# NEW COMMUNITY MURAL IN LLANDEILO:

It's a very exciting time for Llandeilo, as after many months of designing and creating by people from the Llandeilo community, the mural and notice board is finally about to be installed!

#### WHERE THE IDEA CAME FROM ...

The idea germinated way back in 2019 as I chatted with people in front of the notice boards on Rhosmaen Street. So much was happening then in Llandeilo and the notice boards we had were jam packed and overcrowded! From these conversations I discovered that many people wanted more connection and communication with their community and to find out local information via a notice board or word-of-mouth rather than always from facebook or other on-line platforms. Together we also recognised that many of the existing boards of community communication were located in small shop doorways. Reading the notices is not easy as you are in the way of shoppers accessing the shops. Therefore, we realised that the community of Llandeilo needed one big central board where we could all share information.

Around this time the sixth formers of Ysgol Bro Dinefwr were creating a fantastic mural on the wall of the tennis

pavilion by the playground. This received much positive feedback and praise from local residents and so generated enthusiasm for another community mural.

It was these two elements that combined and inspired this project.

Then, at a consultation event in December 2019, it was decided that the mural and noticeboard would be best located on the side wall of Hugh Evans and Son Butchers, in the walkway connecting the main car park to Rhosmaen Street.

#### THE CREATION OF THE MURAL

Many local young people and adults of all ages came together to get actively involved in creating the mural. Through the summer months fun and highly participatory Community Workshops were held at The Hangout. These were led by myself, Dani Lee and my team (danileearts. co.uk). During these workshops we designed the mural and then went onto create these designs into mosaic.

We've used some exciting materials in the mosaic to make it a very textural surface. Look out for broken pottery from local ceramicists, sea worn glass, broken plates, beads from necklaces...even river pebbles from the swing bridge beach! Participants to the workshops shaped tiles and other textural pieces using tile nippers... but at times we did resort to smashing the slate with a hammer! While the Festival of Senses cannot go ahead as usual in 2021, Mayor Rob Jones and Marlene Davies from Davies & Co Lounge decided not to let the season go by unmarked for Llandeilo.

Llandeilo Town Council will switch on the lights of the Christmas Tree on the Friday 26th November at 7pm and the Llandeilo Round Table will bring Santa on his sleigh around town. Santa will also be available on Saturday for visits in his grotto in the refurbished Shire Hall/ Hengcwrt.

## GREENS CALL ON GOVERNMENT TO BRING IN CARBON TAX AT COP26

- Carbon tax a critical lever to help shift the UK towards a clean green economy
- Tax yield will help deliver social dividend by funding cheap and accessible public transport, free home insulation, and a basic income

The Green Party is calling on the UK to announce a carbon tax at COP26, describing it as one of the greatest levers to drive change in society.

Greens propose the tax should start at  $\pounds 100$  per tonne of carbon dioxide released, rising to  $\pounds 500$  per tonne by 2030.

The tax would apply to all carbon emissions, but the tax yield would provide a 'dividend' which would prevent poorer people being hit with higher costs. It would in part be used to fund a Universal Basic Income for all and help those on lower incomes meet the costs of transitioning to a carbon free future.

The party estimates the UK will be responsible for around 800 million tonnes of CO2 equivalent in 2021. Its proposal for a carbon tax and dividend, starting at £100 per tonne of CO2e, would mean up to £80 billion would be generated, which could then be used to invest in the big changes needed for a rapid transition to a zero carbon economy, and to support UK residents through the transition.

Adrian Ramsay, newly-elected co-leader of the Green Party, said:

"A carbon tax is one of the greatest levers we can apply to help shift us towards a clean green economy and fairer society.

"Just 100 companies have been responsible for three quarters of the world's greenhouse gas emissions since 1988. A carbon tax would target these big polluters, particularly energy and oil companies, and render coal,



oil and gas financially unviable as cheaper renewable energies rise up to take their place.

"But as well as tackling the climate crisis, a carbon tax will offer a social dividend which will help the UK to genuinely become a more equal society. Carbon tax yields will provide funds to invest in cheap and accessible public transport, free home insulation, and a basic income.

"A carbon tax is a win-win for the climate and for social justice. We urge the government to show true leadership and introduce such a tax as a key plank of its COP26 strategy."

A spokesperson for Carmarthenshire Green Party added: "A carbon tax presents us with a once-in-a-generation opportunity to tackle fuel poverty in Carmarthenshire. The number of people struggling to heat their homes and pay their fuel bills is well above the national average. A carbon tax would help reduce reliance on dwindling and expensive fossil fuels, and raise much needed funds to ensure the most vulnerable – especially single pensioner households and those in the private rental sector – stay warm this winter."

## TUTOR CENTRE Llanwrda is open!

The Tutor Centre in the old school, Llanwrda has now reopened and we have welcomed our first face-to-face tutees back as well as some of our groups. As many individuals and organisations are seeing, the effects of the Covid shutdown have been slow to heal, but we see confidence growing in all areas of life. We cap the number of students in our Centre at three and ask for a lateral flow test before attending, which we can provide if needed. We have our windows open, masks on and sanitise our hands before entering and leaving the building; so far we have been safe.

Our Centre has been developed to support individuals and schools across Wales that are not only dealing with the challenges caused as a result of the coronavirus pandemic, but everyday situations that may have led a student to look for alternative education, extra tuition or individual A levels or GCSEs because their school could not provide their chosen subject, for example. Our aim is to provide a longer-term contribution to closing the attainment gap by offering classes either in our Centre or online.

We continue to grow, regardless of the pandemic, but our Centre is a place of learning with books, art works, nature structures and a projector for showing important media; it is the ideal friendly and educational environment and we have missed working there. Welcoming back our students and groups has been a real joy and we have all been very grateful to regroup, put the kettle on and learn. ## Padmasambhava Yoga & Meditation Centre

All at the Centre hope you are well and are enjoying the wonderful autumnal colours and the season's berries and fruits, along with the feeling of satisfaction that the harvesting of the Summer's bounty brings. Autumn brings with it a more restful clarity. The practices of yoga can both enhance this sense of calm as well as create a more dynamic energy when needed.

The Autumn term at Padmasambhava continues mostly with online classes. The term is now halfway through and offers a good selection of classes, suitable for many ages and abilities, from the Monday morning chair yoga, to a mixed daytime class on Tuesdays, and a selection of more experienced evening classes. Although the term has reached its halfway point, please do get in touch with the Centre if you are interested in joining a class.

There have been some surprising and unexpected benefits to practicing online. With no commute to class, students have commented that they are more relaxed at the start of the class and able to enjoy the effects of the class without the commute home. Students have also been surprised to find that with an online class they are not looking at or being looked at by other students and so feel themselves more directly focussed on the teaching instructions and the practices themselves.

The classes continue to be kept small to allow the teachers to focus on each student and interact with the class in an individual way. Each class is planned for the students attending, taking into account any health conditions students may have.

The 'New Beginners' course is scheduled to start soon, so please do get in touch with the Centre to book your place. This class is suitable for every body, no matter your age or fitness level. Help is given, as needed, to become familiar with Zoom. Many students have surprised themselves (and others!) by embracing this technology with the help offered.

The Beginner's course introduces a progressive series of practices which help release joints, as well as physical tensions within the body, and increase flexibility and strength. This foundation course introduces tools which are useful in daily life. Time is spent in each class on breathing practices which reduce stress, improve mood



and focus, and develop strength in the lungs. Classes finish with a deep relaxation to allow the body and mind to rest on all levels, renewing vitality.

Padmasambhava yoga classes offer so much more than just the physical aspects of yoga. They can help you to improve your health by introducing you to breathing practices (especially good for people with asthmatic conditions), flexibility of the body and joints, beneficial for anyone with arthritis. Yoga Nidra and meditation, both of which are extremely beneficial to people with high blood pressure, angina and heart problems also help to relieve stress through relaxation. On a mental level, all these practices of Yoga can bring about clarity, calmness of mind, and focus.

Please remember the Centre is there for students old and new – so please do call Padmasambhava if you would like help or guidance or resources for practice. A few simple practices can provide the tools to enhance our awareness and begin to make a difference to the state of our minds, our health, our energy, as well as relax the body – and taking quieter time helps with developing a sense of well-being. 2020 proved to be a challenging year to say the least and like many things all our fundraising plans for the MS Trust were cancelled. Together with husband Emyr, friends Karen and Paul, I had planned a series of fundraising events for 2020, the grand finale seeing Emyr take to the skies again but this time instead of jumping out of a plane he'd be standing on the wings of a WW2 biplane and zooming across the sky at speeds of 120mph. Then COVID hit, throwing us into the unknown, creating a 'new normal'. How could we ask struggling businesses and people to donate? For many it was a difficult time full of uncertainty coupled with the worry of financial hardship and feelings of isolation. Yet the charities need support more than ever. All our usual fundraising avenues were closed. We postponed the wingwalk for a year and focused on online events which we hoped would bring people together as well as supporting the charity.

Online events were problematic in more ways than one, not only did we live in a rural area with slow unreliable Internet speeds but we were of the age that grew up before the Internet. Prior to lockdown we hadn't even heard of Zoom let alone used it. For me this was an alien concept, I remember when the idea of everyone being able to make video calls from their telephone was the stuff of science fiction. After several practice runs with Zoom we hosted a couple of virtual coffee mornings, leaving it up to people how much, if anything, they wished to donate. Being in lockdown it was good to connect with people albeit via a screen. A bonus source of money came when my son won a skipping challenge set by a landscape gardening company offering for the person who could do the most skips in 60 seconds to donate £250 to a charity of their choice.

In between lockdowns we were able to take advantage of a scheme to improve internet speeds in rural areas and this made a massive difference to us. Having dipped our toes into the world of Zoom, we decided to jump right in and host a virtual Quiz Night. Once we'd worked out the practicalities of how a virtual Quiz Night would run, taking into account team members wouldn't necessarily be together in the same location, lots more practice sessions followed, for us and for those who were also unsure about using Zoom. The actual night went well, people forgave us the few minor hiccups and everyone seemed to enjoy themselves, so much so that we hosted another two quiz nights before lockdown came to an end. The quiz nights turned out to be fun and being online we were able to connect with family and friends throughout the UK. In keeping with the quiz theme as we cautiously emerged from the last and hopefully final lockdown, we launched an online 100 logo quiz inspired by Captain Tom's 100 challenge. Ironically this raised £100.

It looked like the wingwalk booked to take place in July 2021 would go ahead but we didn't dare get our hopes up, the previous year had taught us how quickly things could change. As the time drew closer we began collecting sponsorship and having already postponed once prayed the weather wouldn't force another postponement. The weather couldn't have been better on the day. On the Friday night before we travelled to Cirencester for Emyr to complete the wingwalk a bet was made in our local pub, as most bets are! If Emyr did the wingwalk in his boxer shorts an extra £110 would be donated. Of course he did it, much to the amusement of the pilot and spectators. We gratefully received some very generous donations.

Another important issue that became more apparent during lockdown is the importance of looking after mental health as well as physical health. Each day during Mental Health Awareness Week I wrote and posted about it on social media. Anxiety and Depression are common in Multiple Sclerosis.

## 'THE WORST JOURNEY IN THE WORLD': WINSTON CHURCHILL



In 1941 the UK and its Allies began to carry desperatelyneeded supplies to a new ally – Russia, then called the Soviet Union. Smarting from the deceit and invasion of their former ally, Nazi Germany, the Soviets had requested help to keep their defences viable. This required a show of support for Russia on the Eastern Front.

Everything, from tanks and railway engines to boots, had to be carried to the only two Russian ports that were still accessible, namely Murmansk and Arkhangelsk. The voyage, via the northern tip of Norway, entailed braving the Arctic. The winter weather and hours of darkness made this an appalling and dangerous journey. Loss rates for ships were





higher than in any other theatre of naval war. Among those who faced the perils was William Adolphus Keith Thomas, better remembered in Llandovery as 'Keith the Postman'.

Keith was 18 in August 1942 when he volunteered 'until the end of the period of the present emergency'. (Pic 1) In Spring 1943, after training, he joined HMS Mahratta, a naval destroyer that was engaged in escort duties to keep open the vital routes between British ports and the Mediterranean. U-boat activity was taking a heavy toll in the Atlantic and survival could be a matter of luck. For a young sailor the danger must have been obvious. Keith kept newspaper cuttings about one rescue for the rest of his life.

They tell of the rescue of the crew of a Coastal Command Halifax patrol aircraft from their life raft; they had been 11 days adrift after being shot down by a U-boat. There had been no time to send a distress call, and they had been extremely lucky to have been spotted by the destroyer

HMS Mahratta (Pic 2) was soon to sail into even greater danger. It was tasked to escort the convoys heading north to carry supplies to Russia. The threat was ever-present throughout the winter of 1943/44. The extreme weather as they navigated through the narrow channel in the ice was compounded by constant enemy attack; on one occasion the battleship Tirpitz was on their tail.

On 11 February 1944, Keith had a stroke of luck that probably saved his life. He had a routine transfer from HMS Mahratta to duties elsewhere. His former ship was deployed as part of the escort to the largest convoy to follow the Murmansk route. On 29 February it was struck by two torpedoes from a U-boat and sank so quickly that only 16 of the crew of 236 survived. A list of shipmates lost, and a hand-written list of the few survivors, is among the paperwork that Keith left to his family.

He spent the final part of the war In Malta as a crew member of the motor launch ML 598, (Pic 3) assisting in mine clearance in the shipping lanes around the Grand Harbour. These small boats were considered light enough

to pass over the very large mines tethered to the sea bed, an assumption that didn't lessen the dangers of the task.

Leaving full-time service in 1946, he remained a reservist until the 1970s. The receipt of an RNR Long Service and Good Conduct medal in 1973 seemed to be the end of his war.

In 1986 the Soviet government issued a commemorative medal to mark the 40th anniversary of the end of the war. Sent from the Russian Embassy in London, (Pic 4) it was awarded to Allied servicemen who had served on the convoys: '...those who took part in our efforts which led to the defeat of a common enemy....' Keith proudly added it to his medal tally. (Pic 5)

Keith died in 2004. We thank his family for their help in this commemoration.

month I did not expect the full and extremely eloquent (that's two this month!) reply I received and below says far more about him than I ever could.

Here goes .....

#### • Where were you born John?

#### • What is the best country you have visited?

I was fortunate enough to be seconded to the Far East division of my company to assist in the transfer of power from the Hydro Electric Dams in the Peoples Democratic Republic of Laos (PDR) across the Mekong River into Thailand. There were three river crossings in all mostly in the North East and far from the tourist type places. I met and lived with the local communities and was often a guest of honour at many of the homes I visited.

I was initially seconded for three months but ended up staying in the Land of Smiles for more than two years and even twenty years on I am still in contact with some of the many friends I made there.

#### • What is the worst country you have visited?

I think the worst country I have ever visited is Saudi Arabia – or at least the Saudi of forty years ago. It was on my second or third visit to the country and the BBC had just aired a documentary called The Death of a Princess and tensions were running pretty high. It was the first time I had been to a country and not felt in the least welcomed. Usually, because we were building their infrastructure and therefore improving their lives, we were always welcomed by the locals but on this occasion we were very much under scrutiny. We had to carry our passports with us daily in order to show work visas and once we were beaten with sticks for being in a shop at prayer time. We were often visited by state police at odd hours of the day and night to see if we had alcohol on the premises. I can honestly say I was very glad to finish that particular project and move on. I have never worked or visited the country since then.

That is excellent. Thanks John.

We now move into November with its darker nights when the gardens lose their colour, the grass cutting stops and the bird feeders go out. Good for some, less to do for others. Some like it hot, some not.

Our Santa Sleigh runs this year are still in some doubt as door to door calling may not be the acceptable thing to do in times of a pandemic. We will be at the turning on of the Christmas lights in Llandovery. We will visit the villages and we will be in town. It may well be in a different format, and of course subject to government and local guidelines. We really want Santa to visit the community. We really want the children to see Santa. We will do whatever we can, you know we will.



#### FROM LITTLE ACORNS, MIGHTY OAKS DO GROW!

In 2005, Chairman Paul Brewer invited founder Iestyn Thomas to meet him in his Berkeley Square offices. Neither would have any idea of the significance of this occasion and what the next 16 years would bring. They had both worked in the City and were friends through playing rugby at the Harlequins. ChallengeAid had started life before the two met up, under a slightly different guise as an appeal on behalf of UNICEF in West Wales. Following that meeting between the two it was then formed as a Charity in its own right and with the continued generous support of Brewer who insisted on essentially covering the administrative costs. The aim had been to give aspirational young students living in the slum settlements of Kenya and Tanzania access to resources in a safe conducive learning environment, lifting children out of poverty one child at a time. The concept is simple and through these Schools of Hope (SoH) ChallengeAid also provides a support programme offering life-skills, chess, debating, sports and a variety of music and drama opportunities. Education however is undoubtedly the prime focus, and together with exam successes, gives these children unprecedented opportunities by offering both an alternative and complementary form of education. ChallengeAid currently has 45 Schools of Hope and works with over 4000 children on a day-by-day basis.

Recent results from the Kenya Ministry of Education show that 25% of form 4 students (year 13 UK) in our Schools of Hope have gone on to university, with a further 35% taking vocational training courses. Almost all others are in some form of employment which in itself is rare in the context of the slums. Additionally, over 700 primary school leavers were prepared by SoH teams and sat for the Kenyan Primary Certificate - almost all progressing to secondary school. The usual transition rate in Kenya is about 60%, and even less for those living in slum settlements. These results are outstanding considering the additional challenges of Covid and the closure of Government and Informal schools for the best part of 6 months because of lockdown.

#### WOMEN'S EMPOWERMENT

Along with exam success, one of ChallengeAid's main focuses has been the furthering of women's empowerment. ChallengeAid runs a complimentary

sanitary pad program for all teenage girls attending a SoH and has been encouraging girls and young women to question the cultural expectation of marriage and children at an extremely early age. Since 2018 only 1.4% of teenage girls have left our SoHs due to unintended and unwanted pregnancy, compared with the 40% norm that exists in the slums. Any girl who becomes pregnant while attending a SoH is not obliged to leave, in contrast to Government schools where such girls face stigma and ridicule, and are seen as bad examples to other girls. A separate programme for women's adult literacy is currently running in the Masai country for young girls & women forced to leave school to marry and start a family. Many have also suffered from female genital mutilation (FGM). This programme is currently empowering over 600 women (in addition to the schoolchildren) to acquire reading, writing and basic numeracy skills to enable them to enjoy greater independence.

#### DISABILITY

Before the pandemic ChallengeAid had been running a SoH for 60 young children all suffering from Cystic Fibrosis who were receiving physiotherapy and medical



assistance at least twice a week. During the pandemic physiotherapists conducted homecare visits because of Government restrictions and by so doing were advertising the work previously done entirely at the disability centre. The consequence of this is that we now have a population of 200 children attending the centre for disability which is now working in shifts. The children are also provided with food and their mothers receive vocational training to enable them to earn extra income.

#### **ONLINE TEACHING**

Despite many of the challenges that Covid has brought, academic standards have been enhanced by a group of dedicated volunteer teachers from the UK delivering daily online lessons to many SoHs that have sufficient connectivity with WiFi and electricity – a rare luxury in the slums. Lessons are delivered according to the Kenyan syllabus and give access to half a dozen SoHs to receive the very best teaching in Physics, Chemistry, Maths, Biology and English on a daily basis.

#### SMILEY COIN

In a revolutionary pilot scheme, ChallengeAid alongside our partner "Education in a suitcase", is trialling a cryptocurrency Smiley Coin. Students have access to tablets in their SoH and complete online maths questions. By doing so they earn themselves "Smileys", which at the end of each week can be converted and used to purchase food, or even, if they save up their Smileys, eventually their own e-tablet. This program is the brainchild of Professor Gunnar Steffansson from Reykjavik University in partnership with the Icelandic Government. Although currently only a pilot study the initial results are extremely promising with an increasing number of students being able to sustain their families with basic commodities through their online learning.

#### THE PARTNERSHIP WITH WELSH CHARITIES

Through a partnership with WCVA (Wales Council for Voluntary Action), ChallengeAid has embarked on a sanitation and water improvement project - family shacks, which are no more than  $10^{\circ}x10^{\circ}$ , seldom have running water or sanitation. This project has focussed on upgrading the toilet blocks and creating water points in the SoHs, which are at the hearts of their communities. Water points and individual toilet blocks are now more accessible for many children in better lit areas, and attendees of the SoH no longer have to pay to use a latrine. These essential works started in 2020, continue through to 2022 and showcases the breadth and depth of the organisation's commitment to improving life in the slums.

#### LONGEVITY AND CHALLENGEAID

Sustainability and longevity is the long sought after "Holy Grail" for most charities, as it allows projects to persevere rather than fade away in the face of severe challenges due to a lack of funding or a redirection of interest. Total sustainability is almost impossible to achieve, but ChallengeAid has gone a long way to facilitating this by encouraging a modest industry of soap, disinfectant and shampoo-making within each SoH. These small industries create funds, promote self-sufficiency and develop responsibility for the SoH. Volunteer supervisors are recruited from the form 4 leavers who are more than keen to 'give back', knowing the value that a SoH holds for its students. These volunteers are at the heart of what ChallengeAid is able to provide, with sports coaching, the extensive life skills programme, and of course supervised library provision each night. Additionally, each community SoH has a leadership group who form a SoH Committee charged with the organisation of day-to-day running of the SoH in partnership with ChallengeAid. They are well aware that the SoH belongs to their community and the need to take responsibility for it. The initial investment funding is tapered so that one day they may well have to take total financial responsibility. Currently a SoH costs £5,000 over two years to create with an ongoing cost thereafter of £1,000 per year. With approximately 100 pupils per SoH that is just under .03p per child per day!

#### COLLABORATION

ChallengeAid works with a number of partners, as collaboration is a core focus for the organisation. Each partner has its own specialist area, which allows ChallengeAid to benefit from their expertise, and integrate that knowledge to create a value-for-money programme enhancing the outcomes within each School of Hope. Such partners as the Federation of Slum Dwellers of Kenya, the Association of Informal Schools (there are no Government schools inside the slums), and ERKO from Slovakia who fund the Adult literacy programme, are valued stakeholders. ChallengeAid is also currently in negotiation with two Universities in the UK to deliver more online A level lessons, and to create an extensive library of lessons in the Informal Schools that can be referred to at any time by any pupil as and when required. This relationship will also allow students to spend time in Kenya and Tanzania doing some volunteering work in our Schools of Hope and combining that experience before taking on one of the unique global challenges of climbing Kilimanjaro. In addition, a mentoring programme for 22 students partnered with young professionals in Nairobi who are able to give them the benefit of their experience and advice on life after leaving school. ChallengeAid constantly aims to broaden the horizons of its students, lowering the boundary walls of the slums and raising their expectations and aspirations. Certainly the most important partner is ChallengeAid Africa. Knowing its way around the slum settlements, it is an independent NGO and registered charity in its own right and is run by a team of Kenyans integrally plugged into the daily needs and challenges on the ground.

#### THE PAST – THE FUTURE

Historically, ChallengeAid has been phenomenally successful at raising funds through donations, sponsored exercise and challenges. For many years schools and schoolchildren across the UK helped contribute to the success of the organisation by pushing themselves mentally and physically in their own environment whilst improving the lives of thousands of underprivileged children in the slum settlements of East Africa. Since those early days the organisation has evolved, and many adults now participate, fundraising by undertaking some remarkable physical challenges. Activities have ranged from walks, marathons, cycling, mountain climbs, and even the first round-the-world ride on horseback. (www. thelonghorseride.com), to golf days and dining events with celebrities. One of the distinct pledges of ChallengeAid is that none of the monies raised by sponsored exercise challenges is used for administrative purposes.

Over the past sixteen years ChallengeAid has steadily evolved and developed a reputation as a small but effective charity that punches far above its weight. Several factors contribute to ChallengeAid rapidly leaving the "small" tag behind: the numbers of children it is dealing with on a daily basis, the all-encompassing methods it employs, and the impressive educational results that it is achieving. This all leads to life-changing expectations for children who previously had little or no hope of escaping poverty, but who now can see a world outside the boundaries of the slums. It is beyond dispute that it is cost-effective. Some people would say that ChallengeAid lacks immediacy and proximity, in other words, what the charity does, is not an immediate knee-jerk emotional reaction to a sudden global disaster, nor does it rush to help a neighbour or relative suddenly stricken with a disease or ailment. ChallengeAid has proved however to be a long-term sustainable solution to poverty and inequality.

At this moment in time, after bigger charities have appeared to be pouring millions of pounds into topdown bottomless pits around the globe and now with swingeing Aid cuts by the Government 'smaller' charities such as ChallengeAid will start to come into their own working bottom-up with money going directly to the communities that they are involved with. Charities which are streamlined and can deliver value for money solutions at low cost to local people on the ground will become seen as the direction we need to be taking. The young students in Kenya and Tanzania, backed by supporters, donors, and challengers in the UK, would most certainly agree that the sapling that sprouted from that acorn back in 2005 has already grown into a sturdy oak.


