






LLANDOVERY **GARDENING CLUB**

VISIT TO YSTRAD NURSERY. LLANDOVERY

For our club outing at the end of September we were given a warm welcome to the nursery by Julie. We were shown to seating arranged in a quiet area at the back of the nursery, trying out their range of garden furniture.

The theme was hanging backets for the autumn and

Using a wicker basket, and special compost for heathers, Julie explained the positioning of plants from the center outwards or taller ones at the back to lower at the front depended on the position of the basket on the wall. A variety of plants, such as a small conifer and cyclamen were shown with an inverted plastic bottle for self-watering. Other options were heathers, pansies or viola, ivy, cineraria, dwarf wallflowers and forget-meknots. Julie explained that when plants get too big, they could be transferred to a border after the winter.

Permanent pots were another option, suggesting that if made of plastic, putting stones in the bottom to weigh them down when windy weather comes.

Grasses, heuchera, trailing sedum, juega and dwarf bulbs were suggested.

Making a 'lasagne pot' which gave a variety of colour with spring bulbs, by planting them at different levels around edge of pot with plants in centre. What a lovely idea.

A good tip for deep pots was suggested; putting polystyrene in the base - less compost is needed. Sheep fleece could also be used, but this will sink with time.

What an interesting variety of ways to give colour in our gardens through the winter into the spring, thank you Julie.

Babs Rees gave a vote of thanks, noting that we had an enjoyable time being shown interesting ways of giving colour to our gardens. A thank you to the café staff, too.

On Monday 17th November from 1.30pm – 3.30pm we will welcome our speaker, Helen Walters for the afternoon. Helen will be giving a seasonal demonstration.

This meeting also includes our annual Christmas party. As this may be our last club meeting please try and be with us to say a big thank you to Babs for chairing the club for so many years.

Venue will be The Catholic Hall, College view. It would be great if a plate of food could be provided for a festive buffet. We look forward to seeing club members.

MUSEUM NOTES OLD RAFFLE TICKET FOUND IN WELSH FAMILY BIBLE



An old Welsh Bible owned by a Llandovery family, brought to the attention of the town's Museum recently, held an interesting memento of World War I. Between its pages was a sixpenny raffle ticket sold in aid of the Soldiers' & Sailors' Fund and the Red Cross.

The prize draw was to be held at Penlon School, Llwyncelyn, near Aberaeron, on Thursday 13th December 1917. There were fifteen generous prizes – including a sheep, four pounds of butter, a basket of apples, a box of cane sugar and 100 cigarettes. A total of £288 was raised.

How the ticket became lodged in the Bible isn't known; it may have been bought by a member of the Llandovery family during a visit to Aberaeron. More than 100 years later, the information it contains is of general interest, especially the fact that the prizes were to be drawn during a 'variety sale'.

Variety sales - sometimes called 'jumble sales,' 'gift sales,' or 'bazaar sales' - were a common type of local fundraising event during World War I. They were organised to raise money for war charities — mostly the Red Cross, military hospitals, for local men at the front, or the dependants of servicemen.

They usually combined elements of a market, a fair, and a social gathering for the community. The organising committees, led by women or church and chapel groups, brought together donated goods from households in the district.

The 'variety' referred to the range of goods offered. These included home-baked foods, preserves, fruit, vegetables, knitted items, furniture, clothing and 'white elephant' stalls of odds and ends. They were not just sales but social events. Halls and chapels were decorated with flags, patriotic speeches were delivered, and musical items were performed. As well as contributing to the collective war effort, they were important morale-boosters, giving communities a sense of shared purpose.

There were community fundraising events in Llandovery during the war years, but bazaars were being held in the town as early as 1902, which means that the practice had already been established locally and continued into the wartime period.

The Soldiers' & Sailors' Fund was one of the many charitable funds set up in Britain during World War I to provide welfare, financial relief, and comforts for serving men and their dependants.

It was meant to support soldiers and sailors who had been wounded or invalided home and to help the families of men serving overseas, especially widows and children. It also provided 'comforts' such as clothing, food parcels, tobacco, and recreational facilities at the front or in hospitals. Occasionally, it also helped with rent arrears and provided small emergency grants.

The fund was often a local initiative, under the patronage of a prominent community figure. It worked alongside national schemes such as the Red Cross but was separate from them. Many of the local funds were wound up after 1919, with the remaining money transferred to larger charities such as the British Legion, which was established in 1921.

Several women from Llandovery were central to Red Cross hospital staffing and auxiliary work during World War I. Local nurses served overseas or on hospital ships and in larger military hospitals; others nursed in local wards or in nearby military hospitals to which the Red Cross sent personnel. Such work was commemorated by the Carmarthenshire branch of the British Red Cross with a memorial plaque in Llandingad Church.



Being honest, I had visions of turning on the battery and going off like a rocket and ending up in a ditch. If like me, you have never ridden one, I can now share, from personal experience, they are rather fantastic! Ten minutes in I was wondering if I would use the battery, as I was peddling along nicely without it and feeling a little smug that I didn't need it. Thirty minutes and two hills later, I was wondering if I would ever turn it off! I fear I have been spoilt now.



It does go to show that until you try something yourself, you can't always judge what it's like. That is also a great plus to lending libraries. Not only can you borrow instead of buy, but you can also try before you buy as well! While we encourage borrowing, trying a piece of equipment before committing to buying it, will also help cut down on un-necessary purchases that are potentially destined for landfill due to lack of use. We already have basic bike maintenance equipment and bike stands for loan through Pethau Pawb, and Bwrlwm Beics will be holding some bike maintenance courses very soon. So, if you have been wondering if that torque wrench is worth the money, join one of workshops and try before you buy!

Given my last confession led to such a great outcome, I thought I would add another one. I have not yet won the lottery. Figured it was worth a shot and if you see me on a shiny E-bike, you know the confession paid off!

THE HIDDEN HOMELESS

Please read this article, as it may affect you or a loved one at any time.

There are many sad stories about those without homes but few people have any knowledge of the existence of a particular group which is growing every day.

You probably have a friend who experiences unexplained health concerns - perhaps increasingly severe headaches or more obscure symptoms such as severe cold in a particular part of the body. They may have strange sensations in their heart, disturbances in vision or hearing, extreme reactions to smells or sounds, dizziness, disorientation or any unwelcome variety of painful and distressing issues which seem too strange and unconnected for their doctor to diagnose.

The Hidden Homeless come from every country and all walks of life. They are the canaries who have been unwittingly been placed in the position of showing others the damage caused as society adopts increasingly harmful technologies with no choice of opting out. Imagine you wake up one morning with excruciating pain in your body, nothing can stop it and no-one can explain it. We have been taught to believe that communication means being electronically connected at all times, and you are an inconvenience to everyone if you are unable to use current technology. So the pain does not go, but other odd sensations join it. You cannot hear properly or think straight due to the constant buzzing, humming or clicking in your head.

If you are lucky you may have a partner, friend, or family member who will assist you with this hidden disability (classed as ICD-10/W900 and/or W908). They may buy shopping and make phone calls for you and take over all the tasks you could still do if you had access to the society we all lived in until this century.

It is hard for others to accept that their own smart watch, smartphone, wifi, LED lights, smart meters, solar panels and other valued items may be harming strangers, let alone those they care about. So it is easiest to deny the condition and ostracise those who are suffering. Those unable to use the necessities of modern life (computers, mobile phones, online banking, automatic checkouts,

electric transport full of wifi, etc. etc.) who are left alone with their newly enforced disability, become the most disadvantaged of the Hidden Homeless.

All we need is a safe place to live and the understanding of those who have not (as yet) been affected by electrical sensitivity. There is no official support of any kind which is generally available. There are virtually no telephone boxes to call from and no way of knowing which areas may be less affected by the radiation which comes from masts and other new equipment.

The good news is that you can help. If you are fortunate enough to live in a 'not spot' (unaffected by masts, mobile phone signals, wifi, solar or wind farms, pylons, heavy duty cables, dirty electricity, etc.) please let The Post know about this safe area. And if you would be willing to rent out an unused summer house, outbuilding, even a garage or shed, you may save a life this winter.

You could also assist an HH individual by offering occasional use of a landline, a bath, washing machine or other essentials not easily available to those living in a tent or a car. Any offers will be gratefully received, via The Post (and payments made by the individuals who use these facilities).

12TH NOVEMBER – THE TALE OF JAUFRE, A 13TH CENTURY STORY

A real coup for Llandovery u3a as the remarkable Anne Lister will be talking about her research into The Tale of Jaufre, a 13th Century story of a newly-dubbed knight from King Arthur's court. He sets out to avenge an insult to the king and has a number of adventures along the way, including meeting giants, dwarves, some highly unchivalrous ruffians, a demon and an underwater fairy. He also falls in love with a beautiful heiress. All with a touch of comedy, and all very entertaining. The entire story would take far longer than one session to tell, but some episodes can be told on their own. Anne's research focused on telling the story in English for the first time to various audiences, but also led to some quite surprising discoveries in the history of the story, including links to Henry II of England and Eleanor of Aquitaine.

OUR STORYTELLER

Anne is well-known on the international folk music circuit as the writer of several widely covered songs, the best known being "Icarus", sung by Martin Simpson and many others. In 2015 she retired from her day job and decided to pursue her love of "Jaufre" by finally working on the PhD she'd promised herself since her own undergraduate days at Warwick University. She found a welcome at Cardiff University, where she worked with Sioned Davies (who wrote the most recent English translation of The Mabinogion). She has since written two books about "Jaufre", one as an English adaptation of the story and the other expanding on her PhD thesis. She lives in Blaenavon with her husband and two cats. and is currently working on a series of fantasy novels weaving Welsh folklore and medieval writers into various adventures.

The Tale of Jaufre formed the base for the comedy show about the Green Knight last spring, so if anyone



who attended that would like to see a different take on these stories, please come and join us. Anne is a very well known speaker so we are encouraging guests for this meeting. Meet at the Rugby Club from 10:30 for catch up and coffee/tea, with Anne starting at 11:00, with a likely finish about 12:30.






'TAILS' FROM THE TRUST.... A SECOND CHANCE FOR A TETHERED MARE AND HER FOAL

During October we welcomed two new rescues to Lluest Horse and Pony Trust, a 29-year-old mare named Dew Drop and her five-month-old filly foal, Ginny, named in honour of our founder. Our founder, Ginny, tragically passed away at a young age, but her compassion and determination laid the foundations for Lluest. This year marks 40 years since the charity was established, and we are proud to continue her legacy as Wales' oldest equine welfare charity, rescuing, rehabilitating and rehoming equines in need.

Dew Drop had been living tethered beneath trees, surviving mainly on kitchen scraps, fallen acorns, and the occasional handful of hay from kind locals. After foaling, her condition began to decline, largely due to a lack of free access to water and an unsuitable diet whilst nursing her foal. Although her owner loved her deeply, Dew Drop's welfare needs were not being met. She was tethered continuously, with no opportunity to graze, roll, play, or interact freely with other equines — all vital natural behaviours. Being kept near a public footpath also presented additional risks. She had been put in foal so she would have company, a decision made with kind intentions but sadly the wrong approach for her welfare, particularly as an elderly mare.

With the help of the RSPCA and a veterinarian, our Senior Welfare Assistant Rhian was able to sensitively encourage the owner, to sign both mare and foal into Lluest's care. They are now safe for life and finally receiving the correct feed, veterinary care, and management they need to recover and thrive.

We are incredibly grateful to **Baileys Horse Feeds** for their generous donation of five bags of specialist feed for Dew Drop and Ginny. Baileys' representative, Laura Harries, visited to weigh both mare and foal and to create a tailored feeding plan.

During their first few days at Lluest, we were concerned about the possible effects of the toxic acorns and other harmful items they had eaten in desperation. Thankfully, Dew Drop's blood results came back normal and both are bright and eating well. Dew Drop has since received essential dental treatment to remove painful sharp edges from her teeth, which will make eating far more comfortable. With a correct, nutritious diet and careful management, we are confident she will begin to regain condition steadily. Ginny is bright, inquisitive, and full of potential. She will now receive the balanced nutrition she needs to grow up healthy and strong.

HISTORIC 19TH-CENTURY SALEM CHAPEL IN LLANDEILO TO BE REVIVED AS CAPEL CELF

A Community Arts Venue in Llandeilo

Local resident Zoe Twilly has purchased the former Methodist chapel on New Road in Llandeilo and has launched the Capel Celf restoration trust to create an arts venue for the community.

While the adjoining cottage will become a home for Zoe and her family, her vision for the Grad 2 listed chapel itself is to restore it as a welcoming, inclusive venue for community use, hosting exhibitions, music and live performances. Zoe will preserve it's beautiful interior with its iconic stained glass windows and plasterwork ceiling. The building has a listed pipe organ and wonderful acoustics, making it the perfect venue for musical events.

To drive the project forward, Zoe has established a new fundraising vehicle, the Capel Celf Trust, with four trustees: Gordon Kilby – who is an acclaimed musician, choir master and town councillor; Dr Dafydd Thomas – the Chair of the Llandeilo Civic Trust and Kate Glanville – artist, author and town councillor. The Trust will lead on grant applications, fundraising and volunteer coordination to secure the chapel's future for public benefit. Phil Roberts – an architect with a wealth of experience in restoration is acting as a consultant for the project.

Zoe also brings her extensive experience of hosting events and running a public space. For three years she was co-owner of The Tregeyb in Ffairfach, which she renovated extensively and ran as an award-winning pub, restaurant and successful events venue.

"Salem Chapel has been part of Llandeilo's history for more than a century," said Zoe Twilly "I want to bring it back to life as a creative, social space where people of all ages can make, enjoy and share art and music. Restoring the chapel, and its historic pipe organ, will take time but the result will be a place the whole community can enjoy."



THERE'S A FOREST **UP THERE ABOVE** CYNGHORDY

"How we see the world has everything to do with what we can do in the world. Action is shaped by vision" (Rebecca Solnit, 2025).



One of the regular volunteers at the Carbon Community project said, "I'm amazed! You've grown a forest in five years!". He was recalling his first visit to Glandwr Forest in 2021 when he saw rows of hand-planted saplings stretching in different directions up the hillside. Then the trees would have been no more than a metre high. Today many are over five metres. This would not have happened without vision, passion and many hours of hard work.

On October 1st Charles Nicholls, one of the project's trustees, gave a fascinating talk to Llandovery U3A. He explained the history of the charity and the BIG question that underpins the innovative scientific research being carried out at Glandwr: "How can we get trees to absorb more carbon in a nature-based way?" In other words, "what will accelerate and support their growth?" In the attempt to explore the BIG question 25,600 trees have been planted in 72 cells of 400 trees each. Some, replicating commercial forestry, are monoculture using Sitka Spruce. Others contain local native broadleaf trees - oak, alder, birch, aspen, rowan and cherry. The next variation involves enhancing the soil. Some of the plots have been treated with crushed basalt, a by-product of the mining process. Because basalt reacts with rainwater to reduce the acidity of the soil it can help the trees to absorb nutrients better, in addition to absorbing carbon as it weathers. Other plots have been inoculated with soil from existing nearby woodland with similar species. It is thought that the bacteria and fungi in the soil inoculation can accelerate growth. The remaining plots have been left untreated to act as a control. This is a large-scale project which is now entering its fifth year. Its scale allows for statistic robustness of results. As farmers and gardeners know all too well, other factors such as pests, and the weather (too much or too little rain, strong winds, whether something is grown high on a slope, low down

or close to an external hedgerow), are also influencing the viability and growth of individual trees.

A week after the U3A talk the annual Big Tree Measure began. For nine days, citizen scientists including students from Swansea University, Black Mountain College, as well as volunteers from Cyfoeth Naturiol Cymru, Office of the Future Generations Commissioner for Wales, SAP, Tubex, Imperial College, and the public are tasked with measuring the height and diameter of 6,400 of the trees (the diameter meaning at the base and at 1.3 metres). The measurements are recorded on handheld devices. This data is used to look at the above-ground carbon in the trees and is now being analysed together with the below-ground research by both Imperial College London and the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew. PhD and Masters students from other universities have also been involved in research at Glandwr Forest including Swansea, Bangor, Sheffield, and Oxford. For students this can often be a route into future environmental careers.

As well as the Big Tree Measure, other volunteer days are held across the year for tasks such as hedge laying, tree planting (for instance, this year of the endangered Black Poplar), tree guard removing and bar code checking (each tree in the measurement survey has a unique number and data about its growth can be compared year on year).

Quite apart from knowing that as citizen scientists you can play a part in tackling the environmental challenges we all face today, volunteering at the Carbon Community is enriching. Glandwr Forest is a spectacular setting with views across the Cynghordy viaduct and towards Crychan Forest in the east. In addition to the trial area with its 25.600 trees, 75.000 native broadleaf trees have been planted to promote biodiversity. The other 75 acres of the site include peat bogs, Rhos pasture and wildflower meadows where plants such as the Marsh Orchid and the Whorled Caraway grow. There are veteran trees in the old hedges and along a section of the old Drover's Road and, depending on the time of year, a wealth of flowers, birds, butterflies and fungi to be spotted. Signing up for a tree or a wildflower walk is one way to learn more. And whatever the occasion there are always interesting people to meet.

A forest is being grown, and so too are human connections. To find out more about this and other events go to www.carboncommunity.org.

VILLAGE RESIDENTS STRIDE FOR GAZA IN LLANSADWRN, CARMARTHENSHIRE

Residents of the peaceful village of Llansadwrn, Carmarthenshire took on a collective 83.7km walk around the village. The Stride for Gaza action took place on 19 October in solidarity with Palestinians in Gaza.

The walk was in aid of Medical Aid for Palestine (MAP) representing the displacement journey made by one of MAP's Palestinian aids in Gaza who walked 98km. Approximately twice the length of the Gaza Strip. The community hopes its action will inspire others to do the same.

Llansadwrn resident and event organiser Sioned Haf said,

"We are so lucky to be living in this peaceful village. It is a constant feeling of guilt that others, such as the communities of Gaza, on the other hand have none of the peace that we take for granted. That's why we, as a community of local, rural people, will Stride for Gaza. We want to show we're standing with Palestinians as they continue to endure unimaginable loss, forced displacement, and the lack of food, water and healthcare as a result of Israel's genocide.

This is an opportunity to show collective defiance and solidarity in our community by walking together round our village. The village loop is about 5 miles so there will be a big bunch of us doing it so we can cover the distance."

Another resident, Antonio Rizzo said,

"It is easy to feel powerless and exasperated that money from my taxes is included in this outrage. This is especially frustrating living in a rural area where it is difficult to join larger protests in cities to show our opposition to the situation in Gaza, and the complicity of our governments. This is our own little protest to help support a community bombarded with violence, dehumanisation, lack of access to pain relief and food. It is just so awful but this at least is something we can do here, and now."

Local mother Lyndsey Maiden is also taking part. She said.

"My son is appalled and distressed at the tragedy unfolding in Gaza and he wanted to do something. Now he feels so empowered about being able to help even in such a seemingly small way. But we're part of a global support network now. I'd encourage other parents and communities to do the same."




