Parking: During the Christmas Fair a Park and Ride service will be available from Home Farm.



On Thursday 30th September we visited Llysdinam Gardens in Newbridge on Wye. It was a cool, grey damp morning, but we were given a very warm welcome from Becky the Head Gardner and her two assistants. Their enthusiasm for the gardens and plant knowledge was impressive. We were given a short history of the house and then a tour of the main gardens, pointing out the rare and unusual plants, and remnants of the Victorian paths and planting.

Llysdinam Hall has been in the same family for 150 years. It was developed in the 1800's to resemble a Scottish castle, after which it was reduced in size, and the exterior remodelled in the 1930's style to a large family house, which is how it appears today.

The gardens were laid out in the mid 1800's with a formal walled kitchen garden with several greenhouses which supplied the house with fruit, vegetables and cut flowers. The surrounding grounds were of a typical Victorian style with formal beds, rockeries and shrubbed areas. The gardens have been considerably developed since then, mainly influenced by Lady Delia Venables Llewelyn who was resident from the 1950's to 2005. She was still gardening in her 90s and her passion for plants is evident in the many unusual trees and shrubs she planted



there. The walled garden continues to grow produce for the house and now includes an impressive flower garden. The remaining gardens are more naturalistic in style and include a lovely sweeping herbaceous border alongside the lawn fronting the house. This area affords spectacular views over the surrounding countryside. A path then leads you through shrubbed borders and a beautiful bog/ water garden, through the lovely woodland with mature specimen trees and finally to a lake which is a relatively new area of planting and has a tranquil air to it.

Despite the weather, it was a most enjoyable trip and well worth another visit.



A couple of years ago a District Governor (those who visit every club to ensure things are being done properly) visited us and told us that any club who can achieve 1% of the local population as members is indeed a successful club. Since then we have had a big boost as we have had three ladies and three men join us not only boosting the membership but significantly reducing the average age of the club as well. Win win. Our average age is now lower than it has ever been in our 39 year history. Any lower and we will call ourselves a Youth Club! Well, not yet anyway. So now, not only is our membership over 1% of the population we are way in excess of it. We had a new member last month and another one next month. More about them later.

A busy busy month so here goes:-

Firstly we received very sad news this month when we were informed of the passing of former Rotarian Randall Evans. We remembered Randall with a silence at the next meeting and we pass our sincere condolences on to his lovely wife Carol.

Rachel was congratulated on an extremely successful Sheep Festival Weekend. Rachel as Chair Person of the Committee contributed hugely to its great success.

A quiz team consisting of Mike, Mickey, Barry, Dai Shontz and Rachel represented us in the recent Royal Agricultural Benevolent Quiz at a packed out Rugby Club. Although they did extremely well, they didn't quite get onto the podium. They are very good but Eggheads? Not yet!

Early in the month we were honoured to be visited by District Governor Elect Malcolm Hallewell and his wife Carol who is President of Cowbridge Rotary Club. Cowbridge are great supporters of our Facebook page and Carol is organising the planting of the thousands of Crocuses (or is that Croci) by clubs in the District. We have taken four thousand. Malcolm messaged a few days later to say they both enjoyed attending our meeting and the feeling of fellowship in the club. Also that it was wonderful to see so many younger members present as their club's average age is 74!

We picked a glorious day to plant our 4,000 Crocuses (Croci) which signify Rotary's determination to eradicate Polio throughout the world.

During that evening Dan gave us a (long) talk on Bell Ringing or Campanology as it is properly known. Dan informed us that the vast majority of people in the UK live within the sound of bells. Bells are used to wake, when to eat, pray, at weddings, at funerals at celebrations, at the Olympics, at Coronations even to signify the end of War, in fact almost anything. Dan is a bell ringer at Llandingat Church and it can be very warm work. Those bells are between 800 weight (big) and 300 weight. The massive bells at St David's Cathedral are 2,400 weight. We were shown a video and given many interesting facts from Wikipedia and much (much) more.

At the end Dan had brought four hand bells and he, Barry, Kevan and Rosie volunteered to 'have a go' with varying degrees of success! Rosie almost dislocating her shoulder in the process!

Following a plea on Love Llandovery for a projector, within seconds Stuart Tawse very kindly came forward and donated one for our use. We needed a projector for when we have a speaker who comes to give us a talk with visuals. Good man Stuart, thank you, it will be put to good use.

A large group gathered on a Sunday afternoon to plant the 4,000 crocuses (croci) which represent Rotary's fight to eliminate Polio from the world. Much crawling on hands and knees was involved which we left to our younger members. Our oldies planted the ones years ago which pop up annually around the town, most noticeably outside the old Primary school.

Thanks to Caroline at the Old Printing Office for donating gifts which we normally purchase to give to the judges at the Reading, Writing and Art competitions. Thanks Caroline.



Blood Bikes Wales gave us an informative talk about the superb work that they do.

Blood Bikes Wales came to give us a talk and show a video of the wonderful work that they do throughout Wales. The presentation was made by Stephen Gryllis, Carmarthenshire Bike Rider who explained that they are all volunteers and they deliver blood, plasma, human milk and documents but they do not deliver organs. This west area has 80 members who consist of riders, controllers and fundraisers. All riders are over 21 and have an advanced riders qualification. The bikes do around 30,000 miles a year are specially adapted and cost up to £20,000 each. They have completed over 40,000 jobs since 2011 which help to free up the emergency services and save the NHS money. It was Blood Bikes Wales who took on the organisation of the Llandovery Motorcycle Weekend following the sterling work done by Jonah and Sue MacGill over many years. We at Rotary assisted by organising the parking for the hundreds and hundreds of bikes which at one point had us stretched to breaking point such was the sheer volume of bikes here on the Sunday. In 2021 Blood Bikes Wales won the Queen's Award for Voluntary Services. Stephen then wanted to present us with a cheque for £400 for our help with the Motorcycle Weekend. There was one problem however. We refused to accept it! We insisted that not only would we not accept it but we further insisted that they keep the money themselves! All parties were delighted with the decision. Thank you Stephen and your colleagues at Blood Bikes Wales for the fantastic work that you do. There really is great reward in volunteering you know!

LLANDOVERY TO APPLY FOR INCLUSION IN NEW ELITE DOMESTIC COMPETITION By Huw S Thomas

Llandovery will be applying for inclusion in the new Elite Domestic Competition which starts in September 2024 writes Huw S Thomas

At a specially convened and well attended meeting at the Church Bank clubhouse on Friday night the club, with the blessing of the WRU, shared the principles and aims of the EDC with its members as part of an extended consultation exercise.

Areas of mild concern were raised by members regarding the requirement to work closely with the region leading to potential reduction of control within the club and also the impact of the draft season structure on regular rugby throughout the season.

But that said, the club members expressed an unanimous wish for the board to go ahead with the application.

The conditions of entry and the structure of the new competition were outlined and clarified by club chairman Peter Rees who has been the driving force behind the club's application.

"The membership has backed our wish to be part of this exciting new structure and we see it as the way forward for the club to build on its success over the last few years under our coach Euros Evans and his team" said Rees.

"We are proud of the players that have come through our system and gone on the higher things like Emyr Phillips and Wyn Jones and this new league will give us the opportunity to contribute even more to the success of Welsh rugby."

"We believe that we are ready and prepared to meet all criteria and will be busy putting our case forward as as soon as possible, with the WRU intending to announce the EDC make up of the leagues before Christmas."

The EDC will sit above the Welsh Premiership but below the regional game and consist of between eight to 10 clubs currently playing in the Premiership with the aim of bridging the gap between the semi pro game and the United Rugby Championship (URC).

There will be two competitions in the season, one league and one cup with the possibility that the cup might involve cross border competition with English, Irish or Scottish sides.

There will be two EDC clubs assigned to each professional side, meaning that in the Scarlets region Llandovery and Carmarthen Quins have an outstanding chance of inclusion as long as the meet the criteria by implementing a documented good governance performance strategy.

This will be centred on the development of the team, its supporting infrastructure and the establishment of direct pathway links to and from the professional game.

Each successful club will receive £105, 000 per annum for three ring-fenced years but have to provide their own guarantee of funding a minimum of £315.000 for the full three year term of the EDC licence.

There will be a general $\pounds 150.000$ per year salary cap on each playing squad and $\pounds 60,000$ for coaching and backroom staff.

The Llanelli club will not be able to apply as membership is restricted to clubs currently playing in the WRU league structure, leaving the way clear for the Drovers and Quins.

RGC will be automatically be part of the EDC, - provided they meet the criteria - with the Union considering it vital to have North Wales participation.

The three other regions will have two teams each with the possibility of one region having an extra club if criteria are reached.

The Dragons region might choose two from Newport, Pontypool and Ebbw Vale, the Blues two from Cardiff, Merthyr and Pontypridd whilst the Ospreys region has four possible candidate for places – Aberavon, Swansea, Bridgend and Neath.

Of the 13 current Premiership clubs, three or four will be disappointed when the licensing panel including WRU Interim Performance director Huw Bevan and WRU Head of Player development John Alder prioritise the top nine or 10 clubs.

The unsuccessful clubs will drop down to a revamped and non professional community game Premiership, with Brecon, Newcastle Emlyn, Narberth and Crymych to be included in it, if they finish in the top four of the current Championship West table.

Stand by for the WRU decision come the end of December.

Padmasambhava Yoga & Meditation Centre

Now that Autumn is fading out and Winter will soon be coming, we must prepare our minds and bodies for this change and so it is even more important to keep up our yoga and meditation practices. Padmasambhava has a good number of classes and, although many are full, it is worth calling the Centre to see if there are any spaces. They will be pleased to help you.



LLANDOVERY PYLON STEERING GROUP



What have we been up to, we hear you ask! We promise you the Pylon Steering Group has been busy working through the summer preparing to challenge the threat of pylons through our beautiful valley.

The expected licence award by OFGEM to Bute Energy has still not been made. The anticipated deadline of July has come and gone. With November fast approaching we can't get much sense of what is going on from OFGEM. However, rest assured, once Bute Energy does hear they will be on the front foot. They are currently all over social media with self-promotion and have made a number of friends in the Senedd! This threat is not going to just disappear unfortunately.

If you haven't seen our website, then do go have a look at nopylons wales or dimpeilionau.cymru. We've lots of new and interesting material for you to explore. The proposed route is broken down into smaller maps so you can see exactly where the pylons could be run. There is also a Visual Impact Assessment demonstrating how many pylons you may be able to see from any one point. So although the route may not seem to be close, you may not escape the impact of the pylons. There is also a series of videos. These are not just for the technically minded but for anyone who would like to better understand why pylons are no longer the smart solution to green energy. Since the outset we have maintained that we are not anti green energy.

Further work and analysis has been done on the feasibility of undergrounding the cables. A Carmarthen based firm could provide an efficient, environmentally friendly and effective way of installing pipes and cables underground. Potential costs are also far more competitive than the multipliers Bute Energy have been quoting. An exploratory meeting was held in September where landowners of the whole route were invited. We were also pleased to have Rhun ap Iorwerth, Plaid Cymru Leader, as a guest speaker. Plaid Cymru have been active in encouraging the Welsh Government to look at alternative solutions to pylons.



After spending a year fundraising for Alzheimer's Research UK, which was generously supported by the good people of Llangadog & surrounding areas, I was lucky enough to attend a talk and lab tour by Dr Natalie Connoe-Robson, a dementia researcher at Cardiff University funded by ARUK and see first hand how the money we raised is spent.

Scientists are using pioneering stem cell technology to grow 'mini-brains' in a laboratory to trial a large range of potential new treatments for Alzheimer's and study how certain genes affect the function of brain cells. This is possible by reprogramming cells donated from people with and without Alzheimer's. Using the technology they may be able to develop treatments which can stop dementia from occurring, or even reverse its effects. A better understanding of genes and Alzheimer's could lead to better diagnosis. At the moment there is no definitive test for Alzheimer's and the only way to be certain is after death with an autopsy.

One of the areas scientists are looking at is the immune response in people with Alzheimer's and if any of the existing drugs currently used to treat autoimmune conditions could be repurposed to

be used in treating Alzheimer's. If they can this would fast track availability for use as the drugs are already known to be safe.

A new exciting era of research is underway and it looks like we are on the cusp of effective treatments being found, offering hope to future generations for a world free from the heartbreak of dementia.

LLANDOWERY MUSEUM NOTIES



Although we are familiar with rows of white headstones in military cemeteries throughout the world in remembrance of those who fell in the major wars of the 20th Century, less known are similar graves which are to be found in most parish churches, chapels and cemeteries across the UK. As well as commemorating direct casualties of battle, these graves also honour those who died during or shortly after military service.

War graves at 23,000 locations in more than 150 countries and territories are cared for by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC). Formerly known as the Imperial War Graves Commission, it was founded in 1917 to bring order to the chaos of impromptu burials across the Western Front. The graves of 1.7 million individuals are nowadays cared for by the Commission, 'ensuring that all the Commonwealth men and women who died during both world wars are commemorated in a manner befitting their sacrifice.'

As well as paid staff to keep the main cemeteries in immaculate order, the Commission has an army of volunteers who visit isolated graves all over the UK. Although headstones erected after the Second World War are technically in the care of the Ministry of Defence, they are given an excellent standard of care by these dedicated volunteers. Their six-monthly visits ensure that CWGC and MOD burials are tidied and cleaned to ensure that names are visible. Private burials are also tidied but, as the headstone belongs to the family, CWGC will contact them if the name becomes illegible.

Ryan Jones gives dedicated service to our local graves (listed below) and takes a strong interest in the lives and stories of those who are commemorated. We thank Ryan and his fellow volunteers for their outstanding and respectful work.



CLIMATE CHANGE FORUM AT THE SHEEP FESTIVAL

"I would like to apologise to the lady who raised the big question on climate change at the forum, because I didn't answer her first point.

She is quite right that it is difficult to translate "climate" into "weather" and it is certainly not as simple as averaging things out over the seasons. One of the reasons is that we are still learning the science of forecasting weather. For example, although we have known about the jet stream for decades, we have only heard forecasters talking about it relatively recently. Knowing it's there and understanding what happens eight miles high and how it affects our ground level weather are two very different things!

Another example, and this may be apocryphal so I'd appreciate any professional feedback here, is the story of an aid worker posted on an Ethiopian drought mission who heard about a current El Nino event and recalled that one had also happened the last time he was in East Africa. The statistics apparently show that cyclical weather in the Indian Ocean could be linked to similar events in the Pacific, but again, understanding the links is a lot more complex.

On the climate change question I'm afraid that misinformation has been practised for decades but it has been clear since the turn of the millenium that:

- the causes started with the industrial revolution, burning lots of fossil fuel,
- our emissions and the amount of waste heat we dump into our atmosphere are still increasing,
- therefore, our climate will become more extreme.
 On a simplistic level, if you keep heating the pot, it gets more violent!

The effect of carbon dioxide on our atmospheric "greenhouse" was discovered by a couple of European chemists back in the 1880s, but since it gets rather cold in northern Europe perhaps they thought a bit of global warming might be a good idea! However, in recent years, even within the Oil and Gas industry in the UK, there is realisation that things have to change and there are webinars on our professional engineering institution websites looking at how we get the industry off crude oil and gas as feedstocks for materials as well as fuels. It will be a huge task, and our Government will also need to work out how it can find the tax revenues that are currently paid from oil.

Meanwhile, although there are still some technical challenges, the electric age looks set to succeed the oil age, and from the human sustainability viewpoint it can't come quick enough!"




