

SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE AT THE HERITAGE CENTRE



September brings more artists together in the galleries at the Centre with three different mediums being featured.

The colour of summer is captured in the stunning glassware being displayed by Irene Funnell who is inspired by the hills and coasts of Wales. The colours and textures of rocks, sand, sea and sky are suggested by the juxtaposition of glasses of different composition which react together to create the effect of subtle shading and fusing, whilst the elements of the countryside; trees, woodland creatures and the four seasons are created using a variety of methods including cutting, fusing and painting.

Vibrant colour is also a feature of artists David Button and Jean Francis who exhibited in France for many years, before moving to Carmarthenshire. With a background in architecture David has a unique approach to painting using different perspectives to achieve the unusual whilst Jean, who was at the Royal College of Art with David Hockney and Patrick Caulfield, uses colour to enhance her abstract work.

Our ceramic exhibition is by Left Paw Pottery based in Llanwrtyd Wells where a wide variety of pots, porcelain, stoneware and crank are fired using electric and gas kilns using unique glazes.

So whether your preferences lie with glass, ceramics or paintings a visit to the Heritage Centre is well worth while.



A NEW SEASON AT SINEMA SADWRN WITH SOMETHING SPECIAL FOR HALLOWEEN



Sinema Sadwrn had a great time over the summer, with a free screening of The Jungle Book as part of the Llansadwrn Big Lunch in July and a family-friendly screening of Mary Poppins Returns at the Sexton Arms in August. We'd like to thank all our kind sponsors who helped make this possible and everyone who came along. We're now looking forward to a new season of films at Llansadwrn this autumn and winter, including The Shape of Water in September, Hostiles in November and A Christmas Carol double-bill in December, as well as something special for Halloween.

On Friday 25 October, we're inviting our audience on a cinematic journey of discovery as part of the 2019 Year of Discovery, led by Visit Wales. This special screening will be a chance to see the new Welsh folk tale, Gwen, which is set against the brooding Gwynedd landscape, along with the comedy-horror short film, Neckface.

Gwen (certificate 15) is the feature film debut from William McGregor, the award-winning director of TV series such as Poldark and Misfits. Gwen has had great reviews at festival screenings, and the leading actress Eleanor Worthington-Cox won the Toronto International Film Festival Rising Star award for her work on the film. The cast includes BAFTA-nominated actress Maxine Peake, star of Funny Cow and Peterloo, Richard Harrington, best known for his leading role as DCI Mathias in the crime drama Hinterland, and Kobna Holdbrook-Smith, whose recent credits include Mary Poppins Returns.

Set in the stark beauty of 19th Century Snowdonia, the gothic drama tells the story of a young girl desperately trying to hold her home together. Struggling with her mother's mysterious illness, her father's absence and a ruthless mining company encroaching on their land, a growing darkness begins to take grip of her home and the suspicious local community turns on Gwen and her family.

Unsettling and atmospheric, Gwen has been described by critics as a 'chilling mystery-horror', so we're hoping it will make for perfect viewing a few days before Halloween. We'll also be screening the comedy-horror short film Neckface, directed by award-winning comedy writer Sian Harries, who is originally from Carmarthen, and starring Isy Suttie and Rhodri Evan.

Sinema Sadwrn's screening of Gwen is supported by Film Hub Wales as part of the BFI Film Audience Network (FAN). Join us on Friday 25 October at Llansadwrn Reading Room – tickets cost £5 or £4 for groups of three or more or under 16s and doors open at 7pm. AGA-STYLE KLOVER SMART 80 REPLACED SOLID FUEL AGA

A leaking chimney ruined the existing solid fuel Aga in this farm building.

The owners took the opportunity to rejuvenate the outdated kitchen but wanted to preserve the rustic and traditional look. To the declared Aga fans only the very similar looking Klover Smart 80 would do to preserve the original charm of the building and form an attractive feature in the heart of their house.

It fitted in the alcove of its solid fuel predecessor and not only serves as heating but also provides hot water and a hob for the kitchen.

The system is automated, allowing the owners to programme the time the heat and hot water come on. It is also cleaner and much easier to operate, saving them plenty of time and dirty, hard labour. By moving away from fossil fuels the owners have significantly reduced their carbon footprint.

They qualified for an interest free loan to pay for the system. Regular payments from this governmental scheme over 7 years will help to repay the initial capital cost.



MICHAEL THE FLYING RED SQUIRREL

HELP SUPPORT AND PROTECT OUR PRECIOUS NATIVE RED SQUIRREL



On Saturday 13th July, wildlife enthusiast Michael Cunningham will jump out of a plane to raise vital funds for the Wildlife Trust of South and West Wales' Mid Wales Red Squirrel Project.

The aim of the Mid Wales Red Squirrel Project is to protect and expand the unique population of red squirrels in the Tywi Forest, one of only three key populations left in Wales. Grey squirrels in Wales now outnumber red squirrels by more than 320 to 1. This is a crucial time to save this iconic species.

Once common throughout the UK, red squirrels have disappeared from many areas of England and Wales and are threatened in Scotland and Northern Ireland. They are now largely confined to Scotland, with small populations in areas of North and Mid Wales, Northern Ireland and parts of Northern England. Unfortunately, red and grey squirrels cannot live side by side; when grey squirrels

arrive in a red squirrel area, the red squirrels will die out if there is no intervention.

A native of North America, the grey squirrel first arrived in mid Wales in the 1950s, and has spread at an alarming rate, colonising Wales so effectively, that they are now the dominant squirrel species. As well as competing for food and habitat, the grey squirrel carries the Squirrel Pox virus, which has little effect on the grey but is fatal when passed to the red.

The five year Mid Wales Red Squirrel Project has built a solid volunteer base and has raised the profile of the red squirrel in Mid Wales; volunteers have donated over 10,000 hours of their time to the project. Volunteer surveys have helped to build a more complete picture of where red squirrels are thriving and where they are not. Since 2014, reports of red squirrel sightings in mid Wales have risen by over 100% compared to the previous five years, suggesting that the red squirrel population in Mid Wales is beginning to make a recovery.

This is a crucial time to build on the good work already achieved by the project, but funding is coming to an end. We need your support to recruit and train volunteers and to work with forest managers to improve conditions and help save the red squirrel in mid Wales.

We currently have very little information about how red squirrels survive in the forests of mid Wales. The more we can find out about how red squirrels use the forest habitat, the better we can inform habitat improvements and hopefully increase the red squirrel population. Mike's target of £5,000 will fund the purchase of vital equipment such as trail cameras for red squirrel detection and pittags to enable the project team to identify individual squirrels and develop a better understanding of red squirrel behaviour.



On 26th June Llangadog Garden Club visited Dyffryn Gardens (Gerddi Dyffryn). Dyffryn is a collection of botanical gardens located near the villages of Dyffryn and St. Nicholas in the Vale of Glamorgan, Wales. The gardens were selected by the British Tourist Authority as one of the Top 100 gardens in the UK and are in the care of the National Trust.

We found a peaceful oasis on the outskirts of Cardiff covering more than 55 acres. The Edwardian gardens are undergoing an ambitious garden revival project to restore them to their original splendour. With year-round seasonal highlights the gardens feature the best woody collection in the National Trust.

There were many intimate garden rooms including the Pompeiian garden, Paved Court, Reflecting Pool and Mediterranean garden. The enormous great lawn is bordered by seasonal bedding, an amazing succulent bed and a croquet lawn.

There is also a large glasshouse, statuary collection, and arboretum featuring trees from all over the world as well as the Log Stack area.







Designed by eminent landscape architect Thomas Mawson in 1906, the gardens are the early 20th-century vision of coal magnate John Cory and his son Reginald.

Within the gardens, Dyffryn House, a grand Victorian mansion overlooks the key aspects of the gardens. Parts of the ground and first floors are being restored and are unfurnished.

We all had a lovely day which was finished off with a bit of shopping at Pontarddulais Garden Centre.

Aberglasney

BOUNTIFUL ABERGLASNEY



Aberglasney in Carmarthenshire is a renowned plantsman's paradise and 20 years after opening to the public these world-renowned Gardens in Carmarthenshire's Tywi Valley are looking better than ever!

Visitors at any time of the year are rewarded with vibrant displays of plants, many of which are seldom seen anywhere else in the country. This month however, a bumper crop of fruit and vegetables has brought an extra dimension to the seasonal displays. From more unusual varieties of runner beans to melons and kiwi fruit the Gardens are providing so much more than just a feast for visitor's eyes.

Aberglasney's Melon House has produced its first fruit this year. The variety grown is Melon 'Emir' which is more tolerant to low temperatures, bearing fruit even in cooler summers. Oval in shape with a greyishgreen peel it turns orange when mature with a fantastic fragrance and sweetness. The Melon House is also where Aberglasney grows tomatoes and chillies.

Melon is not the only tropical fruit grown in the Gardens either. Aberglasney has Kiwi Fruit growing on an outside wall. Thanks to the warm weather the deciduous climbing plant Actinidia deliciosa is producing plenty of fruit although it's not quite ready for harvesting yet.

Aberglasney's Kitchen Garden is however, bursting at the seams. As well as salad leaves and herbs, asparagus, rhubarb, apples and pears, there's an excellent crop of runner beans. The 'Brecon Black' is a heritage variety being grown for the first time this year. Extremely rare, it was cultivated in Brecon by the family of Dr Robert Davies in 1945 and the seed (donated to Aberglasney) is hard to come by. Don't miss the lattice works of apples and pears covering the wall in the Kitchen Garden, and dwarfed apples trees that make the boundaries to the borders, known as step-over fruit trees.

It's unusual to see the Loquat or Eriobotryia japonica tree growing in the United Kingdom and it's even rarer to see it produce fruit. Head gardener Joseph Atkin is especially pleased to see the small tree in Aberglasney's Pool Garden providing a substantial crop as it nearly died in the winter of 2010. Joseph explained: "It lost all its leaves and a few of the main stems. We are thankful that it's recovered well due to the mild winters we've had since."

Originally from southeastern China the Loquat has a high sugar, acid, and pectin content and as well as being eaten as a fresh fruit it makes great jam and wine. Aberglasney's Tearooms meanwhile are serving delicious loquat meringues.

As well as offering a taste of the Gardens the Tearooms has an extensive menu of fine teas and a full barista range of coffees, as well as quintessential afternoon tea including homemade cakes and pastries. The Tearooms is also open for breakfast and lunch serving a range of dishes, from light snacks to more hearty meals all made with fresh local ingredients.

Aberglasney is 12 miles east of Carmarthen and 4 miles west of Llandeilo. Open all year including this August bank holiday weekend.

A note on Aberglasney: Covering an area of more than 10 acres, which includes three walled gardens, and at its heart a fully restored Elizabethan cloister garden and parapet walk, Aberglasney (a registered charity) is recognized as one of Wales' finest attractions. The Gardens contain a magnificent collection of unusual plants, including a wide variety of woodland plants. An award-winning indoor garden has also been created within the ruins of the mansion's courtyard, where rare sub-tropical plants are cultivated. Restoration of the ground floor of Aberglasney's Grade II* listed mansion house was completed in spring 2013 and officially opened by award winning actor Damian Lewis.





SOCIAL PRESCRIBING IN SOUTH POWYS:

Rhiannon Davies and Dawne Shepherd discuss the benefits and effectiveness of a Mind Cymru Project

Wednesday 18 September 2019, The Muse, Glamorgan Street, Brecon, 7pm, £5 (Friends/Members £2)

The Friends of Brecon and District Mind have invited Rhiannon Davies and Dawne Shepherd, link workers from Brecon and District Mind, to talk about its Social Prescribing Project. The centre was chosen by Mind Cymru as one of four local Minds to take part in an independently-evaluated research project. Started in spring 2019 and running for two years, this considers the benefits and effectiveness of Social Prescribing in supporting individuals with mild to moderate depression, anxiety and stress to take control of their own health and wellbeing. It is funded by the Welsh Assembly Government.

Recognising that people's health is determined by a range of factors, Social Prescribing seeks to address people's needs holistically taking into account key ways to wellbeing – connecting, being active, taking notice, keeping learning, being creative and giving. The scheme offers support through voluntary and community sector organisations. Examples include welfare and legal advice,

housing adaptation, family connectedness, communitybased wellbeing activities such as walking, arts and crafts, gardening, cookery and healthy eating advice, volunteering opportunities, group learning, non-clinical interventions including mindfulness and stress control and local Mind services and peer support groups.

Aimed at primary care patients from the age of eighteen, they may, typically, be frequently visiting their medical practice, experiencing risk factors for poor mental health such as isolation and unemployment, have a long-term condition, have experienced a life-changing event or have a problem linked to social, emotional and practical needs. Social Prescribing is a way of enabling primary care professionals to refer patients to a range of local non-clinical services through a link worker.

There are two part-time link workers based for one day a week in Brecon, Crickhowell, Hay and Talgarth medical practices. They explore the needs of individuals and possible solutions and empower them to make choices about treatment. Working together they create a plan, set goals and access services and activities.

The Friends support the work of Brecon and District Mind and raise awareness of mental health issues in and around Brecon, Crickhowell, Talgarth and Hay-on-Wye. It is open to everyone and holds talks, walks, social activities and fund-raising events.



CHAFF IN THE WIND

As a crotchety old age pensioner I find that I have an occasional spare minute or two to observe my surroundings and watch nature being so thorough in what it does for the benefit of us one and all. I sat own to take a good look at my runner bean row, which is an important part of my kitchen garden.

It was mid July and the beans were eagerly climbing a little more than half way up the sticks, the weather was very warm, and they were watered each and every day, also having an organic feed once weekly, the growth was phenomenal with flower buds beginning to form on the lower leaf axils. I decided there and then that growth was too rich, so I withheld the watering for a few days, now this was a shock to their system, and by the time they reached the top of the canes they had responded to this hard treatment by smothering themselves with flowers, each plant had a dozen stems, each one carrying a dozen flowers or so, all this added up to a potential crop of I20 beans per plant, a crop that one can only dream of, but alas soon after we had a windy storm that did no good at all, but we still hope to harvest a good crop this year, we already have quite a few stored safely in the freezer for use next winter.

Earlier this month I attended the Pembrokeshire young farmers show at Lamphey, not far from Pembroke town, meeting a friend there, he pointed across the valley to some large fields, and explained to me that there had been an agricultural demonstration there recently, apparently some expert, armed with a spade had walked the fields. demonstrating to his numerous audience how to carry out an active worm count in the said fields. I understood that he failed to find a single worm whilst he crossed back and fore over this large field.

All this should have, and hopefully was, a good and hard lesson for the so called progressive farmers that support such modern demos, not even they can carry on abusing and killing off nature wholesale like this, without worms there is a lot less nutrient rich rainwater penetrating the top few inches of soil, this is half the reason for the recent extreme flash floods that worry all our local councils. Let alone all the dead spiders as well.

Looking back a hundred years a typical farmer, with his wife and servant would spend three hours a day sitting on a three legged stool, hand milking little, and he spent vey little else, today it seems to me that progressive farmers are fast becoming slaves to modern mechanisation, they can by now do very little with out it becoming rather costly!. Well there it is then.

TAILS FROM THE TRUST

GWEN UPDATE

Last month we brought you the story of Gwen, an orphan foal found in a gorge by two walkers in the Brecon Beacons and brought back to the Trust. Since she has been with us, Gwen has put on weight (around 6kg at the time of writing), and her skin, which was very scurfy and dull, has improved. But it has not been an easy ride for Gwen. Several times she has needed a visit from the vet as she has taken a downhill turn with a painful abdomen along with bouts of coughing. We have been on high alert to these stomach aches and her resulting lethargy. Our vets think these health problems are due to intestinal parasites. As is our policy at Lluest, we perform worm egg counts on all our incoming horses and Gwen's was extremely high. Although an oral worming product will kill worms in the gut, they can migrate through the lungs and cause problems as they die. Our vets think that this massive worm burden is the cause of her ill thrift and, because she is still so tiny, it is a bit of a fight. There are good moments though and the trend is generally upwards. Gwen is a tough cookie who loves her food and is holding her own. We are all rooting for you Gwen.




