



ABERGLASNEY ANNOUNCES WINNER OF CHILDREN'S ART & POETRY COMPETITION

Aberglasney has been overwhelmed by the quality and quantity of entries received for its art and poetry competition making it extremely difficult for resident artist, Andrew Douglas-Forbes, to choose a winner.

Children up to the age of 16 were encouraged to enter the competition to do an A4 design of their dream garden and to make it as colourful as the flowers around Aberglasney Gardens. A poem about their dream garden could be created instead, or as well as, a picture.

The gardens designed had beautiful flowers and bees as a common theme but some had so much more with treehouses, vegetable plots, ponds with bridges, tennis courts, deck chairs, pets, swimming pools, bicycles, basketball nets and football pitches incorporated.

Congratulations go to Molly Bechan Rose, aged 10, from Ceredigion. Molly uniquely combined the competition brief as she drew a garden design on one half of her A4 entry and wrote an absolutely magnificent poem on the other side. Her entry stood out amongst the entries and has been chosen as the competition winner.

Andrew Douglas-Forbes said, "Congratulations to Molly. Your drawing stood out amongst all the entries



for me as it looked so realistic and your poem 'Fy ngardd breuddwydiol' was breathtakingly fabulous. The standard of entries was very high. Thank you to all who entered. I can see a lot of time and effort has gone in to each piece of art and poetry."

The winner will be able to bring a group of friends or family to have a fun-packed, bilingual, and informative guided tour of Aberglasney by the Gardens' Director, Helen Scutt. The group will also be given lunch, prepared by the Tearooms.

The standard of entries was so high that Andrew also chose second and joint third prize winners and each will receive a £10 voucher to be used in Aberglasney's giftshop. Freya Rees, aged 10, from Ysgol Saron in Ammanford, came second and the two third place winners are: Mia Haf Tomlin, aged 11 and Lilly from year 3 at Ysgol Llangynnor.

Helen Scutt, Aberglasney Gardens' Director said, "Congratulations to all the winners and thanks to all those who sent in entries. I was especially blown away by the standard of the poem that won. Such fantastic work Molly well done. The competition is a fitting tribute to the residency of one of Aberglasney Gardens' long-standing supporters, Andrew Douglas-Forbes. It is always a pleasure to welcome younger visitors to Aberglasney. We have fun activities and trails for children of all ages throughout the summer holidays and all the competition entries will be on display in the mansion during the summer holidays for visitors to enjoy."

World re-knowned artist, Andrew Douglas Forbes, lives in Llandeilo and studied under Patricia Briggs at Swansea College of Art. He subsequently received guidance from Gordon Stuart, known for his portrait of Dylan Thomas and dramatic landscapes where forms emerge from light.



Beyond his artistic talents, Andrew is a scholar of the Royal Academy of Music and a professional tenor who lived in Tuscany for several years to pursue an opera career. Upon returning to Wales, Andrew coincidently was invited to a ball at Aberglasney when it was still in ruins, which he recalls as 'enchanting'. Since the end of the 1990s, his relationship with the mansion has deepened as the space itself has evolved. Understanding Andrew's unique vision as an antique specialist, artist and operatic tenor is crucial to appreciating his work.


MUSEUM NOTES



Although a recently published report warned that traditional music in Wales could die within a generation, determined efforts are being made locally to nurture Welsh folk dancing. A few days after the publication of the report by Arts Council Wales, a highly successful Folk Dancing Evening was held at Myddfai Hall.

Thousands of young people are encouraged to take part in folk dancing by competing at Urdd eisteddfodau and there are more than twenty adult folk dancing groups throughout Wales. One of the best known is Dawnswyr Talog from the Carmarthen area.

A century ago, when the Urdd was founded, folk dancing in Wales was at a very low ebb. It had been

frowned upon by the Nonconformist chapels which had mushroomed during the 18th and 19th centuries, and vigorous attempts were made to stamp out such 'sinful' entertainment. It continued only behind closed curtains in a few homes. Various rebels, supported by Lady Llanover, also collected and transcribed dance tunes.

In 1949, the Welsh Folk Dance Society was formed, with the aim of promoting and resurrecting the old dances, and folk dancing developed into a lively part of Welsh culture. The Society now has a large library of published dances and melodies, with new compositions being constantly added.

Folk dancing, which involves the wearing of closefitting clogs with wooden soles and leather uppers, has developed into intricate forms in Wales. New steps involve extinguishing a candle and jumping over brooms. Such is the demand for clogs that there aren't enough clog makers in Wales to supply all that are needed.

Clogs were widely worn in Wales, especially, in rural areas, until the end of the nineteenth century. In 1896, a local newspaper acknowledged that clog making continued to be one of the recognised skilled trades in Wales – although in a very few years it would probably become extinct.

Clog makers were drawn to Llandovery because the area had an abundant supply of suitable timber. Although alder was mostly used, ash, sycamore and birch were also acceptable. Giant cones of clog soles were a familiar sight in area, with as many as thirty men sometimes working in one camp. After splitting, surplus bark was removed before the wood was very roughly shaped with the aid of a small axe and thrown into calico tents where the clog soles were made.

These were sorted into four sizes, seasoned in the giant

stacks, and then transported to dealers in Lancashire. There they were hollowed out and leather uppers were attached. In due course, the clogs would be worn by millworkers in Rochdale, Bolton, Preston, and other cotton towns.

Even at the beginning of the twentieth century, a clog maker in West Wales was advertising for 'four good breakers up' and another was seeking 'two sober hands' for cutting the timber into manageable blocks.

Many of the clog block makers were itinerant workers. For example, members of the Barlow family, who eventually settled in Llandovery, originated in Lancashire and worked their way down through Shropshire, Flintshire, Montgomeryshire and Breconshire. At least two members were still making blocks at the time of the 1921 census.

The clog maker required considerable strength and skill to shape the blocks into finished soles. Three knives were used, all of which are displayed at Llandovery Museum. The first completed the shaping of the sole, the second (pictured) hollowed the inner surface of the sole, and the third cut a groove around the sole into which the leather upper was fitted. The hook at the bottom was attached to an eye in the workbench so that greater force could be exerted.

Llandovery Museum and Heritage Centre is open Tuesday to Saturday, 11:00am – 2.00pm.







HONOURING A LOCAL MYTHOLOGICAL HERO



A retired Ammanford shop keeper faces a long journey by dozens of local buses to make a pilgrimage to the South of France honouring a local mythological hero.

James Whitworth, aged 67, who ran the record store Gwlad Deg in Quay Street until 2013, has just left his Golden Grove to embark on the 700-mile trip to Mortagne sur Gironde dressed in medieval garb.

The adventure is his tribute to the sponsored cycle ride in 2023 by Cross Hands fundraisier Kevin Bowen, who is campaigning for a memorial to Owain Lawgoch, the fourteenth century "Heir to the Last True Prince of Wales" being installed somewhere suitable in the country.

James, a volunteer with the Amman Valley Railway Society, said: "I thought Kevin's bicycle marathon to Mortagne was a brilliant way to promote sustainable transport.

"I've walked and cycled all around the UK and West Europe to complete several spiritual pilgrimages like Santiago de Compostela and Odense but health issues mean I only take my bike on local trips now.

"Being a greenie – no car, no mobile phone, being offline – I refuse to go on motorways so I'll be travelling slowly, town by town, following Kevin's route. I'm hoping to get an ongoing diary published in real time to encourage others to embark on their own Owain pilgrimage by listing information about cheap accommodation and visitor attractions as I go.

James said he is looking forward to seeing the memorial in Mortagne to Lawgoch, installed in 2003, commemorating his military career fighting the English, as a mercenary in France where he became known as Yvain de Galles.

James however is fascinated by the mythological aspect of Lawgoch.

"Strange stories about him apparently originating in the Cross Hands and Carmel areas abound in books about Welsh legends.

"His name is associated with the Gorslas lake Llyn Llech Owain, from where Kevin began his incredible ride. Some stories say he sleeps in a cave near Pentregwenlais's unique turlough – rather like the Arthurian sleeping warriors tale – ready to come to the aid of the Welsh people.

"A few stories even dub him a hated outlaw who was chased along with a retinue of followers into a cave near Carmel, blocked in and starved to death.

"No-one knows why Lawgoch came to have this local connection – historians say he was assassinated in Mortagne by a Scotsman or Englishman and never returned to Wales at all.

"Personallty, I'd love to prove the historians wrong!"

James is also drawing attention to the growing expansion of Cross Hands, possibly into a new town, and the need to extend the Llandeilo Conservation Area to the Golden Grove and Carmel areas in order to protect such an historical area from development.

The district north of Cross Hands (a town still with no Welsh name) might also be called Cwm Lawgoch.

DAI JONES LLANILAR MEMORIAL PRIZE LAUNCHED AT ROYAL WELSH SHOW

A special Memorial Prize was launched at the Royal Welsh Show on Tuesday 22nd July 2025 by S4C and the Royal Welsh Agricultural Society dedicated to the memory of the well-known farmer and presenter, Dai Jones Llanilar.

A talented singer, renowned farmer and presenter of agricultural and entertainment programmes on radio and TV in Wales for over fifty years, Dai Jones was a popular and much-loved personality. He passed away in 2022 at the age of 78.

The Dai Jones Llanilar Memorial Prize will give one young person the opportunity to work with multimedia production companies Telesgop (Ffermio) and Slam (Cefn Gwlad/Y Sioe) to develop an original idea into a fully formed item, which will then broadcast on S4C's platforms.

According to Geraint Evans, Chief Executive at S4C, the Prize will nurture future talent:

"At S4C, we were keen to establish a Prize in memory of Dai, and to mark his invaluable contribution to the world of agriculture and the world of broadcasting in Wales. He really was one of the most talented broadcasters on Welsh television.

"We hope that the Prize, dedicated to Dai's legacy will open the door to the world of broadcasting for young people, and will nurture future talent while ensuring that we continue to bring fresh and relevant content from the agricultural world in Wales to S4C."

Professor Wynne Jones, Chair of the Board of the Royal Welsh Agricultural Society, said.

"The Society is eager to have a special award for young people who are enthusiastic about rural issues and the importance of rural Wales. Dai's family are very supportive and are proud to see the media and the Royal Welsh Show working together to create this special


