CÔR MEIBION FOR ST. DAVIDS AND LLANDEILO

Côr Meibion De Cymru – The South Wales Male Choir in Peterskirche, Vienna in 2022

Wales's only regional choir are delighted that His Majesty King Charles III, on the occasion of the first anniversary of His Coronation, has announced that he wished to continue his Patronage of Côr Meibion De Cymru – continuing over 40 years of Royal support ever since the Choir's foundation. The decision has given rise to a number of Celebration Concerts, the first of which takes place in St. Davids Cathedral, Pembrokeshire next Saturday 7th September at 7.30.

For the 33rd time The South Wales Male Choir travels west to its spiritual home and will be joined by two up and coming soloists Sioned Llewellyn and Emyr Lloyd Jones together with organist Merion Wyn Davies. Some tickets are available from the Cathedral Shop or from the choir web-site, plus reservation by phone on 07583 853557.

Then on Saturday 5th October there will be a double, even triple celebration as the Choir's guest artistes at St. Teilo Church, Llandeilo includes the towns' own Baritone Owain Rowlands, the winner of the W.Towyn Roberts Scholarship prize at the National Eisteddfod in Pontypridd last month. He will be joined by the talented violinist Rahki Singh, now Manchester based but originally from Llandybie. Rahki, who's musical career started at the tender age of 9 went on to win

The Texaco Young Musician of Wales title and appeared in the very first Llandeilo Music Festival 24 years ago.



LLANDOVERY SHEEP FESTIVAL FORUM TO DISCUSS FARMING IN A CHANGING CLIMATE



Farming is a traditional way of life in the Towy Valley but what is the future for farming in a changing climate?

A forum to discuss farming in a changing climate will take place during next month's Llandovery Sheep Festival. Panelists and guests will discuss the range of issues affecting farming as a result of climate change.

Llandovery Sheep Festival will take place on 14 and 15 September. The Forum will be in the Castle Hotel from 11am on Sunday, 15 September and everyone is welcome to attend to hear the panellists speak and take part in the debate.

Alan New, a member of the Llandovery Climate Action Group, is organising the event on behalf of the Llandovery Sheep Festival. He said, "All around the world people have been experiencing the impact of climate change through unusual, sometimes extreme, weather events. We have seen temperature records broken, huge forest fires, violent storms and flooding. And this is just a taste of what's to come, we are told. We



have always seen examples of extreme weather events and I expect you can all remember some examples that have happened in your lifetimes. But these are now becoming more frequent and more severe. The impact is already affecting food production so communities around the world will have to deal with famine as well as the other catastrophic impacts of fires and flooding.

"Here in Wales we won't be immune to these effects either. We have previously seen wildfires, record temperatures and flooding events. We've just come through a wetter and milder winter and spring than normal, and a grey, wet summer. We can already see that our weather is becoming less predictable and more difficult to manage for food production. So what can we do about it, here in Llandovery?"

Alan has brought together a panel of experts from a wide range of backgrounds, doing really interesting and innovative work to cope with the challenges of our changing climate and make our farming and environmental practices more sustainable and resilient.

Sharing everyone's knowledge and experience freely between farmers, scientists and academics, environmentalists and concerned amateurs, gives us the best chance of figuring out how to farm in a changing climate. That is the theme of the forum. It will be chaired by Ian Rickman, President of the Farmers Union of Wales.

Llandovery Sheep festival will be a celebration of rural crafts, food and entertainment, held in the town centre. The weekend-long event will also celebrate old drovers' trails, sheep farming and the wool industry.

Rachel Everett, Chairman of the Llandovery Sheep Festival, said, "Events such as this are important to the agricultural community, not only in terms of bringing people together, but also in terms of showcasing the best of local produce, goods and services. The concept behind this community-led festival is to showcase the best of Llandovery, to share its cultural identity and historical past through the promotion of the wool industry and the local farming economy. This year's packed programme will certainly not disappoint and will have something for everyone."

The town's Market Square and Castle carpark will be a kaleidoscope of colour during the event in September with almost 100 exhibitors displaying their wares from textiles, arts and crafts to locally produced food and drink. The streets of Llandovery will be packed with entertainment and music.

NEW EXCITING LIVE THEATRE FESTIVAL TO TAKE PLACE IN LLANDOVERY THIS SEPTEMBER



A magical day of world class, sitespecific theatre, from established and emerging Welsh artists, performed throughout Carmarthenshire's historic market town of Llandovery.

Llandovery is set to host a diverse array of brand new theatre productions, created by prominent Welsh writers and theatre makers specifically for unexpected locations within the town centre on Saturday, 28 September 2024.

Each production will last 15 minutes and will be held in unique non-theatrical venues throughout Llandovery including a car showroom, a pub beer garden, a fish and chip shop and the castle ruins.

Luke Bailey and Ella Peel have created the concept and are organising the event. Both are actors themselves and live locally in the rural town of Carmarthenshire. Luke Bailey said, "The Festival has been designed to engage seasoned theatre-goers and theatre first timers alike. The unusual venues will play host to performances designed solely for them. There will be five brand-new, one-act, plays commissioned specifically for the Festival."

Ella Peel added, "Our aim of the Theatre Festival is to showcase the stunning tourist destination of Llandovery, my hometown, to visitors in fresh and inventive ways. We hope the event will also challenge locals to engage with the community, their home, their nation and the arts in powerful new ways."

All the artists and creatives involved will be selected from the extraordinary Welsh and Wales-based professionals, with at least 30% coming from within 30 miles of Llandovery. They will range from emerging talent to established professionals.

The productions will explore diverse issues that affect the local region in an engaging and relatable way. They will also tackle issues facing the local community today.

During the Festival there will also be free adult masterclasses, children's workshops, post show discussions, street performers and stalls. There will also be an opportunity of a paid shadow scheme for a resident of the town interested in pursuing a career in the arts to assist one of the directors in their rehearsal period, to gain an insight and experience into a professional theatre production.

The project is funded by UK Government and supported by Carmarthenshire County Council. 

SCIENCE CAFE LLANGADOG




CRW brought their Science Cafe to Llangadog Hall, complete with a giant inflatable bowel! The cafe, with its interactive exhibits and talks, showcased the world class research that is happening right here in Wales. Those who attended found it excellent and very interesting, providing much food for thought.

After people had had a chance to explore the exhibits and grab a coffee & cake, Dr Peter Henley opened with an introduction to CRW. He explained a common misconception, CRW are independent and not part of CRUK. The money they receive stays in Wales going towards research into improving cancer diagnosis & treatments in Wales.

It's not just about finding out the how's & why's of cancer but also devising simple, less invasive early diagnosis methods and better treatments, then implementing these so they are available to everyone. One in two of us will be diagnosed with cancer and Wales's cancer survival rates are amongst the lowest in Europe, something CRW are working to change. For the last few years CRW has worked with CanSense on the Raman blood test, a test for the early detection of bowel cancer. Teams of scientists at Swansea University have developed a simple blood test that can accurately detect the presence of a bowel cancer fingerprint, made up of biological material from bowel cancer that has seeped into the blood. This could prove





to be a real game changer. The Raman blood test is noninvasive, provides rapid results, is low cost and doesn't rely on symptoms which can help GPs distinguish between bowel cancer and other common conditions. As such, the number of unnecessary colonoscopies will be reduced, saving the NHS money and patients from the discomfort of the procedure and patients on waiting lists can be seen more quickly. Hopefully it will be available in the NHS soon. Work is now being done to develop the Raman blood test for breast, lung, and pancreatic cancers. As well as funding research CRW has provided opportunities for future PHD scientists.

Dr Catia Neto then spoke of her work using 'mini brains' to better understand brain tumours and their microenvironments, looking for more effective treatments. Scientists are using pioneering stem cell technology to grow organoids or 'mini-brains' in a laboratory allowing for detailed studies of brain tumours and their surrounding environments. This is possible by reprogramming cells from samples donated by people with and without cancer. The aim of the research is to accelerate the development of new and more efficient treatments to fight brain cancers. One question that came up from someone attending the cafe was, 'do these mini brains have feelings and thoughts?' Brain organoids are



not as complex as a fully functioning brain, and it is believed they do not possess any form of consciousness.

Dr Jason Webber spoke about his research on small packages released by cells, called extracellular vesicles (or exosomes), and their role in prostate cancer. Cells talk with their neighbours by sending extracellular vesicles out into the surrounding space. These vesicles help the cancer to grow and then spread to other sites around the body. They do this by escaping from the prostate and entering the patients' blood stream. The vesicles can then exit the blood stream at sites such as bones, lungs and the liver. Once they arrive, the vesicles can act as a Trojan horse. They trick normal cells into making a friendly environment for prostate cancer cells to invade. This results in the disease spreading. A blood test is being developed to detect aggressive prostate cancer early on and possibly replace the need for an invasive biopsy that carries risks of its own. But would people trust a blood test over a biopsy for diagnosis and if not, what would be needed to gain trust?

This was a small portion of the work CRW is funding. The whole event was very inspiring, and it was good to know about the relevant research being carried out in Wales. There really is some exciting work being done, all leading to cancer no longer being a life-threatening disease. Everyone plays an important part in this journey, from the fundraisers, the people who donate, the researchers, the volunteers, the charities like CRW – everyone. 

LLANDOVERY GARDENING CLUB REPORT

A quiet drive through conventional gateposts? Hardly: Closer inspection shows them to be carved of timber. Panels are inscribed as mileposts: Doncaster 350 miles; Japan 4000 miles, which reflect the origins of the owners. Pausing between these posts one reads the enigmatic inscription THE RUINS OF TIME BUILD MANSIONS IN ETERNITY.

There is also a totem pole, a stack of four animals carved out of the trunk of a former beech tree and erected as a focal point west of the house. Another, multi-trunked dead beech has been carved in situ in the likeness of a four headed dragon.

Our garden visit in August was to Treffgarne Hall in Pembrokeshire. The turnout was good, the weather was cool and overcast but we were given a very warm reception by the owners, Martin and Jackie Battie. Martin treated us to a brief description of the history of the house, and a tour of the walled garden.

The couple bought the property in 2003. At that time the four-acre garden surrounding the house was mainly put to lawn.

They were a little daunted by having such a large area, which was essentially a blank canvas, so the couple enlisted the help of designers Julian and Isabel Bannerman to advise on the hard landscaping.

The old walled kitchen garden has been utterly transformed and now boasts an immaculate slate paving, parallel rills and huge oak pergolas. It has been stunningly planted with borderline hardy exotics including many from South Africa, New Zealand and Australia, many of which were in flower at the time of our visit. The rest of the garden is less exotic but remains beautiful with many themed borders and large sculptures.

All in all, an interesting and colourful garden.

Padmasambhava Yoga & Meditation Centre

Everyone at the Centre hopes that you are well and have enjoyed the Summer, a break from the usual routines and have been able to meet and relax with family and friends, whatever the weather – and that you are looking forward to starting Yoga again in September.

The Autumn term at Padmasambhava begins on Tuesday 10th September for some classes and Monday 16th September for others. The term brings a good range of classes, including the well-loved daytime and evening classes, Meditation, and a new Beginners. Gentle yoga invites students to 'come as they are' and work within any physical limitations and learn at one's own pace. There is also Seated Yoga for those students unable to get up and down off the floor. Daytime Yoga is moving to the earlier time of 10.00 – 11.30am and especially welcoming students returning to yoga. Each class includes a blend of classic postures, breathing techniques, and deep relaxation of Yoga Nidra. Classes at Cwrt Henri and Ammanford are mixed ability classes within the community.

The Meditation class introduces techniques to help bring about greater awareness, peace of mind and relaxation through body stillness and getting to know your own mind.

The benefits of yoga resonate beyond the class and physical practices, bringing a calmer mind and body into daily life. Yoga introduces a greater awareness of the breath and its importance to our good health. 

But let me tell you, 2020 was rough for him – losing his wife in January was just the beginning. Then came the pandemic, locking us all away from each other. Alone and unsure of how to move forward, Mike found himself at a crossroads.

That's when he remembered reading an article about Men's Sheds. Determined to stay positive and give back to his community, Mike set out to find a local shed to join. But when his search on the 'interweb' came up empty, he contacted us and decided to start his own shed right in the middle of a pandemic. And that's how the Llangadog, Llandeilo, and Llandovery (or Triple L, as we call it) Men's Shed was born.

I've visited the Triple L shed many times, and the welcome is always warm. The members are constantly busy with all sorts of projects. About a year ago, Mike casually mentioned they were going to get some Scalextric sets donated and build a super-track - one that could be easily assembled and disassembled on joinable and portable tables. Naturally, I was intrigued.

Every time I spoke with Mike after that, I'd ask, "How's the Scalextric coming along? Any chance we'll see it at ShedFest24?" Well, for those of you who attended, you know they didn't quite make it. But hey, there's always next year!

In our July chat, Mike mentioned they were finally going to test out the tables and track ahead of the Llandovery Sheep Festival. He invited me to come along to the trial run at Llangadog Community Hall on the 12th of August.

The trial was the first time all the tables and tracks had been assembled and connected. It took some head-scratching and a lot of teamwork, but they got it all set up. And when the test began, competitive racing ensued! The atmosphere was electric (Scalectric!) full of the kind of banter, laughter, and light-hearted cursing that makes a Men's Shed so special. And, of course, we all paused for a shared lunch of fish and chips - a quiet five minutes that was soon replaced by the sounds of Scalextric cars whizzing around the track.

I had the chance to catch up with Nick, one of the members of the Triple L Shed, and we chatted about how this Scalextric project came to be. Turns out, the idea was sparked at last year's Sheep Festival. After putting out a request on Facebook, they ended up with about four donated sets, with some members chipping in a bit of money to get a couple of higher-quality ones.

Mike found the table designs online, and the rest, as they say, is history.

The tables are ingenious, with screw-on legs for easy transport and adjustable height to ensure a level trackcrucial for a smooth racing experience. The 12th of August was their first full test, and now they're all set for the official launch at the Sheep Festival next month. And speaking of the Sheep Festival, if you're wondering what that's all about, Nick summed it up perfectly: "It's an excuse for a bit of fun in Llandovery, really!"

I also had a chat with Steve, another member of the Triple L Shed. Steve, a former carpenter and all-around handyman, was recommended to go the shed by his GP about a year ago. He shared how much he enjoys the camaraderie and banter that comes with being part of



the shed. For Steve, it's a return to the good old days of working in joinery shops and on building sites, but with the added bonus of a welcoming, supportive community.

Apart from the Scalextric project, they've been working on all sorts of things, from repairing an ornate bird table to restoring an old phone box in Llandovery. It's clear that these guys aren't just building tracks and benches—they're building friendships, skills, and a sense of belonging.

So, if you find yourself near Llangadog, Llandeilo, or Llandovery, I highly recommend stopping by the Triple L Men's Shed. Whether it's to race some Scalextric cars, share a laugh, or just enjoy a cup of tea with some great people, you'll find a community that's as warm and welcoming as they come. And who knows? Maybe next year, we'll see that super-track at ShedFest after all.

CHARITY SUPPORTING VETERANS IN WALES WELCOMES BISHOP OF SWANSEA AND BRECON AS NEW PATRON

Charity Alabaré which supports Welsh veterans is delighted to announce that The Right Reverend John Lomas, Bishop of Swansea and Brecon has joined them as a Patron.

Alabaré runs homes and a range of support activities across Wales, dedicated to helping veterans who have become homeless since leaving the Armed Forces, enabling them to regain their wellbeing and build successful, independent lives of their choosing. Originally from Ashton-under-Lyne, Bishop John Lomas joined the Royal Navy after leaving school to train as an aircraft engineering mechanic in the Fleet Air Arm. He worked on aircraft carriers around the world and served in the Falkland War. After leaving the Navy he spent two years in the Middle East working on Tornado jets.

Bishop John began training for ministry at St Michael's Theological College in Llandaff, Cardiff, and was ordained in 1994. His first curacy was at Rhyl where he served for five years from 1994 to 1999. He was also Padre to the 3rd Battalion of the Royal Welch Fusiliers. He then returned to the Royal Navy as a Chaplain to the 3rd Destroyer Squadron serving on HMS's Edinburgh, Glasgow and Liverpool.

John returned to Wales as Vicar of Holywell in 2001, where he spent the next 10 years before being made a Canon Cursal of St Asaph Cathedral in 2008 and serving as Area Dean of Holywell from 2008 to 2011. He became Archdeacon of St Asaph in 2014 and subsequently was appointed Archdeacon of Wrexham in 2018. He was appointed Bishop of Swansea and Brecon in November 2021

Bishop John has a particular affinity for Alabaré through their work with Armed Forces veterans in Wales. The charity is the largest provider of supported accommodation for veterans in Wales and provides a range of activities and services to improve the wellbeing and regain the health of those living in their homes and in the local community.

Bishop John says:

"Having spent 14 years in the Royal Navy, and therefore being a veteran myself, I am very much aware of the acute difficulties facing some who leave our armed forces for civilian life.

"Meeting with some of the veterans at the Swansea home has given me an insight into the vital service Alabaré can and does provide for veterans who need a helping hand when difficulties arise. The threat of homelessness and isolation is a real one, and so to be approached by Alabaré with a view to becoming involved is an honour.

"As Bishop for the Diocese of Swansea and Brecon I see this as another example of the sterling work being done across Wales and beyond. I am pleased to play a small part in this life changing work."
