17th February 2023 saw the community come together from far and wide for a meeting, galvanised by Rachel Evans of the Countryside Alliance Wales on the threat of pylons through our valley. A Steering Group was quickly formed but before we could make any plans the public consultation by Bute Energy/Green GEN Cymru landed upon us with no time to spare. We quickly organised and distributed flyers publicising the meeting at Llandovery Rugby Club on 29th March 2023. The turnout was amazing with over 700 people attending at what was short notice and at a critical time for farmers due to it being the middle of lambing season. We invited the attendees

to complete feedback sheets as they left the consultation and only 1% were supportive of the Bute Energy/Green GEN Cymru proposals. The crane parked overshadowing the rugby club showed the minimum height of the pylons at 27m and drew plenty of interest from the TV news programmes.

Our next milestone, which was fast approaching, was the written consultation response deadline of 28th April 2023. As soon as we learnt that no comments would be recorded by Bute Energy/Green GEN Cymru at the consultation of 29th March 2023 there was another flurry of activity. More flyers urging everyone to write not only to Bute Energy/Green GEN Cymru but also to our Senedd representatives and the Minister for Climate Change and the Environment. A draft template letter was prepared to help the Community respond on what will be judged in accordance with the planning legislation. We also hosted two drop-in sessions where people were encouraged to attend for assistance with drafting a written response. We learnt of many more personal stories of the devastating impact that this scheme will potentially bring. In addition to the 100s of you that took time to write to Bute Energy/Green GEN Cymru we also submitted a more detailed response on behalf of the Community.

Simultaneously we were visiting every landowner on the preferred route. Similar to the consultation feedback over 99% do not want pylons on their land! As you will be aware, Bute Energy/Green GEN Cymru have a number of alternative routes through our valley and we will be contacting those additional landowners over the coming months.

We have attracted more media interest with a brief piece in the *Daily Express* and a more substantial piece on *S4C's Ffermio*. We have caught their attention and there are more articles and programmes planned in the coming months. Before we rest on any laurels, we are looking at how we can engage with possible supporters at the Urdd Eisteddfod. The Urdd Eisteddfod is a celebration of our future and we wish to make sure it is the best Urdd possible, and the potential of 100,000 additional supporters to our cause is too good an opportunity to miss.

With this in mind we have launched a new website, www.nopylons.wales and www.dimpeilonau.cymru . Please visit the site to see what we have been up to and, if you haven't already, please join as a supporter so we can keep you personally updated in the coming weeks and months.

Finally, a massive thank you to the whole Tywi Valley Community, the response has been inspiring and motivates us to fight to the bitter end.



- Guest Speaker: Huw Richards, Permaculture.

Our speaker for the evening was Huw Richards who began his talk by describing how his passion for growing vegetables came about. From an early age he would help his father grow fruit and vegetables in their kitchen garden which consisted of a series of raised beds on poor soil. As his experience grew, and at the tender age of 12, Huw began a YouTube channel to show what he was growing in the garden. Having begun with just a few viewers, Huw described how he fine-tuned the videos and soon had



established a dedicated following which now has reached a staggering 90 million viewers worldwide. His initial goal still remains to show people that growing vegetables doesn't have to be expensive or time-consuming and his fame has quickly spread to feature articles in newspapers and gardening magazines, even radio and tv gardening programmes. He's a relatively local lad who attended Llandovery college, and following an approach from the DK publishing company, wrote his first book 'Veg in one bed' in the Printing Office café as the wifi signal was too weak at home.

Huw recommends growing field beans rather than broad beans as they are easier to grow, produce twice as many beans and are not susceptible to black fly. He also recommends sowing 'Sarpo Mira' potatoes due to their resistance to blight.

It was evident from Huw's talk that his passion for gardening continues unabashed and he now has a 7-acre permaculture site near Aberystwyth where he has raised beds, solar tunnels, a newly planted orchard of 120 trees and a 35 metre long rose bed developed in collaboration with David Austin roses as an initiative to use roses for their edible petals and hips. Huw explained to his audience that he continues to experiment with different growing techniques and recently has created hot beds to allow him to extend the growing season. Clearly, he is a dynamic and articulate young man and continues to produce 2-3 videos a week, alongside finding time to visit other inspiring gardeners. At the end of his talk Huw answered questions and was given a warm applause.





# PHYSICIANS OF MYDDFAI STILL INSPIRING

Herbal medicine is the theme of this year's Physicians of Myddfai conference, to be held in the village Community Hall on Saturday 24 June. There will be four presentations, presided over by the chairman of the Physicians of Myddfai Society, Dr R Brinley Jones.

The conference will be opened by one of the Society's local members, Mary MacGregor, who will read her poem, 'Naming of Plants'.

She will be followed by Rosemary Westlake of Cardiff, a member of the Institute of Herbal Medicine, who will talk about early treatments for chest ailments, together with some that are still used today.

Lara Bean will then outline the modern practice of herbal medicine. Lara was raised in Myddfai but now lives and works in north Pembrokeshire.

"Through walks, talks and workshops I bring tradition and science together with the aim of increasing awareness and understanding of the value of plants as medicine," she said.

"Our bodies have an innate ability to heal themselves and herbs have been used for thousands of years to bring balance back to the body," she added.

After lunch there will be two presentations. In the first, Dafydd Monks will talk about the herbalist David Thomas Jones (1779-1839), Mynydd Llanllyfni, known as 'The old mountain doctor'. His son, also David Thomas Jones (1824-1888), sold children's herbal medicine in Europe and America.

Dafydd Monks is a herbalist who lives and works in Gwynedd and is interested in the history of herbal remedies and folklore.

The final presentation will be given by Val Thomas of the Cowbridge Physic Garden. Surrounded by high stone

walls which partly date from the 13th century, only plants found in Britain before 1800 are included in the garden.

Twelve central beds are devoted to plants which, over many centuries, have had medicinal properties attributed to them. Each of these beds contains plants specific to a part of the body or a specific illness.

After tea, the Society's annual meeting will be held. The tickets, which cost  $\pounds$ 32, include tea or coffee on arrival, lunch afterwards, and tea and cakes at the end of the conference.




# LLANDOVERY ROTARY CLUB

### BRIAN PHILIP HANCOCK



Following a shocking and heart-breaking diagnosis of Glioblastoma (a fast-growing and aggressive brain tumour) last year, our beloved husband, dad, granddad and friend Brian Philip Hancock of Salem, Llandeilo died peacefully at home on 17 April 2023.

How can we sum up Brian's life in a few words?

Brian and his first wife, Una, married in 1979 and raised two wonderful daughters, Emma and Laura. While they're marriage wouldn't last forever as they'd hoped, Brian and Una remained close, and were excellent grandparents for their very loved granddaughters, Isobel and Olivia. Una and her partner Stuart Davies were a great support to Brian and Debbie during his illness.

Brian was a dedicated conservationist, and spent most of his career as Head Warden for the National Trust in Carmarthenshire. He was instrumental in bringing the iconic White Park Cattle back to Dinefwr in the early 1990s and led on a number of projects designed to improve access to Dinefwr Park, including the Mill Pond boardwalk and way-marked path through the Deer Park. After retiring, Brian continued his passion for creating rich and varied ecosystems through consultancy work across the U.K. as well as improving wildlife habitats at his own farm.

After marrying Debbie in 2014, Brian provided guidance, wisdom and laughter to his "bonus kids", Sam, Molly and Becky. He played an important part in their lives as they all moved into adulthood, and he always enjoyed spending time with them.

Our family liked to say that Brian had "itchy feet", and he spent much of his time travelling (or planning travel!) with Debbie. Their passport stamps increased over the years, but Brian especially looked forward to their trips to California, Italy and Spain (where they owned a home), as well as to France to see his dear friends Ian and Sheila Bennett.

If you knew Brian, you'll know he was quiet, unassuming and extraordinary in his ability to say just the right thing at the right time. He had a passion for history and loved learning. He loved being near - or in - the sea, and always enjoyed time on boats. Brian gave us all so much love, happiness and adventure, and our lives are so much richer for sharing his life for the time we did.

Brian is so loved and deeply missed by his wife Debbie (Queen) Hancock; children Emma (Nick) Leach and Laura Hancock (Sandro Antunes), Sam (Bryanna) Ingle, Molly Ingle, Rebecca Ingle; grandchildren Isobel Leach, Olivia Antunes and Mikaela, Ace and Ian Ingle.

Cheryl's talk then focused on the history of the Trussle Trust that started in 1997 founded by Paddy and Carol Henderson. The name Trussle came from Carol's mother who was a Trussle. The charity was started to help children in Bulgaria whose families were struggling to find enough food.

The first Trussle Food Bank was in Salisbury and today there are some one thousand two hundred Trussle Food Banks in Britain almost equivalent to the number of MacDonald outlets.

Cheryl explained that the Trussle Trust do not directly run Food Banks and operate as a franchise and said there are a number of Food Banks operating in the area but they work independently.

Ammanford has 3 part time staff and relies on monies that are predominantly donated with the majority of food from supermarket bins.Mainly volunteers bring food to the Food Bank and Ammanford has to purchase food to meet needs.

Ammanford was established in 2013 and has provided help to some 21,000 people in under 10 years of which 40% were children. Today working families come to the Food Bank via referrals come from other charities, Doctor's surgeries, Citizens Advise etc; For example Cheryl said that in 2019 some 2,400 people were assisted rising to 3,498 people in 2022.Of this help 40% of the people were on Universal Credit.



Today Ammanford has had to widen its help outside the food range to include items such as toilet rolls, nappies and incontinence pads.

In addition to providing food and other household necessities Ammanfood Bank has established a Health Centre operating 2 days a week and run by volunteers. In addition to further service this part of West Wales a further outlet is operating in the Aman Valley and further satellite Food Banks will be established. Cheryl said that her organisation is planning up to 4 years ahead.

The talk generated a large number of questions with the vote of thanks delivered by the President Colin Jenkins.



# MUSEUM NOTES



This year is the fiftieth anniversary of the official opening of the Llyn Brianne reservoir in the Upper Tywi Valley. On 15 May 1973, Princess Alexandra pulled the handle of an old village pump to open a valve which initiated the flow of water from the dam.

The Princess had flown over the 530-acre reservoir in a helicopter of the Queen's Flight before landing at Ystradffin Farm and travelling by car to the site.

The reservoir regulates the flow of the river to Nantgaredig, where water is abstracted prior to being treated and piped to various parts of South Wales. In 1996, the reservoir spillway was raised and a hydroelectric generating station was added at the base.

The 300-foot-high dam, constructed of locally sourced rock and clay, is one of the highest in Britain, and the reservoir – completed almost two years ahead of schedule – immediately became a major tourist attraction.

The original plan had been to build a reservoir in the



Gwendraeth Valley, which would have meant drowning the village of Porth-y-rhyd. Fierce opposition forced the authorities to choose another site at Llangyndeyrn. Whenever the engineers approached the village, the church bell would ring to warn the inhabitants, who obstructed all entrances.

Eventually, attention was turned to a site four miles to the north of Rhandir-mwyn. William Jones, aged 86, and his sister Jane of Troedrhiwruddwen Farm, who had successfully prevented the Forestry Commission from taking over their farm in 1952, refused to allow access to officials of Swansea Corporation to survey some of their land.


A Defence Committee was formed, with Emlyn Jones, Llanddewi Brefi, as chairman, and Dafydd Dafis, headmaster of Rhandir-mwyn School, as secretary.

A Public Inquiry, which opened at the Castle Hotel, Llandovery in December 1966, continued until February 1967. In December of that year, the Secretary of State for Wales, Cledwyn Hughes, approved the building of the reservoir, on the condition that minimum damage was done to the area. The Minister also decided not to authorise recreational facilities at the reservoir.

On the day of the official opening, twenty coaches from Swansea, Neath. Port Talbot, Pontardawe. Llanelli and Llandovery, transported VIPs to the Llyn Brianne site.

A notable absentee was the Mayor of Swansea, who was offended when he discovered that people of a 'lesser status" were to be presented to Princess Alexandra, and he was not. Instead of travelling to Rhandir-mwyn, he sunbathed in the grounds of Mansion House before visiting three old people's homes.

It was announced at Daniel's funeral that a fund would be set up that would provide support to those, like Daniel, who were suffering from poor mental health. It became clear that there was a lack of awareness around mental health, everyone had been touched by suicide but very little was being done to combat the issue.

Daniel was an agricultural contractor and was wellliked and known throughout the community. His strong ties with the agricultural sector coupled with Emma being a farmer's daughter made this an obvious route for targeting support. It also became clear that agriculture carried the highest rate of suicide, yet little was being done to help this. Emma has used Daniel as a basis for everything the Foundation has gone forward to do. Daniel was a quiet character with lots of love and care for those around him, he would hate the idea of anyone suffering or feeling the way he did. In his name the DPJ Foundation is using Daniel's story to help others.

Kate Miles, Manager of the DPJ Foundation, said, "We are very grateful to Ashmole & Co for choosing to help raise funds and awareness of the foundation over the next 12 months. As part of the fundraising activities, Ashmole & Co will be doing a sponsored walk along the Pembrokeshire coastal path, dress-down Fridays once a month and some staff will be taking part in running events including the Cardiff Half Marathon.



into the road! Mercifully no-one was hurt, but I have to say Jacky had, what might be termed a Grade SIX nervous breakdown at the news. We were instructed by the County Council to rebuild

We were instructed by the County Council to rebuild the wall, or take it down to a safe level and to complete before the Eistedfodd. There followed weeks of search for professionals to rebuild, while we examined and reassessed the damage and how to put it right. We stared and stared at the debris and the wreck when a question arose. Did we actually own this wall in Stone Street?

- We examined the 1848 Deed, when the then Carmarthen Council was given a 99 year lease by the Llwynywormwood Estate in order to provide a British School for the poor in the Parish of Llandingat. The surveyor's drawing on the Deed shows the wall is already there. So NO, the wall does not belong to the theatre.
- 2. The wall is built in stone with lime mortar, it is built against 4 feet of ground, its foundations in the road. It is a RETAINING WALL. According to the UK law on Retaining walls built on Highways, the responsibility for maintenance and ownership is with the Highways Department of the County Authority. So, NO, we do not own it.

We have written to the County Council four times explaining that THEY are the owners today on behalf of the good people of Llandovery, Llandingat and not forgetting Llwynywormwood.

We have rebuilt the wall as ordered by the County, completed before the Eistedfodd as instructed by the County. We await response from the County, it is now five weeks of silence.

We want to get back to our theatre work, without this burden of indecision/responsibility hanging over us.

Long live live theatre!


