In addition, if existing A.R.R.L. members renew their membership, the club will receive \$2.00 per renewal.

At the July board of directors meeting I proposed that we offer new members to Delta Club an incentive to join A.R.R.L. We have noticed that there has been a decline in the number of members who are also members of A.R.R.L. Consequently, when the number of A.R.R.L. memberships in the Delta Club drops below the 50% mark, we loose this revenue.

AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE TEN-TEC has come out with many kits in the past couple of years to fill the gap left by Heathkit when they quit making kits for the Amateur community. One of the kits they now offer is the UTILITY AUDIO AMPLIFIER Part number 1252.

This unit can be used for a test bench audio amplifier, audio signal tracer, audio center for QRP equipment and handhelds, and listening to near field RF energy. The kit is a high gain 1.5 watt audio amplifier with a volume control, high and low

changing magnetic fields, light, and RF sources. The kit comes with a first class metal case to put the completed project in. The kit also includes plugs and sensors for monitoring magnetic fields and RF. The unit has a jack to run on 12 volts

impedance inputs and outputs, and an input pre-amp for further gain. The kit includes a first class assembly manual along with a companion book on listening to various energy sources. With the proper sensor hooked up you can listen to

D.C. or internal batteries. I modified the unit to use nicads by adding a charging circuit to allow nicad charging from the power jack. The printed circuit board supplied is of very good quality. The kit took about 4 hours to construct and has already become one of my favorite pieces of test equipment. The cost of the kit is \$44.00. I will have the TEN-TEC UTILITY AUDIO AMP at the meeting to show and answer questions on for those who wish to build their own units.

AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE ... The ARRL has come out with several new publications with information on digital modes. The book, Personal Computers in The Ham Shack, contains information on Logs and Contesting, digital modes, Internet use, antennas, and circuit design. The ARRL also has a new book out on the APRS (Automatic Packet Reporting System). This book has information on commands and a glossary of terms to get you started with using APRS. Several books on Packet Radio are also
