Afonydd Cymru, the organisation which oversees the country's six Rivers Trusts, will play a key role in improving Welsh rivers.

In January, NRW's Chief Executive Clare Pillman and the Afonydd Cymru's Chief Executive Dr Stephen March-Smith signed a Memorandum of Understanding to work together to improve river catchments, fisheries and ecology.

David Letellier, South East Wales Operations Manager for NRW. said: "This is an exciting development as greater collaboration between Afonydd Cymru and ourselves will lead to a variety of environmental, community and social benefits.

"Historically, many of the links between NRW and the Rivers Trusts have developed at regional level but this agreement will make sure that the best examples of working together are used across the country."

The MoU will focus on protecting our rivers for future generations, encouraging more people to enjoy rivers through angling, navigation and other recreational activities; protecting wildlife and habitats; improved ecological status and reducing the impact of climate change through environmental improvements.

David added: "Healthy rivers are a sign of a healthy environment and we all have a key role in ensuring they are the best they can be.

"By sharing information, encouraging best practice and developing educational programmes, this partnership will be a major step forward in bringing together a wealth of expertise and knowledge from both parties.

"That's why we are delighted to work not only with Afonydd Cymru, but with any organisation or group which aims to improve our rivers and protect the fish, animals and plants which live in and around them today and for the future."

Dr Stephen Marsh-Smith OBE for Afonydd Cymru said: "We are delighted that the work of Rivers Trusts and collaboration with NRW has been recognised in this way and set down formally.

"The rivers of Wales, their fisheries and wildlife are in urgent need of restoration and protection. This cannot be achieved solely by one group and we hope this new understanding heralds a turning point.

"In the future there may be huge changes to the way we manage our environment and it is vital that we have partnerships and plans in place to bring about some much-needed restoration when the opportunity arises."


