In response to our letter as published on page 44 in The Post no 331. February 2024:

Dear Criw Amgylchedd Llanymddyfri -Llandovery Climate Action Group

Thank you for your email to the Minister for Climate Change, asking for a National Clean Energy Plan for Wales. I work in the Energy Division and have been asked to respond. Thank you also for the work the Llandovery Climate Action Group is doing locally, and ensuring an opportunity to discuss important issues. It is vital we find a way to discuss and consider all views, which is fundamental to planning decision in Wales. The social, environmental and economic (including job-creation) benefits associated with any development should be fully factored into the decision-making process. Planning decisions must be based on an assessment of the impacts of the proposed development, irrespective of who the applicant is.

The Welsh Government considers it vital that communities benefit from local renewable energy projects. We have achieved 97% of our target for 1 GW of renewable energy to be locally owned by 2030. We shall continue to work with developers to ensure they understand the policy intention in Wales to deliver benefits and support communities. As you note in your e-mail, Wales has for centuries not benefited from its rich natural resources; the intention is to reverse this trend and ensure we maximise opportunities for Wales.

In relation to the point you made on a National Energy Plan, we are seeking relevant evidence. Our investment supporting all local authorities to develop local area energy plans will identify opportunities for retaining benefit within communities. All local authorities across Wales are working on a Local Energy Plan; regional energy plans exist already. These energy plans will provide Wales with detail on the energy needs and generation of each local authority area. This will provide us with better knowledge to approach the national plan, so that we have the local and regional knowledge feeding to the national level.

I have included the following links for your attention and apologise if you are already aware of the documents. I hope you find them of interest, as they form part of planning for sustainable energy in Wales.

Heat Strategy for Wales:

In 2022, we published a consultation on the draft Heat Strategy for Wales, which includes reference to green energy, renewable energy, the Well-being and Future Generations Act and community heat. Keep an eye on the Heat Strategy for Wales consultation webpage to read the Responses Report and Final Strategy, due for publication in March 2024.

Review of Wales's Renewable Energy Targets:

In 2022, we consulted on the Welsh Government's proposed new renewable energy targets. You can read the consultation documents and responses summary on the Review of Wales's renewable energy targets page, which include reference to renewable energy local-ownership and low-carbon tracked growth.

Energy Generation in Wales:

For more on Wales's community energy projects,

please see the Energy Generation in Wales report 2022, which highlights Wales's latest progress in developing renewable energy. You can read a summary in the Minister's written statement.

Renewable Energy Developer:

Please see Renewable Energy Developer for Wales to read about plans to develop Welsh Government owned solar and wind projects, the income from which will go to the Welsh Government. A board will supervise the projects, ensuring the developer acts in the interest of Wales and its people.

Future Energy Grids for Wales (FEW) - Insights Report:

Future Energy Grids for Wales: Insights report (gov. wales)

The FEW project aims to contribute to the Net Zero Goal by 2050 by:

- 1. Consolidating a broad view, across the network companies operating in Wales, of the Net Zero compliant Welsh future energy system pathways to 2050;
- 2. Identifying the key implications for electricity and gas network operators and steps needed to develop energy networks in Wales as part of the wider UK energy system: and
- 3. Developing recommendations for the Welsh Government, consistent with its ambitions to accelerate decarbonisation and role in the energy governance landscape.

Air Source Heat Pumps:

We recently published our commissioned research into Heat Pump Noise and Permitted Development rights, as we wish to encourage heat-pump uptake without creating noise nuisance. You can read the Minister's written statement, which links to the report. Our Planning team are reviewing the research findings with a view to consulting on the topic this year. Please see the Welsh Government consultations webpage, where you can sign up for newsletters on future consultation, and there is an option to filter by topic or key words.

GLANSEVIN MANSION PLAS GLANSEFIN PLAS GLANSEVIN

The Glansevin Estate once extended over more than 4,000 acres and belonged to the Lloyd, later Pryse Lloyds for well over 500 years. Do you know where we are? We have discovered that many people locally don't know Glansevin even exists. Having become the owners two years ago now, we want to bring the Mansion back into the community's consciousness.

The house is Grade II* and is listed mainly for its plasterwork and staircase. The front facade and rooms were added in the early 1800s and those and the older parts of the Mansion have reached the point of needing a lot of work. This has prompted me to look closely at the history, particularly what has happened in the last 100 years or so, to try and find out how any repairs or alterations work with the older fabric.

In doing this, we have met many people, some who lived there, some who visited. We now have a timeline and fairly direct contact with nearly everyone who has owned the place since 1947. We have tracked cousins of the Lloyds who lived here until 1947. They knew about Glansevin, but Glansevin no longer had contact with them. Other people who lived here are Terry who was

at Glansevin as an evacuee from London in WWII and who will be spending his 90th birthday here this year and Gwenda Rees who ran the Hwyrnos with her husband through the 1970s. The Hwyrnos staff held a 50 year reunion at Glansevin last September. We are in touch with other people who lived here or visited as children from the 1940s onwards. We love hearing their memories and they are also really useful, throwing light on how this large set of buildings was used.

Apart from the constant mending and maintenance we are doing, we let Glansevin for weddings, large family and friends self catered parties, workshops, corporate off sites. Guests mostly stay for at least two nights, but we are open occasionally or last minute for parties who don't need the accommodation, particularly if they are mid week. You may have seen our adverts.

We have also been working in the grounds. Our mature apple trees are Glansevin - a variety which, I am told, originates here. We have started a programme of replanting the orchard, with another "Glansevin" tree but also with other at risk rare apple varieties. We hope to be able to press some serious quantity of apple juice in years to come. Our ancient oak tree on the front lawn continues to survive although sadly a large split in the tree a few years ago is worrying.

I am very keen to hear any stories or connections people have to Glansevin and I love showing people around, so do ask if you would like a mini tour.

Padmasambhava Yoga & Meditation Centre

Bringing awareness into breathing opens the pathway to using the breath to bring about relaxation and balance and enhance energy all adding to a sense of wellbeing and better health. Weekly practice of yoga allows the body to gently gain strength and flexibility and these qualities are often also reflected in the mind.

Classes at Padmasambhava are suitable for people of all ages and abilities, from Beginners through to more progressive, as well as Chair Yoga. LLANDOVERY EVENTS AND COMMUNITY **ACTIVITIES** MEET OUR NEW SUPPORT



Excitement is brewing in Llandovery as two dynamic individuals step into roles pivotal for community growth and development. Maggi Swallow and Tiago Gambogi, both proud residents of Llandovery, have been appointed as the Llandovery Events Support Coordinator and Llandovery Community Activities Support Coordinator, respectively. Their appointment marks the dawn of an ambitious venture - the Llandovery Support Coordinator's Project – a two-year initiative fuelled by a generous National Lottery Community Fund grant. Led by the Llandovery Youth and Community Centre (LYCC) and a steering group through the Rural Futures Programme this project aims to tackle critical issues such as the cost-of-living crisis, accessibility to essential services, and fostering community resilience.

Central to the project's mission is a surge in community activities and volunteering opportunities from 2024 through to early 2026. Residents can anticipate an array of enriching experiences, from Luncheon Clubs and Repair Café workshops to Cooking on a Budget sessions and circular economy initiatives like plant and seed swaps.

Additionally, existing services addressing the cost-ofliving crisis will be amplified to ensure residents receive any necessary support. However, the scope of the project also extends beyond these initiatives. 

LLANDEILO LITFEST

In 2016, a group of local authors got together and organised a book fair in Llandeilo's Civic Hall. Each author had a small stall, and the group held a selection of readings and workshops during the day. All with the desire to get their books to an audience ever more difficult to reach in the Amazon style of book selling online.

With help from local Welsh speaker Gaynor Jones in 2017 this evolved into a proper Literature Festival with a focus on local Welsh themes and Welsh language. It grew fast in size and scope, inviting speakers from further afield, with a mix of local talent and bigger names. It picked up a diverse range of topics – politics, the environment, gender, art, music, history etc.

The first Lit Fest weekend included over 40 different events, branching out into town, using the function room at the Angel Inn, the Horeb Chapel, Fountain Fine Art Gallery, Oriel Mimosa, the Ginhaus and the Cottage Inn to name a few. In 2019 over 1000 visitors came to Llandeilo and the festival won the Carmarthenshire excellence in Culture Award for a second time in a row.

Sadly, the 2020 event had to be cancelled due to Covid and in 2021 it had to be held online only.

However, in 2022 the festival took a leap of faith and held a smaller but hybrid event, entirely in Hengwrt but streaming half the sessions on the Internet.

Thanks to its success in 2022 and generous, faithful sponsors, 2023 saw the return to a full-scale event with the reintroduction of evening performances, there was 'Pot Fest at the Lit Fest', a celebration of local ceramics to compliment celebrity potter Keith Brymer Jones's talk. Many of the events were held at Hengwrt but there were also talks at Oriel Mimosa, Diod, Flows, The Civic Hall The White Hart and a magical evening of storytelling at The Warehouse.



From the start in 2017 we defined ourselves as a multigenre. Welsh festival with as many Welsh language events as possible, with simultaneous translation of as many Welsh events into English as possible. Where the language isn't Welsh, the theme usually is. Our talks spark important conversations and debates affecting our lives in Wales and we are proud to be the only festival in Wales with such a focus on Welsh literature. This year almost 40% of our talks will be in the Welsh language, with English translation available for most. We have a goal to reach 50% Welsh language for next years' festival.

This year's festival will include a children's festival at Yr Hen Farchned, just up the road from Hencwrt. There will be a mixture of performance, illustration, writing workshops and author talks as well as lots of hands-on art and craft. Like the main festival all the authors are living in Wales with good representation of Welsh language children's books.

LLANDOVERY GARDEN CLUB

Secretary: Denise Nicholson's Report of Meeting: Thursday October 2024 Guest Speaker: Richard Williams 'Plant Hunters'

Richard began with John Tradescant, the elder, who served as the gardener to King Charles I. He was responsible for the introduction of many species, including the conker, which was probably traded from merchant ships on London's Docklands. He also founded a museum of curiosities, called the Ark, which displayed his plant and animal collections. His son, John Tradescant, the younger, succeeded him as the gardener to King Charles I. He collected specimens from Russia, North Africa, the Middle East and North America. He brought back many treasures, including the tulip tree, magnolia, phlox and Virginia creeper. He also inherited his father's museum, and added more items to it, such as native American artifacts, shells, and fossils. He donated his collections to Elias Ashmole, who later founded the Ashmolean Museum in Oxford.

The historical romantic writer, Philippa Gregory has written 2 books about these gardeners: Earthly Joys and Virgin Earth.

Joseph Banks was another famous plant hunter who accompanied Captain James Cook on his first voyage around the world. He collected over 1,000 new species of plants from places such as Brazil, Tahiti, New Zealand, and Australia. He also introduced many plants to Britain, such as eucalyptus, acacia, and kangaroo paw. He became the president of the Royal Society, and the director of the Royal Botanic Gardens at Kew.

David Douglas was a Scottish botanist, who explored North America and Hawaii, and collected over 200 new species of plants. He introduced many conifers to Britain, such as the Douglas fir, the ponderosa pine, and the sugar pine. He also discovered the California poppy, and the columbine. He died tragically at the age of 35 when he fell into a 'bull trap' in Hawaii and was gored by a wild bull. There was, however, some uncertainty as to the manner of his death – did he fall or was he pushed?

Tom Hart Dyke is a modern plant hunter, who travelled to over 50 countries, and collected over 5,000 species of plants. He is especially interested in orchids and has discovered many new and rare varieties. He famously survived a kidnapping ordeal in Colombia, where he was held hostage by guerrillas for nine months. He used his time to sketch a map of his dream garden, which he later built at his ancestral home, Lullingstone Castle. He now calls it the World Garden, and it showcases his plant collections from different continents.


LLANDOVERY ROTARY CLUB

Ysgol Pantycelyn was one of the first schools to take part and has taken part, I believe, either as Pantycelyn or Ysgol Bro Dinefwr every year since with the exception of the Covid years. Th initial organiser was Mr Thomas after whom I took over and then Mr David Marks organised it for a few years but I then returned as organiser. The teacher who originally trained our Pantycelyn team, Mrs Edwina Rees (now a teacher in Ysgol Bro Pedr), is also still coaching teams every year but we're both a little older now.

ONCE AROUND THE SUN WITH THE CAFFI TRWSIO LLANYMDDYFRI



I came to live in the parish of Llansadwrn during January of last year. A few months later, in March, one of my neighbours asked me if I would like to join him doing voluntary repairs at the new Repair Cafe in Llandovery. I had read about the concept of repair cafes before and, being a dyed in the wool conservationist, I found the whole concept of keeping landfill out of the ground by extending the lifetime of the things we use in daily life very attractive.

"When is it happening?" I asked. "Today in about half an hour" he replied. "But I can't fix anything!" I objected. "You know how to fix your bike don't you?" He was referring to the fact that I had just returned from a three month cycling trip around Europe. Somehow I just couldn't resist the opportunity of getting involved with local people to fix local problems, however small and insignificant they might seem. There was barely enough time to pack the few tools I had into the car and drive along the valley to the Scout hut in town.


When I arrived there was, of course a sea of unfamiliar faces to get to know and I have to admit that even after a year and maybe half a dozen repair sessions I still don't know everybody's name. But it really didn't matter, the Repair Cafe is an extremely welcoming place. Every session is cordially supported with delicious home baked cake and teas. Some people have become regular "customers". Electronics repairs are often in demand and we have two qualified volunteers able to examine, advise but sadly not always complete the repair, if obtaining spare parts is an issue. Some customers have returned at a subsequent session having sourced the spare parts themselves. Furniture repair has also been very popular. One week when there were no bikes to fix I found myself mending a very beautiful antique looking chair, under the watchful eye of Chris our Woodwork specialist. We often have volunteers with sewing and machine skills who are

willing to do textile repairs and improvements.

It's always encouraging to hear from people when something has gone particularly well and it can also be helpful to know when repairs have not been so worthwhile, so if you have had a repair done here, we are always pleased to hear back from you.

There are no charges for the work we do, but if you are seeking a repair you are asked to complete a short form which helps us with planning and providing the service. While your repair is undertaken you are free to enjoy some home baked cake, a hot drink or just to chat with other folks. When the repair is completed you are invited to make a contribution towards the costs of hiring the hall, publicity and so on. But such contribution is entirely voluntary.

We are looking forward to another year at the Scout Hut and we're considering whether or not we could manage to provide the service on a regular monthly basis which would make it easier for people to plan. So it would be a great time to join us if you have some spare time on a Sunday afternoon. We're looking for people to help with repairs, providing teas and cakes, and with publicity, as well as new customers. The idea being that the more volunteers we have, the more we are able to spread the commitment and no one will have to sign up to attending every month. So please do come along in the first instance and enjoy the atmosphere with us at our next session on March 17th at 2pm in the Scout Hut. All are welcome, with or without repair jobs!

Phil reported that despite considerable expenditure on improving the green surround which volunteers had undertaken last year there was still scope for further investment in the club for the benefit of the membership.



SIR JOHN GARDNER WILKINSON (1797–1875) THE MAN WHO UNVEILED THE SECRETS OF EGYPT



In the shade of a yew in Llandingad cemetery, Llandovery, you will find the tombstone of one of the most influential people of the 19th century. On the remarkable monument, designed by himself, it is said that 'Sir Gardner Wilkinson, Knight, D.C.L., F.R.S.', who died on 29 October 1875, was a member of most of the learned and scientific societies of Europe and America.

Although his name is not well known outside of his specialist circles, his influence was huge, and he has been described as the 'Father of Egyptology in Britain'.

He was born on 5 October 1797 in Buckinghamshire, where his father was a clergyman who had a great interest in antiquities. Although his parents died young, Gardner inherited enough income to be educated at Harrow School and Exeter College, Oxford. He did not graduate, however, because of ill health. In an attempt to restore his health, he travelled to Italy, where he studied Egyptology at the instigation of the famous antiquarian, Sir William Gell.

In October 1821, aged, he visited Egypt for the first time. Such was the attraction that he stayed in the country for twelve years. During that time, he visited most of the





ancient sites known at the time, copying and recording inscriptions and paintings and making extensive notes. Indeed, his numbering system for the Valley of the Kings tombs is still used today.

He was very busy in other areas, too. He collected over four hundred plants and illustrated each one in colour. Although he prepared a manuscript, Desert Plants of Egypt, it was not published.

On top of this, he collected snakes and minerals, studied hydrology in relation to the Nile, and tried his best to learn the classical Arabic language.

When he returned to England in 1833, he was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society, and was later knighted. He also managed to publish the results of his research in many publications. Due to the publication of volumes such as Manners and Customs of the Ancient Egyptians and Handbook for Travelers in Egypt, he was considered an authority on ancient Egypt.

Following a trip to Eastern Europe in 1844, Dalmatia and Montenegro was published in two volumes. He visited Egypt for the third time, between 1848 and 1849, and was there for the last time in 1855. After that, Wilkinson stayed in Britain. Although his home was in London, he would often escape from the hustle and bustle of the city to visit friends in the fresh air of Wales.

It was during his frequent visits to Llanofer that he met his wife, Caroline Catherine Lucas from Gower, who was a quarter of a century younger than him. In 1856, when he was 59 years old, they married, and that was the beginning of his association with Llandovery and the area.

Caroline was a descendant of the Powell family, Glanareth, and her sister Maria was married to the Reverend William Watkins, a native of Gwynfe who was Warden of Llandovery College.

Caroline and her husband settled in Tenby temporarily, before moving to their permanent home, Brynfield House in Gower. The spot was ideal because they both had an interest in seashells and it was within reach of many prehistoric sites. In 1869, Sir Gardner was made Vice-President of the Society of Antiquaries of Wales.

He and his wife often visited William and Maria Watkins at their home in Bank House, Llandovery, which is where Sir Gardner died in 1875. His widow stayed with her sister at Bank House until her own death in 1881

Caroline had written a number of books herself, including Weeds and Wildflowers (1858). She also edited her husband's manuscripts. However, Sir Gardner left his



collections to a cousin who was married to the owner of Calke Abbey in Derbyshire, leaving his widow in a poor financial position. Fortunately, Benjamin Disraeli came to the rescue, by persuading the Queen to grant her a pension.

Sir Gardner Wilkinson's papers are now held in the Bodleian Library, Oxford, and the contents of his library are safe at Calke Abbey, now owned by the National Trust.

Post-note: Caroline and Maria were great-aunts of author and historian Robert L.T. Lucas (1917-2006), Former President of the Gower Society. In 1992, he was in contact with A.T. Arber-Cooke because he wanted to show Bank House, Llandovery, to Jason Thompson, author of the biography, Sir Gardner Wilkinson and his Circle

others inspired by the art of Gustav Klimt, Katsushika Hokusai and Georgia O'Keeffe.

The new work took 18 months to bring to life and unfolds picture by picture. Excitingly the piece will change every time it is performed by the Trio, as they weave their expert improvisation skills into it and push the boundaries of the music and themselves as performers.

In his twenties, while studying for his Masters in classical violin, Tim toured and recorded Django Reinhardt style jazz with the Dutch "Sinti" guitar Gypsies. Tim soon started writing his own music that draws from both jazz and classical music, marrying melodic twists with a rhythmic power that is truly exciting.

This led to prestigious collaborations with the Netherlands Chamber Orchestra, Cape Town Philharmonic and Tallinn Chamber Orchestra, and tours all over the world sharing the stage with renowned musicians such as Les Paul, Richard Galliano and Roby Lakatos.

As a climate composer, Tim firmly believes that art can inspire a better future for the planet and younger generations. Tim wrote his first big climate piece, The Five Elements, during the Covid 19 lockdown. On the back of that, he was commissioned to compose a Triple Concerto for the Amsterdam Concertgebouw and the Radio Philharmonic Orchestra, and in 2022 he was invited by the Dutch Royal Family to accompany them on their state visit to Sweden. 2023 saw Tim and his Trio open the Water Conference at the United Nations General Assembly in front of 190 countries.

STOP THE MADNESS – WALES IS NOT FOR SALE!

Over the last few months there have been multiple applications from businesses seeking to build new wind turbine installations across the Cambrian mountains and surrounding areas.

For those with only a passing knowledge of what the climate change crisis represents and the solutions being offered, these proposals would seem like a good thing, right? After all, wind turbines are good, and anybody who opposes them is bad.

Well, no. This storyline has become the persuasive dialogue in the media, and the Welsh Government is one of the worst peddlers of this simplistic narrative.

As a reaction to this situation a number of concerned citizens who live in the Towyi and Dolacothi valleys have formed a new community protest group to oppose these developments. Our group is called 'Cadw Cambria' and our tagline of "Respect our country's green heart" summarizes our vision of the critical need to protect and cherish this wonderful landscape.

As a preamble let us get one thing straight — we are not a 'nimby' group out to stop a specific project trashing our own location. As a group we are against all new wind turbine projects anywhere in rural Wales for the simple reason that this problem has already been solved — Wales



already generates more green power than it needs for its own purposes.

Also, we are not 'conspiracy nuts'. Cadw Cambria is clear that there is a climate change crisis to address, and that wind turbines have a part to play in providing a replacement to traditional carbon-based sources like oil, coal, and gas. However, that logic that does not permit the unfettered 'Californian Gold Rush' style building frenzy that the Welsh Government is unleashing on the Cambrians.

The cartoon below summarizes our nightmare.

There are several critical factors that are omitted from the public debate on green power generation.

First, there is no such thing as a 'no carbon' power source. All power sources including wind and solar have a carbon footprint. Obviously, this is lower than oil and gas, but it is still material and something that needs to be accounted for when measuring environmental impact. For instance, to build and install a single large wind turbine will generate around 80 tons of carbon, including 1,400 litres of lubricant oil over its lifetime. So, the true way to frame green power sources is 'low carbon', not 'no carbon '.

Secondly, all power generation installations cause environmental damage. Onshore or offshore, these installations have an impact, some more than others, and the critical mission for a government is to balance how, where, and how many to build without destroying the environment that you were setting out to save.

Thirdly, all of a country's power needs cannot be delivered from green power sources alone. Energy sector experts have calculated that green power sources like solar and wind will only ever be able to deliver around 70% of the total power demand. That is because these sources are variable in nature and can only operate within certain conditions, whilst the National Grid is an 'alwayson' service that needs to deliver on 100% of demand. As the grid cannot depend solely on variable sources, then the 30% gap must be filled by reliable sources like gas, coal and nuclear. Use of battery storage to fill this 30% gap is pure fantasy, as the volume of batteries required to deliver on this would be unaffordable, and battery manufacture itself has a high carbon footprint. The evolution of new battery technologies is underway but that is unlikely to yield benefits anytime soon by which time crude generation methods like wind turbines will have been made redundant.

There are at least seven different wind turbine developments in planning across the Cambrians, and for those in the Llandovery area there are two projects should be of particular concern:

- The 'Bryncadwgan' project from Galileo that proposes to install twenty-five 230-metre-tall turbines on top of a mountain at the head of the Dolacothi and Towyi valleys. This is equivalent to erecting twenty-five 70 story office blocks, each one twice the height of the Centre Point tower block in central London.
- The 'Waun Maenllwyd' project from Belltown Power located outside of Llandewwi Brefi, where they are seeking to install six 230-metre-tall wind turbines.

As a community group 'Cadw Cambria' plans to oppose all unwarranted wind turbine developments for two compelling reasons:

- · Firstly, that Wales already produces more green energy than it requires, so there is no economic or environmental logic for constructing new sites.
- · Secondly, if there was an incremental demand for new green energy then the more efficient and ecologically sensitive approach would be to scale up existing green power generation installations, thus avoiding the unwarranted destruction of environment and optimizing on the use of existing power transmission infrastructure.

If that is the case, then why is the Welsh Government so keen to support these new developments?

The primary reason appears to be the Welsh Government's plan to use the Cambrians as the base for a massive new wind power generation industrial complex. The Welsh Labour Party in particular has adopted an ideological viewpoint on this subject, where their ministers simply ignore scientific and economic data that contradicts their position. We suspect that the motivations are purely selfish and guided by green political leadership ambitions. In short, it is another vanity project, like the 20mph speed policy.

Should the worst happen, and the Cambrians end up being carpeted with dozens of new wind turbines, it is important to realize that this will bring absolutely no benefit to the people of Wales.

- There is no gain in terms of employment the equipment is manufactured abroad, the sites are highly automated, and ongoing maintenance requires a small number of specialists who will travel to a site as required.
- · There is no gain in terms of green power provision for Wales - that problem has already been solved, and the energy generated by these new sites will go into the grid to be sold to foreign energy companies outside of Wales.
- · There is no financial gain, as the investors behind these projects are mainly from abroad, and the profits would return overseas.
- There would be a massive negative impact on local

The tragic irony is that over the years central government and the Welsh Government have funded multiple conservation projects designed to protect the Cambrian environment and the local wildlife it supports like red squirrels, pine martins and various rare birds, not to forget the unique peatlands.

About a decade ago a similar proposal to install wind turbines in the Dolacothi valley was thwarted by stout local opposition. We at Cadw Cambria aim to achieve the same outcome.


