Around Llangadog/Bethlehem

It's now been a few years since I wrote my last article for The Post about Nordic walking. Those who read the article in the pre-pandemic days may remember my sitting in an elegant mansion, off the Downs in Bristol, in a classroom studying for my Diploma in Fitness and Nordic Walking! My heart sinking as, when making introductions, I heard, "physiotherapist", "professional golfer", "national cycle champion", another "physio", "doctor", "professional dancer", eventually it was my turn...oh dear. But my fears were needless, soon we were out on the Downs training for 2 and 3 hours at a time, getting it wrong and occasionally right, becoming friends and supporting each other.

Then came the Level 2 anatomy and physiology exam on the last day. It felt very odd to be on the other side of an exam paper. The mantra of many revision sessions with pupils going through my head - take your time, read each question thoroughly, make sure you turn the pages correctly...and breathe!

In the intervening years we have had the Covid pandemic which essentially put paid to many a nascent business across the country. I too pulled the plug on my Nordic walking website as we battened down the hatches and lived careful lives.

Gradually, as we learned the new government rules, those I'd taught to Nordic walk got together to walk in pairs or very small groups as allowed.

Since that awful time we've become a small walking group, meeting across 3 FREE possible walks each week around Llangadog, Llandovery, Myddfai and Llandeilo. A friendship group as much as a fitness group.





Blwyddyn Newydd Dda! Just like that, it's 2025!! All those months to come with endless possibilities of what we can achieve. After a nice rest over the festive period, we are excited to be back and continue to build on the work we started last year.

Originally the intention behind Bwrlwm was to explore the potential of establishing an Energy Local Club in Llandovery and we will continue to develop that through this year. We also found ourselves doing some other work too, as along the way, other opportunities presented themselves and well, it would have been rude to refuse them! Some of these, such as The Great Big Green Week event will be repeated this year. Tŷ Hadau, our seed station and planter project, supported by WWF, will continue to run in the background with resources being available to help communities to develop their own seed stations. While we will not have time to repeat the Swap, Sell & Repair events which were supported by Cyngor Sir Gâr, we will happily share our blueprint on setting up one in your own community.

I am excited that this year sees us focusing on sustainable transport, establishing an E bike hire hub in Llandeilo! Our coordinator role for Dinefwr Car Club raised awareness of the benefits of community sharing and borrowing and so we hope, with the near completion of the cycle path linking Llandeilo and Carmarthen, that an E-bike scheme will bring further benefits. The best bit? MUSEUM NOTES OLD SLEEPING HABITS

One of Llandovery's most famous sons, Vicar Rhys Prichard (1579–1644), has received considerable publicity recently, following a Welsh academic's research into the vicar's description, in his popular verses, of seventeenth-century sleeping habits.

In a recent edition of the on-line publication *Gwerddon*, Dewi Alter, a lecturer at Cardiff University, says the vicar's poetry offers fascinating clues as to how people in Wales got their nightly rest almost four centuries ago.

The vicar wrote several poems that depict how people slept and how he thought they should prepare for bed. Sleep was an intensely religious and spiritual experience, with prayers being offered for a safe night's sleep. The vicar encourages people to shut their doors while they slumber, warning that the devil is always awake and, like a lion, wants to take people at night and devour them.

Before the Industrial Revolution, it was common to have a period of wakefulness during the middle of the night for a couple of hours in order to complete a variety of tasks. Prichard encourages his readers to emulate the biblical King David who, according to the Book of Psalms, rose at midnight to give thanks to God.

Rhys Prichard, who was the son of a wealthy landowner, accumulated additional property during his lifetime. His income from the Church was also considerable; as well as being vicar in his native Llandovery, he held other Church offices in Carmarthenshire and Breconshire. He built a large house on the site of his birthplace in Llandovery. Sadly, this house was demolished in the mid-20th century.

A large photograph of the magnificent building is on permanent display in Llandovery Museum, together with

an oil painting by Ronald A. Chapman which depicts the moment the vicar realised the evils of alcohol. Inside a tavern, a goat which had become drunk the previous evening, is seen to refuse the vicar's offer of more alcohol.

It's believed that this painting, like Chapman's copy of *Salem* by Curnow Vosper, is based on the work of another artist, but attempts to find any such painting have so far ended in failure.

Ronald Albert Chapman (1928 – 1983), who was born in Rochford, Essex, moved to Cynghordy where he built the Lodge Restaurant. Although sirloin steaks were a speciality, he is best remembered as an excellent fish cook. His Art tutor was a local teacher, Ron Downing, and some of his paintings hung on the dining room walls.

Vicar Prichard died in December 1644, but the exact whereabouts of his final resting place are unknown. According to one tradition, he was buried in Llandingad Churchyard, Llandovery, where his grave was swept away by floodwater during the eighteenth century.

Although many of the vicar's verses have survived, many more have been lost. According to one report, most of his works were destroyed in a bonfire that burned for two days.

As far as is known, only one poem was published during his lifetime. Various selections of verses were later published in London, but it wasn't until 1681 that the complete known works were first published as *Canwyll y Cymru* (The Welsh People's Candle). The original Welsh verses and English translations have been published in about fifty editions, of which many were printed on the Tonn Press in Llandovery.

HONOURING THE FOUNDER OF THE PHYSICIANS IOF MYDDFAI SOCIETY



Dr & Mrs Donald Williams

During a lunch at the Myddfai Community Centre on Tuesday 3 December, a crystal glass bowl was presented to Dr Donald Williams who had just stepped down as secretary of the Physicians of Myddfai Society. His wife Margaret was presented with a Christmas rose.

Dr Williams, a consultant psychiatrist who first discovered the connection between heading the ball and footballers suffering from dementia, had also been responsible for organizing the society's annual conferences from the beginning. He got the idea for a conference after considering the medical contribution of Llandovery Grammar School.

He was a pupil there at the same time as two boys from Llangadog, Gareth Rees (1935-2024) and Glyn Evans (1942-2013), who became consultants at St Bartholomew's Hospital, London. Dr Gordon Thomas, a consultant physician in Abergavenny, was also a classmate.

In 2009, Gareth Rees and Glvn Evans were guest speakers during a presentation evening at their old school. In their speeches they both emphasized the excellent education they had received in Llandovery.

This was a trigger for Dr Donald Williams to organize a meeting at the beginning of July 2011 to celebrate the tradition of the Physicians of Myddfai and its continuation into the 21st century. At the meeting, in Myddfai Community Hall, Professor Sioned Davies discussed the legend of the Lady of Llyn-y-fan; Dr Morfydd Owen related the story of the first physicians;

Professor Terry Turner dealt with the physicians' medicines, and Dr Donald Williams spoke about subsequent Myddfai doctors. Two years later, there was a further meeting, which focused on the history of the Lady of the Lake legend, the early development of medical services in Wales and the Laws of Hywel Dda.

The Physicians of Myddfai Society was formally launched during an open meeting at the annual conference on 28 June 2014. It was decided that the Society's main responsibility would be to organise an annual conference, a St Luke's service (Luke is the patron saint of doctors) and an annual walk to Ffynnon y Meddygon (The Physicians' Well) on Myddfai Mountain.

The first St Luke's service, at Myddfai Church on 16 October 2016, was organised by Mike Davies. The local vicar, Rev. Ian Aveson, officiated and musical items were provided by the Llandeilo Singers. In addition, there was a poetry reading by Mary MacGregor.

The first walk to Ffynnon y Meddygon was organized and led on 19 August 2017 by Dr Robin Barlow. Robin was also responsible for editing an important bilingual book which was launched by the Society at the following year's conference, Transactions of the Physicians of Myddfai Society 2011-2017.

There was no conference in 2020 and 2021 due to Covid. The following year, the theme was 800 years of continuous tradition, and a bilingual booklet, The Physicians of Myddfai: A Continuing Tradition, was launched.

The theme of the conference in 2024 was 'The Scope of Medicine' and the preacher at the St Luke's service was the Bishop of St Davids, the Right Reverend Dorrien

Although the Society does not have a secretary to succeed Dr Donald Williams, the new chairman, Dr Huw Llewelyn, a former consultant neurologist, has agreed to carry out the crucial task of selecting speakers for the annual conferences.

Exciting news that the much loved National Botanic Garden of Wales Antiques Fair and Vintage market is returning to the Gardens SA32 8HN on Saturday 1st and Sunday 2nd February with the same quality stands. This will be marking 25 years since the impressive Garden opened to the public in that historic Millennium year 2000. The Garden has under gone a huge transformation in those 25 years and has matured into a wonderful venue for the Antiques Fair.

Nestling into the Carmarthenshire countryside, on the outskirts of Carmarthen and just 15 minutes away from the end of the M4, it's conveniently situated.

The weekend of antiques, is set to be a busy one. The success of the fair has been mainly down to the diversity and quality of the antiques on display in the splendid setting of the Garden.

Fans of classic antiques should make their way to the various Garden venues – including the Great Glasshouse – for displays of Welsh art and pottery, quality jewellery and outstanding militaria collections. Step next door to Principality House which is now known as Ty Melyn and discover displays of quality antique furniture, Welsh textiles, and a superb array of books, jewellery and silver. Tucked away beside the Millenium Courtyard is the large marquee where you will find a large range of furniture, art glass and some vintage delights.

The recently transformed Theatr Botanica will be exhibiting old favourites such as silverware and collection of Moorcroft, Lorna Bailey, Beswick and Doulton, art and treen plus collections of quality welsh furniture and textiles.

Millennium Courtyard will be filled with a Vintage

market housing smaller marquees displaying vintage toys, clothing, retro and upcycled furniture.

The fair has had a reputation for showcasing Welsh areas of collecting including Welsh pottery, welsh blankets, Welsh art and furniture. Again not to disappoint, there will be an amazing display of period Welsh oak furniture. From Welsh child's chairs, milking stools to much larger pieces including dressers and linen press cupboards. Richard Bebb's collection of Welsh artists is impressive and a stand not to be missed.

Wales has a rich heritage at producing good quality welsh wool due to the land and being ideal for sheep farming. This helped with a thriving woollen industry. In the 19th century it was possible for quilts to be one hundred per cent Welsh because we had a wool fabric industry. In a country famous for sheep, the wool was not only used to make fabric but also used as a filling for the quilts, so Welsh quilts could be described as entirely home made.

The materials used were further enhanced by the method of quilting; the combination of traditional patterning and the springiness of a wool filling gave Welsh quilts their very distinctive sculptured appearance and stamped them with their Welsh identity.

Quilting is a method of stitching layers of material together. Although there are some variations, a quilt usually means a bed cover made of two layers of fabric with a layer of padding (wadding) in between, held together by lines of stitching. The stitches are usually based on a pattern or design.

The earliest quilting was used to make bed covers: very fine quilts are often mentioned in medieval inventories and frequently became family heirlooms. Throughout their history, many superior examples of the technique have survived by being passed down through generations. During the medieval period, quilting was also used to produce clothing that was light as well as warm. Padded wear could be put on under armour to make it more comfortable, or even as a top layer for those who couldn't afford metal armour.

Although quilting can just use basic running stitch or backstitch, each stitch has to be made individually to ensure it catches all the layers within the quilt. Where the stitching is laid down in decorative patterns, it can be extremely fine work. Popular stitching patterns have been given names such as 'Broken Plaid', 'Hanging Diamond', 'Twisted Rope' or 'True Lovers' Knot'.

Because items such as bed covers typically involve large surface areas, quilt making is often associated with social occasions where many people share the sewing. Particularly in north America, where early settlers from the UK and Holland established quilting as a popular craft, there is a tradition of a quilt-making 'bee' for a girl about to get married, with the aim of stitching a whole quilt in one day.

Although closely linked to quilting, patchwork is a different needlework technique, with its own distinct history. Patchwork or 'pierced work' involves sewing together pieces of fabric to form a flat design. In Britain, the most enduring method is known as 'piecing over paper'. In this method, the pattern is first drawn onto



paper and then accurately cut. Small pieces of fabric are folded around each of the paper shapes and tacked into place (also known as basting, this uses long, temporary stitches that will eventually be removed). The shapes are then joined together from the back using small stitches called whipstitches. Often these guilts were produced from unwanted or torn items of clothing that could be recycled into an amazing display of colour and textures in the quilt.

It's easy to say that Welsh quilts are simply quilts that come from Wales, which is of course true. But it can be argued that Welsh quilts are entirely unique and unlike any other that is produced elsewhere.

Traditionally, quilts were made by professional quilters by hand - usually one woman and an apprentice. The woman was usually a spinster in a town or a widow who needed a source of income for her family.

Nowadays, quilting is not only seen as a job and a way to benefit the economy, it's considered as a form of arts and crafts too. Many quilters craft quilts now to simply keep up with the tradition because it's an important part of Welsh heritage. For others, collecting antique Welsh quilts a hobby. Therefore there will be a good selection on display at the fair.

The fair has a rich cross section of antiques and vintage on display, from jewellery, watches, books and silver, including ephemera, militaria and vintage clothes and accessories. There will also be collections of glass and up cycled and pre loved furniture, plus interior design pieces including French brocante. I'm sure visitors will not be disappointed with the selection on offer at this popular fair.

Militaria will again be heavily represented at the fair with rare medals, ceremonial swords and suits of armour. The fair opens at 10.00am and closes at 4.00pm

Admission is £12 for a weekend ticket allowing you to enjoys 2 full days at the Antiques fair plus a further 5 days admission to the Garden. The tickets last for 7 days which is very good value. Dogs are now welcome over the Antiques weekend except in the Glass House.

That imposing almshouse building at the back of Llanwrda's playing field, next to the old school: who had it built, and why?

The construction funds came from Letitia Cornwallis (1694-1740), whose family owned Abermarlais mansion, Llansadwrn. The mansion burned down after its last occupant, Miss Campbell-Davys, died in 1977.

Letitia's life story is told for the first time by Pat Racher in The Cornwallis Inheritance, an A4sized limited-edition illustrated book containing five genealogical charts, and a list of inhabitants of the Llanwrda building at censuses from 1841 to 1921 and in 1939.

The story of Letitia's legacy includes the profound influence of her stepfather, John Robinson Bishop of London, her brother's marriage to his godmother 22 years his senior, fears that the family's lawyer was not above dishonesty, shady and fraudulent financial dealings, chronic mismanagement of the Abermarlais estate, and even a couple of murders.

The book, costing £9, is available at upcoming second-hand book sales organised by the Almshouse Charity of Letitia Cornwallis, which are in aid of the charity's efforts to renovate the historic building to create homes for local people. 
